Read letter of 17<sup>th</sup> inst from the Secretary, Donegal County Council Technical Instruction Committee, regarding scheme of Technical Instruction, and giving particulars of proposed scheme. After discussion Mr Hanna proposed "that we recommend the County Committee to make trial for this year of one properly qualified itinerant manual labour instructor to form and instruct classes in convenient centres in manual labour throughout the County, also an instructor to form and instruct classes for girls at convenient centres in domestic economy." Mr W Llwaine seconded the motion which was unanimously adopted.

The Clerk reported that Mr H E Alexander was disqualified for non attendance and the cooption of a councillor in his place was postponed till next meeting.

The Clerk submitted reprinted copy of Local Government (Ireland) Provisional Orders Confirmation (No 5) Act, 1901.

Resolutions from Monaghan Union, and Ullan Rural District Council were marked read.

Read letter of 31<sup>st</sup> ult from the Local Government Board to 57449, relative to proposed Boundary Inquiry, and asking for an expression of the views of the Council on the subject,

Proposed by Mr Hanna, seconded by Mr Mitchell that we the Londonderry to 2 Rural District Council, earnestly protest against the partition of Londonderry Union, by separating this Rural District from it.

1. Because the Donegal County Council have not shown other than mere sentimental reasons for the change. We fail to see however anything sacred in County boundaries that does not apply to Union boundaries. Each was created for its own special purpose the former as a political unit and the latter as convenient for administering the Poor Law Acts, and bringing it within reach of Workhouse classes.

2. We consider it invidious to select Londonderry Union, for partition, apart from a general readjustment scheme for all the Unions in Ireland, 40 of which are in 2 Counties, and 17 in 3 Counties.

3. We respectfully submit that the Local Government Board is not justified in altering the present Union boundaries except a substantial inconvenience would be remedied thereby (Sec 38 sub Sec 3 L.G. A)

4. We submit, instead of advantage being attained either in economy of administration, or general convenience, the contrary would be the result, as Letterkenny Workhouse is an average of 12 miles distant from the 3 Western Electoral Divisions, while Derry is 6 miles. Carradnagh is an average of 16 miles from the 6 Eastern Electoral Divisions and Derry 7 1/2 miles.

5. The Ratepayers of Londonderry to 2, are almost unanimously against the change, both in their interest as Ratepayers, and in the interest of their sick, and destitute poor.

6. The valuation of this District is fully one fifth of the total valuation of Londonderry Union, consequently, they, as ratepayers have contributed in that proportion to the erection of the present Workhouse, and Hospital buildings. Hence they consider, it would be very unjust to deprive them of their vested interest in them, and then compel them to pay over again for the increased building that would become necessary in the enlarged Unions of Loughswilly and Loughswilly.

7. In view of all the circumstances, we would earnestly and respectfully ask the Local Government Board, to reconsider the decision of holding an inquiry, and thereby impose on us the serious expenses which would become necessary to defend our position and threatened interests.

Mr Craig moved as an amendment that the Local Government Board be requested to proceed with the Inquiry, which was seconded by Mr Guigley.

In a division, the amendment was lost and the original motion carried by 10 against 2.

Read letter from Mr Philip O'Doherty Solicitor, asking for payment of £11.6 fees for Professional services on behalf of Miss Mary Coyle, in recent Local Government Inquiry under the Labourers Acts, and Petition to Privy Council. Ordered that the Clerk write Miss Coyle to know if she paid Mr O'Doherty for his services in the matter.

Read letter of 6<sup>th</sup> inst from Mr. Tracey Solicitor to the Council regarding Bunsfoot and Inch road, suggesting Council's opinion should be taken, by the District Council, and sent on to the County Council, on the motion of Mr Mitchell, seconded by Mr W. Swan, it was Resolved that Mr. Tracey submit the case to Council, and report.

Read application from Andrew W. Lucas, Caretaker of Drumhaggart Graveyard, asking to have his salary increased. Mr Mitchell gave notice that at next meeting he would move that all resolutions fixing the salary of the Caretaker of Drumhaggart Graveyard be rescinded, and that his salary be then increased to £2 per annum.
