

The following Letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland, or others were read, and directions given thereon as follows:—

From L. G. B. date 28<sup>th</sup> Nov. 1899 forwarding for the observation of the Guardians thereon an extract from the Return from "L" of Medical Officer of Pallintua Corp. Dist. for quarter ending 30<sup>th</sup> Sept last, relating to the water supply and sewerage of the District.

The extract is as follows.

"The District is in fairly good sanitary condition except as regards water supply and drainage"

From Local Govt. Board date 28<sup>th</sup> Nov. '99 referring to minutes of Council of 18<sup>th</sup> inst. which contain an entry respecting the water supply of Pallintua, the Board point out, that it is the duty of the District Council to provide a sufficient and wholesome supply of water for the use of the inhabitants of all parts of the Rural District, and the fact that the General Rural District Council do not see fit to agree to a joint scheme for improving the water supply of this village cannot be accepted as an excuse for the District Council regarding their responsibility with respect to this matter.

Having regard to the several representations in this matter made to the Board from time to time they must request the District Council to reconsider their decision, and in this connection the Board desire to refer the Council to the terms of Sec 15 of Public Health (Ireland) Act 1896.

The Council respectfully and firmly deny that they have any wish or intention to evade their responsibility in the matter of the water supply of Pallintua, but they are of opinion that the General District Council should not be allowed to evade their responsibility to provide for the water supply in the portion of the village in that District either by an independent scheme or a joint scheme with this District. This Council are further of opinion that it would be most unfair to tax the ratepayers of Pallintua Corp. Dist. for the water supply of residing in another District and Union.

This Council request the Local Government Board to have the goodness to inform them, whether they have communicated with the General District Council on the subject and the result of the correspondence.

The Select Vestry of Killybarrow wrote date 30<sup>th</sup> ult requesting the Council to reconsider their decision with reference to the extension of the Pallyshannon Water Mains to the new Rectory house, and to pay the cost of the whole extension, as the valuation of the premises will probably bring in a water rate sufficient to pay water rate on an outlay of £50 or £60.

The Council decline to increase the amount of expenditure beyond the amount fixed on 4<sup>th</sup> ult. by £25.

The General order of the Local Govt Board



date 22/11/99 regarding communications between District and County Councils and Sanitary Officers was also received.

The scheme for providing 25 labourer's cottages with a stated acre of land attached to each including the site of the cottages was considered by the Council.

Mr Wane proposed Mr Leahy seconded and it was passed unanimously.

That the scheme now before this Council for providing labourer's cottages and plots of land for labourers in this District be approved of and adopted.

The scheme was then signed by the Chairman and Clerk of the Council and the seal of the Council affixed thereto.

From Local Government Board date 4<sup>th</sup> May 1900, referring to minutes of District Council of 18<sup>th</sup> ult the Board express their sanction to payment of interest on the sum of £1094 advanced to the District Council by their Treasurer since the appointed day, and the Board point out that all overdrafts must be paid off before 31<sup>st</sup> March next.

From the Select Vestry of Rathphelim date 30<sup>th</sup> Dec 1899 informing the Council that they accept their offer to contribute the sum of £25 towards the cost of extending Rathphelim water mains to the new Rectory house.

The Medical Officer of Health reported a nuisance at the residence of Mrs. Miss Purvis in Buncrana, caused by an open sewer, and suggesting that a cesspool be constructed to intercept the sewage, the cesspool to be regularly cleaned out and lined.

The Medical Officer also reported a nuisance in Finner caused by a cesspool on the premises of Mr. Geo. Hamilton, the sewage from which percolates through the wall on to the public road.

Dr. Purvis & Co. and the Clerk to visit the several premises and report as to the best means of abating the nuisances.

The Medical Officer of Health further reported the stoppage of a drain in Bishop St. Rathphelim, and it was ordered to be made right.

The deliberation of the General County Council that there be no main roads in the County, but that each District maintain its own roads, was considered and unanimously approved of.

The Local Government Board wrote date 30<sup>th</sup> inst returning again the plans Specification and estimate of the cottages proposed to be built in this District and stating, that although some of the defects in the plans and specification have been amended the documents are still insufficient and most unsatisfactory and cannot be approved. As an example of the defects referred to the Board point out that the section shows the house 20 ft. 9 inches wide, whereas the plan only shows it 17 feet wide. The estimate also appears too low.

In conclusion the Board suggest to the Dist. Council the advisability of having fresh plans prepared by a competent Architect.

The plans to be referred back to the Architect for amendment.

The Local Govt. Board also wrote date 28<sup>th</sup> Mar. 1900 referring to previous correspondence on the subject, stating that they learn that the Dist. 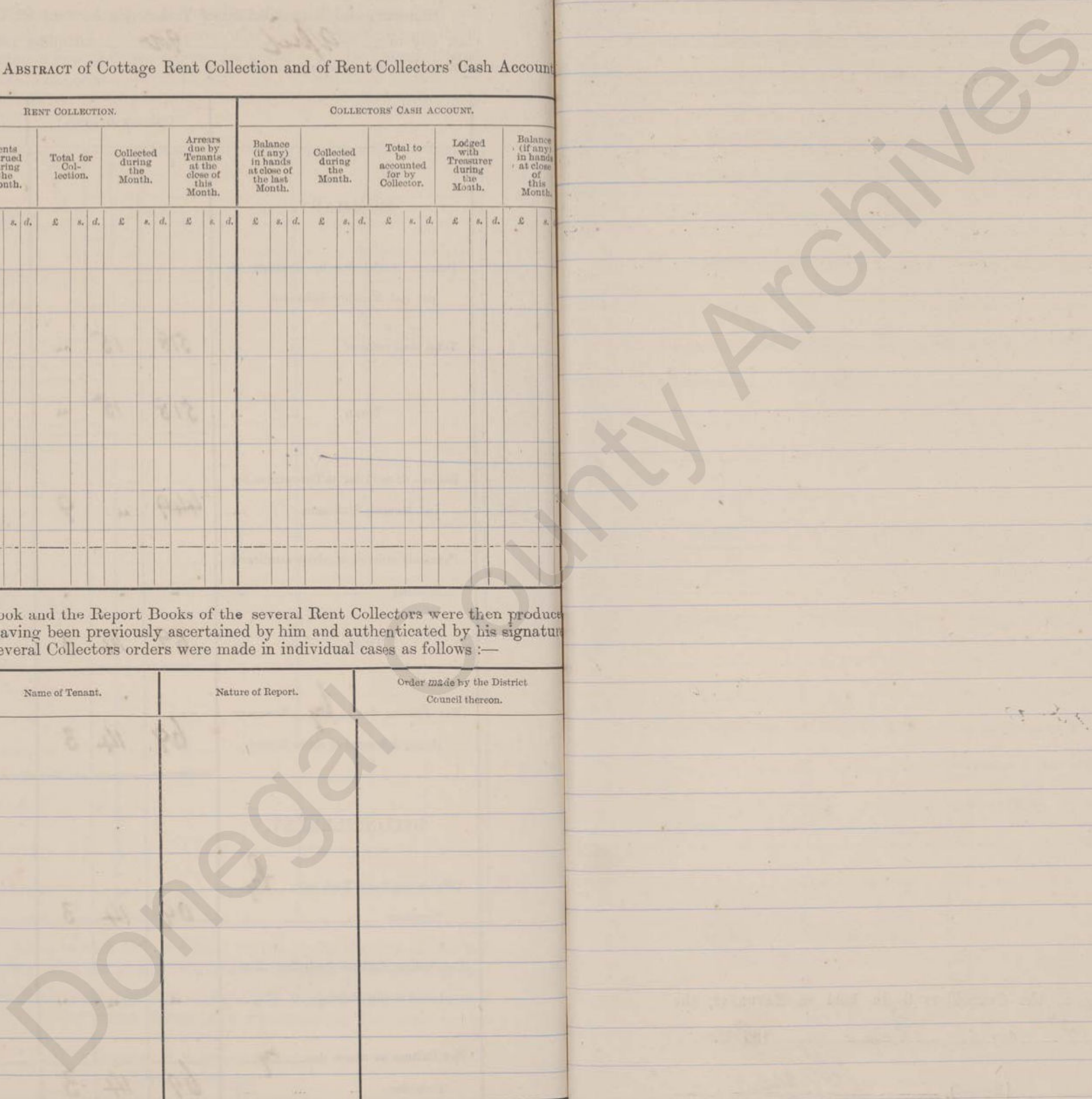

From Local Government Board date 18<sup>th</sup> June 1900 referring to minutes of meeting of the Council of 2<sup>nd</sup> inst. the Board state that they will again address the Council on the subject of areas of charge for special expenses incurred under the Public Health Acts.

From Local Government Board date 18<sup>th</sup> June 1900 sanctioning the proposal of the Council fixing the salary of their Clerk at £35 a year, his salary as Executive Sanitary Officer to remain as heretofore at £15 per annum to be roughly apportioned between the three Rural Districts according to the valuation of each District.

Mr. Alfred Stubbins wrote date 22<sup>nd</sup> inst. asking permission of the Council to place a cattle trough in his field outside the the water area.

The Council agreed to give permission provided Mr. Stubbins agreed to pay for the water supplied.

Mr. L. Lippitt Solicitor to the Council wrote enclosing Council's opinion as to the action to be taken by the Guardians to put a stop to the discharge of sewage into the Brook at East-Port at Ballyshannon.

The Solicitor to be instructed to take the steps as advised by Council, in the matter.

The petition to the Local Government Board requesting confirmation of the Improvement Scheme under the Sanitation (Ireland) Act was signed by the Chairman and the seal of the Council affixed thereto.
