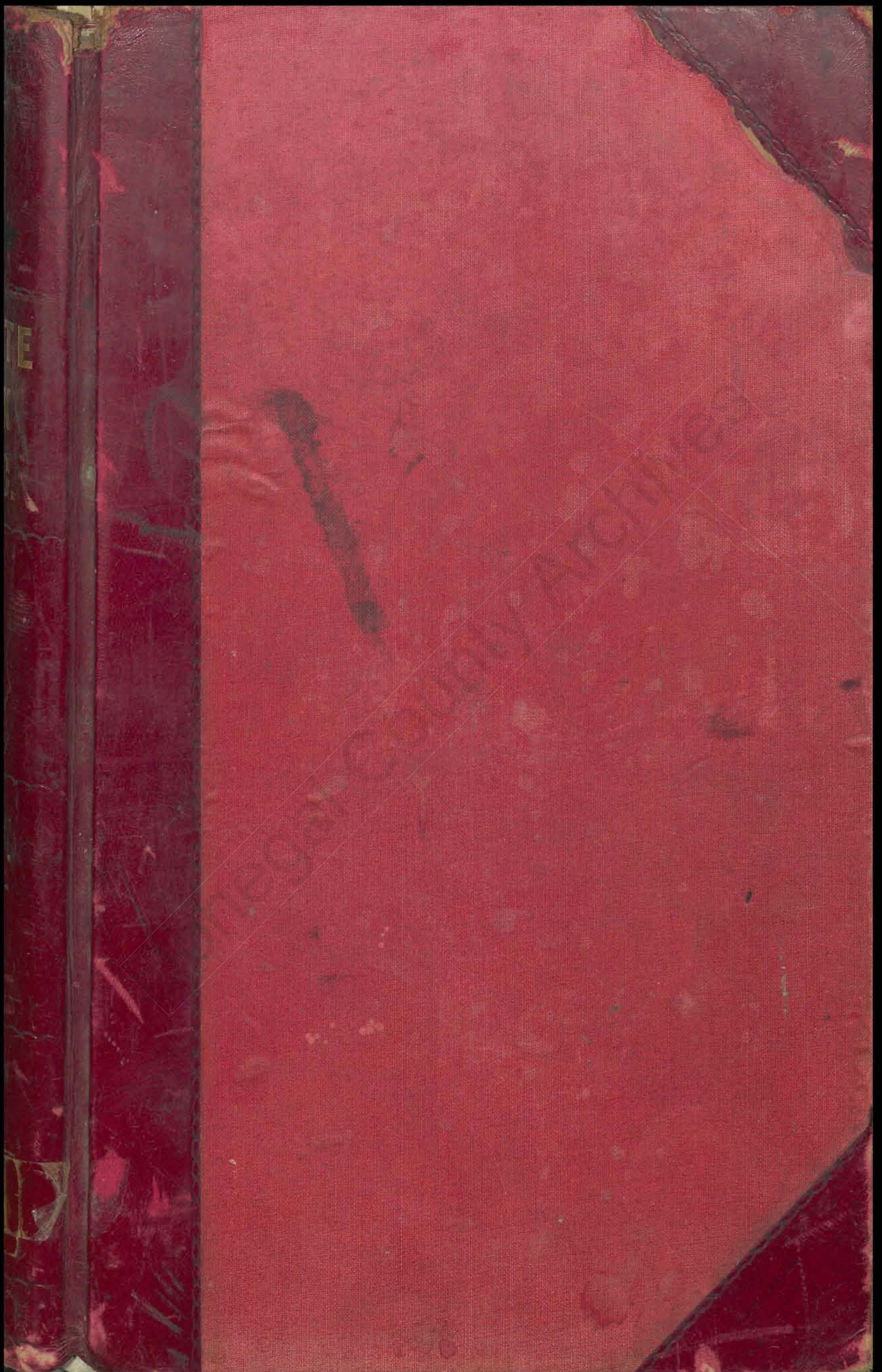

Sudden Damage.

"We direct that the following rules shall

any public work he shall immediately
inspect the same and if in his opinion
the damage is such that comes within
the said section of the said act
he shall without delay send notice
with particulars of each breach on the
clerk of the district Council and said
clerk shall bring the matter before the
first meeting of the district Council
held thereafter. The said district Council
shall make such order thereon as
may be deemed advisable.

If said damage is such that the
public safety would be imperilled by
delaying the repair of same until the
above rule is carried out the County
surveyor or in his absence the assistant
surveyor should cause such temporary

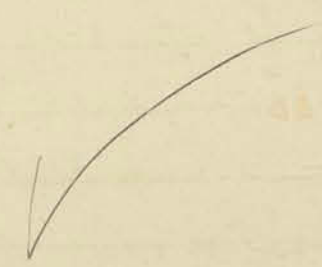

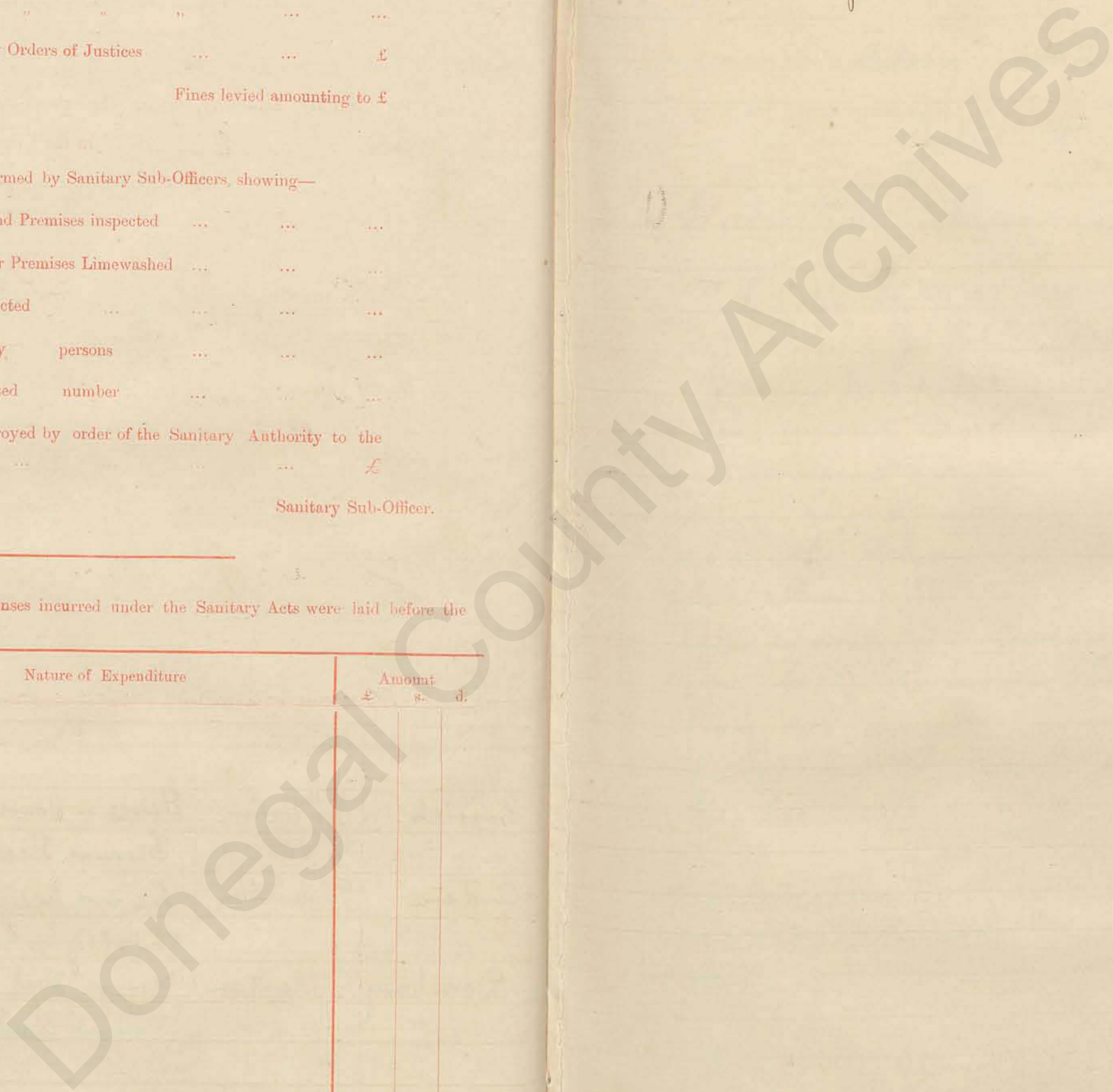

No 26.331 dated 23rd May 1900

I am directed by the Local Govt Board for Ireland to state for the information of the Rural District Council that it has come under their notice that in some instances persons without available means have been accepted by District Councils as sureties for contractors for public works, and that in other cases persons have been allowed to become security for one or more contractors for amounts which individually or in the aggregate are far in excess of the realizable property. As a consequence important public works have had to be abandoned or postponed to the inconvenience and loss of the public owing to the default both of contractors and sureties. In one case it was shown that the occupier of a holding of the annual rateable value of £7 was interested either as contractor or surety in twelve different contracts and had entered into bonds representing a total liability of nearly £500.

In reference to this matter the Board desire to call the attention of the Rural District Council to the terms of Article 18 (2) of the Local Government (Procedure of Councils) Order, 1899, from which the Council will observe that they are prohibited from accepting any tender received in respect of a proposal formulated by them, unless the person tendering appears and satisfies the Council of the sufficiency of the guarantor and of his willingness to give the guarantee. The Board trust that the provisions of this

Article will be carefully borne in mind and that the Rural District Council will exercise the needful precautions to ensure that only such sureties are accepted as satisfy the Council of their ability to comply with the conditions of their bond in the event of the contractor for whom they give security becoming a defaulter.

In accordance with notice of Motion duly given John Gildea D.L. moved that the Glenties Rural District Council beg to protest against the Quarterly scale of payments to contractors at present carried out by the Donegal County Council and their officers and that we instead, the Glenties Rural District Council propose for their consideration two half yearly payments

No 697 was modified by changing it to 50 tons broken stone for L.H. O.D.

No 641 was first rejected by the unanimous voice of the Board. The Council upon discussing the importance of the several roads standing in the name of James Dr. Boyle decided upon giving them No 641 although previously thrown out. Colonel Hamilton proposed and John O'Connor seconded that No 641 be granted although previously thrown out. Major Johnstone proposed as an amendment that the Council adhere to their former decision regarding No 641 but his amendment not finding a seconder the Council adopted the proposition of Hamilton.
