 £10 per cottage means £50 additional. In the  
 case of Cunningham the date fixed for the  
 completion of the contract was the 29<sup>th</sup> July 1915.  
 The cottages are now finished and ready  
 for occupation. The tenants have been paying  
 rent since May 8<sup>th</sup> 1916 when they signed  
 the agreements and started to cultivate their  
 plots. The original contract for the two  
 cottages was £280, the additional amount  
 now proposed to be paid is £20 or £10  
 per cottage

The Council cannot see their way to throw away any money to their solicitor. They have carefully considered the terms of Mr O'Intyre's contract but having regard to the very exceptional unforeseen circumstances arising from the War and the great delay on the part of the Contractors the increased cost of living as well as the attendance of Mr O'Intyre at Quarter Session & the small amount of remuneration on the Cottages acquired & we are satisfied that Mr O'Intyre is justly entitled to a War Bonus and we accordingly ask the L.G.B. to sanction payment of the amount of the War Bonus proposed to be allowed to Mr O'Intyre namely £10 which we consider very moderate having regard to his claim for £35

L5524: 1916 From the L.S.B. regarding the Report of Mr Foley CE and requesting that the defects in the Cottages be remedied

24.7.1916 From John Fienlyre CE stating that he drew the attention of the Contractors to the several defects complained of by the Architect and requested them to have them attended to.

2-8-1916 From Messrs McEneaney Bros contractors stating that they had all the defects complained of put right and requesting payment of the balance due to them also the Bonuses

6/20:31.7.16 From the L.S.B. relative to the payment of £10 per Cottage as a War Bonus to Messrs McEneaney Bros and W.J. Cunningham and pointing out that they will defer consideration of this proposal until the final payments have been certified for by the Councils Engineer and pointing out that the Council has lost sums of £4.10 and £2.18.0 per Cottage which should be considered.

The Council is satisfied that the Contractors have already lost considerably owing to the increased cost of materials and labour due to the War and they cannot see their way to enforce the Penalties. The Engineer thinks it will take the Bonus of £10 to repay for the difficulties in getting foundations. The final payment will be made at the next meeting of the Council when the Council hopes to have the S.B. sanction for the payment of the Bonuses. The Clerk reported that he visited the Cottages at Camels and got the dispute about the division of the land settled

The Clerk reported that he finds that James Conwell Killybegs has converted his cottage into a shop. In case he is continued as a Tenant, the Council might give him permission to erect a shop for a shop.

L6122: 1916 From the L.S.B. stating that they have nothing to add to their letter of the 4th July on the subject of the Councils proposal to allow their Engineer Mr John McIntyre £10 as extra remuneration to compensate him for his increased trouble and expenses caused by the Contractors delay. The Council wish to pay this claim on the 2nd Sept 1916. This Council is satisfied that they made a reasonable bargain with Mr McIntyre for the unforeseen increased trouble and expense caused him owing to the War and they fail to see why the L.S.B. cannot see their way to sanction same and thus avoid Law Costs. The Council wish the L.S.B. to approve of this payment which can be reviewed by the Auditor. This includes 3 attendances at Quarter Sessions appeals. 2-8-1916 From James O'Donnell Junr Collector stating that W. Gorman Dunlop refused to accept the Cottage and that J. Glacken refused to give him the keys of the Cottages.

The Clerk reported that he had sent on the agreement for Campbell who was accepted Tenant in case Gorman refused and that he had written Glacken to give up the keys
