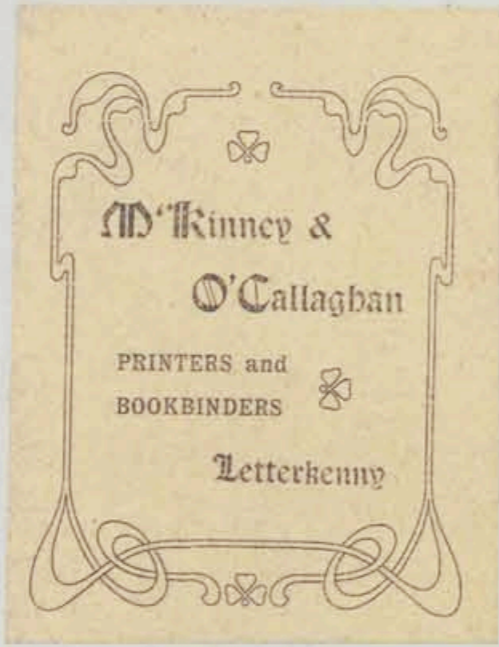

I would warn Contractors to carefully clean out waterchannells, outlets, and apes of pipes as this is the time of year that floods may be expected. If contractors fail to carry out this important duty and their contract roads are damaged, they should not expect to receive any financial assistance from the County Council.

 The report of the County Surveyor for the quarter ended the 31st December 1912 was as follows:—  
 "During the earlier and greater portion of this quarter, the weather was very wet and harvesting work absorbed a good deal of the time of the contractors during the recent fine weather. The result has been that contractors are not as well forward in the majority of cases with their work as should be the case at this time of the year and this accounts for the items deferred in the pay sheet.

The liabilities are significant that with the price Continuing Maintenance Contracts £1287 and Miscellaneous Works 298.

The Balance of the Co. Council has 63 pence. Hence it would be injudicious to pass anything until the April Meeting except maintenance works or urgent and necessary repairs the main object of the Road Board in having a thorough system of maintenance.

The Report was unanimously adopted and all the items on the sheet were rejected except the recommendations of the County Surveyor.

County Surveyor's Report.

The County Surveyor's Report for the half year ended 30th. September 1913 was read: "During this half year the weather was on the whole favourable for the maintenance work of roads and I fully expected that considerable progress would have been made by Contractors in getting their annual quantities of metal ready in good time for measurement especially having regard to the fact that 2/3 of the yearly amount of each maintenance contract can be paid at this time of the year. I regret to say that generally there has been but a poor attempt to perform the necessary work to enable me to certify in the manner I should have liked to do. Not only is the amount of metal out - in the majority of cases very small, but the cleaning up of the sides, water tables, gutters, has so far received but small attention. Boyle, Call and

As your District has already contributed towards the capital expenditure incurred for steam rollers I would suggest the advisability of getting some value for this outlay by seeking the use of some particularly as this only means the passing of a small sum to cover the actual working expenses.

For the financial year ending March 1915 the annual limit of expenditure for the District will be required to meet the expenditure on road maintenance and other works.

On the motion of the Chairman seconded by Councillor Mulligan the Report was unanimously adopted.

The County Surveyors Report for the half year ended 30th September 1913 was read during the meeting. 

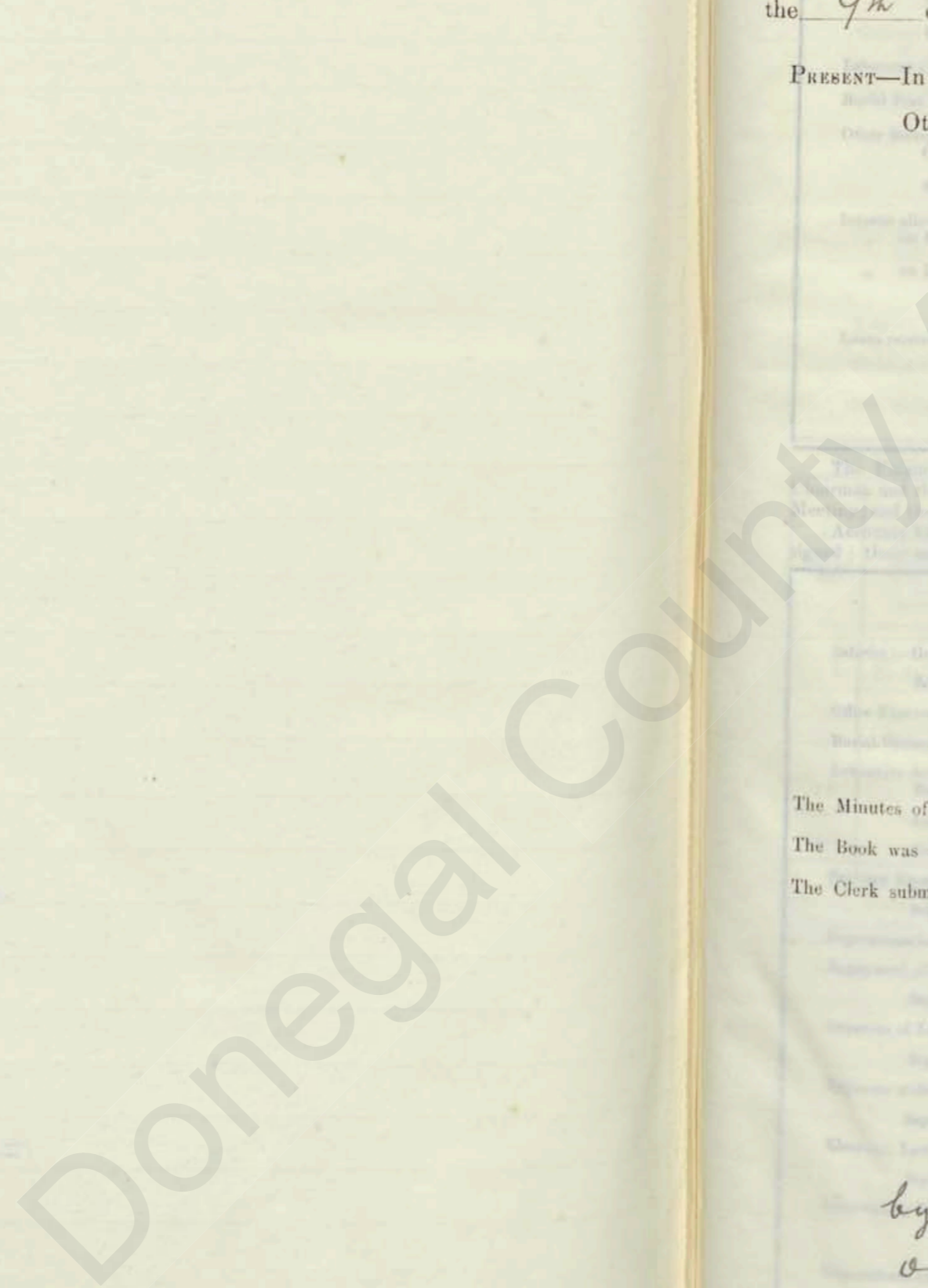

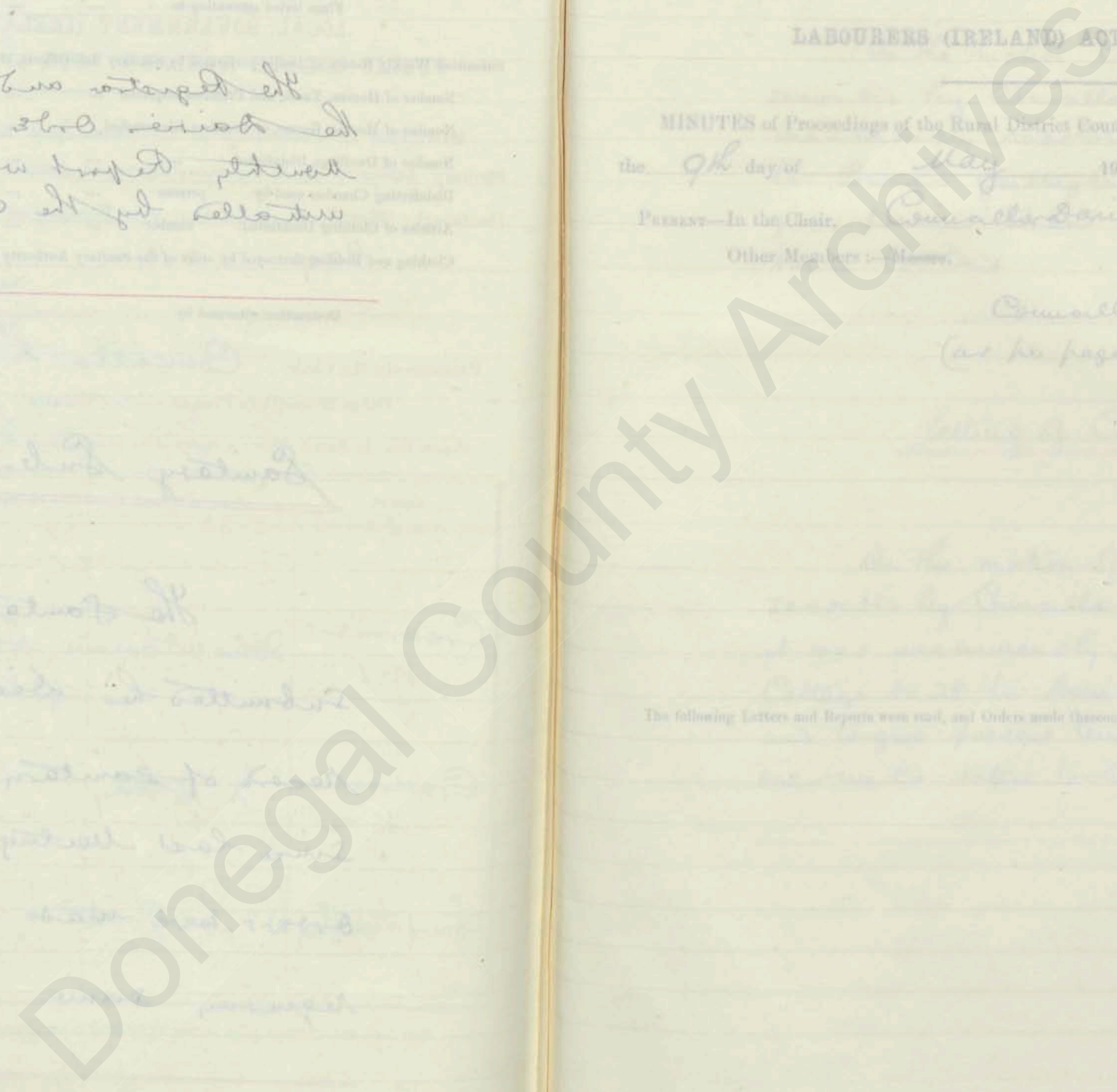
