next Finance day without taxation

No 8035 dated 23 August 1915 relative to the remuneration of the Clerk and Engineer to the Council for their Services in Connection with the re-plastering &c by direct labour of Cottages provided by the Council under the Labourers Act. and stating that they are unable to alter their decision in this matter as they consider the amounts already sanctioned are adequate, being at the rate of nearly 15% for the Engineer and over 85% for the Clerk on the Gross expenditure -

The Clerk stated that an accurate percentage could not be fixed at the time the sanction was given - and that the amount now exceeds £512 expended and the work is not yet completed, nor the Bills all paid.

Mr J W Dermott proposed that the Council adhere to their resolution fixing the remuneration to the Engineer at the rate of £30 a year = Total £80. and a Bonus of £50. to the Clerk. and that the services of the Engineer be continued at the rate of £30 for one year from 4th June last, which is the terms of Minutes of 4 June and 6th August last and that the Local Gov Board be requested to reconsider the matter and express their sanction without further delay, seconded by Mrs Gallagher & passed unanimously

 W. Colhoun J.P. proposed that

The Local Port Board be again requested to accede to their proposals as set out in minutes dated 4th June last, as this Council has again considered the matter and are of opinion that their recommendations are very reasonable for the work entailed, and are surely well able to form an opinion of the amount of labour entailed in connection with such a scheme as this carried out by district labour extending over such a long period; and trust that the Local Port Board will without further delay express their sanction to the proposal of the Council.

The Council would further point out that it is essential that some person should be able to report on occasional repairs that may be necessary, and send reports about same to the Council and also the painting of the Council's Cottages will have to be undertaken soon. Seconded by Mr Patk Gallagher and passed unanimously.

John Tourish a labourer applied for permission to erect a small house at his Cottage - leave granted so as it does not adjoin Cottage

Application from Pate, Dr Lanley of Drumra for a 12" Sewerage Pipe as his Cottage was refused. Dated 26. 9. 15.

From Mr Platt Raymochy Contractor dated 1 Oct 1915, that he has the both Cottages finished except the roofs of the Closets & expects to have them finished next week.

From Mr O'Malley Engineer dated 1. 10. 15. That Mr Gregg has not done any work since last report. and that Platt has done a little and should soon be finished.

The Council deferred making any order on Platt's case till next day of meeting.

In Gregg's case the Council ordered that he be written to, to appear before the Council at its next meeting to explain cause of his delay in completing his contracts, and in the meantime he be directed to have the Bellanacadden Cottage rendered.

The Rate Collector submitted a list of Labourers whose rates have not been paid.

The Council directed the Clerk

to send notices requiring payments of all Rates forthwith - otherwise the tenancies are to be terminated

The Council request the Local Board to recommend the Irish Land Commission to issue the final instalment of loan of £1870. being £370. as the instalments already issued are exhausted.

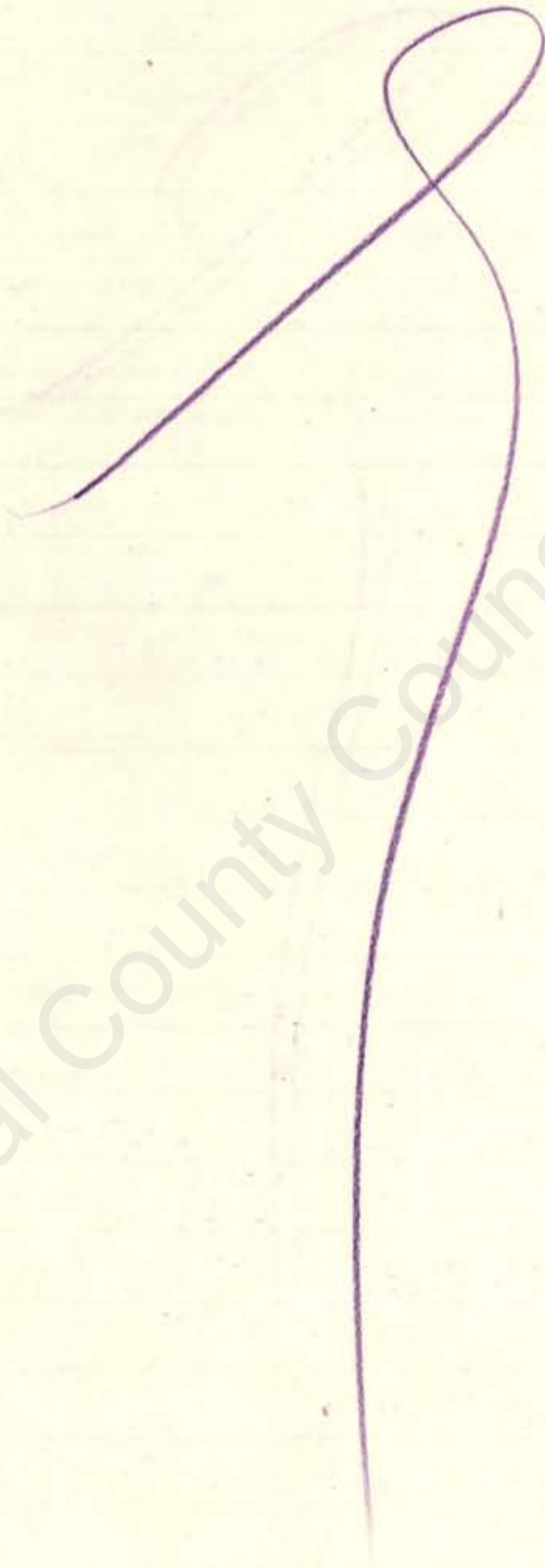
