I got no reply to several letters I wrote to this Gentleman nor could my Dublin agent obtain an interview with him though he called often at his residence in Dublin. I could of course

procure a copy of the Will from the Court of Probate but I had reason to know that the document was very long and the cost of a Court Copy considerable.

I explained the circumstances to the Registrar and asked him to do with a copy of the Will which I at length succeeded in obtaining from Mr. Siblings but on seeing the copy of the Will the Registrar raised questions as to the trusteeship under the Will and I am engaged at present in discussing that matter with him. I will try to get the Legislation completed as soon as possible.
