

### COPY REPORT OF THE COUNTY SURVEYOR.

To the Foreman and Gentlemen of the Grand Jury of the County of Donegal, assembled at Spring Assizes, 1849.

Gentlemen.

The Schedule of Applications to be submitted for your approval at the present Assizes, comprises very few Works requiring special comment from me. But I would beg to state the necessity of fiating all Presentments for the renewal of contracts on the leading lines of Road, particularly those situated in the Baronies of Boylagh and Banagh, as, in consequence of the rejection at last Assizes of similar Applications, the roads in the district referred to, are at present in a very unsatisfactory state.

One of the most important Presentments to be brought under your notice, is for the Erection of a Gaol Hospital at Lifford, in conformity with the Specification and Plans, &c., prepared by me, agreeably to the Instructions (as to extent, accommodation, &c.) with which I was furnished.

### SPRING ASSIZES, 1849.

This building is desirable, not only on account of its usefulness as an Hospital, but, also, as it would give increased accommodation for prisoners, by enabling that portion of the present building which is eccupied by the sick, to be devoted to the general purposes of the Gaol.

I would respectfully call your attention to the new lines of road commenced under the late Relief Act. The completion of the more important of these, would in most cases, not only be permantly useful, but would give Employment to the labouring classes in Districts where such is much required.

Should you think proper to take this subject into consideration, I am prepared to lay before you approximate estimates of the amounts required to complete the several lines in each Barony, which I consider to be respectively of the greatest utility.

In my Report to the Grand Jury at Spring Assizes, 1848, I referred to those new lines of road which had not been completed at the time specified. I regret to be obliged, again, to call attention to the same subject, with respect to the following, which still remain unfinished :-

In compliance with the resolution passed at last Assizes directing my attention to the subject of "old roads which ought to be shut up by Presentment," I adjoin a list of roads which I consider to be of very little service to the Public; but I cannot state that any advantage to the County would result from their being closed, as no Certificates for repairs are granted on them.

The unprotected state of a considerable number of the main thorough-fares of this County is a subject, regarding which I consider it would be desirable that instructions should be given, in order that proper fences might be erected at those places which are at present a source of danger to the public.

In conclusion, I beg to offer a few remarks with respect to the keeping in repair of contract roads.

The Grand Jury Act provides, that in case any contractor allows the road under his charge to get out of repair, and should not (within Ten Days) comply with the terms of a notice requiring him to put the same in proper order, the County Surveyor may employ any person to execute the work required, and deduct the amount, so expended, from any money which would have been due to the Contractor, had he fulfilled his Contract.

The power thus vested in the County Surveyor, (the only summary one of which he is in possession,) is one which in this County he is scarcely ever enabled to exercise, as he has no funds from which he can pay daily labourers, and Contractors are unwilling to interfere with each others Works.

To remedy this deficiency, I would respectfully suggest, that the County Treasurer should be requested to advance money (on account of such Contracts) on obtaining the County Surveyor's Certificate; and that the sums so advanced should be accounted for by the Surveyor at the next Assizes, and deducted respectively from the amounts of the several defaulting Contractors.
