Minutes of Proceedings of adjourned meeting held on 15th October 1917

In the Chair Thomas Gorman Esq. J.P. Junior
Others present: Councillors J. Carty; Jas. Carroll;

The correspondence read and the orders made or resolutions passed thereon were as follows:—

From Local Government Board No. 43629: 1917 dated 11th September 1917 relative to rents and tenancies of the Cottages referred to in Auditor's last report.

Some Councillors thought that rents cannot be raised till after the termination of the war.

Council directed Clerk to write Local Government Board, stating that is the opinion of the Council that rents cannot be raised while war is in progress and asking whether this opinion is correct.

From Local Government Board No. 49,123: 1917 misc. dated 12th October 1917 relative to Maternity and Child Welfare.

Council agreed that the necessity did not arise in the district for the provision of Food and milk in connection with the subject of Board's Circular letter.

Application dated 13th October 1917 from Michael J. McManus, Bundoran, contractor for delivery of road metal, pointing out that he was executing the work at a loss, and requesting Council to either increase the cost per ton for delivery or grant him a war bonus.

Council were unanimous in agreeing that the work of delivering, spreading, watering, and brushing the metal, could not be done for one shilling and six pence per ton for a quantity of eight hundred tons.

Proposed by Thomas Gorman Esq. J.P. Senior

Seconded by John Carty and unanimously resolved:—

"That subject to the sanction of the Local Government Board, a War Bonus of Ten pounds be given to Michael J. McManus, Contractor, for the application of about 800 tons of road metal to the roads in the district, the Contractor's present price of one shilling and six pence per ton being considered insufficient."

Clerk suggested that a small committee be appointed to consider the framing of suitable Bye laws. No action was taken.

The financial position of the Council was considered; the members concluded, that, except regular and substantial lodgments of the current half year's rate were made, the Banking Account would show a monthly debit balance. It was ordered that the Rate Collector be urged to proceed vigorously with his collection.

Town Surveyor reported that about five hundred tons of metal had been applied to the streets and that the remainder would be rolled in, during the coming week. Approved.

Water works' Caretaker reported a waste of water caused by washing carriages at premises of the Great Northern Railway Company.

Clerk was ordered to write to the Railway Company informing them, that if the public water is used for other than domestic purposes, a special charge will be made by the Council.

The Medical Officer's Return for the half year ended 30th September 1917, was laid before meeting Council believed it appeared satisfactory.

Town Surveyor reported that a street hydrant and public fountain had been repaired, and that a new valve had been placed at the eastern end of water main, which contained a large quantity of filthy stagnant water. The main pipe was thoroughly washed out from Reservoir to eastern end.

Medical Officer of Health reported that a broken drain at the back of Mrs Jas. Hamilton's house sea view Bundoran is causing a nuisance.

Ordered. notify owner to have drain opened up and cleaned.

The meeting then considered the advisability of proceeding with the work of connecting the

Artisans Dwellings in Fish Lane Magheracar, with the main Sewer. Councillor Carty suggested that this work be postponed till after the war.

This suggestion was agreed to and the proceeding ended.

The monthly accounts were laid before the Council, examined, and certified for payment.

The meeting deferred consideration of Sanitary business to its adjourned meeting, fixed to be held on Thursday 15th November 1917, at 10.00 p.m.

Minutes of Proceedings of Bundoran Urban District Council at its Half yearly meeting held on Thursday 15th November 1917 at 12 o'clock noon.

In the Chair - Thomas Gorman Esq. J.P. (Junior)
 Others present - Councillors John Carty, Vice Chairman

The following copy of Town Surveyor's Report, for the half year ended 30th September 1917, was read, after the minutes of last Half yearly meeting had been read and signed.

Town Surveyor's Report.
 "To the Chairman and members of Bundoran Urban District Council."

Gentlemen, In accordance with article 8 paragraph 2, of the Urban (Transferred Business Procedure) Order 1906 I beg to submit the following Report for the Half year ending the 30th September 1917.

Roads. The roads in the District, with exception of those, the unexpired contracts of which terminated under the Donegal County Council on the 31st March 1917 and 30th June 1917 respectively, are in a tolerable state of repair.

By your directions I have now ready, between eight and nine hundred tons of Road metal, which when applied, will leave all the roads under your control in good order.

Contract no. 1. Owing to Contract no. 1, dated 14th June 1915 not having been completed, I feel bound to recommend that the sum of Twelve pounds be struck off in respect of this Contract.

Foot paths and water tables. The Footpaths and water Tables, in many places require repairs, but the high prices of labour and materials render repairs almost impossible.

Water Supply. The continuous drought, from 23rd June 1917 to 7th August following, and the great quantity of water required to meet the requirements of the residents during the tourist season, caused the water pressure to be exceptionally low. During this period I frequently visited the Intake and had large quantities of mud, gravel &c removed. The openings in the Rose head, which is placed at the bottom of supply chamber, were frequently found stopped up with mud and vegetable matter, and were thus prevented from allowing the full quantity to flow into

the water main. The rose head ought to be raised or an additional one placed at a higher level in the supply chamber.

A short extension of the main water pipe was made, at the end of the system in Finner, and a valve fitted so that the main can be washed out periodically.

Sewers.

The public sewers gave practically no trouble during the half year, but often an accumulation of sewage matter has been found and removed from No. 1 manhole East End. Now when the water is plentiful they should get a thorough flushing.

Septic Tank

In consequence of the abnormal rain fall, a large quantity of sand and grit has lodged in Septic Tank. This lodgment should be removed and the tank cleaned. The heavy seas have washed a considerable quantity of sand &c into the sewer from Septic Tank to outfall. This deposit should be removed by flushing as soon as possible.

Surface man

The services of surface man, in the absence of contractors will be required to keep the roads in good condition.

main Roads
Declaration

As the Order of the Local Government Board with reference to the declaration as to main Roads in County Donegal, has not been received by this Council, it would be advisable that contracts for maintenance of all roads in the District be so arranged, so as to expire on 31st March 1918.

The following are my recommendations.

No. 11. To keep in repair for 3 months, commencing 1st January 1918, and ending 31st March 1918, about 7324 perches of the road leading from Ballyshannon to Sligo, between the New Road at Finner and Bundoran Bridge, including branches to sea cliffs at Finner Basking Strand, Railway Station, and from Singlestreet by Great Northern Hotel, to Bundoran Bridge with 20 tons 1 1/2 inch broken stone of approved quality, to be applied before 31st March 1918, according to Town Surveyor's Special Specification. Total cost not to exceed £6.

No. 12. To keep in repair for 3 months commencing 1st January 1918 and ending 31st March 1918, about 566 perches of the road from Ballyshannon to Sligo between Bundoran Bridge and Urban Boundary Magheracarr, including part of road leading from Bundoran to Kinelough, between Main Street Bundoran and Soudhamapulla Stream, and also Shem Avenue, with 20 tons 1 1/2 inch broken stones of approved quality, to be applied before the 31st March 1918, according to Town Surveyor's Special Specification.

Total cost not to exceed £6.

My estimate for the maintenance of public works in the District for the ensuing financial year is as set forth below.

Road metal for main Road, including cost of application, rolling &c. 500 tons at 8/- per ton	= £200

In the Chair: Thomas Gorman Esq. J.P. (Junior)
Others present: Councillors John Barty; Joseph Busack; James Carroll; H.J. Kelly; Jas. Ward; Patrick Muhan and Town Surveyor.

The correspondence read and the orders made or resolutions passed thereon were as follows:—

From Local Government Board no. 894/1918, dated 18th January 1918, (Donegal County) forwarding copy of letter, addressed to Donegal County Council, relative to Mr Michael Mulhern, Poor Rate Collector in the Urban District of Bundoran.

Council directed Clerk to inform Rate Collector of the matter, and to point out the gravity of his continued neglect of duty, and urge him to reduce the debit balance with the Treasurer, by making substantial lodgments immediately.

From Local Government Board no. 63952:1917 Donegal County, dated 21st January 1918, forwarding copy of Order made by Board, declaring what roads shall be main roads in the County of Donegal, as from the 1st April 1918.

Councillor Kelly requested to be informed what roads in the Urban District were declared to be main roads and what was their mileage

Clerk stated that on the 29th January 1918, he wrote to County Surveyor of Donegal, asking to be informed what roads in the Urban District, were declared to be main roads, under Order of Local Government Board dated 11th January 1918. No written reply was received; but the County Surveyor informed him verbally, that the length road referred to in the Order, is the road running through the town, from the eastern to the western boundaries of the Urban District.

Chairman pointed out that other roads must be included, so that the total will be 2 miles 52 perches, as stated in Order.

Clerk was again directed to obtain accurate information on the subject.

Councillor Kelly said that the proportion of main roads allotted to Bundoran was not equitable, considering its importance as a health resort and its high valuation, and said he believed that Council has power to resist it, and was not satisfied that the Local Government Board had authority to make order, all the circumstances being considered.

Clerk referred Council to letter no. 15578/1917, Glenties Rural District, dated 1st May 1917, which was read at meeting of 7th May 1917, informing Council that an inquiry was fixed to be held in Lifford on 22nd May 1917, so that an opportunity was afforded to give evidence on the question of main roads, and Section 8 (5) of Local Government Act of 1898, gave power to Local Government Board to make any declaration on appeal against the declaration of the County Council.

Councillor Ward said that the Urban Council was not represented on the County Council, and there should not be taxation without representation, and a protest should be made against Order, or an appeal lodged.

Clerk pointed out that a protest would not avail, and an appeal would fail, as the Order was now law.

Council directed Clerk to write Local Government Board pointing out the injustice to Bundoran, if the Order is carried out, and requesting to be informed how cost of maintenance of main roads will be defrayed - whether on the proportion of mileage, or on the valuation, and asking whether the Board will grant an inquiry.

From Local Government Board No. 4402: 1918 Office dated 1st February 1918, forwarding a copy of the Education (Provision of meals) (Ireland) Act 1917.

Councillor Carty said all school children in the district were well fed so far. Council took no action.

From Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland, enclosing copies of orders relating to slaughter of in-lamb ewes, Council directed that the Order be given wide publicity.

From County Donegal Committee of Agriculture No. 2355/16/F.F. dated 21st January 1918, enclosing circular issued by Mr Frank Barbour on the subject of Flax seed. Ordered that circular be given the widest publicity.

From Charles McDermott water works Caretaker at Intake, in reply to Clerk's letter of 7th January 1918, stating that owing to illness he was unable to do the work of removing the deposit of gravel, at filter bed.

Town Surveyor reported that he employed men to do the work and the pressure is now good.

Water main was scoured and a new head fixed on sluice valve on the Kilmough Road, approved.

The Collection Book of Artizans Dwellings Rent showed that two tenants were considerably in arrear.

Councillor Carty stated that the arrears in one of these cases were now paid. Council took no action.

Clerk asked if any action would be taken as

to obscuring the street lamps. No directions were given as Council believed it was the business of the Contractor.

Chairman announced that as Mr. James Kearns, who was elected some time ago to fill a vacancy on the Council did not accept office, a casual vacancy is now created.

Gentlemen,

In accordance with Article 8, Paragraph 2. of the Urban (Transferred Business Procedure) Order 1906, I beg to submit the following Report for the Half year ended 31st March 1918.

Roads

Roads. The state of the Roads now under the control of the Council taking all the circumstances of the unprecedented crisis through which we are passing, into account may be pronounced as fair

During the half year 870 tons of metal were rolled in but owing to the breakdown of the Steam Roller, parts of the branch roads were only partially rolled.

The heavy traffic caused by the haulage by traction engines is sure to injure the road surface.

Scavenging has been properly attended to and the streets were kept clean.

Main Roads Order

In a short time it will be necessary, in consequence of the main Roads Order recently made by the Local Government Board to either allow these roads to be maintained by the Donegal County Council, or that Bundoran Urban Council undertake the work of upkeep according to the terms of an agreement with the former Council, which will pay half of the annual expenditure from the County at Large Charges.

The Urban District will be called in to contribute on the basis of its valuation, towards the cost of maintenance of the main Roads of the entire County

In consequence of the indefiniteness of the main Roads Order as it applies to Bundoran Urban District, it is desirable that this matter receive your

Foot paths
and

your careful consideration.

The Foot paths and Water Tables, are still in need of repair, but owing to the high prices of labour and material work in this connection must necessarily be postponed.

The large deposit of gravel which accumulated at the Intake was removed, and the pressure improved during the past half year. An additional supply of gravel has been washed down recently and will require removal.

At intervals the main supply pipe was washed out and the process has resulted in causing the supply to be much purer.

Sewers

Main sewers have been attended to and deposits removed from manholes. The septic tank was emptied of sludge, and the whole sewerage system appears now to be working satisfactorily.

The following are my recommendations:-

no. 1 To keep in repair for Half year commencing the 1st October 1918, and ending 31st March 1919, 320 perches of main Road from Bundoran to Sligo, between Christ Church and Danville Gate, with 100 tons 2 inch broken Stones of approved quality according to Town Surveyor's special specification - Cost not to exceed £32.10.

no. 2. To keep in repair for Half Year commencing the 1st October 1918, and ending 31st March 1919, 258 perches of main Road from Bundoran to Ballyshannon, between Christ Church and New Road at Finer, including branch to Railway Station, with 90 tons of 2 inch broken stones of approved quality according to Town Surveyor's special specification - Cost not to exceed £29.5.

no. 3 To keep in repair for Half Year commencing the 1st October 1918, and ending 31st March 1919, about 114 perches of main Road, between Bundoran and Kinelagh from main Road at Bundoran, to lane way at Patrick Johnston's, Magheracary, with 60 tons 2 inch broken stones of approved quality according to Town Surveyor's special specification - Cost not to exceed £19.10.

no. 4 To keep in repair all the roads in the District from 1st April 1918 to 1st October 1918, by direct labour
