To His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant

The County Council having claimed ^{the}
ownership & control of the buildings at
Listed Ruthers occupied by the Grand Jury
we beg to give the following sketch
of the history of these buildings.

The house was built & furnished originally
by members of the grand jury ~~then~~
about three ^{or four} generations ago & kept in order
at their expense till about 15 years
ago when repairs having become necessary
the pres^g judge of Aragon authorized the
County Surveyor to lay out such sums
as might be necessary to put them
in repair which were small in

The House was built and furnished originally by members of the Grand Jury about three or four generations ago and kept in order at their expense til about 15 years ago when repairs having become necessary the [Spring] judge of Assize authorised the County Surveyor to layout such sums as might be necessary to put them in repair which were small in amount.

These buildings were transferred to the Sheriff as part and parcel of the buildings of the County Court House and have since been used as part thereof –
