Read Circular from the Secretaries Limerick Industrial Assocⁿ dated 8th Oct. 1907, requesting the Council to appoint 2 delegates to the Third Annual Industrial Conference at Limerick. — No action.

Councillor Diver moved, Councillor O'Neil second, and it was Resolved — "That we the members of the Inishowen Rural District Council join in the demand for the institution of a complete and searching Public Inquiry into all the circumstances connected with the Glenageary bomb explosion with a view to the detection of the perpetrators of the outrage as we are of the opinion that the Ashtown explosion was inspired by the party in Ireland whose whole record has been a systematic and malignant vendetta of manufactured outrages and conspiracy for the purpose of defaming the character of the Irish People, and we condemn the high-handed action and biased conduct of County Court Judge Fitzgerald during the hearing of the Ashtown case, as we believe such judicial arrogance only degraded our public life and tends to destroy all confidence in the administration of justice, and we hereby call upon the Irish Executive to take cognisance of Judge Fitzgerald's disgraceful conduct."

Councillor Diver moved, pursuant to notice, Councillor O'Neil second, and it was Resolved — That each District Councillor be requested to furnish a short written report of the state of the crops in his district for meeting to be held

on second Monday of October and that a copy of same be sent to the Chief Secretary, for Ireland, the Congested Districts Board, and Mr John B. Redmond, Chairman of the Irish Parliamentary Party, with a view to getting something done to aid the poor in each district who have lost heavily by the failure of the different crops.

Ten reports were received dealing with the Electoral Divisions of Ballyliffin, Durnaff, Desertegney, Phentaghs, Whitecastle, Moiville, Turmore, Gleneely, and Beldaff. Summarised, all are agreed that the oat crop is from a third to a half short of last year and in many districts owing to the wet weather it has not yet been sowed and has got badly injured in the stooks. The potato crop generally speaking is from one fourth to $\frac{1}{2}$ short of last year, varying from a fair crop on some good dry land to a half-yield on poor soil, and not worth digging on wet or mountainy land. In six reports turnips were stated to be a total failure, in two almost a total failure, in one a half average yield. Hay a light crop generally, from a fourth to a half under average. In many cases a poor crop and badly sowed. Flax a fair crop but very little sown, and that only in a few districts. In one case cabbage is described as bad, and pasturage no good for cattle, and several members voice the fear that the bulk of the turf will have to remain in the bog through the winter entailing bitter hardship on the poor. One report puts the crops generally as hardly half an average yield, & says if present wet weather continues & harvest not got sowed it will be a much worse year than 1879.

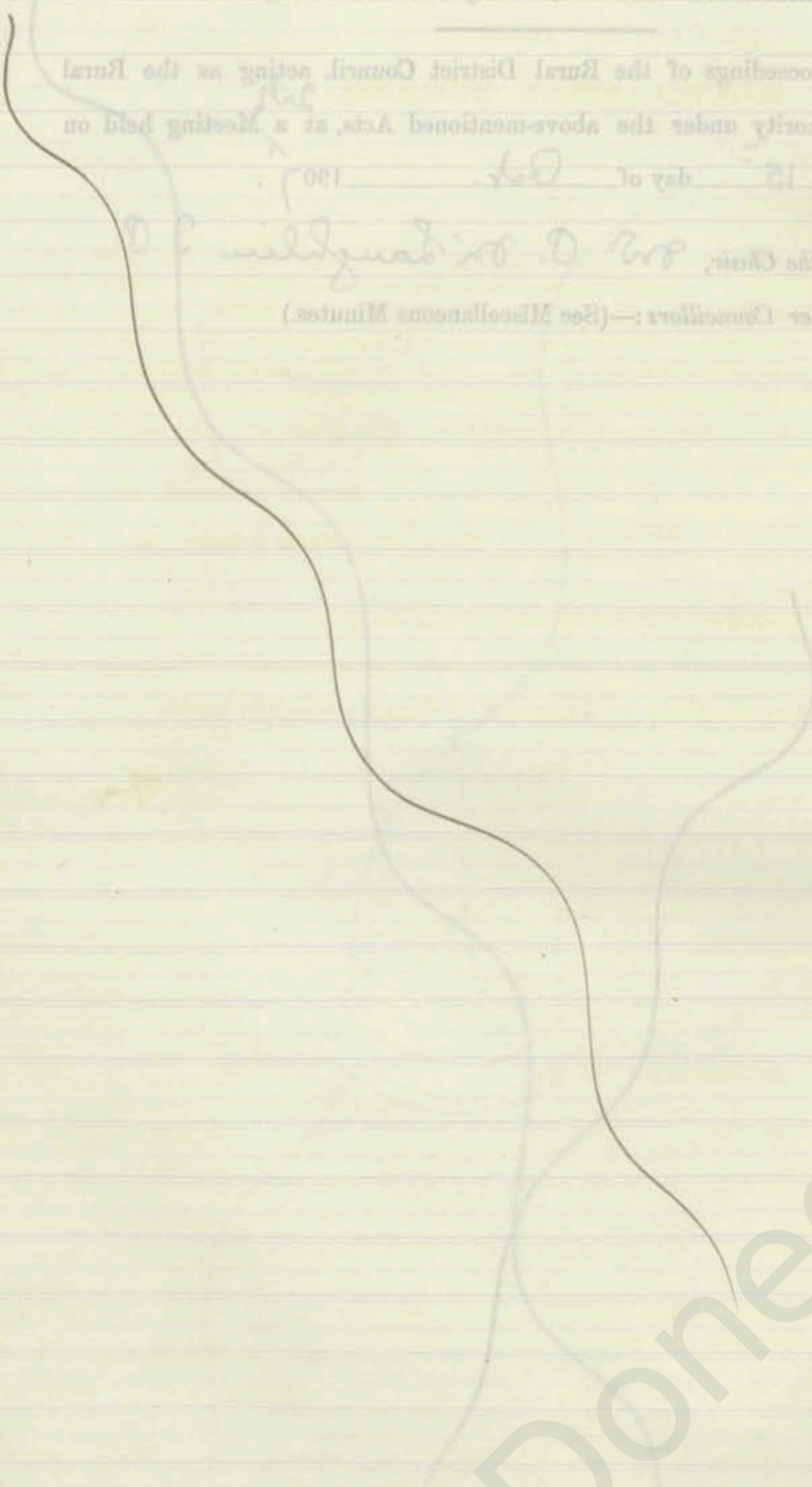

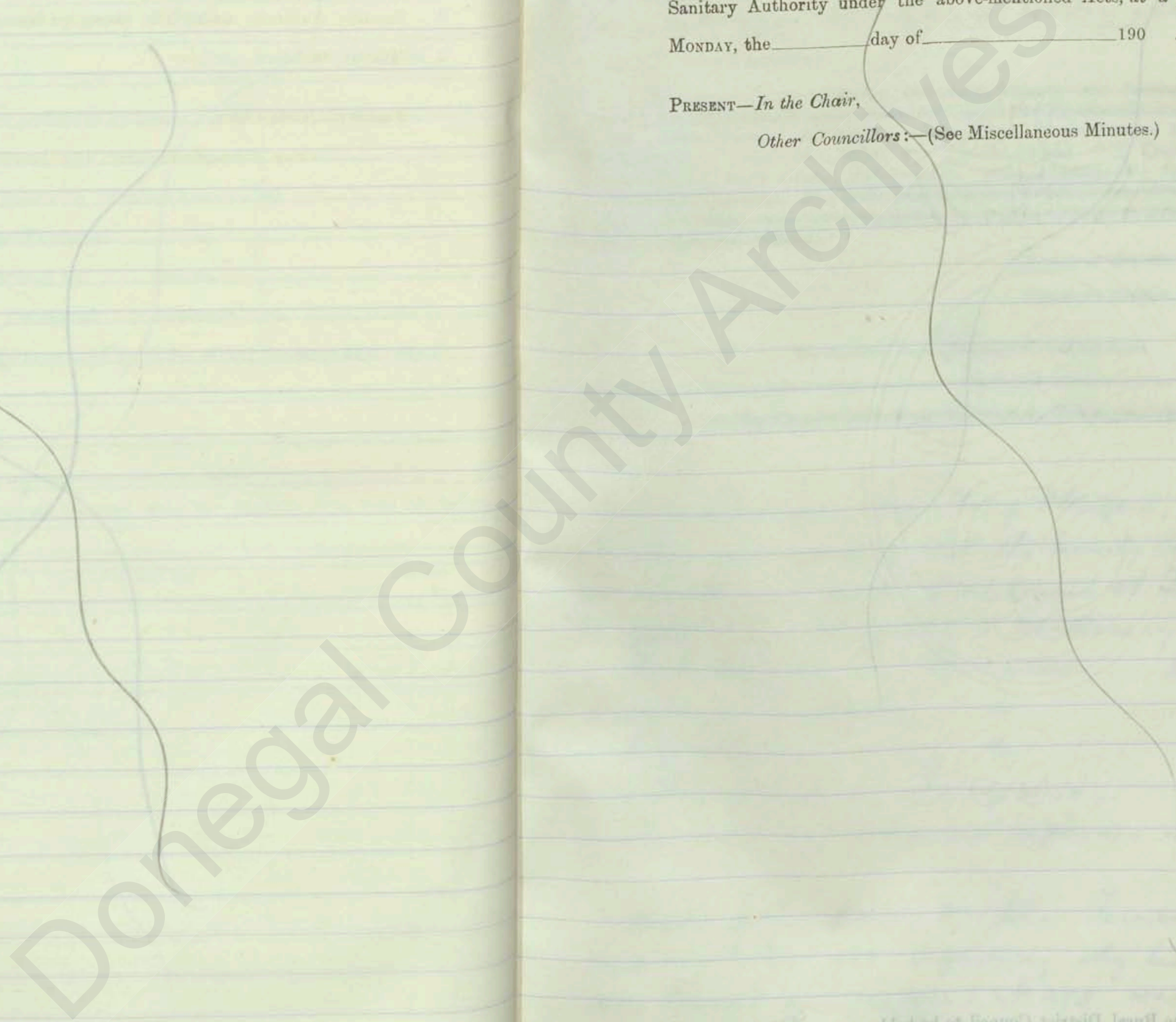

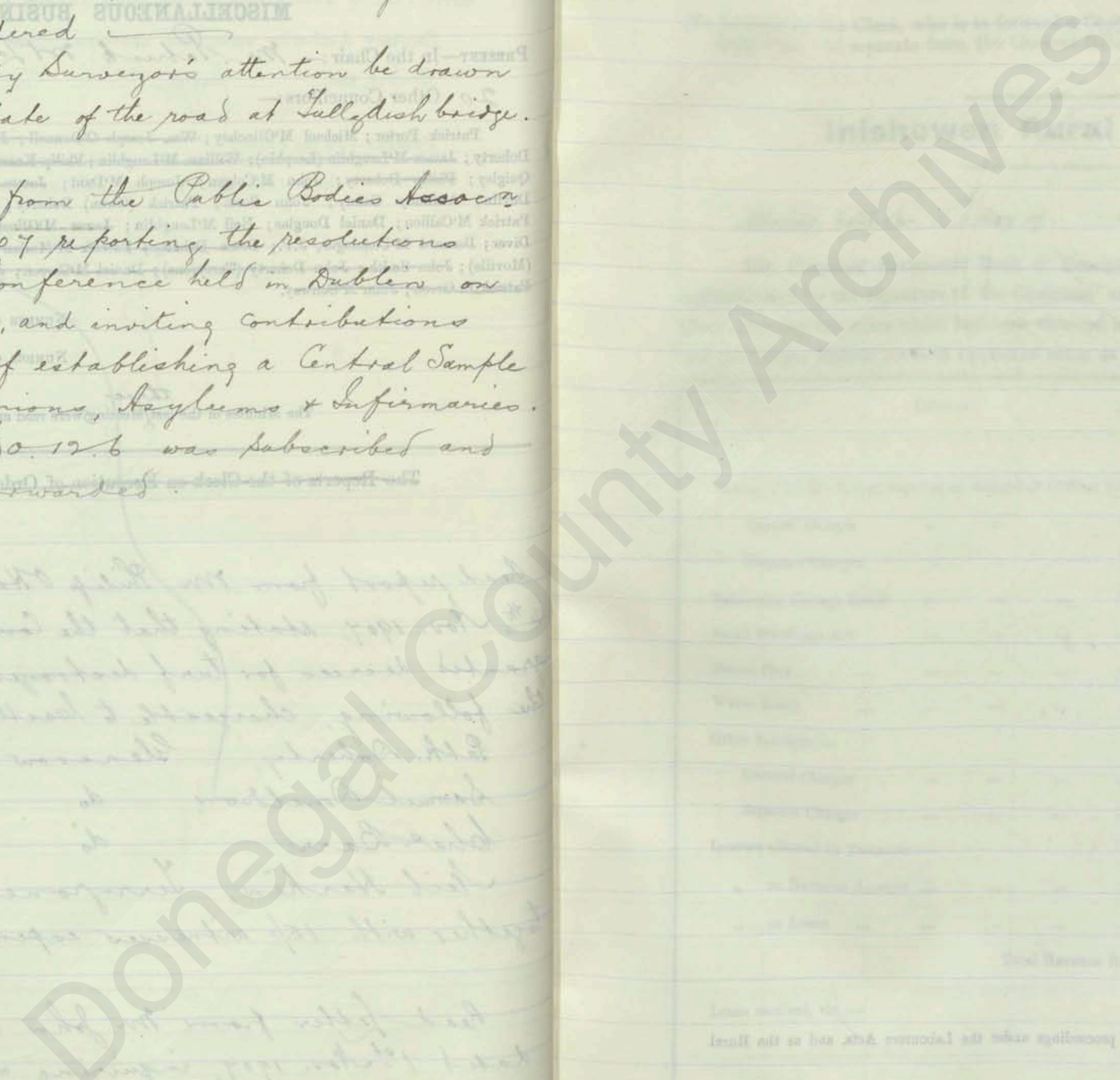

Prosecutions were ordered against Neal Doherty for failing to comply with notices to have yard cleaned & levelled so as to retain no stagnant water, and against John Kearney, Magheramore, for keeping a cow in his house, D. O'Malley to conduct the cases for the Council.

Read Circular Letter from the L.G. Board, dated 30th Oct. 1907, No. 127 M., forwarding a copy of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, & drawing special attention to the provisions of Part 4 of the Act relative to Infectious Disease, and suggesting that same might be adopted by the Sanitary Authority. It was decided to take no action at present.

Read Reports of Moyville Public Health Committee dated 18th Oct. and 5th Nov. 1907, stating

- (1) They had accepted Mrs. Treacy's tender to supply for Moyville street lighting, Lamp oil @ 7^d per gallon, Linch Chimneys @ 2/- per dozen, Duplex Chimneys @ 4/- per doz., Wicks @ 1/4 per bolt, & large round wicks @ 6 each.
- (2) That on the application of John Tracy, the lamplighter they had granted an increase of 1/- in his weekly wages, bringing him to 9/- per week.
- (3) That Mr. Nolan's plans for repairing the Moyville reservoir and constructing a by-pass at an estimated cost of £25 and £55 respectively were approved and recommended to the District Council to advertise for Tenders for carrying out the work, as soon as possible in separate sections.
- (4) That Mr. James McLaughlin had been appointed Secretary.

McLaughlin J.P. seconded by Councillor Scott, the report was adopted, and an advertisement ordered to be published inviting Tenders, same to be sent in to the Noville Public Health Committee on 25th inst. the Committee to consider them and accept a Tender, and have the work started as soon as possible.

Read Report from Carndonagh Public Health Committee, of meetings held on 6th and 9th Nov. 1907, stating (1) with reference to the proposed removal of the slaughter house in Neil Cannoy's yard that it will be sufficient to have the slaughter house kept in proper order and a short sewer made, & that Messrs. Mr. Donough and Jas. Banny are now willing to make the sewer.

(2) With reference to Dr. O'Sullivan's report recommending a proper water supply for Carndonagh, the Committee refer the Council to their report of 23rd May last on the subject.

(3) That a sub-committee inspected the alleged broken sewer beside Mrs. Hubert O'Donnell's house in Carndonagh, and recommended that an opening be made in the road & the sewer fixed, the Council to obtain the County Surveyor's permission for opening the road.

On the motion of Councillor Diver seconded by Councillor Parker, the report was adopted.

Read report from Dr. O'Sullivan, Carndonagh, recommending a short extension of the sewer on south side (rear) of Bridge Street, Carndonagh, to abate a nuisance caused by stagnant water in the yards of Daniel Doherty and W^m McKinney.

In same connection a Memorial was read from a number of residents in same street calling on the Council to prevent the discharge of the sewage of these yards into the river where they left the water for domestic use, and suggesting with this object a connection between the pipe at rear of Jas. R. Doherty's premises and the pipe on the front street at Mr. Binns's corner.

Ordered that both reports be referred to the Carndonagh Public Health Committee.

Read Report from Buncrana Public Health Committee, dated 4th Nov. 1907, requesting the Council to deal with the case of Mr. W^m Longwill for failing to comply with a notice served on him to connect the premises occupied by his tenant, P. McKinney, with the main sewer.

Doherty's backyard to the late John Gallagher's backyard in Bridge Street, and the Memorial in connection with same suggesting that a sewer should be made across Bridge Street to Mr. Cunniff's corner so as to carry the sewage from South side of the street and discharge it below the bridge, the Committee think that even all the sewage of Bridge Street is carried below the bridge, and it will be expensive to do that, the sewage of Chapel Street will still pollute the river, and it cannot easily be diverted as it is too far up to carry it below the bridge. Besides Chapel Street is badly in need of another sewer which would also need to empty into the river. This sewer has been kept back for a length of time owing to the objection having been made that it would pollute the water of the river. Considering everything the Committee believe that an effort should be made to have the town provided with a proper water supply. They have frequently stated the expense

of a water supply could not possibly be borne by the town people themselves. The taxable area must needs be enlarged. They would suggest that the L.G. Board should hold a sworn Inquiry and have the area determined. In this connection they would point out that according to Dr. O'Sullivan's report the supply of water to the Workhouse during the summer was neither good nor sufficient and they think that the question of having the Workhouse provided with a branch supply of pure water should come within the scope of the Inquiry.

Ordered that this report be not adopted and that Mr. F. Nolan C.E. be asked to report whether it would be practicable to divert the Chapel Street sewerage and carry it below the bridge at Bridge Street. That the Council are opposed to any enlargement of the area of charge for any water scheme for Carndonagh beyond the immediate area benefitted, and the resolution of 4th June 1907, is hereby endorsed, but they will undertake any water scheme the people of the town desire provided they agree to pay the cost same as has been done by the rate payers of Moville and Bunerana, and entirely independent of the Workhouse, which has now a good & sufficient supply.

D^r. Macfarthy, in his report, recommended that the Sanitary Sub-Officers be required to send in their Sanitary Diaries monthly for inspection, and that these Officers should be supplied with books of Notices to abate such nuisances as want of cleanliness, whitewashing, accumulation of manure &c. to be served forthwith when he discovers such a nuisance, and if not complied with then report to the Council.

He stated that there is no Inspector of Dairies &c. and no regulations adopted relating to the Conditions under which cattle or milk are kept, and no inspection of meat or milk. No byelaws in force in the District for any purpose of the Public Health Act. Common Lodging Houses neither registered nor regulated by byelaws, no disinfecting apparatus provided, and no Committee appointed to study the question of the prevention of Tuberculosis and the provision of a Sanatorium for the North West of Ireland. That the water supply of Carndonagh has been frequently reported on by the Medical Officer of Health and by himself (D^r. Macfarthy). The water is got from a few wells and from the river, at a point a little below where a couple of foul drains discharge. The water supply is quite inadequate for a town the size of Carndonagh. A supply of pure water for the town is urgently needed. A public well in Culdaff having been reported as in need of cleaning the Rural District Council made an order calling on the inhabitants of Culdaff to clean it themselves. The Sanitary Authority cannot thus evade their responsibility nor throw upon individuals that most important of their public duties the duty of providing each part of their District with pure water. A similar order was made

with reference to the well at Slievebane, which is subject to pollution and as to which he made a special report some years ago in connection with an outbreak of Typhoid Fever in the neighbourhood. The sewers of Carndonagh are most defective.

Ordered—

That D^r. Macfarthy's suggestions as to furnishing books of notices to abate nuisances to the S.B. Officers be adopted and these Officers required to produce their Diaries monthly for inspection; that a disinfecting apparatus is not necessary; and that the Infectious Diseases Act be not adopted; that as there are no common lodging houses in the District, byelaws are unnecessary; that no action be taken to appoint a Tuberculosis Committee pending the result of the conference between D^r. Bigger and the Guardians on 10th Feb. relative to Consumptive wards at the Workhouse; that the matters relating to Carndonagh Water Supply and Sewerage be referred to the local Public Health Committee the Council being willing to promote any schemes for improvement in these respects recommended by the Committee, always provided the area of charge be confined to the area benefited.

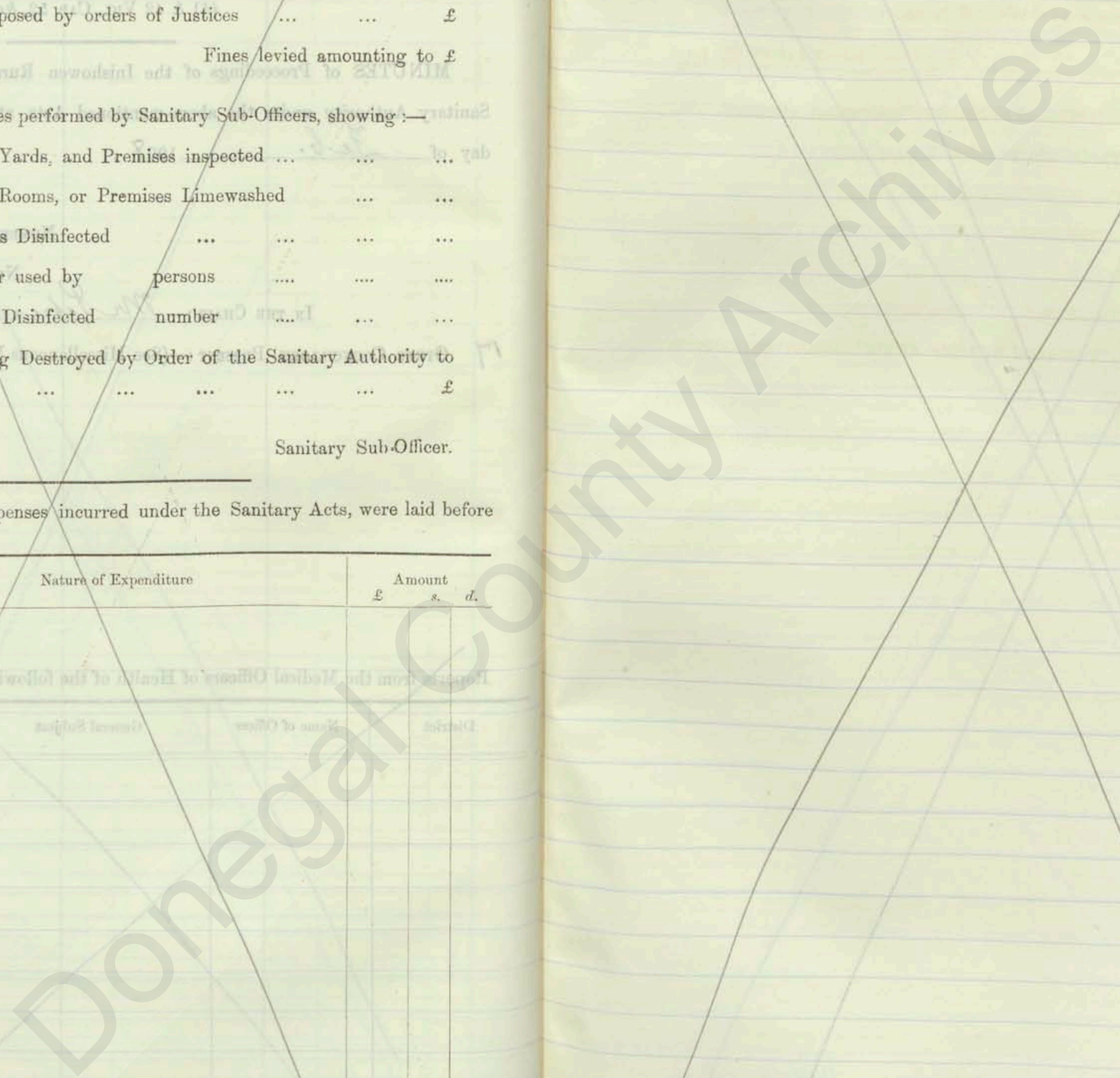

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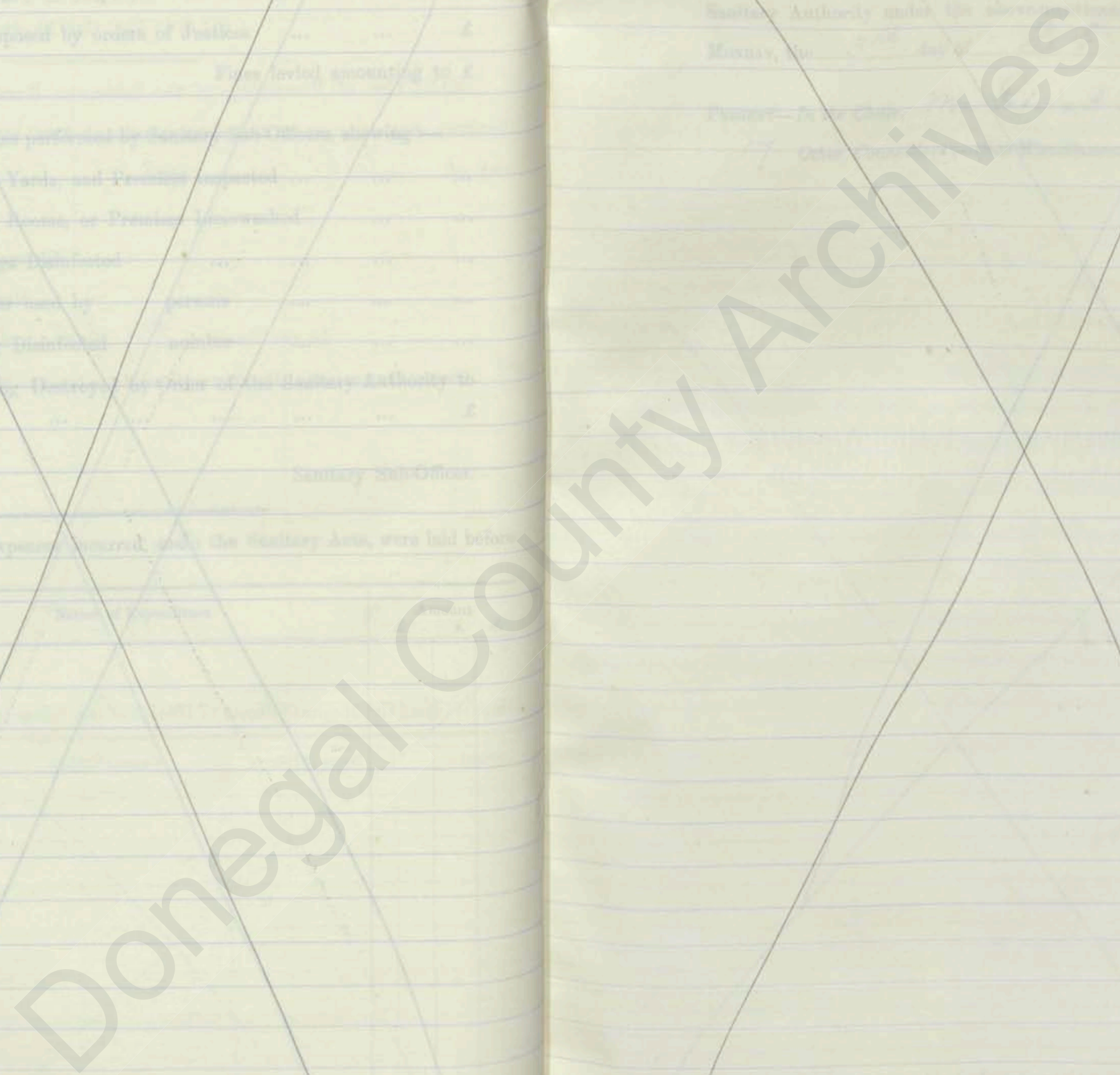

Read Letter from Mr. Foster Nolan B.E. dated 7th February 1908, reporting that he had carefully examined Chapel St. and Bridge St. Carndonagh, with a view to the prevention of the contamination of the river above the bridge by the discharge of all the sewage and surface water from those two streets and that he believed it could be effected by the construction of a main sewer from the North corner of the graveyard, and crossing Chapel St. Mr. Francis Harkin's garden, the Horse Basket & entering Bridge Street through Mr. Neal Doherty's gateway, continued across Bridge St. past the West Gable of the Shirt Factory, and discharging either into the Mill race or River thus catching all the sewage of these 2 streets with the exception of two premises. That there are no difficulties in the way which would make the cost abnormal and the scheme would be a step in the right direction towards improving the sanitary condition of Carndonagh.

Ordered that this Report be referred to the Carndonagh Public Health Committee.

On the Authorisation of Payments received from Buncrana Public Health Committee there were 2 items which the Committee desired to have paid out of the Sewerage loan viz. £28 to P. H. Brown for 2 ventilating shafts with revolving extractors for the main sewers at Buncrana (as per minute of 14 Oct. last) and £2.2.0 to Mr Thos. Johnston, the Engineer, for preparing Plans and supervising the work.

At the back of both houses is an open drain, which conveys the ooziings of the overflow from Mr. Tool's office houses and manure heap and water from this drain oozes into Rudden's house rendering it damp and unhealthy. He ordered Mr. Tool to build a wall between the drain and manure pit, and recommended the manure pits, in these and all other cases to be removed at least 20 yards from any part of a dwelling house. Ordered that a notice be served to have the S.O.'s recommendations carried out.

The circular letter of the L. G. Board, dated 25th Feb. 1908 No. 74 No. accompanying a copy of the Dairies, Cow Sheds and Milk Shops (Ireland) Order, 1908, was considered.

Read letter from L. G. Board, dated 28th March 1908 No. 15, 111 stating in reply to the Council's inquiry on the subject that as the full amount of recoupment made in the standard year is allowed at present in the Rural District, no recoupment can be made in additional sanitary schemes.

The following resolution of the Coleraine Rural District Council was unanimously adopted:—

On account of the repeated malicious injury claims from this locality, councillor McCarroll moved and councillor Philip Doherty seconded and it was resolved that the police authorities be requested to erect a hut on Bliqqan farm, and keep two constables always at the place to try and prevent any more damage.

Councillor Porter moved and Councillor John Kavanagh seconded that the Council revert to the practice of making a small charge for Tenders and Schedules same as a few years ago, and that only one schedule be sent to each Councillor.

Councillor Diver moved as an amendment and Councillor John D. Doherty, seconded that no charge be made.

It was pointed out that the Auditor had declared such charge to be illegal, and the motion was not pressed to a vote.

Read Letter from Mr H. C. Brothers Inspector of Factories, at Derry, dated 21st Dec. 1908, stating that Workshops at Buncrana occupied by Sinclair & Buchan and the Irish Fishing Co. are not provided with proper Sanitary accommodation for employees and that they have been served with notices to have the accommodation provided.

Read three reports from Buncrana Public Health Committee, dated 22nd & 23rd Dec. 1908, stating that (1) the sanitary arrangements referred to by Mr Brothers for fish curers at Buncrana are very much required and they urge the District Council to put all possible pressure on the employers concerned to make the necessary provision by jointly carrying out the works recommended.

(2) that the committee had again considered the question of supplementing the water supply of Buncrana. They cannot advise that any such extensive scheme involving a new Reservoir as was apparently contemplated by the L.G. Board Inspector on the occasion of the last public Inquiry be proceeded with in view of the increased rate which it would necessitate, and they feel that such an increase in the supply as is covered by the following resolution adopted by them will be sufficient to meet the town's requirements for many years to come:—

Resolution:—That the Buncrana Public Health Committee request the Derry District Council to authorise them to take the necessary steps for a contract to raise the bank of their water reservoir by three feet at expense not exceeding £300, cost of said works to be levied by three annual instalments on the contributory area for Buncrana Water Supply.

(3) that a letter had been received from Mr. Geo. Baldick and other frequent users of Ferris Lane stating that on dark nights, the railway bridge in that street is very dangerous and asking for a lamp. It was also stated by Members of Committee that a lamp is required in Park Avenue near the entrance to Father McMeamin's residence, and the Committee had Resolved:—That the Buncrana Electric Supply Company be asked to instal a 32 candle power lamp at both places on circuit with other public lamps at a cost not exceeding £2 per annum for each.

On the motion of Councillor Porter seconded by Councillor McGlenshey, the Report was adopted.

An Account for £3.5.0 furnished by Mr. John Mullin contractor for Buncrana Main Drainage Contract No. 2 (Outfall) for extra in connection with said contract was entered on the Buncrana Local Committee's Authorisation of Payments, & certified as due by the Engineer.

There being no tenders received for building 2 Cottages on plot 17 in Dristernan, or for 1 Cottage on plot 39 in Carrrowblack or Leckemy, after advertising on four different occasions and a letter having been read from Mr. James A. Fulton, Derry, who has already secured the contracts for 20 Cottages, stating that he had visited the sites at Dristernan and Carrrowblack & found that these 3 Cottages could not be built at the price allowed for them, viz £134 each, as the greater part of the material

material must be carted 6 miles, but if the Council could allow a little more for them he would put in a tender.

It was Resolved to request Mr. Nolan, the Engineer, to report on the practicability of cutting down the specification somewhat so as to make it possible to get these three houses built @ £134 each.

Read Letters from Mr. McCConnell, Moville, dated 11th Nov. 1908 &c, sending Declaration of Title and applying for payment of compensation awarded him, and stating that he will indemnify the Council for any loss by paying him now.

Also letters from Mr. O'Hagan, Sol^r dated 24th & 30th Dec. 1908, sending a letter of indemnity to be signed by Mr. McCConnell & given along with the signed Statutory Receipt in exchange for Paying Order.

Read letter from Mrs. Martha Anne Wilson of Ruthe, Montserrat, protesting against the proposal to require a site for a labourer's Cottage on her holding in Aughratubrid townland.

No. 3 Improvement Scheme

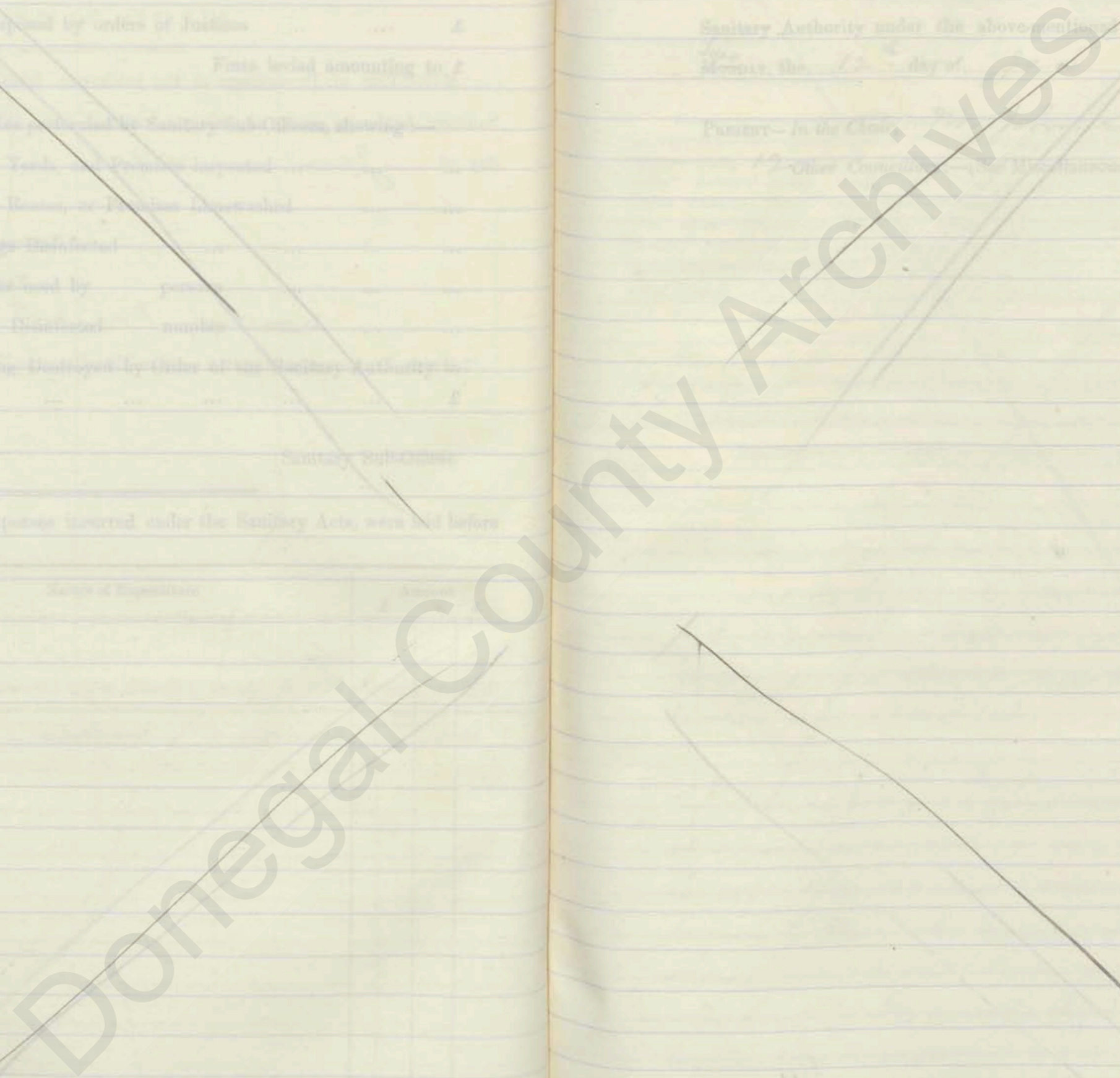

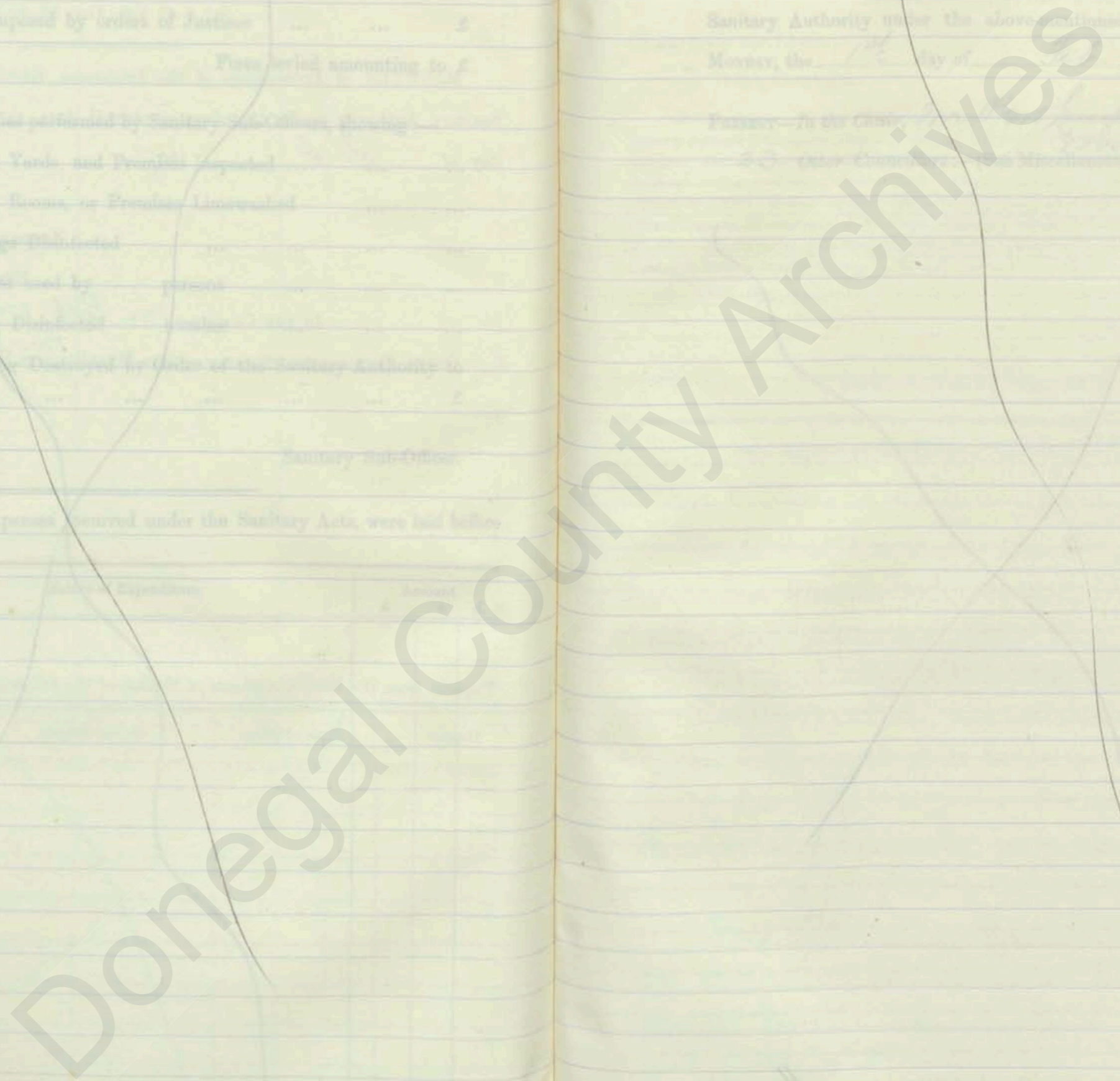

Read Letter from the L.G. Board, dated 3rd Feb. 1909, No 16663/1909, with reference to the order made by the Council on 11th Jan., on their letter of 11th Dec. last, and inquiring what action has since been taken regarding the water supply of Barndonagh, and pointing out that it is the duty of the Sanitary Authority to see that all parts of their District are supplied with pure water.

Ordered that the attention of the L.G. Board be drawn to the report of the Barndonagh Public Health Committee (set out further on).

Read Letter from the L.G. Board, dated 19th Jan. 1909, No 10711, forwarding copy of a communication they had received from the Department of Agriculture relating to the insanitary condition of a paddock and slaughterhouse off the Fair Green, Buncrana, and asking for an explanation from the Sanitary Sub-Officer concerning his failure to secure that the surroundings of the slaughter-house in question are kept in a sanitary condition.

Ordered that this letter & the accompanying communication be referred to Buncrana Public Health Committee, and the S.P.B. be asked to furnish the required explanation.

Read Circular Letter from the L.G. Board, dated 18th Jan. 1909, transmitting a copy of the Tuberculosis Prevention (Ireland) Act 1908, which comes into force on 1st July 1909.

Councillor McPuley called attention to the case of the nuisance at Mr. Jas. Balkin's premises in Turmore caused by the overflow sewage and surface water from the village of Ballymagaragh, and stated that the Council should take some action at once or they might have to incur very heavy law expenses.

After careful consideration of the matter, Councillor Scott

proposed, Councillor Ed. Kearney (M) seconded, and it was unanimously Resolved

That a deputation of the Council consisting of Councillors Mr. Mullins, Baranagh, & Dr. Bauley, be appointed to visit the place on Monday 15th inst. at ten a.m., and report to the Council as to the steps which should be taken to abate the nuisance.

Read Report of Buncrana Public Health Committee dated 6th Feb. 1909, forwarding the following resolutions unanimously adopted by the Committee.

(1) That having considered Tenders from the various contractors (four) for the Improvement of Buncrana Waterworks, we recommend the District Council to accept the lowest, that of Mr. Doherty (mason) of Buncrana, @ £ 232. We are satisfied that the said Mr. Doherty (mason) is sufficiently competent to carry out the proposed works, but we are not satisfied with the sureties he offers, and his Tender is recommended for acceptance subject to his providing better sureties satisfactory to the Committee.

(2) That in connection with the Improvement of Buncrana Waterworks we ask the District Council for authority to appoint a clerk of works to act during the carrying out of the works at wages of 30/- per week for constant attendance.

On the motion of the Chairman seconded by Councillor Edward Kearney (M) the report was approved and adopted, and the Tender of Mr. Doherty (mason) accepted, subject to his providing sureties approved by the Committee and entering into an Agreement and Bond without delay to carry out the contract in accordance with Plans & Specification.

Read Report from Moville Public Health Committee dated 4th Feb. 1909, forwarding Authorisation of Payments and accounts, and asking what steps should be taken against the owner and occupier of a house in Moville where there is great waste of water owing to a defective service pipe from the water main on the street into the house.

Ordered that the Committee be recommended to notice the owner and occupier concerned to make good the defect in the service pipe or replace it by a new one, forthwith, or the water supply to the house will be cut off.

Read Report from Barndonagh Public Health Committee dated 27th Jan. 1909, as follows:-

The Committee dealt with six sanitary reports by the Medical Officer of Health which are returned with the Committee's decisions endorsed, after inspection of the premises.

(1) Jas. B. Doherty's gateway - Those whose manure heaps contribute the nuisance should abate it by making their manure heap pits self containing, or be required to periodically reduce such heaps by removal to the fields. The Committee are of opinion that some action must be taken with regard to all such heaps, which, where dwelling houses are numerous, should not be permitted. (2) Nuisance in yards of Mr. McKinney and Dan. G. Doherty - Both yards are in a very insanitary state. Notices from Executive Sanitary Officer to be sent, and legal steps, if necessary, to be taken. (3) Stagnant water at rear of Deal S. Doherty's premises. - An extension of main drain for sewage at back of these premises and others is to be taken in hand by the Committee, and the several occupiers will be required to connect therewith in order to remove surface & stagnant water. (4) Nasty open sewer at rear of Hubert O'Donnell's premises. - There are two drains running for

some distance parallel occasionally emptying into this yard, and the Committee requested Mr. McDermott, L.C. to inspect, in order to determine whether the sewage of both can be discharged by one. There is a sewer and gully trap in the yard for the reception of same. (5) Unsanitary state of the yard of Eugene Doherty (Butcher). — There is a gully trap in this yard for the reception of such sewage as reaches it. There is a dung heap which is not large, but Doherty's slaughter-house is at the end of the yard and the washings &c. from it ought to be conveyed by covered drain referred to. Charles Barry, Chapel St. is the owner and Eugene Doherty, the occupier. Notices from Executive Sanitary Officers to be sent. (6) Sanitary condition of Mr. Elders' yard is bad. — Not in a very bad condition, surface water thrown off but runs to adjoining yard, Eugene Doherty's. Nothing at present to recommend. The report then proceeded:—

Typhoid Fever Reports

Copies of 3 reports to L.C. Board by Dr. O'Callaghan, Medical Officer of Health, were read, with accompanying letter from the Board (N^o. 68713-1908). The "probable source of infection" is stated to have been impure water. After consideration the Committee made the following minute with reference thereto:— This Committee reiterates its opinion that the extent to which the town of Barndonagh is owing partly to defective drainage (to which subject the Committee are giving earnest attention) but chiefly to the presence in objectionable proximity to human dwellings of numerous manure and excrement heaps and of stagnant water; that previous to the alleged outbreak of typhoid fever in Malin St., the Committee learned that a

large and lengthy open sewer maintained for the purpose of carrying off the sewage from houses on the north side of the Square and from Malin St. was in a filthy and unsanitary state and emitted a foul stench, and at their meeting on the 25th Nov. the Committee ordered the cleaning of same; that the Committee observing by their Minutes of that date that Dr. O'Callaghan stated that "no analysis of the water used in Barndonagh had been obtained in his time" are unable to understand how the present water supply, which is plentiful, has been pronounced impure; but that, pending the adoption of a scheme for a better one, they must urge a constant attention on the part of their Sanitary Officers in the Barndonagh area to general sanitary requirements as already indicated.

Board, dated 20th Feb. 1909, (No. 16.663/1909, Irishwoman (Q.D.) relative to the proposal to raise the bank of Buncrana Reservoir 3 feet, at a cost not exceeding £300, calling attention to their letter of 25th Jan. 1907, dealing with a similar proposal, & stating that the Council would not be warranted in proceeding in the manner now suggested by the Buncrana Public Health Committee for the purpose of effecting the necessary improvement, and as regards the proposal to levy the cost of the works by three annual instalments stating that recourse should not be had to borrowing without the Board's sanction being first obtained.

The following report of Buncrana Public Health Committee dated 26th Feb. 1909 was read, and on the motion of Councillor Barranagh seconded by the Chairman, approved & adopted, and ordered to be sent to the L.G. Board on the Minutes :-

Re Buncrana Waterworks Improvement.

My Committee have had before them the letter of the L.G. Board. They note that it is dated 20th inst. and refers to your Council's Minutes of 11th January. Now, my Committee did not commit your Council to any binding obligation till sufficient time had been given for the consideration of the Minutes by the L.G. Board, & only on the 8th inst. was the lowest tender (£232) for the works accepted, and not till 16th inst. was the contract signed. The contractor has been at work with great energy since the former date & is at present clearing out the mud and silt of 23 years, a temporary and very effective arrangement having been made for the town's supply.

Every detail of the plans & specifications were gone into most carefully and the securities proposed by the contractor not being satisfactory other two solvent men were insisted upon. All requirements of the Public Health Acts as to contracts were carefully complied with. The L.G. Board seem to be under the impression that the report of their Inspector and their observations accompanying it were not considered by the Committee or by your Council. That is an entirely erroneous impression. The Committee had at their meetings when that report was considered the assistance of three engineers, two of whom are members of the Committee and all of whom are intelligent men of business, vitally interested in the water supply and health of Buncrana, & in its progress and name as a health resort.

No doubt if the times were favourable or if the prospects were at all fair a larger scheme would have commended itself to the Committee.

But unfortunately the reverse is very clearly the case. Half of the newly-built houses are without tenants, and of the older houses probably 20 per cent are vacant. Trade is very bad and summer visitors are not half what they were. The receipts of the principal hotel have fallen over half - to about £1600 gross receipts. Under these circumstances my Committee knowing well that no increased demand would occur for another generation, and having had 2 years experience since the introduction of sewerage scheme of the fullest possible demand, were agreeably disappointed in finding that a short supply was not necessitated during the last two summers for even one week. There are very few waterworks in Ireland with that record. However it was felt that even that inconvenience should not be submitted to if a moderate expense would remedy it. In any case it was necessary to clean the reservoir and take out certain stuff which had fallen in, reducing its water contents. We have had several years experience of raising the sill. It gave us about 6 days additional supply. The breast of the dam is immensely strong. The streams supplying us small, and the arrangements for receiving water so made that no danger from flooding was to be apprehended. Under these circumstances it was arranged that the temporary arrangement (which cost exactly 7/6) should be made permanent, but to the extent of three feet solid embankment over the existing puddle trench, with the further provision of raising the level of water in reservoir by means of stop planks to meet an emergency demand. Thus we had three clear feet additional water at top level provided for - not a foot and a half as the report assumed. Now, three feet additional water at top level of this reservoir is 370,840 gallons and gives us 12 days supply if all the streams and springs had wholly dried up. The report by some extraordinary error stated that our plans would only give 2 days additional supply. That may have been an error for 20 days, but clearly the Inspector did not remember what raising the sill of the overflow could and did effect. Possibly he was afraid of such an expedient. We know it is not, and we are advised that

in many waterworks it has been without any danger introduced in anticipation of summer scarcity.

The matter of the supply pipe is sufficiently dealt with by our Engineer's letter which we append. Our difficulty has never been that we lost any floods waters. The six-inch pipe is never half full in the wettest of seasons, and we can turn in at the reservoir any flood water which escapes the supply pipe. Under these circumstances having failed to get a loan we determined to execute the work out of revenue and asked your Council to so provide, and you were good enough to do so and to recognise the public spirit of the locality by spreading the instalments over three years instalments. We are not borrowing and you are paying the contractor out of revenue. It was always so done by the Grand Juries and has been strongly recommended by Mr. Cowan, L.G.B. Inspector, for small affairs of this sort.

Now your Council is the Sanitary Authority proposing to do what is a necessary work, out of revenue, but postponing & spreading the levy over three years. You are not proposing to borrow, you are not charging the future with either interest or sinking fund, & the L.G. Board is got after all has been arranged to reopen the matter. Some disappointed contractor, or Engineer, or person has written calling their attention to the matter. Well, all we can say is that human nature being what it is we cannot be expected to submit to this treatment, & are certain your Council will maintain its rights and independence as a Sanitary Authority. You shall have them at all your contracts if this goes on. If however the matter goes to the bitter end we will not insist on the grace of a levy spread over three years. The L.G. Board cannot interfere unless by the ingenious plan of calling this a loan. If they persist in this & are found to be right, why, we must pay up, but before doing so we are prepared to indemnify the Council in respect of all costs & expenses in fighting the issue. In the meantime we are preparing a full statement for the Irish Executive & Parliament, and trust we shall have in all this most uncalled for contest the unanimous support of your Council.

Mr. Robinson's remuneration for so doing to be £15, this to include a fair amount of supervision during the progress of the work and all reasonable duties usually required of a Consulting Engineer. (4) That they wish to draw the attention of the Council to the want of sanitary accommodation at the Fishweiring Stations at Buncrana and to several heaps of decayed herring bones and refuse in their vicinity, and that the ^{recommending} recommendations of Mr. Brothers, Inspector of Factories be enforced. (5) That they had agreed to the proposal of the Electric Supply Co. to instal a 32 candle power lamp at bend of St. Mary's road & maintain same lighted during same hours as existing street lamps, at the rate of £2 per year dating from 1st Oct. 1909, no charge to be made in the meantime.

Read report from Councillors M. Cauley Cavanagh and M. Mullan the deputation appointed on 8 Feb 1909, to visit Ballymagaraghy stating that they had duly examined Ballymagaraghy and district re nuisance & reported, and giving their opinion as to the cause of the nuisance &c, and how to abate same. They inspected the town and did not see any undue nuisance or great flow from the manure heaps owing to ground being of a hard rocky nature, and the town situated on a height, but nothing to cause alarm, at times there might be a wash out owing to excessive rains, but such things happen in best regulated sanitary districts. When this does occur James Elkin's premises being situated on a lower level than the town, the water, principally surface water in which a certain amount of wash out or manure heap flowing, although in a much diluted state, is carried towards Elkin's.

This water has no way of escaping until it flows down to Elkin's fields and he won't allow it to flow into his fields, one in particular from which he gets his supply of water for domestic use. They (the Committee) went over the ground and first thought a cesspool made close to the town would serve the purpose to catch the flow, but on inquiry and examination found this could not be made owing to the peculiar situation of town. However they came to the conclusion the Council have three courses open to take away water and supposed nuisance:—

- (1) A pipe made from road through P. M. Feely's field about 80 yards long to catch an open drain which leads in a roundabout way through other lands to the shore.
- (2) A pipe made from road through P. M. Colgan's field about 40 yards long on left hand side of road to catch a small rivet, but Elkin objects to this as his cattle uses the rivet.
- (3) A pipe made through a kind of stack garden about 70 yards long, to catch an open drain leading to shore. This seems to be the most natural way for the water to go.

On the motion of Councillor McCauley seconded by Councillor Edward Kearney the report was approved, and Mr Foster Nolan B. E. directed to prepare plan and specification for a pipe in the direction suggested in the 3rd paragraph above, and the L. J. Board requested to fix the Rural District as the area of charge.

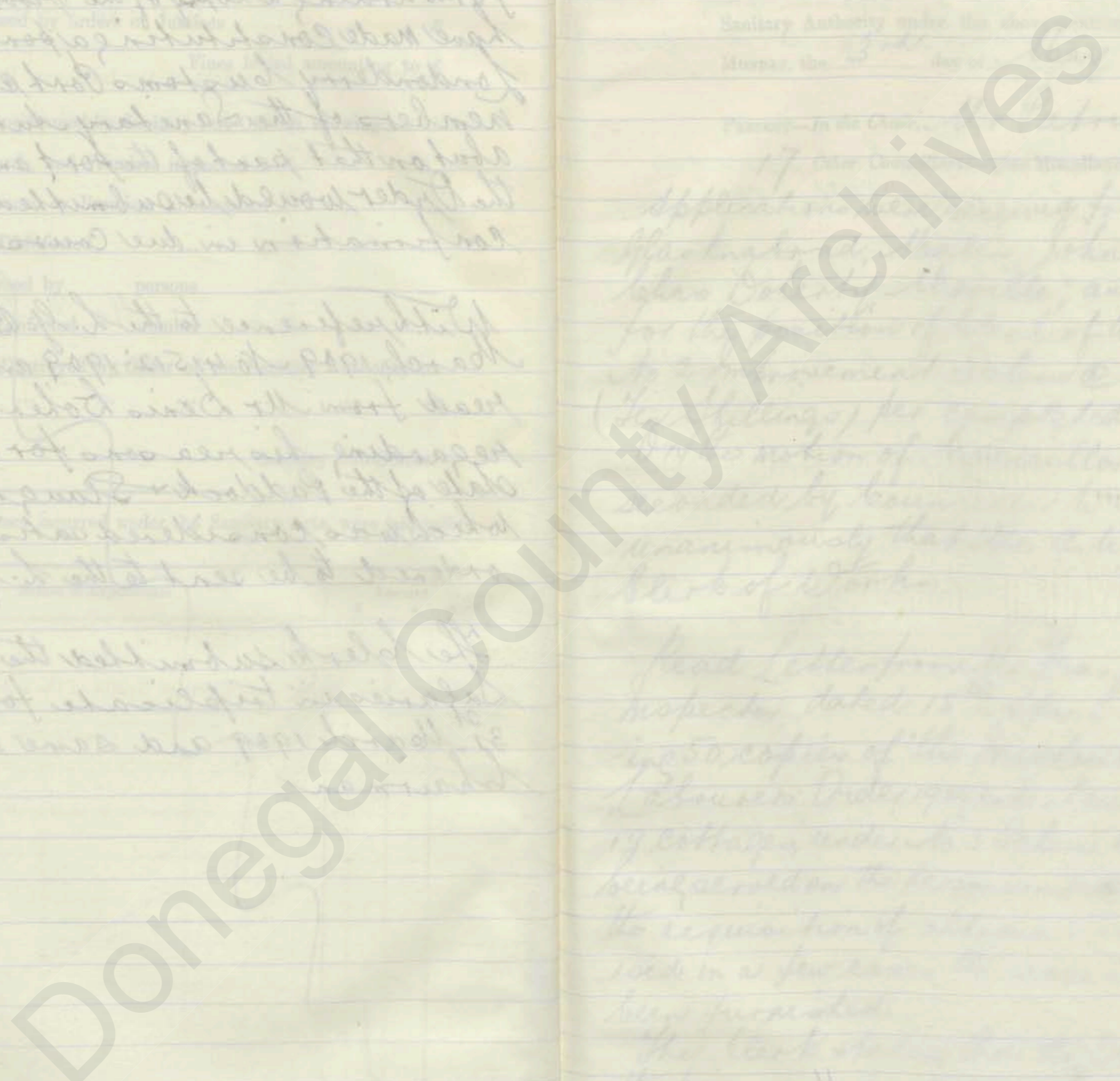

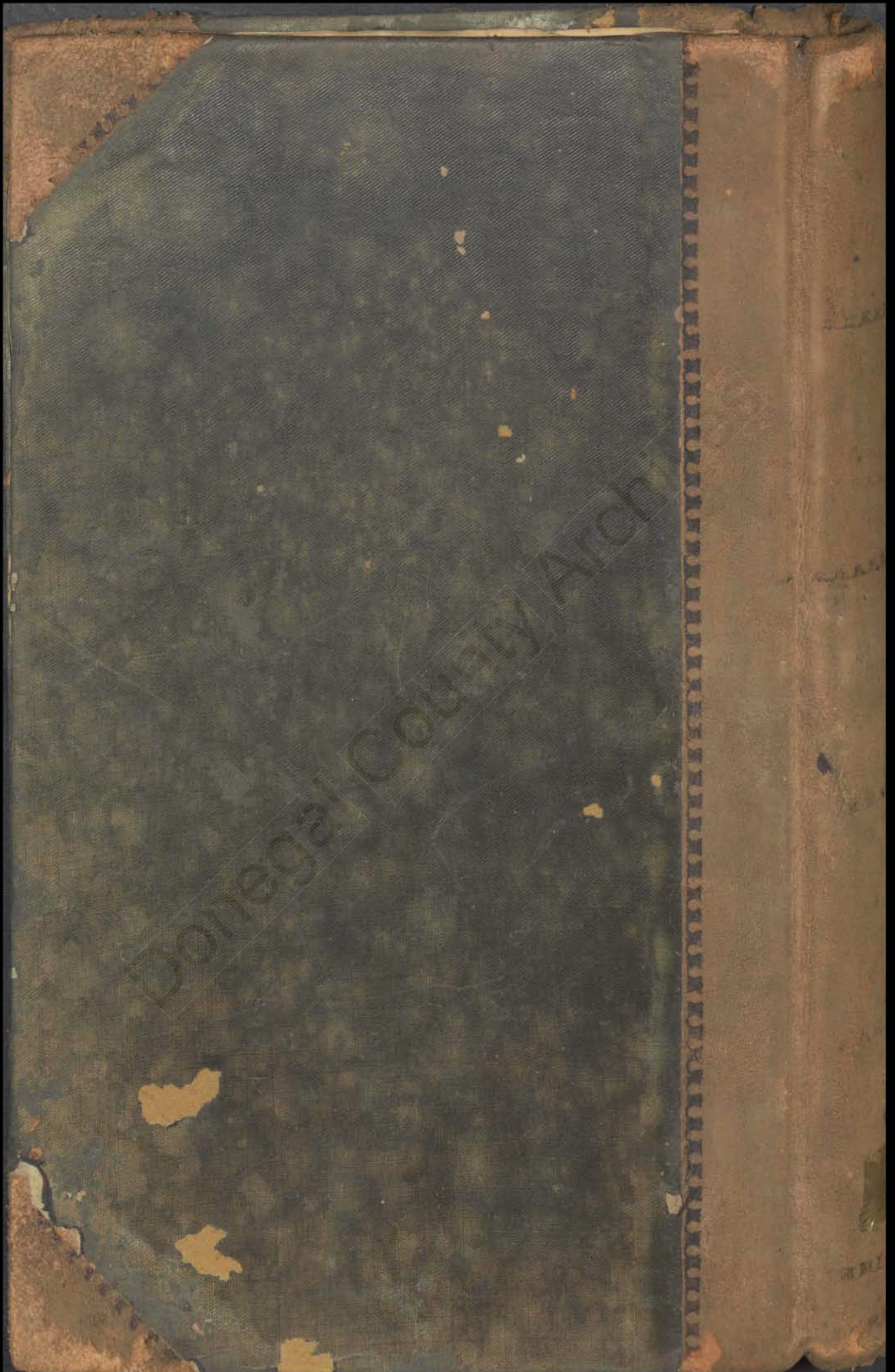

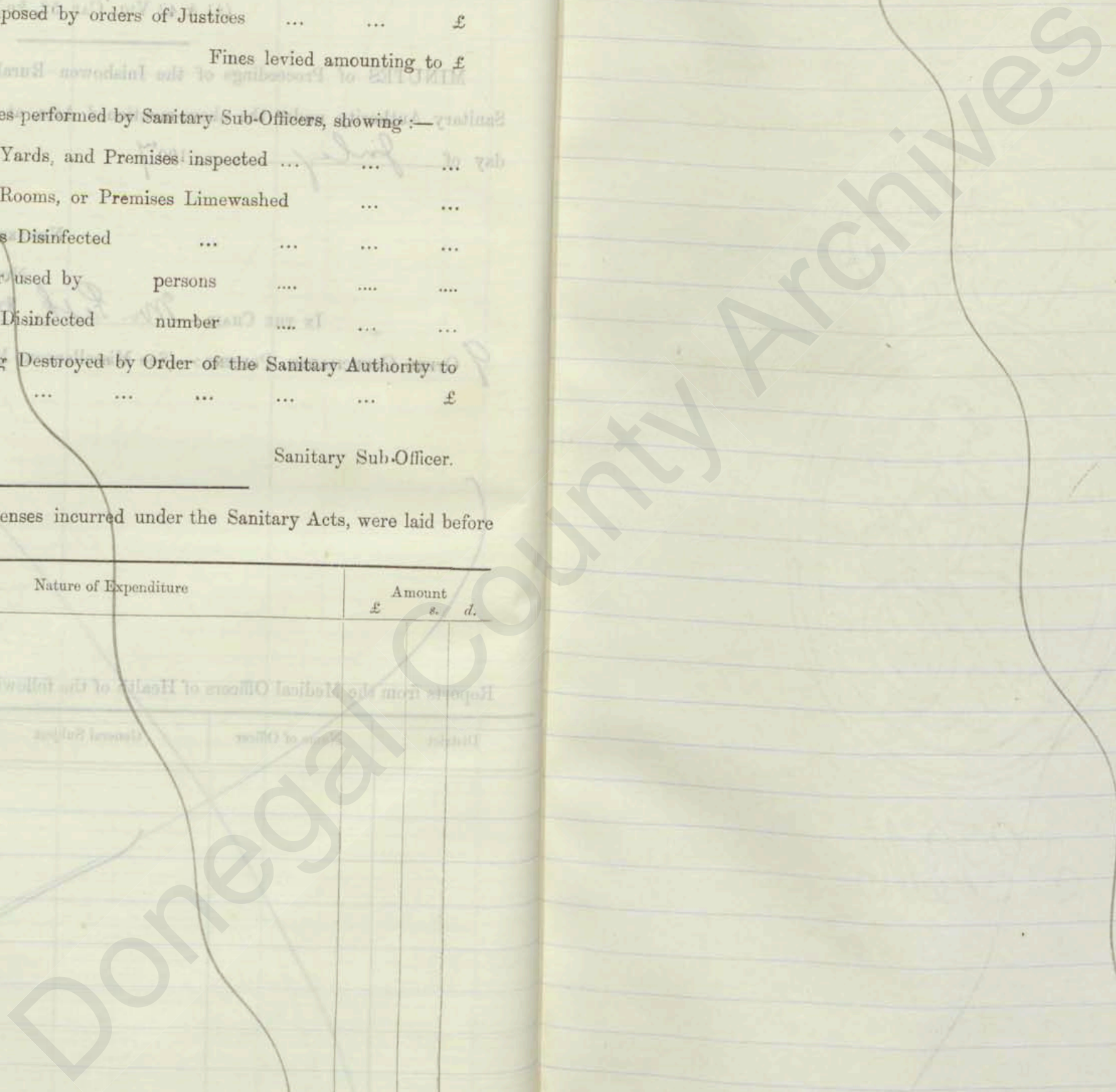
