With reference to the correspondence re the Turbany for Labourers Cottages it appears the R.D.C. have no power to borrow money for the purchase of mere right of turbany and consequently the L.G. Board cannot sell to the Council a right of turbany unless the tenant surrenders his tenancy therein and the Board would be in a position to sell the fee simple of the plot to the R.D. Council. This would be absurd in its ultimate results, as the Council would be left in possession of plots of cut away bog in the middle of holdings in no way attached to their Cottage plots. The L.G. Board is anxious to see that the Labourers in their Cottages suffer no hardships owing to the disposal of turbany amongst their own tenants who are in a position to pay cash.
