Dated 1st April instead of 27th March. which must have been a mistake. but it arrived ~~by~~ the Evening Mail. after I had written to you in reply to yours of the 30th instant. I have signed your order for £1064.12.7 in favor of the paymaster of civil Servies. I have initialed the nos and amounts on the back so far as my book discharges them, leaving only the number 1006. without my initials. I cannot find that number discharged or at all in the ^{quoin} books of back quoin of this army. I think you ought to make it 1006 $\frac{1}{2}$. It is strange

SUPPLEMENT TO THE GRAND WARRANT

OF
Summer Assizes, 1848.

10th and 11th Victoria, chapter 87, section 7.

And be it enacted, that any such sum of money to be from time to time raised and levied off any barony, half-barony, electoral division, part of an electoral division, district, county of a city, or county of a town, as aforesaid, shall be charged upon and apportioned, raised, and levied upon and from the occupiers of and other persons rateable in respect of lands and hereditaments, within such barony, half-barony, electoral division, part of an electoral division, district, county of a city, or county of a town respectively, and rated under the then last preceding rate or rates made, or from time to time made in respect of the same, under the provisions of an Act passed in the first and second years of the reign of her present Majesty, for the more effectual Relief of the destitute Poor in Ireland, and the several acts amending the same, and shall be payable by the respective rate-payers who under the said last preceding rate or rates shall have paid or contributed, or been liable to pay or contribute rate in respect of property in such barony, half-barony, electoral division, part of an electoral division, district, county of a city, or county of a town, according to the several valuations and proportions according to which respectively such last preceding rate or rates shall have been made, charged upon, and payable by the rate-payers in respect of such land or hereditaments respectively; and any such sum of money shall be apportioned, assessed, and levied by the respective high constable or collector of grand jury cess for or in such barony, half-barony, or place aforesaid, as a poundage assessment, equally upon the net annual value of the several lands and hereditaments within such barony, half-barony, electoral division, part of an electoral division, district, or county of a city, or county of a town respectively rated as aforesaid, as such net annual value shall have been stated in such last preceding rate or valuation as aforesaid; and on receipt of the respective county treasurer's warrant as aforesaid, such high constable or collector is hereby authorised and required to levy the money therein mentioned, and to give to the parties paying the same separate duplicate receipts therefor, which shall not be subject to stamp duty; and such money shall and may be collected and levied, sued for, and recovered by such and the same ways and means as any grand jury cess, or the money apportioned on the several persons liable to pay any grand jury cess, or any rate for the relief of the destitute Poor, may be collected and levied, and within the same times as any grand jury cess, and with like powers, authorities, immunities, and privileges to any such collector, as in case of the levying of any grand jury cess or any rate for the relief of the destitute Poor in Ireland; and the several clauses, provisions, powers, and authorities in the said first-recited Act contained with respect to the monies to be raised and levied under the same, and the collectors thereof, and their powers, securities, remunerations, proceedings, and duties, and the obtaining copies of rates and valuations, and any penalty in respect of the same, and with respect to any deduction to be made from any rent in respect of any assessment under the said Act, and also the several provisions and powers of the said Acts for the more effectual relief of the destitute Poor in Ireland with respect to any such deduction to be made from rent or tithe, shall be extended and applied to the monies to be assessed, raised, or levied under the provisions of this Act, and the several words and expressions in which an extended meaning is given in the said first-recited Act shall include the like signification in this Act.

The Lords Commissioners of her Majesty's Treasury, having had under their consideration the Resolutions of the Special Sessions, held at Lifford, on Tuesday, 19th September, under the 6th clause of the Act 11th and 12th Victoria, chap. 51, it is ordered that, by the powers vested in them by the above Act, they are pleased to authorize the conversion of the Annuities payable under the Act 10th Vict. chap. 87, (being half-yearly for ten years,) into equivalent Annuities, as follows:—

COPY ORDERS AND RESOLUTIONS OF THE GRAND JURY.

SUMMER ASSIZES, 1844.

ORDERED—That, for the future, in all Road Contracts for a terms of Years, the County Surveyor shall apportion the number of tons of broken stone, or other material, such roads annually require; that two-thirds of such quantity be apportioned to the period of the year intervening between the months of July and March, and the remaining third to that between March and July; and that the HALF-YEARLY Payments to the Contractors shall hereafter be regulated in the same proportion; and that a copy of this Resolution shall be published in the Grand Warrant.

THAT in case of the death or illness of any of the Deputy Surveyors, the County Surveyor is to perform his duty until a successor be appointed.

THAT from and after Spring Assizes, 1845, at the expiration of half-a-year's unwrought road contract, the Money for that half-year be represented to the Surveyor, for the purpose of being laid out on the road; and that all other works, except BRIDGES and MASONRY, in progress, unwrought at the expiration of ONE YEAR after the time fixed for their completion, the amount of them to be represented to the general credit of the respective Barony, or of the County.

ORDERED—That the County Surveyor do direct the Deputy Surveyors to keep a Diary of the duty done by them, and to make observations in it on the state of any of the roads they may pass over—the same to be produced for inspection at the Road Sessions, or at the request of any Magistrate or Grand Juror.

ORDERED—That neither the County Surveyor, or Deputy Surveyors, do in future grant any Certificates to Contractors for Payment of any Work, between the Road Sessions and the Proposing Sessions, or any adjournment of them.

SUMMER ASSIZES, 1845.

ORDERED—That, in future, the High-Constable of the respective Baronies do attend on the first day of the Fiscal business, to settle their Accounts, make their Affidavits of Levy, and enter into their Securities; and that they make their return of Cess-Payers to the Secretary of the Grand Jury six days before the first day of the Fiscal business. That a copy of this order be sent to each High-Constable, and that he be apprised, that, in case of noncompliance herewith, their presentments for Poundage will be respited until the following Assizes.

ORDERED—That in consequence of the unexplained delay in opening the new line of road through St. Johnston, that any contractor, in future, whose work shall not be completed in the time specified in his contract, unless the delay be satisfactorily explained to the Grand Jury, the Co. Surveyor is directed not to give a Certificate for the work done.—This Resolution only refers to the Contracts entered into at, and subsequent to, the Spring Assizes, 1846.

It having come to the knowledge of the Grand Jury, that the Applotters of the County Cess in the different parishes have been in the habit of applotting fees for themselves, in addition to the County Cess, thereby making the applotment illegal,

RESOLVED—That the attention of the High Constables of each Barony be specially called to this subject, and that they call the attention of the Churchwardens and their Collectors to this illegality, and that no applotment be received unless it contain the exact amount of the Treasurer's Warrant according to Law. And that the High Constables be directed to hand over to Mr. Barrett the names of those applotters who have neglected to make out their applotments in proper time, for the purpose of being proceeded against for the penalties under the Act.

RESOLVED—That the Treasurer be directed to insert a copy of his Warrant to each High-Constable in the Grand Warrant, showing the exact sum charged on each Townland in the County.
