In accordance with the notice appearing on the Agenda the Council had again under their consideration the Local Govt Board letter No. 8671/106 dated 22nd June 1910 when the following reply was submitted by F. G. Townsend Architect relative to the circumstances under which he gave a certificate to P. Kennedy without personally inspecting the works.
"My explanation of Kennedy's Certificate of May 4th for £26. 9. 2 is as follows. On a previous visit of March 25th I pointed out to Kennedy and to the Local District Councillors certain matters which required attention. I received a letter dated 6th April from Kennedy stating that the cottages were complete - I accordingly went specially to Burtonport and found that Kennedy had not completely carried out my orders. The next occurrence was that just before the May meeting of the Council I received a letter from Kennedy begging for some money enclosing a certificate from the Local Councillors to the effect that the work pointed out by me had been done. As Kennedy's contract amounted to £551 and as out of this he had only received £438 I saw no harm in issuing a small certificate on ac for £26 as there was still left a sufficient sum in hands to do the work four times over. I explained the circumstances in a letter accompanying certificate dated May 6 to the Council under which I issued the certificate leaving it to them to allow the certificate to go through if they thought fit. They did not think fit and the certificate was not issued. I was unable to go to Burtonport at the time. The journey occupies at least two days. If I have done wrong I beg to tender my apologies to the Board. F. G. Townsend"
