

On a division there voted for the motion, Councillors O'Donnell, Ruddy, Kavanagh, J. McFarrown, P. Quigley, Cole, James Doherty, David Kearney and Glackin = 7, and for the amendment, Philip Kearney, Philip Doherty, McFallion, and Douglas = 4. Messrs E. Kearney, J. Scott, and Grant did not vote.

The motion was declared carried.

A. Statement from Ballyshannon Rural District Council on the question of the proposed declaration of Drain Roads in Co. Donegal was read from which it appeared that the Scheme would work out adversely for Irishmen

The consideration was adjourned till the monthly meeting in August.

The following Letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland, or others, were read, and directions given thereon, as follows:—

Read letter from Mr. Thomas Callaghan, Clerk Buncrana Urban D. Council dated 25th July 1916 stating that his Council had appointed a deputation of 4 members to meet 4 members of this Council at the Boardroom on 31st July 1916 at 11.30 a.m. to discuss the terms of transfer if any of the Labourers Cottages situated within the Urban area.

The Clerk reported that Messrs W^m. Doherty, J.P.; Hugh McElinchee, J.P.; John Larkin, and Hugh W. Daid of Buncrana met Messrs John Scott, John W. Connell, Philip Doherty, and Patrick Quigley, J.P., of this Council on 31st ult. as arranged, when they drew up the following and recommended it to their respective Councils for ratification:—

Memorandum for settlement of the question of the transfer of the Labourers' Cottages situated within the Buncrana Urban District, from the Inishowen Rural District Council to the Buncrana Urban District Council.

1. That the 33 Cottages within the Urban District shall be transferred to the Urban District Council as from 1st October 1916, with entire responsibility and liability in respect thereof, the remaining 92 Cottages in the Rural District to be retained by the Rural District Council with the entire responsibility and liability attached to them.

2. The Urban Council shall contribute at 1st June and 1st December in each year one moiety of the sums of £108..15..2 and £12..3..6 making a total of £120..18..8 annually until the loans shall have been paid up.

3. That the Urban District Council pay to the Rural District Council at 15th December 1916, the pro rata share of the loss incurred by the Rural District Council

in the period between 1st April 1914 and 30th September 1916 in respect of the 125 cottages situated within the Inishowen Union.

4. That the loans for the cottages continue in the name of the Rural District Council.

5. That the Rural District Council get their solicitor to prepare an agreement, carrying out this settlement, both Councils to pay the cost of same in equal proportions.

6. If requested by the Urban District Council the Rural Council shall sign a conveyance to them at the expense of the Urban District Council.

On the motion of Mr. Scott, seconded by Councillor P. Kavanagh the foregoing terms were approved and it was ordered that the Council's solicitor prepare an agreement carrying out the settlement as proposed.

Read letter from Dr. W. Connors, Buncrana dated 18th July 1916, inquiring the reason why the cheque for his salary as Medical Officer of Health, for quarter ending 30th June 1916, was only for £1-15-0 instead of the usual one of £3-15-0, his salary on appointment in October 1914 having been £15 per annum, and stating that he intends to resist any reductions in the salary at which he took the position on 18th October 1914, and that as regards the salary of £8. he receives from Buncrana Urban Council, he regards it as an

entirely different appointment, and in no way an excuse for the Rural Council in reducing the original salary as Medical Officer of Health.

The Clerk was directed to write D. W. Cornick and state that under the terms of the Adjustment Award dated 9th February 1916 the payment of his salary of £15 as M.O.H. was apportioned as follows i.e., by Inishowen R. D. C. £7 and by Buncrana U.D. Council £8, and that he should apply to the Urban Council for their portion. Shortly after his appointment the two Councils on 29th October 1914 came to a verbal agreement as to their respective shares in the payment of his salary, but the Councils not having agreed on all matters requiring adjustment left all to the Arbitrator; but the Buncrana Urban Council when fixing their Officers' Salaries were probably guided by the informal agreement of 29th October 1914.

Read report dated 10th July 1916 from Mr. A. W. McLaughlin C.E., Asst. Surveyor, relative to a broken pipe over a stream at Labourer's cottage No. 26 Glenmakee, and stating that the opening of the pipe was 2' x 2' and much too small for the quantity of water to be vented. He recommended a new pipe 4' x 4'.

On the motion of Councillor Scott, it was decided to direct Mr. McLaughlin to have a new pipe made at a cost not exceeding £5, stone wall abutments to be built, topped with concrete reinforced by 5 iron girders and a protection wall built (L. G. B. Sanction requested)

Accepted the tender of Mr. Henry Doherty to make a new bridge or pipe over the mill race at Labourer's cottage No. 89 in Inlraee, widening the pipe to 4' 6" clear, building 2 piers, 9ft. long by 3' 6" high, and putting on concrete top with 5 iron girders, for the sum of £4¹¹ 17⁶ (Sanction of L. G. B. requested, as the one previously given, dated 5th April 1916 No. L. 2406, is useless, the amount in same being insufficient.)
