The following resolution was unanimously adopted that as the salaries of Irish National Teachers meagre as they were before the war are now altogether insufficient on account of the rapid increase in prices in some cases as much as 50% and as the Irish National Teachers are the only large body of public servants who have not been granted a bonus, we the members of the Donegal Association (memberships 90) demand a war bonus of 7/6 per week for all National Teachers including Lay Assistants in Convent Schools and Junior Assistant-Mistresses whose salaries are less than £2 per week and 5/- per week for those whose salaries are over £2 per week.

That as the welfare of the nation depends on the education of its people and as instruction cannot be expected to be zealously and energetically imparted by underpaid and discontented teachers we call upon the Irish members of Parliament and all Irish public bodies to give in the interests of the nation all the support in the power to this just and reasonable demand.
