"I have to report to you an outbreak of fever in Creeslough. I have at present 9 patients in the fever hospital from four different houses in the village. I attribute the outbreak to the low level of water in general for the past few weeks owing to the abnormally small rainfall for the past 12 months, and the unusually hot summer. The well in Creeslough is the chief source of water supply for the inhabitants thereof; it is badly situated very difficult to keep clean, has become contaminated, and is the immediate cause of the outbreak. 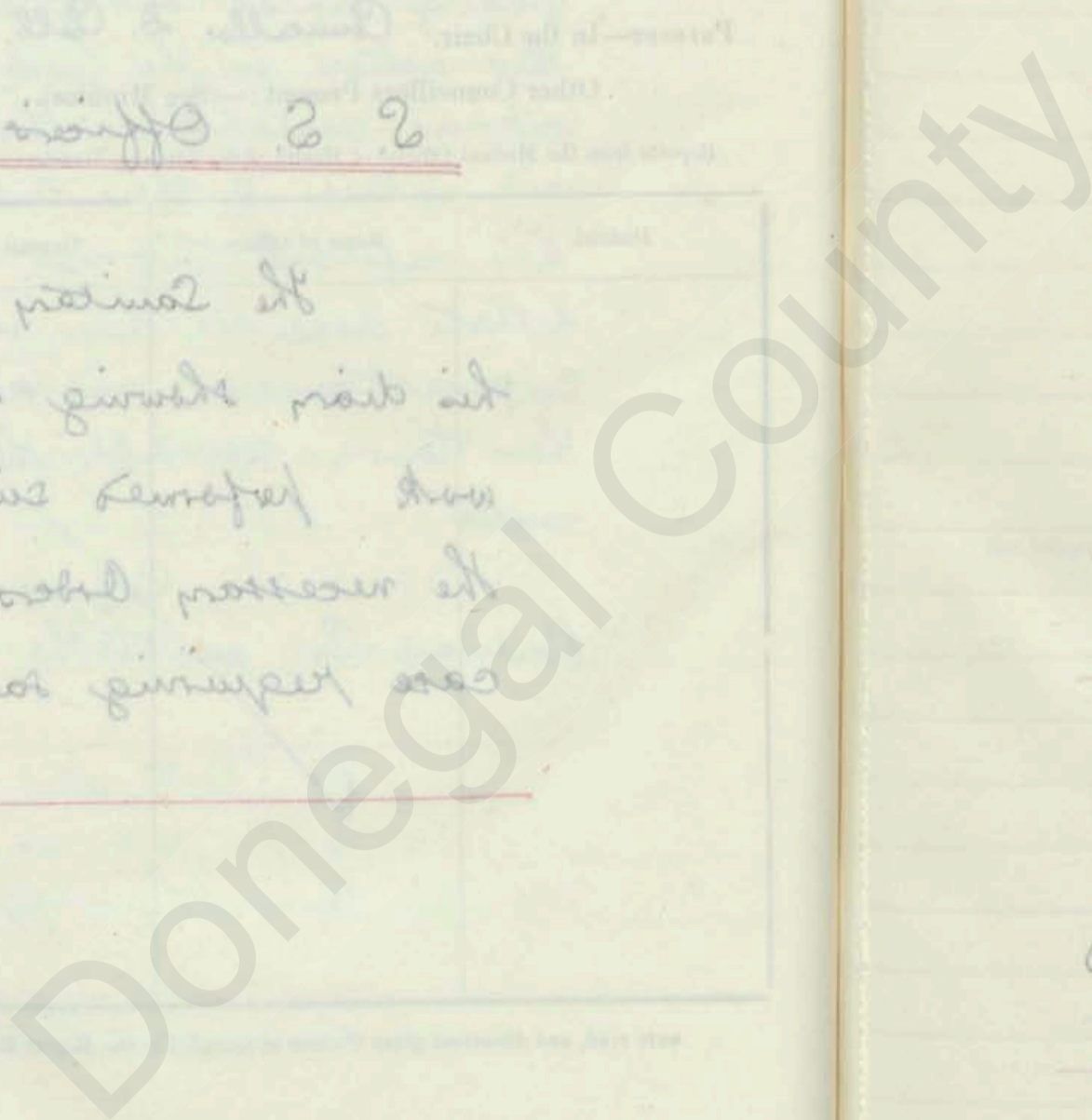
