The Council have a right to appeal by case stated to the High Court of Justice and Counsel (Mr Horner) is of opinion that a different decision might be obtained there if the matter is proceeded with. The procedure will not be very expensive as no pleadings will have to be prepared nor witnesses produced. At the same time Mr. Sipssett says the Judge of the High Court will probably make the Costs follow the event so that if the Council does not succeed they will possibly be rendered liable for Defendants Costs.

Mr Sipssett further says with reference to Puck Duly's Malicious injury claim for £20. That he arranged for two or three witnesses to give evidence as to the peaceful state of the district of Mahera-car. The Judge, however gave a decree for £5 - Mr. Sipssett is of opinion that this should be appealed against as there is no evidence from

which it can reasonably be presumed that the injury was malicious.

In conclusion Mr. Lepsett asks the Council's instructions on the matter.

Mr. Meehan proposed and Mr. O. McGowan seconded that an appeal be proceeded with in the case of the Council against Sweeney, for the pollution of the stream running through Rockville unless Mr. Sweeney agrees to prevent the overflow from his cesspool running into the stream.

The Committee appointed to consider the report of Mr. Gilchrist C.E. recommended that the several suggestions contained in his report be attended to, and that a letter be written to Mr. J. S. Atkinson calling upon him to close the drain referred to in the report.

Mr. Gilchrist reports:

that the main works are in good order throughout and continue as efficient as when completed in Nov 1892.

The result of the inspection shows first, that the Ardpatton Lake now stands considerably below the level which was fixed for the works, secondly that there is an irregular and abnormal consumption of water going on in the town, and thirdly there is evidence of a good deal of waste being allowed and a want of supervision over the distribution fittings &c.

Lake level. The present low level of the Lake is

evidently due to a recently made partial diversion of its chief tributary stream and by this the Lake is deprived of a large volume of water it originally received.

Unless an arrangement can be made by which this diversion and interference with the inflow to the Lake would be discontinued it will be necessary to improve the Lake at its outfall so as to maintain it at the level fixed for the works.

With respect to the consumption and waste there is the undoubted remedy at hand by adopting an intermittent supply to the town, but bye laws and regulations based on Sec 67 of Public Health Act, Mr. Gilchrist says should be adopted and put in force under proper supervision.

In reply to the resolution of the Council of 19th ult the Board state that they are not possessed of any power to authorize the Council to pay interest in respect of an overdraft.

If however the Council are able to obtain temporary monetary accommodation free of interest the Board will not interfere.

From Local Government Board date 13th July 1901 - referring to minute of the Council of 2nd inst. relating to the control of the water supply of Ballyshannon, the Board inquire whether the Council propose to adopt the recommendation of the Water Works Committee to make bye laws for the regulation of the water supply of the District.

The Local Government Board are respectfully

request to forward a copy of Bye Laws if they have prescribed a form to be adopted in such cases.

A memorial from a number of householders in the town of Ballyshannon was sent in to the Council, calling upon them to take immediate steps to remove the cause or causes of the scarcity of water in Ballyshannon.

The memorial states that on certain days in the week especially Wednesdays and Fridays some of the householders are left without water for the greater part of the day, which causes great inconvenience and serious danger in houses containing high pressure boilers.

Memorialists then go on to say that the machinery of the two local newspapers is worked by means of the town water supply as they are improved, and they request that permission to use the water in this way may be withdrawn until such time as it can be found that there is sufficient water for this purpose without in any way inconveniencing the houses of the people.

In conclusion memorialists request that diligent inquiry be made at once to discover at the reservoir or in the town any other causes for the scarcity and that steps be taken immediately to rectify them.

Mr Gilchrist C.E. to be called in to make a further report on the matters referred to in the memorial.

Consideration of the matter was postponed.

Mr Gilchrist C.E. reported as follows re Hallymoran
 Water supply, date 22nd inst.

I visited the works on 16th inst. in reference to the shortness
 of water supply complained of during latter part of
 last week. I found the service reservoir full and
 overflowing and it was covered in all day while I was
 there and consequently all parts of the town were

under full pressure.

The reply to my telegram to day shows that these conditions
 have not continued and in my opinion the immediate
 cause of the recurring deficiency in the town is the heavy
 consumption of water at the two printing offices by the
 water engines employed there.

Unless your Council would be prepared to make an
 extension of the water works plant and provide additional
 storage were it will be necessary to discontinue the
 supply of water to these engines, if the domestic supply
 is to be maintained throughout the town.

In conclusion Mr Gilchrist recommends the appointment
 of a reliable Water Inspector for the works.

A meeting of the Water Works Committee to be held this
 evening at 8 p.m. to consider the report.

The Local Govt. Board also wrote date 23rd inst. in
 reply to a telegram from the Clerk of Council stating
