

From Mr James Ward, regretting that owing to his age and the state of his health he could not continue in office

Proposed by Councillor Conlan

Seconded by Councillor H. J. Kelly and passed unanimously

"That we accept the resignation of Councillor Jas. Ward which his ill health has necessitated, and express our regret at the loss of his valuable services to the Council"

Clerk was directed to prepare a form for signature declaring a vacancy on the Council.

Council fixed 10th June 1918 as the date on which the vacancy would be filled. Proposed by J. Doherty, seconded by H. J. Kelly

From R. H. Reid, Solicitor, Ballyshannon, dated 9th May 1918, stating that Pat. Daly, a tenant of Artizans' Dwelling no. 17, has sub-let dwelling at £9 per year, and asking for directions in the matter.

Clerk informed Council that he replied to Mr Reid stating that Daly by his agreement was prohibited from sub-letting, and that he has not given up possession of Dwelling to Council.

Council ordered that this matter be referred to Solicitor. The case of Patrick Daly (Terence) a tenant of Dwelling no. 5 who has emigrated, and whose brother Dan. Daly holds possession was considered.

Council ordered that this case be referred to Solicitor. From Portrush Urban District Council requesting this Council to protest by Resolution against increase of Railway Fares.

"That as the increase of 50 per cent on Railway Fares in such a poor country as Ireland will result in a serious reduction in holiday travelling thereby injuriously affecting the health of the nation especially the working classes, and bring ruin to Health Resorts, we request that the Order fixing the increased fares be withdrawn without delay, and that copies of this resolution be forwarded to the Chief Secretary, the M. P. for the constituency and the Irish Railway Executive"

Clerk reported that the letting of the Bathing machines for the season, fell through for want of bidders, but that after the Auctioneer left town William Travers, offered a sum of nine pounds as rent of machines for the season.

"That the eight Bathing machines be let to William Travers for the season, at a rent of nine pounds sterling, on condition of their being moved near the bathing places to suit the convenience of bathers"

Minutes of Proceedings at a Special meeting held on 10th June 1918.

The notice, which stated that meeting was called for the purpose of choosing a person to act as Councillor in the room of Councillor Ward, resigned, was read.

Clerk stated that the notice declaring the office vacant was duly published.

The Chairman said, another opportunity had arisen, by which the Council could show its broadmindedness, in giving a seat to a section of Ratepayers, hitherto not having any representation on this body.

Councillor Conlan, supported, and said he believed if it were only from a business point of view, the Council would be acting right in choosing a member from the section referred to.

Councillor Carroll said that those people were getting a fair representation on Council but would not accept of it, when Council was being first formed.

Proposed by Councillor John Carty, V. Chairman

Seconded by Councillor James Carroll and unanimously resolved:-

"That Mr. John Judge, Magheracar, Bundoran be chosen a member of Bundoran Urban District Council in room of Mr James Ward resigned"

Clerk was directed to have declaration of office prepared for signature.

The proceedings then terminated.

Minutes of Proceedings of Bundoran Urban District Council, at its adjourned Half Yearly meeting held on 10th day of June 1918.

In the Chair:- Thomas Gorman, Esq. J.P. (Senior)
Others present were:- Councillors Carty; Peter Clancy; Thomas Gorman J.P. (Senior); John Doherty (Owen); James Carroll; John Conlan, J.P., and Town Surveyor.

Town Surveyor reported that he attended the meeting of Donegal County Council, as directed, at which it was decided to issue draft agreements

in connection with the recent main Roads Order made by the Local Government Board, for consideration by the Urban District Councils.

The Council expressed their opinion that no agreement can be entered into with the County Council of Donegal for the maintenance of main roads in the Urban District of Bundoran, under the terms of the Order declaring what roads in County Donegal shall be main Roads, issued by the Local Government Board, and dated 11th January 1918, as the Schedule to this order appears to show all the roads in Bundoran Urban District, as being comprised in the list of sections of main Roads in the Ballyshannon Rural District.

Clerk informed Council that no correspondence on the subject of main Roads had been received from the County Council since last meeting.

The Council unanimously decided that as the roads needed repair, and were now out of contract no further time should be allowed to elapse, without getting contractors for the work.

Proposed by Councillor John Carty

Seconded by Councillor Thomas Gorman (Senr)

"That the recommendations of the Town Surveyor submitted for the maintenance of the roads in the Urban District of Bundoran, be and are hereby adopted." Resolution passed.

Clerk was directed to publish the necessary notices for Contractors.

On the motion of Thos. Gorman Senr. seconded by John Carty, the Clerk was directed to write John Granaghan, Ardarna, for terms for a supply of stones from his quarry.

Meeting unanimously adjourned to 1st July 1918 at 8 o'clock p.m.
