Council deferred the consideration of this letter till next meeting.

From Lipssett & Ramage, Solicitors, dated 5th May 1916, applying on behalf of Mrs. Rebecca Hamilton Bundoran, for permission to connect a communication pipe with town water main, so as to have a supply of water for a field at the end of Sweeney's Lane as lately in the occupation of Thomas Harrison.

Clerk was directed to write Messrs Lipssett and Ramage, stating that the Council could not give the permission sought

Chimney pot for burning

From John Murray Artizans Dwelling no 29 requesting that a chimney pot be placed on Chimney so as to prevent down draught. Council directed Surveyor

to have the necessary work carried out.

From E. M. Duade Rock Bundoran dated the 19th May 1916 stating that he was unable to supply Kerbing for proposed foot path. Surveyor directed to apply to some other Quarry owner.

Councillor Ward read an extract from a report of last monthly meeting in a local paper, from which it appeared he was represented as having opposed the reduction of rents on Artizans' Dwellings.

Chairman referred to minutes of last meeting and pointed out that the resolution reducing the rents was seconded by him, (Mr. Ward) and that evidently there was apparently an accidental omission from the press report.

Uncollected Rates

The Schedules of uncollected Rates were laid before the Council. The claim of Rate Collector for repayment of Town & Poor Rate, from Bundoran Urban Council was disallowed in the cases of Reps of Pat^r Rafferty Magheracar, Bundoran, Rate no. 299, and of Edward Mcglew, Magheracar, Bundoran, Rate no. 396 on the grounds that these premises were not vacant during the half year ended 31st March 1916.

Clerk was directed to forward the Schedule of uncollected Rates to the Local Government Board for its ruling; and to return receipt forms nos. 299 and 396 to Rate Collector stating that his claim for repayment of the rates in question has been disallowed.

The Rate Collectors Bond endorsed to cover Rent collection was laid before meeting. Clerk was ordered to forward it to Local Government Board.

A report dated 1st June 1916 from Town Surveyor was read. It stated that owing to heavy rains part of surface of footpath opposite entrance to Brighton Terrace, Bundoran, was in a dangerous state.

Thomas Gorman Esq J.P. (Senr) proposed John Doherty seconded and it was passed unanimously.

"That the necessary repairs to the public foot path at entrance to Brighton Terrace Bundoran be carried out at once by the Town Surveyor"

A lengthened discussion relative to the adoption of a resolution of the Donegal County Council declaring for main Roads took place.

Councillor J. Gorman (Senr) asked if a copy of the provisional declaration required was laid before this Council. Clerk stated that a copy of provisional declaration had not been received.

A report dated 22nd June 1916, from Sanitary Sub-officer, stated that he visited the premises of Mrs. Kearns, East End on 17th June inst and found no notice taken of the M.O. Health's order.

for measurement. Owing to these circumstances I am compelled to recommend that payment of a sum of Two pounds sterling on foot of Contract no. 1 be deferred till Surveyor's instructions be carried out by Contractor.

The Town Streets have been attended to carefully and cleaned regularly, so that their general state as regards cleanliness is satisfactory. I strongly urge the Council to provide a suitable place for the reception of street and house refuse as the cleansing of the Township as a whole cannot be effectively carried out until this want is supplied.

As the duty hitherto executed by Donegal County Council, of maintaining two sections of the roads in this District, the Contracts of which will expire on 31st March next, will devolve after that date on the Bundoran Urban District Council, steps should be taken as soon as possible to procure the services of a Steam Roller, Scarifier and Water Cart.

Footpaths.

The Flagged Footpaths in many parts of the Town, and the Crossings to Entrées are most unsightly and to some extent dangerous. It would be well if the broken flags were replaced by sound ones and the displaced flags re-set. Work no. 4, passed at meeting held on 25th May 1915, has been executed according to the direction of Council.

Some means should be adopted to prevent the surface water of laneways and yards from flowing over the pavements. If channels were made on both sides, to connect with traps at ends of lanes the water could be conveyed under the footpath and street to main Sewer.

Water Supply

Abundance of water at fairly high pressure was obtainable during the past half year, and this was apparently mainly due to the co-operation of the users with the Council in carrying out the suggestions contained in the leaflet distributed in the Township, with a view to the prevention of

waste or misuse of the Town Water Supply.

I may point out that in most Urban Districts a charge is made to consumers of water for purposes other than domestic use.

Sewers.

The main Sewer and Septic Tank have caused practically no trouble, except for the blocking of a pipe in West End causing overflow of sewage for a short time. The obstruction has been removed and the sewer is now working satisfactorily.

Some owners of property appear to think that they cannot be compelled to construct suitable drains to connect with the main Sewer, in spite of the fact that Section 25 of The Public Health Act 1878, gives power to any Sanitary Authority, to require owners of houses to make a covered drain to empty into the Public Sewer.

Public Lighting

The Contractors for the Public Lighting have replaced defective lamps when notified, so that the system is now in good order.

I would direct the attention of intending Contractors to the necessity of carefully reading the Specifications of works before tendering, as the carrying out of all requirements will be rigidly insisted on.

Having regard to the strenuous times at present prevailing I have included in the list of applications only those that are absolutely necessary.

I recommend that the following works be carried out.

no. 8. To keep in repair for two years commencing 1st April 1917, and ending 31st March 1919, about 754 perches of the road leading from Ballyshannon to Sligo, between New Road at Finner and Bundoran Bridge, including Branches to sea cliffs at Finner, Bathing Strand, Railway Station and from Single Street by Great Northern Hotel to Bundoran Bridge, with 470 tons Irish broken stones of approved quality to be supplied annually, according to Town Surveyor's Special Specification - Cost not to exceed £130 yearly.

no. 9. To keep in repair for 2 years commencing 1st April 1917, and ending 31st March 1919, about 566 perches of the road from Ballyshannon to Sligo between Bundoran Bridge and Urban Boundary Magharacar including part of road leading from Bundoran to Kurlough between main Street, Bundoran,

and Srahannafulla Stream, and also Thene Avenue and Fish Lane, with 360 tons 2 inch broken stones of approved quality, to be supplied annually - cost not to exceed £100 yearly.

No. 10. To provide services of a Steam Roller, coal oil, waste, and other necessary stores, also to pay wages of Driver and Flagman, while working Roller in Bundoran Urban District - cost not to exceed £48.

No. 11. I recommend that a payment of Four pounds sterling, be made at next monthly meeting, to Bryan Doherty on foot of amount of contract no. 1. the remaining two pounds to be paid when the instructions of the Town Surveyor have been carried out, both sums to be paid in respect of Quarter ended 30th September 1916.

No. 12. I recommend that the final instalment of £5 due on foot of contract no. 7 be paid at next monthly meeting to John O'Kane, this sum being the balance due of fifteen pounds - total amount of contract.

The Council considered that as the defective wall is common to both tenements, the owners of both houses are responsible for its repair.

Letter dated 23rd October 1916, from Mr. Thomas Orr, Solicitor, Ballyshannon, on behalf of Mrs. Catherine Flynn pointing out that the premises of Mrs. Mary Sweeney, West End, Bundoran, are in a dangerous state, and asking that this matter may be brought before Council.

From Local Government Board, letter No. 55, 953:1916 dated 27th November 1916, with regard to the working of the Summer Time Act 1916.

Council was unanimously of opinion that the Act is unsuitable for Bundoran, as a sea side resort, for the following reason.

The visitors and trippers generally observed the old time during the latter part of the day, and no saving in expense for artificial light was effected.

The fires were lighted an hour earlier than heretofore, necessitating an increased cost in fuel.

In the rural districts, farmers were compelled to wait, in the hay making season till the dew evaporated under the action of the sun.

The extracts from Inspection Report of the Medical Inspector were again considered.

The Estimate of Surveyor, in connection with the prevention of the flow of water from the streets on to J. Mookan's property, was submitted.

Council decided to leave the matter over for some time.

Clerk was directed to write Great Northern Railway Company, relative to proposed construction of a walk near Beach, adjoining Company's grounds.

Paying Orders for amounts shown on Treasurer's advice note submitted to the Council were ordered to be issued.

Report dated 23rd November 1916.

Chas. Gorman, Age 12. Jno. Gorman age 10 yrs, Mary Gorman 6 yrs K. Gorman, Age, 4 years. Cannot trace source of infection cases sent to Fever Hospital and House disinfected

Report dated 26th November 1916.

Mrs Gorman, Aged 40 yrs. Rose Gorman, aged 7 years Cannot trace source of infection. Cases sent to Fever Hospital and House disinfected.
