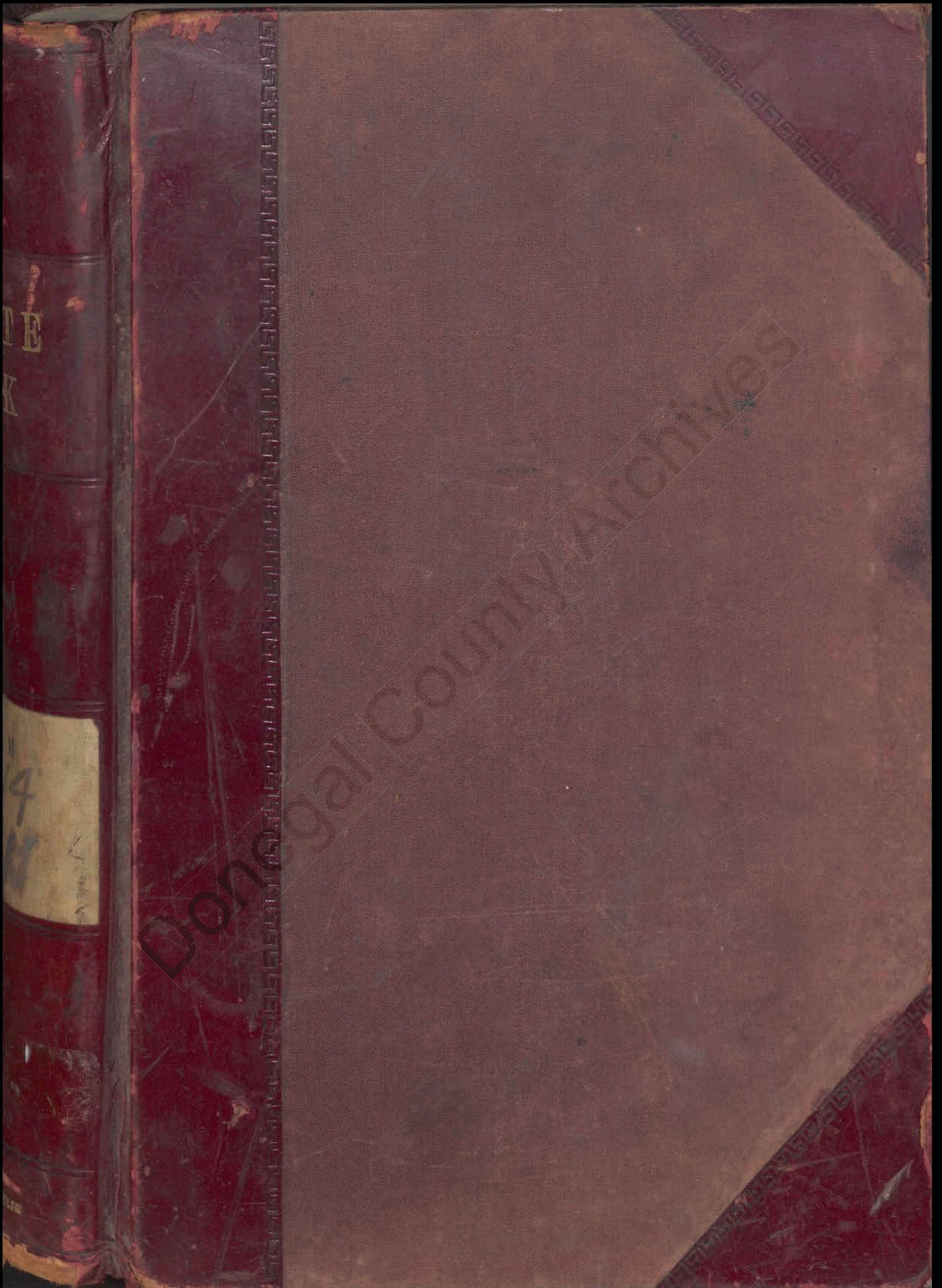

Clerks Report

As already reported at Guardians meeting by
Waste & I a fire occurred in the Boardroom
office on the morning of 21st inst. which
destroyed all the books & documents deposited
therein. I would ask you gentlemen
to pass a similar resolution to that
passed at the Guardians meeting
to get new pass books written up &
to get copies of the Treasurers Authorities
for payments, so that a financial statement
of Receipts & Expenditure may be written up
for the current half-year, and have
the half yearly abstracts of accounts prepared
which I fear cannot be done within
the prescribed time and I would request
you to procure an assistant for me
for some time to get affairs into order again

I regret to state that at the time of
the fire the sum of £ 52.5.0 was in the safe.
This sum was collected from Gas meter on
17th & 18th inst up to 6 o'clock. I deposited
the amount in the office safe with the intention
of finishing the collection on 21st and
squaring up the books. I have recovered £ 29.12.0
of which I lodged £ 26.5.0 recovered yesterday - the balance
£ 3.7.0 was recovered today. - leaving £ 23.13.0
still missing. The safe fell with the office floor & was
found open with fire

The Rent collection books are also lost
except a small collecting book which the
