The Medical Officer of Ballyshannon Drapensoy District reported on a number of dwellings in Bundoran which required to have connections made with main sewer

"It was directed that the necessary steps be taken to compel the owners to have the necessary connections made"

The following Orders of the Local Government Board for Ireland were laid before the Board, and directions given thereon, as follows:—

The following Letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland, and others, were read by the Clerk, and directions given to answer them, respectively, to the following effect (or Orders made on them, respectively, as follows):—

From Local Government Board date 26th July 1914 regarding Ballintra water supply; the Board suggest, as it now devolves on this Council to formulate a joint scheme in consultation with Donegal Rural District Council for the provision of the water supply in question, that it would be well to consult their Engineers in the matter, without delay.

He also forward the following extract from Minutes of Donegal Rural District Council of 14th July, 1914, on the matter.

From Mr. M. Duinin caretaker, Burial Ground at Funnis stating that portion of the Boundary wall had fallen and requires to be rebuilt. He estimates the cost at £1

Minute:— "To be repaired to satisfaction of Messrs J. Gorman & J. Corry."

Mr. O. McGowan reported that he had received offers to repair Boundary wall of Teetanny Burial ground at £3.

Minute:— "Mr McGowan to get it repaired if possible at £2-0-0"

Mr. M. Travers caretaker reported he had the Bundoran ^{River} septic tank cleaned out at cost of £6-10-0 and £1-9-4 for materials required in connection with the cleansing.

A deputation of tradesmen and labourers (in building trade) waited on the Council to lay before them the views of a large and representative meeting of workers held on 13th inst. in Ballyshannon.

They pointed out that throughout Ireland a great many of the Cottages lately built had not given satisfaction; in many cases the cottages bear the mark of the hands of the unskilled workman, and inferior workmanship, with the result that, year after year, the ratepayers are called upon to pay large sums to meet the cost of repairs. They point out that it will be in the interest of the Council and the Ratepayers that in the building of Labourers Cottages tradesmen only be employed to do tradesmen's work and that the workers be paid a fair living wage.

On the motion of Mr. James Gavigan

Seconded by Mr. Thomas Gorman it was unanimously resolved that the following clause be inserted in the specification for the section of Labour Cottages. The clause also to be inserted on the tender forms. "That the

Fair Wages Resolution passed by the House of Commons on 10th March 1909 will be observed by the Contractor, and the Council will require the Contractor whose tender may be accepted to pay not less than the standard rate of wages, at the rate paid by Building Contractors in the District, and to observe the hours and conditions now recognized as proper there, and in every contract proper penalties shall be provided in case the Contractor shall violate the above conditions. It shall be a condition of the Contract only that regular tradesmen only shall be employed to perform tradesmen's work and that an official of the Council shall be authorized to inspect all works done by Contractors at such times during execution as the Council shall direct. The Standard rate of wages applies to labourers as well as to tradesmen."

Mr M. McGuire, in introducing the deputation, said - We beg to thank you for receiving our deputation. We have reduced what we intended to say to writing, believing it would facilitate the Council, as well as enable us to submit our views more clearly.

At a large and representative meeting of workers engaged in the building trade, held at Ballyshannon on the 13th inst., we were appointed to lay the views of the meeting before your Council.

Your body proposes to build a number of labourers' cottages in Ballyshannon and the surrounding district. It must be within your knowledge that in many parts of Ireland the cottages lately built have not given satisfaction, they bear the mark of the hand of the unskilled workman. Unscrupulous contractors, in the rush of keen competition, tender at very low prices and then introduce inferior workmen at a small wage to do the work. The result is that year after year the ratepayers are called on to pay large sums to meet the cost of repairs to these badly-built houses - costs which are out of all proportion to the initial outlay.

We respectfully submit that it will serve the Council and will be to the interests of the ratepayers if your Council follow the example of the Donegal County Council and other public bodies by insisting on contractors doing work for you employing tradesmen only to do tradesmen's work, and that the tradesmen and labourers engaged should be paid a fair living wage.

By adopting this course you will have the satisfaction of knowing that all building contractors will enter into competition for

the building of the labourers' dwellings with 'a fair field and no favour,' and you shall have the added pleasure of knowing that the workmen employed by the successful contractor will receive a fair living wage for their labour.

The annexed resolution puts our case in as concise language as we know how to use. The wages we ask for are those being paid at present by the builders in the district.

In submitting this resolution we are not to be understood as wishing to bind the Council to its exact form. We only offer it in the form of a suggestion, that if your Council is good enough to admit the justice of our demands, your solicitor will be able to put the matter in proper order afterwards for the Council.

We beg you to give a favourable consideration to the report of the deputation.

The following resolutions unanimously adopted at the meeting referred to were then read :-

"That this meeting of tradesmen and labourers, engaged in the building trade, respectfully requests the Ballyshannon District Council to incorporate the subjoined clause, or a clause to the same effect, in the agreement or agreements, to be entered into between the Council and the contractor or contractors, appointed to erect the cottages: -

" There are many poor dwellings in Ballyshannon, the occupants of which have no means of removing refuse. A system of removal of this refuse would be of benefit to the town.

" In Ballintra water is supplied from a pump and two springs. The pump is in bad order and the water of doubtful purity. The springs are inaccessible. A water supply is necessary. Samples of water are being sent from Ballintra + Ballyshannon.

" There are no bye laws under the Public Health Acts in force in the District.

" The common loading houses in the District are not registered

" The Sanitary authority has not provided a efficient disinfecting apparatus for their District
