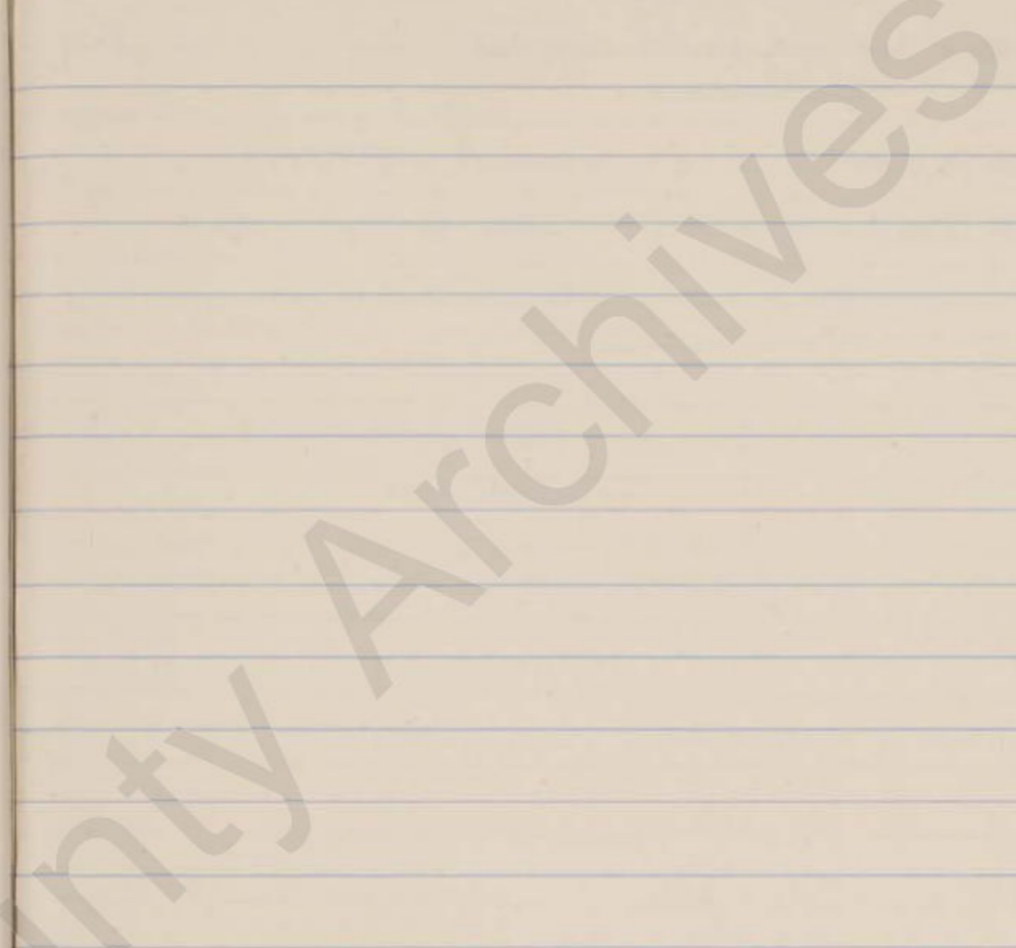

From Local Government Board date 20th June 1902 referring to the Descriptive List forwarded by the Clerk on 9th Inst. proposing as the area of charge for the Sewerage Work at Bundoran "the area fixed for the Bundoran Water Supply by the Board's Order of 1st Aug 1895" the Board point out that the Order of 1st Aug. 1895 fixes the area of charge for Sewerage Works and not for Water Supply.

The Board further state that the area of charge for Bundoran Water Supply is that fixed by the Board's Order of 13th Decr. 1894 as amended by the Order of the 3rd Oct. 1901, and the Board would be prepared to fix this area as the Area of charge for the Sewerage Works at present in contemplation.

In conclusion the Board state that upon receipt of a formal resolution to this effect the Board will give directions for the preparation of the necessary Order.

Proposed by Mr. Ward seconded by Mr. J. Donnelly jun

and passed unanimously:—

That the Local Government Board be and are hereby respectfully requested to fix as the Area of Charge for the proposed sewerage Works at Bundoran, the Area as fixed for the Bundoran Water Supply by the Board's Order of 13th Decr 1894, as amended by their Order of 3rd October 1901.

From Local Government Board date 20th Aug 1901 which through an oversight on the part of the Clerk had not been considered by the Council enclosing extracts from the report of their Medical Inspector Mr. McCarthy and requesting that each of the matters referred to may be carefully considered and that the Board may be furnished with Council's observations thereon.

The extracts from the report of Mr McCarthy are as follows date 9th Aug. 1901:

"The Sanitary Sub Officers Books are not submitted for inspection at each meeting of the Sanitary Authority. There is no Inspector of Dairies, Cowsheds, and Milkshops in the District

"There is no systematic Inspection of the Meat and Milk Supplies—

Notices are served in compliance with the Order made by the Sanitary Authority and on the report of the Medical Officers and Sanitary Sub Officers but such notices are not enforced, ^{no prosecutions} under the Public Health Acts were instituted since last inspection.

The sewer in Bullintra requires attention.

As regards Water Supply, that of Bullintra is insufficient. The pump which supplies the village chiefly

is in Donegal Union. It was erected 36 years ago and has not since been cleaned. There are also two walls in bed of ~~river~~ near main sewer outlet, but these are inaccessible in rainy weather and liable to serious pollution.

There are no bye-laws under the Public Health Acts in force in the District.

The Common Lodging Houses in the District are neither registered nor regularly inspected.

There is only a two-wheeled van provided for the conveyance to Hospital of persons suffering from infectious disease.

There is no disinfecting apparatus provided for the District.

Neither the Infectious Diseases (Notification) Act 1899 nor the Infectious Diseases (Prevention) Act 1890, has been adopted in the District.

As regards the duties of Sanitary Sub-Officers the Board request that the attention of these Officers may be drawn to the terms of Art. 17 of Sanitary Order of 3rd May 1900, strict compliance with which will be required in future.

A Copy of the Local Government Board's model regulations respecting Dairies Cowsheds and Milkshops is enclosed for guidance of the Council and they might consider with propriety the question of adopting them in the Rural District.

As regards the village of Ballintra the Board state that the Council should give their careful attention to this matter and also to the Water Supply of the village.

In regard to the regulations of Common Lodging Houses the Board point out that the Provisions of Sec. 87 of Public Health (Ireland) Act 1878 are mandatory, and a copy of model Bye Laws ~~as~~ as to such premises is enclosed for Council's information. The Local Government Board also urge the Council in the interests of the Public Health to consider the question of adopting the Provisions of the Infectious Diseases (Notification and Prevention) Acts in the District.

It was ordered that the Sanitary Sub Officer be requested to report fortnightly in future.

There are no public Dairies in the District. The Sanitary Sub Officer attends to keeping cowsheds clean. The Constabulary act as Court-Inspector in the District. The Council are willing to join with Donegal Council in providing a Water Supply for Ballintra.

The Bye-laws as to the Common Lodging Houses were adopted in the Union in the year 1897. In

many cases where notices for abatement of nuisances were served there was no necessity for legal proceedings.

The question of adopting the Provisions of the Diseases (Prevention and Notification) Acts in the District was postponed.

The Estimate and Demand for the year ending March 31st 1903 was laid before the Council and adopted.

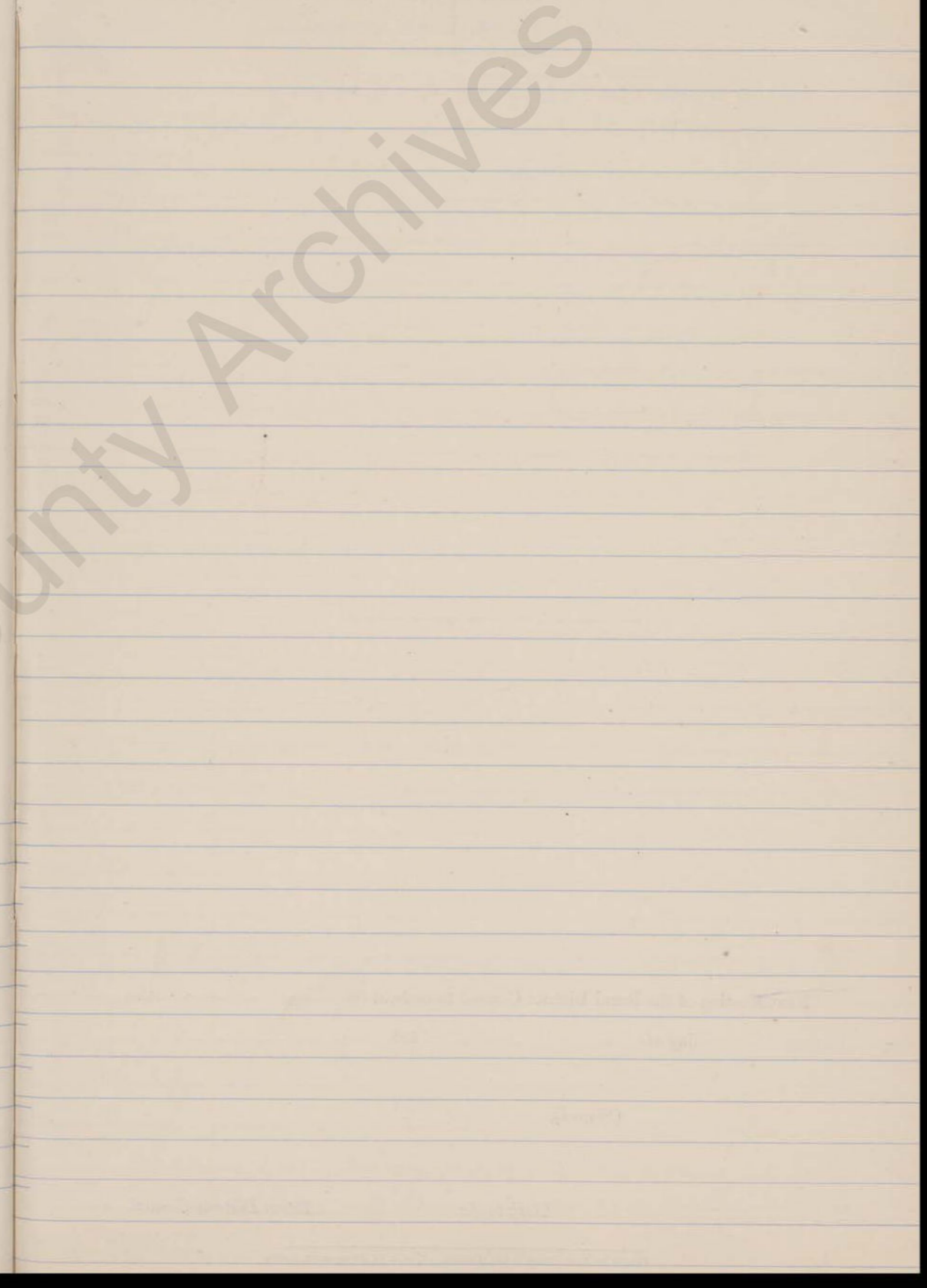

I gather from the letter received from the Agents of the Head Landlord that they will consent to this arrangement and Messrs Anderson and Atkinson have already signed consents.

That this Council respectfully beg to ask the further consideration by the County Council of the application for a grant for Bundoran Pier and wish to direct the special attention of the Council to the following claims which the town of Bundoran has on the County funds and the great ^{injustice} ~~inconvenience~~ it would be to the District to deprive them of the grant given by the department or to tax them still further by making it a District charge.

1st Because we consider Bundoran entitled to special consideration owing to the fact that it contributes such a very large contribution to the County rates, paying annually nearly £300 to County expenses for which it receives no return worth noticing.

2nd As the town and District are already taxed to their fullest extent it would be ruinous to impose

such an extra tax upon them at present, and as the amount is very trifling when levied off the County at large, only $\frac{1}{32}$ of a penny in the pound, it would not be noticed on the County Rate whilst it would be heavy on the District rate (about $\frac{2}{2}$ in the pound.) it would be a serious loss to the District to be deprived of the grant from the Department through the want of cooperation on the part of the County Council.

3rd That the County Council would be doing an injustice to the County by depriving Bundoran of this grant from the Department, and thus impeding the progress which is sure to follow the extension of improvements by the increased traffic and reduction of freight to the town.

4th That the improvement of the pier and the improvements sure to follow by the increase in the erection of buildings, will thus become a source of greater increase to the County funds.

Mr. Ward proposed as an amendment and Mr. Slain seconded,

That the people of Bundoran be required to provide £125 - out of the £250 asked for for Bundoran Pier, and that the County Council be recommended to grant the remaining £125 off the County at large.

A vote having been taken the amendment was declared carried by a majority of five votes.

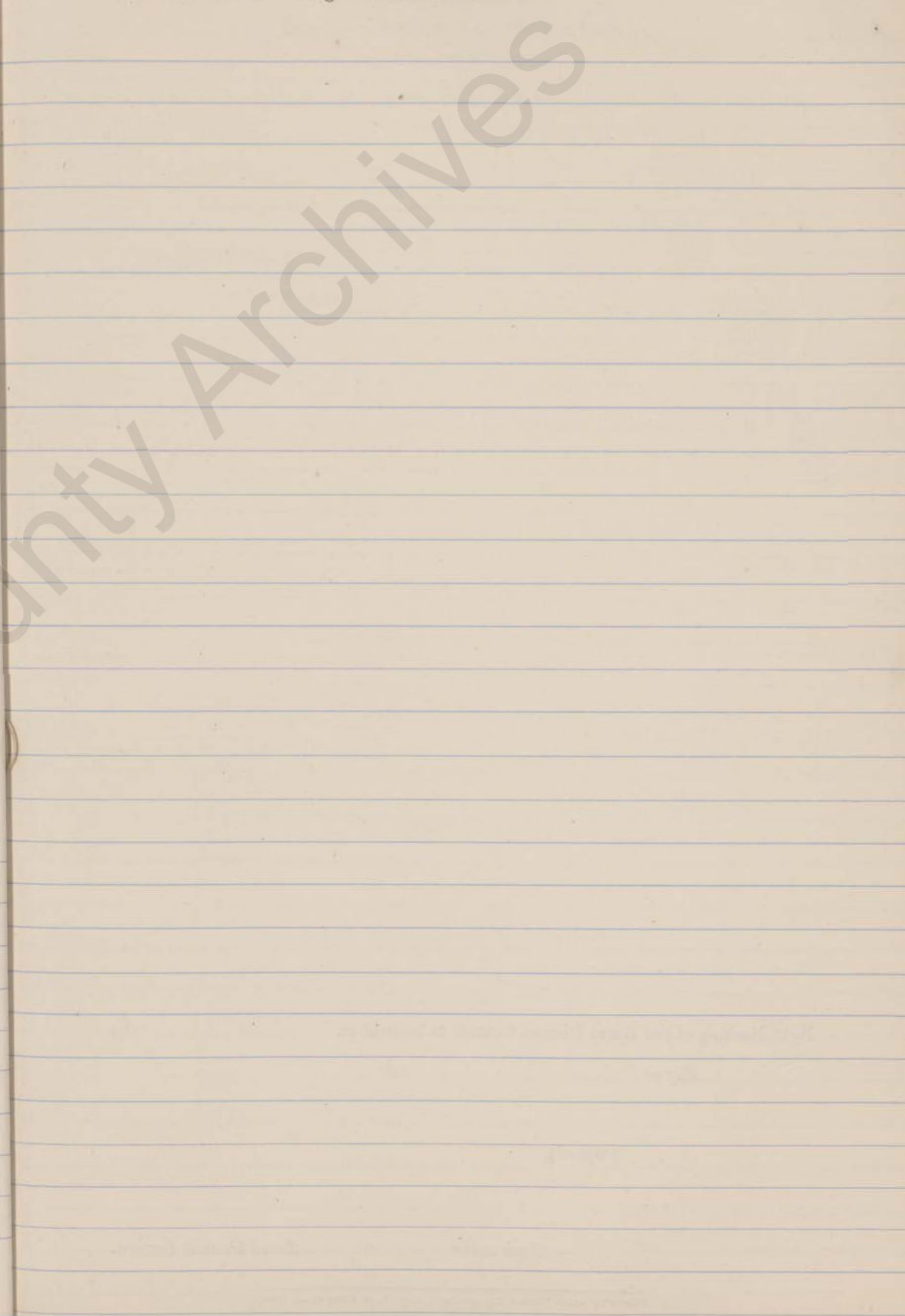
