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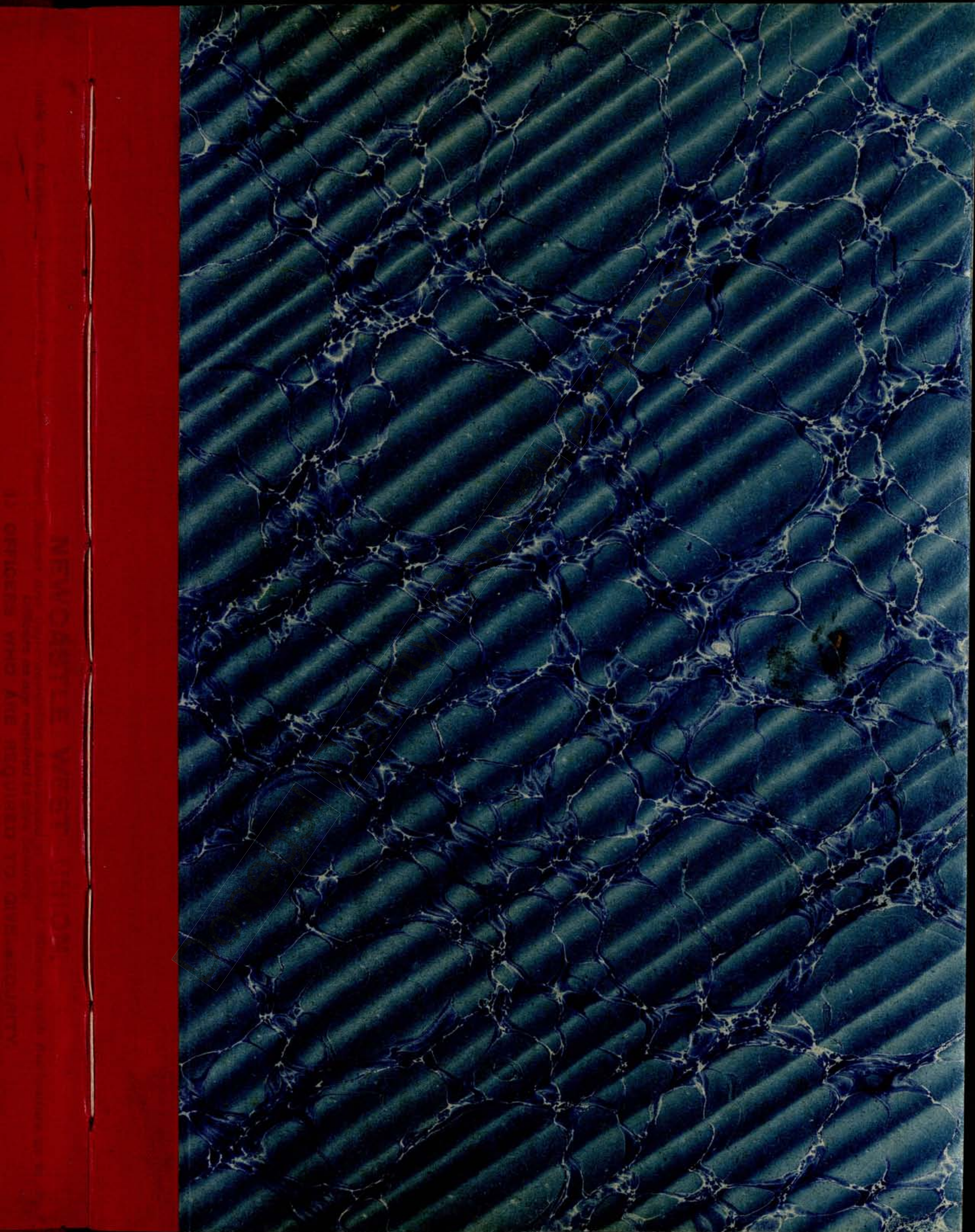

DIRECTIONS FOR USING THE Pen Duplicate and Triplicate Books

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Place a sheet of one-sided carbon paper, face downwards, between the first and second leaves, and then the sheet of black board after the Duplicate. Write upon the first leaf with a Duplicator or Manifold Slip Pen, and two copies will be the result.

In the case of a Triplicate Book, a sheet of two-sided carbon paper is placed between the 2nd and 3rd leaves, and then proceed as above.

A CARBO-PLATE can also be supplied to take the place of the black board. This is a plate which grips the carbon, and at the same time provides an extra hard plate, made of aluminium, which gives an extra clear copy, and enables the carbon paper and support to be placed in position for writing and withdrawn without touching the carbon with the hands.

This Council is satisfied that Mr McIntyre is entitled to the extra remuneration which they decided to grant him as a War Bonus owing to the delay in getting the Contractors to complete their Contracts. The circumstances arising from the war could not be foreseen when he entered into his agreement in 1912. Seeing that the Council has enforced the penalties to cover the amount proposed to be paid to the Engineer the Council again request the L. G. B. to approve of their action in this matter. The Council think it very unreasonable to expect their Engineer to spend 4 years making fortnightly inspection of the works and to receive only £86 for his time trouble and expenses
