SIR,

The Local Government Board for Ireland have had before them previous correspondence, respecting the proposal of the Glenties Rural District Council to let to persons other than agricultural labourers two untenanted cottages and plots provided in 1908 under the Labourers' Acts at Rosbeg, neither of which has since been let to an agricultural labourer.

In their letter of the 10th November, 1911, the Board pointed out that under Section 8 of the Labourers' Act, 1906, before a labourers' cottage with plot can be let as proposed it must be shown that it cannot with advantage be used for the purposes of the Labourers' Acts, and that the Board before issuing an Order enabling the Council to make such a letting must be satisfied that the purpose for which the cottage is to be let would be beneficial to the inhabitants of the district.

In connection with the recent Local Inquiry held by their Inspector, Mr. Hannigan, into the last Improvement Scheme made by the Council, the Board instructed him to furnish a report respecting these two cottages and the report in question has now been received. Referring to one of the cottages, that occupied by a non-agricultural labourer for some months in 1911 and which formed the subject of previous correspondence, Mr. Hannigan observes:—

"I found free access to this cottage through an open door at rear, which the late occupier, Colonel Hamilton, had temporarily put in during his tenancy. It was fixed in underneath window on removal of wall; there is no lock or security of any kind and the house is exposed to every itinerant passer-by who has easy access thereto with the result that it is already being speedily dilapidated. Some panes of glass are broken in windows, the crane is pulled off fixture in chimney, the floors are damp and neglected; and outside the offices are in full accord with the cottage."

The condition of the other Labourers' Cottage is, it appears, better than the cottage just referred to, but the Inspector noticed on the occasion of his visit that there were no shutters to the windows, or shelves in the pantry, or crane in the fireplace, and that the privy door was off its hinges. This cottage was built in pursuance of a representation made on behalf of a man named Patrick Fisher now deceased, who lived in a house condemned as unfit for human habitation, and his widow and family still continue to reside in the condemned house in which the Inspector mentions, her husband and three members of the family died of consumption. Mr. Hannigan, having interviewed this woman who is an agricultural labourer within the Acts, states that she would be willing to become tenant of the labourers' cottage in question, but that she would be quite unable to pay the rent at present fixed by the Council.

The Inspector reports that he also visited another existing dwelling in the district occupied by a woman (who also seems to be an agricultural labourer) and her niece, and he describes it as a wretched hovel on the wayside having practically only one room, dark and ill-ventilated, with damp clay floor, and that the walls are simply mud covered with sods. He adds that the house on his visit was reeking with soot and smoke.

There are it is presumed other cases of unfit houses at present occupied, within a limited radius of Rosbeg, and as it is the duty of the District Council, who are the Sanitary Authority of the District, to take steps as far as possible, with a view of diminishing the number of unsanitary dwellings in their district, the Board do not see how it could be contended that the two untenanted labourers' cottages at Rosbeg, "cannot with advantage be used for the purposes of the Labourers' Acts," the condition precedent for the cottages being legally used for any other purpose.

So far as the Board are concerned, having regard to the exceptional circumstances relating to the Rosbeg district they would be willing to sanction an alteration, after compliance with the requisite preliminaries, in the present Letting Regulations of Cottages, whereby the rent of the two labourers' cottages in question would be let at a considerably reduced rent—say 8d or 9d a week—which would induce suitable applicants now living in unsanitary houses to become tenants and so that their existing dwellings might be demolished. Such action would result in a financial gain to the ratepayers, as the longer cottages remain untenanted they will obviously fall into greater dilapidation and eventually become unfit for habitation.

The Board request that you will forward, without delay, a copy of this communication to each Member of the Council, and that the matter may be considered by them at their next Meeting.
