Board, stating that questions have arisen in a number of Unions throughout Ireland as to whether Contractors for the supply of sugar were entitled under the terms of their bonds to charge in addition to their contract price extra duty paid by them on sugar supplied after the 22nd September last, and if so the amount of such extra duty is whether the full amount of the extra duty imposed, or the net amount after making allowances for the reduction in the price made by the Sugar Commission at the time the duty was increased. The Board have referred the matter to the Law officers of the Crown, who have now given the following opinion:—

- (1) That the contractor is entitled to charge the full duty
- (2) That he is so entitled when his contract binds him to deliver (though it does not bind the other party to receive) the sugar.

This ruling will of course apply to the further increase of duty imposed by the recent budget.
