<p>It was unanimously resolved "That the following procedure be followed henceforth in dealing with Sanitary Reports (1) As soon as the Executive Sanitary Officer receives a Report from a Medical Officer of Health drawing attention to a nuisance he shall forthwith fill a Notice (Form A) requiring the abatement of the nuisance within a time to be specified by him and he shall forward same to the Sanitary Sub Officer for service. All such Reports shall be submitted to the Council at their next meeting but the Notices Form A may be served before the meeting of the Council in pursuance of this General Order (2) The Sanitary Sub Officer shall immediately serve the Notice Form A and after the time specified in the Notice he shall reinspect the premises and return the Notice duly endorsed as to whether it has or has not been complied with (3) The Notices shall be submitted to the Council at their next meeting and in every case where a Notice has not been complied with, unless the Council make a specific order to the contrary a summons shall be issued as soon as possible in order to have the case brought before the next Petty Sessions Court (4) The proceedings in the Petty Sessions Court shall be conducted by the Sanitary Sub Officer on behalf of the Council except in any special cases where the Council may consider it necessary to employ a solicitor"</p>
