

Read letter from Mr John Tracy, Solicitor, Derry, dated 28th July 1924 relative to the Order of the Council on 14th July to the effect that, as the result of a complaint by Mr Robert Toland if the goats belonging to Mr Tracy's client, Miss Hannah McFarvey, is not banished notice to quit will be served because of the trespass by the Goat and consequent breach of the Letting Regulations, and stating before taking action should give Miss McFarvey an opportunity for explanation.

Read further letter from Mr Robert Toland, The Green, Killybegs, Derry, dated 28/8/24, complaining that Miss McFarvey's goats have been again trespassing. He had captured one of them and advertised for the owner, but she did not come to claim it.

Read report from Mr John Kitson, Rent Collector, dated 8th August 1924, stating that Hannah McFarvey occupies cottage No 10, Altharadeery, of which her brother Henry McFarvey (not in occupation) is the tenant.

Ordered that Mr Tracy be informed his client has no standing and that notices to quit be served both on Hannah McFarvey and her brother.

With reference to the Scaffolding of the Labourers Cottages at Castlethorpe, Carrigans, referred to the Rent collector at the Council meeting on 14th July.

Read letters from Mr J Kitson dated 8th Aug 1924, and 7th July 1924, stating a drain can be made, as far as he can see, without going outside the Council's property, but it is a matter for an engineer. The late Derry No 2 Rd. Council used to employ the assistant Surveyor & Mr Kitson would recommend this course.

Ordered that Mr Kelly, asst Surveyor, be employed to prepare Specification and supervise work @ fee of £1-1-0. Sunders, on receipt of Specification, to be invited by the Clerk for

Consideration at next succeeding meeting available.

Read report from Mr John Kitson, Burnfoot, Rent Collector, stating floor of a room in Rebecca Burnside's Cottage, No 181 Burnside, is defective, joists are rotten and floor falling in.

Ordered that Mr Kitson be asked to obtain an estimate from a competent tradesman and to furnish further report as to cause and when it first became known the floor was defective.

Read letter from Mr J Kitson, Rent Collector, Burnfoot dated 29th August 1924 stating that some of the cottage tenants in his district are behind with their rents especially James Craig, No 114a. This man has a wife and family and has not done more than three months work in the year and if put out we would lose all

Ordered to press for payment so as to keep down the arrears.

Read further letter from Mr J Kitson, dated 4th Sept 1924, reporting that the joists in one of the bedrooms of the cottage occupied by Joseph Campbell, Burnfoot, No 48, are rotten & part of the floor fallen in. The rear of the house is flooded by water from the adjoining cottage and would require a drain made through Campbell's plot to carry off the surface & other water. In its present state it is dangerous to health.

Ordered that Mr Kitson get a detailed estimate for floor and drain.

Read Circular letter from the Secretary, Lisconail County Council dated 8th September 1924 from which it appeared the Half-yearly meeting of Inishowen R.D. Council is fixed for 3rd November 1924, 6th October 1924 being the last day for lodging applications.

Read letter from the Secretary County Council of Lisconail dated 2nd October 1924, 1090, stating the Commissioners of Public Works have paid a sum of £215-4-6 to Lisconail County Council in full discharge and final satisfaction of all claims incidental to, or arising out of the use of, or interference with the workhouse premises at Carndonagh by the Military of the Free State during the period of occupation, and the County Council have decided to accept the above amount.

Read letter from Mr P J McGoldrick J.P., Buneraua, dated 17th Sept 1924 acknowledging receipt of the Council's resolution of 8th September expressing protest against the reduction of old age Pensions, and stating he agreed with its terms.

The following Letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland, and others, were read by the Clerk, and directions given to answer them, respectively, to the following effect (or Orders made on them, respectively, as follows:—

~~Read title~~ A Resolution passed by the Standing Committee of Sinn Féin at its meeting on 22nd September 1922 protesting against the reported exhumation of the remains of Republican soldiers was submitted.

Consideration adjourned for three months.

On the motion of the Chairman, Mr P. Quigley, seconded by Mr. Beed & Browne, it was unanimously resolved to employ Mr Patrick Grant, the Porter of Lonsdownagh District Hospital to keep the Boardroom, the Stairs, and the Registry Office clean and to light the fires in Boardroom and Registry Office at remuneration at the rate of £3. per annum.

(Sanction requested - The Council at their meeting of 14th April 1924 voted a similar remuneration to the former porter. Mr N. J. O'Sherty, he declined the offer ^{and discontinued} performing the work since when no one has been in charge of fires or ^{sweeping}).

A claim for £300 compensation for House, Office House and stable alleged to have been maliciously burned at Magherabeg, Fahan, on 13th or 14th September 1924 was submitted on behalf of Mary Ann Bonner, 1 Creggan Road, Derry for hearing at Lifford Circuit Court on 9th Dec.

Also submitted, a claim for £50 compensation on behalf of John McElloway, Breeslaughtkeel, Fahan for a house alleged to have been maliciously tumbled on 5th Oct 1924 for hearing at Lifford on 9th Dec.

Ordered that Council's solicitor be instructed to oppose

On the motion of the Chairman, seconded by Mr Edward Smith, it was unanimously resolved to request the sanction of the Minister of Local Government to the holding of the November

monthly finance meeting on the date of the Half-Yearly meeting, 3rd November, instead of on 10th November, this being the usual practice followed in order to obviate the necessity of an additional attendance of councillors.

(Sanction requested - Reference to previous similar Sanctions - 939871/1923 of 9 Oct 1923; and telegram of 5th May 1924)



Ordered, on the motion of Mr Cole seconded by Mr Gallagher, that the seal of the Council be affixed.

Read letter from the Clerk of Buncrana Urban Council dated 8th Sept 1924 forwarding payment order £ 60 = 9 = 11, that Council's proportion of Cottage Loan Instalments due 1st June 1924.

Relative to the entry on Minutes of 5th May 1924 —
Read letter from Messrs H. C. O'Doherty Son, Solicitors, Derry dated 10th Sept 1924 threatening to serve writ on the Council for flooding of the lands of Mr John Sweeney, Inverness, Insh, through defective drain at Labourers Cottages.

The Clerk stated he had sent a copy of the letter to Messrs Bryce and Gallagher, local Councillors with a request to view the place and report and had also written Messrs H. C. O'Doherty Son to stay proceedings. The recommendations of Councillors Bryce and Gallagher having now been considered.

It was unanimously resolved on the motion of Mr Bryce, seconded by Mr Gallagher, to take the following steps in the matter and to write Messrs H. C. O'Doherty Son accordingly; viz., that to remove the pipes, as Complainant suggested, would not stop the flooding as the ground which

is gravelly would slide in where the banks are high and to prevent this the faces would require to be picked and it would be a very expensive job. That the late Mr Sweeney ^(uncle of present complainant) when a District Councillor, got the ^{late} Derry No 2 Council to lay these pipes and the work proved satisfactory for years. Consequently the Council wish to give it another trial for a year, Mr Boyce & Mr Gallagher to be appointed a Committee to have the County road pipe scoured and to arrange for the payment of a man to keep this tail drain open and the grotto free from obstruction.

With reference to the order of the Council on 8th September employing Mr P.J. Kelly C.E. to prepare Specification & estimate supervise work in connection with the rectification of defective sewerage at Labourers Cottages Nos 133 to 138, Castlethrid, Complainant about by the M.O.H., Mr Kelly returned the order sent him saying he would not act at the fee (£1-1-0) offered.

On the motion of Mr Alexander seconded by Mr Gallagher (two former members of the late Derry No 2 R.D.C.) it was ^{unanimously} resolved to appoint Councillors Alexander and Rankin as a Committee to arrange for a man locally to clean out the sewers as was done previously by the late Council, the employment of an engineer being unnecessary.

Mr John Nelson, Rent Collector, in letters dated 30th ^{Sept} and 10th Oct 1924 reported a lot of ceiling off the kitchen at 129 Tonagh (John Magee occupies) at ^{Cottages}

also four square feet of ceiling fallen in kitchen of John Craig (Cottages 40107, Mosses)

That, at the time of general renovation there was ^{no} ^{about} ^{word} defects in floors at Campbell's & Burnsides Cottages Nos 48 & 181 reported to meeting last month. He has asked local carpenters for estimates and directed but has not

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yet received them

Ordered that Mr Kilson also obtain estimates from local tradesmen for repair of ceilings in Cottages 129 & 107.

Read letters from Mr John Kilson dated 30th September, 3rd October, and 6th October 1921 stating he had served notices to quit on both Henry McFarvey and his sister Hannah McFarvey at for possession of the Cottage No. 10 Altaghaderry as directed last month; stating Henry, the tenant, had relinquished the tenancy; but Hannah refused to give up possession; asking directions as to a summons against Hannah, who he said had been a good tenant, rent payer and willing to become regularly the tenant under agreement; and stating persons were looked for for this cottage who were not labourers.

The Clerk states in view of the order given for the service of notices to quit last month, he had issued notices inviting applications from labourers for the tenancy.

Read further letter from same, dated 22/12/24 stating that notice of appeal has been served in this case for hearing at next sitting of the Circuit Court.

The letting agreement of Daniel Frizzell for Cottage No 45, Currowish, and that of Mrs Mary McFleeway for £65, Ballynally, were submitted duly signed and witnessed by Mr Patrick Doherty, Rent Collector, the Sureties being Patrick McFormack of Fardrum and James B Montgomery of Ballynally.

The Clerk stated that on 27th April 1925 Mr F. A. S. King, L. G. Insp. informed him he had been directed to report on the proposed acquisition by the Council of the disused Coastguard Station at Greencastle for a housing scheme, and suggested it would be well for some one to accompany him on behalf of the Council. He asked Mr McLaughlin to do so in order to get definite information for the Council, which he did, and put in an account for £2.2.0 for examining and reporting.

Mr McLaughlin's report stated:-

"As requested I have examined the Greencastle Coastguard Station in company with the L. G. Inspector and report as follows:- There are seven houses, each consisting of five apartments, in good order, each house has a garden of about one rod, and two out-offices attached. These houses are at present being washed and painted and repaired generally by the Board of Works and considerable expense will be incurred. I am informed that the ground rent amounts to about £55 per year, this added to taxes, insurance &c. would make the premises very expensive. Under such circumstances these houses could not be profitably let for less than £10 or £12 per year which would not be an attractive rent for a labourer. Consequently I would recommend the Council not to have anything to do with the scheme at present as the undertaking would likely become a burden on the Ratepayers."

Respectfully Yours, A. W. McLaughlin, Curran Donagh, 14th April 1925
It was decided to proceed no further in the matter, as the rent would be too high for labourers to pay.

Read letter from Mr Jas E. O'Donnell, the Council's solicitor, dated 25th March 1925, stating that the appeal in the case of the Council v. McFarney, Labourers Cottages No 10, Apsaltery, was heard at the Circuit Court at Lifford on 24th March, and dismissed. The order for possession was confirmed with a stay of execution till 1st Sept. next, tenant to pay the rent in the meantime.

Read further letter from Mr Jas E. O'Donnell, dated 25th March 1925, with reference to the case of the Council v. Vincent Burns, stating he had written to Burns to give up possession and pay the rent, and was enquiring re the decree obtained at Moyville District Court on 11th March 1924. Meantime it would be well to know whether the tenants' mother is fit to be removed.

Mr Doherty, the rent collector, said the ambulance and a nurse would be required.

The tender of James O'Kane of Meedinstane, Three Trees, Tull to repair two cottages (6 TD.) at Three Trees, supplying and fitting 11 slates and 2 18' rafters also pointing slates, cleaning 'spouting', and repairing door for £3-5-0, was accepted, the work to be examined and account certified by the Committee, Messrs McLoor, Bradley and Huey appointed at last meeting.

Read letter from Mr Wm O'Donnell, rate collector, Lisdowney, dated 24th March 1925, applying for payment of rates for year to 31/3/25 on the Labourers Cottages occupied by Hannah ^{McFarney} Andrew Dorrain, Robert McFarney and James Gibland and stating that he had called several times without success.

Ordered that notices to quit be served if the rates are not paid.

Read letter from Mr McFarney complaining of the tenant of cottage ^{No 10} at Castlecooley, Park, that the ditch has been cut away and no protection left to prevent trespass of foot

and fowls.

Ordered - Serve notice on the tenant James McGrath.

Read letter from John McQuaid, tenant of labourers cottage in Bullocht, dated 2nd April 1925, complaining that the tenant of the adjoining cottage has turned the surface water on to his street, and he will pay no more rent until the matter is remedied.

Ordered that Mr McBlaney, the rent collector, inspect the place and warn the offender.

Read letter from Mr John Kitson, rent collector, Burtinfort, dated 26/3/25 reporting that James Lynch left cottage No 109, Glack, Ineh, on 21st March 1925.

Referring to the entry on minutes of 6th April 1925, an account for £2-2-0, from Mr A. W. McLaughlin, B.E., for his report on the adaptability of Greenock Coastguard Station for purposes of Labourers Cottages, was submitted, and payment ordered
(Sanction requested)

The proposal of John Hill, Carradonagh, to become tenant of Labourers Cottages No. 35, Kintoshier, vacant and duly advertised in the district, was accepted. Surety Thomas McFool, Carlor Carradonagh.

Read letter from Mr John Katson, rent collector, Burnfoot, dated 30th April 1925, stating that being laid up with influenza, he is unable to lodge his rents at the usual time. That he has still some collections to make and can't say when he'll be able to go out again.

Read letter from Mr James E. O'Donnell, the Council's Solicitor dated 22nd April 1925 stating that he attended at Inverurie District Court on Monday 20th April 1925, and applied for warrant for possession of the cottage occupied by Vincent Burns, which was granted, & that the Clerk of the Court informed him that Burns had given up the cottage and handed the key to him.

A report to same effect, dated 23/4/25 was received from Mr Patrick Doherty, rent collector, who inquired if he may now give the key to John McFelloway, who was accepted by the Council to be tenant of Burns' cottage.

Read further letter from Mr O'Donnell, Council's Solicitor dated 30th April 1925, asking whether proceedings are to be taken against Vincent Burns for recovery of the rent due by him as he was told the man has no goods which could be captured on a decree. If proceedings are to be taken he'll issue process for the District Civil Bill Court at Carnarvon in June.

It was decided to apply to Burns for the rent and take proceedings if not paid.

Read letter from Mr Patrick Doherty, rent collector dated 2nd May 1925, stating that John McFelloway, who is to be tenant of Burns' cottage is anxious to get into the cottage but is afraid he would be liable for the arrears of rates and rent. It was decided to reply that he would not be liable for

The rent but the Council could say nothing about the rates.

Councillor McSheffrey said that Owens told him he would pay both rent and rates, and he was asked to see him and induce him to do so at once.

On the motion of Councillor Cole seconded by Councillor McSheffrey it was unanimously resolved to ask the Ministers for Local Government and Public Health to have all Labourers Cottages handed over to the ownership of the occupying tenants in the interests of the ratepayers as well as of the tenants.

With reference to the entry on minutes of 6th April 1925, Mr McSheffrey, rent collector, reported he had visited the Culcoort Cottages. The Council would need to do something by way of making a drain to carry off the water complained about by John McQuinn. The tenants are on bad terms.

On the motion of Councillor Cole seconded by Councillor McSheffrey, Councillor Neil O'Leary was deputed to bring the tenants to terms and authorised to incur an expenditure not exceeding £1.10.0 in having the necessary drain made.

The Clerk submitted the bond of Mr Wm Grant, ^{continued employment} ^{of appointment} (whose name as rent collector is recorded above) duly signed by him and his sureties, Messrs John O'Leary Ballyhallon, and John McQuinn Effehmore, Clonmany. Ordered that Warrant of attorney be dispensed with, pursuant to L.G.B. circular No 106^m of 10 July 1913.

Tuberculosis Prevention (Ireland) Act, 1908, Part I

and the Sanitary Staff should be instructed accordingly and supplies of the prescribed notification Certificates obtained for distribution to Medical Practitioners. It was also suggested that notices of the requirement of notification should be given by the Sanitary Authority to the Medical Profession and the Public by press advertisement and such other means as the Council consider advisable.

Keepers of Common Lodging Houses should also be notified of the amended provisions relating to them.

The question of advertising was discussed and it was agreed that it would be cheaper to allow the Board of Health, as the Council's successors, to publish an advert. relating to the whole County.

Read letter from the Ministry of Local Government & Pub. Health dated 16th May 1925 (P.H. 23759/25, unknown R.D) stating that the appointment of a caretaker for Newbourn Canningham well is a matter for the Council's decision on their own responsibility.

The Clerk submitted a statement signed by Wm Griffin, the new caretaker, setting forth his duties.

Read letter from the Secretary Dept of Posts & Telegraphs, Dublin dated 20th May 1925 (T. 7358/25) stating in reply to the Council's resolution of 14th May 1925 that in the circumstances detailed in their letter of 20th Sept 1924, the determination of the agreement before the due date of expiry cannot be agreed to in connection with the guarantee for Cullkenny Telegraphs.

On the motion of Councillor Cole, seconded by Councillor McSheffrey, it was decided to leave the claim over to be dealt with by the County Board of Health.

Read Report from Mr R Marnes, Dist. Inspector dated 1st June 1925, stating "During the past month I inspected 12 premises. Improvements and repairs ordered by me on previous inspections have been in most cases carried out. Directions re a plentiful application of limewash for the Summer were given."

Read Report from Dr O'Sullivan, M.O.H. Carndonagh, dated 6th June 1925, stating "It has been reported to me that the public well at the back of the Barracks Hill requires cleaning, and I recommend that it be cleaned out and limewashed, and while on this matter I beg to report that the whole water supply of the town of Carndonagh is in a most shocking condition, and, as I have already said a disgrace to a civilised community. If the present warm weather continues the wells will be all dried up and the mercy of God only can save the town from disease."

Ordered that a man be employed at £1 to clean all the wells immediately, and that the general question of a water supply for Carndonagh be left over for the Board of Health.

Half-yearly Report Form (III) Public Health, from the Medical Officer of Brounle Dispensary District for the Half-year ended 31st March 1925, was laid before the Council and contained nothing calling for action.
