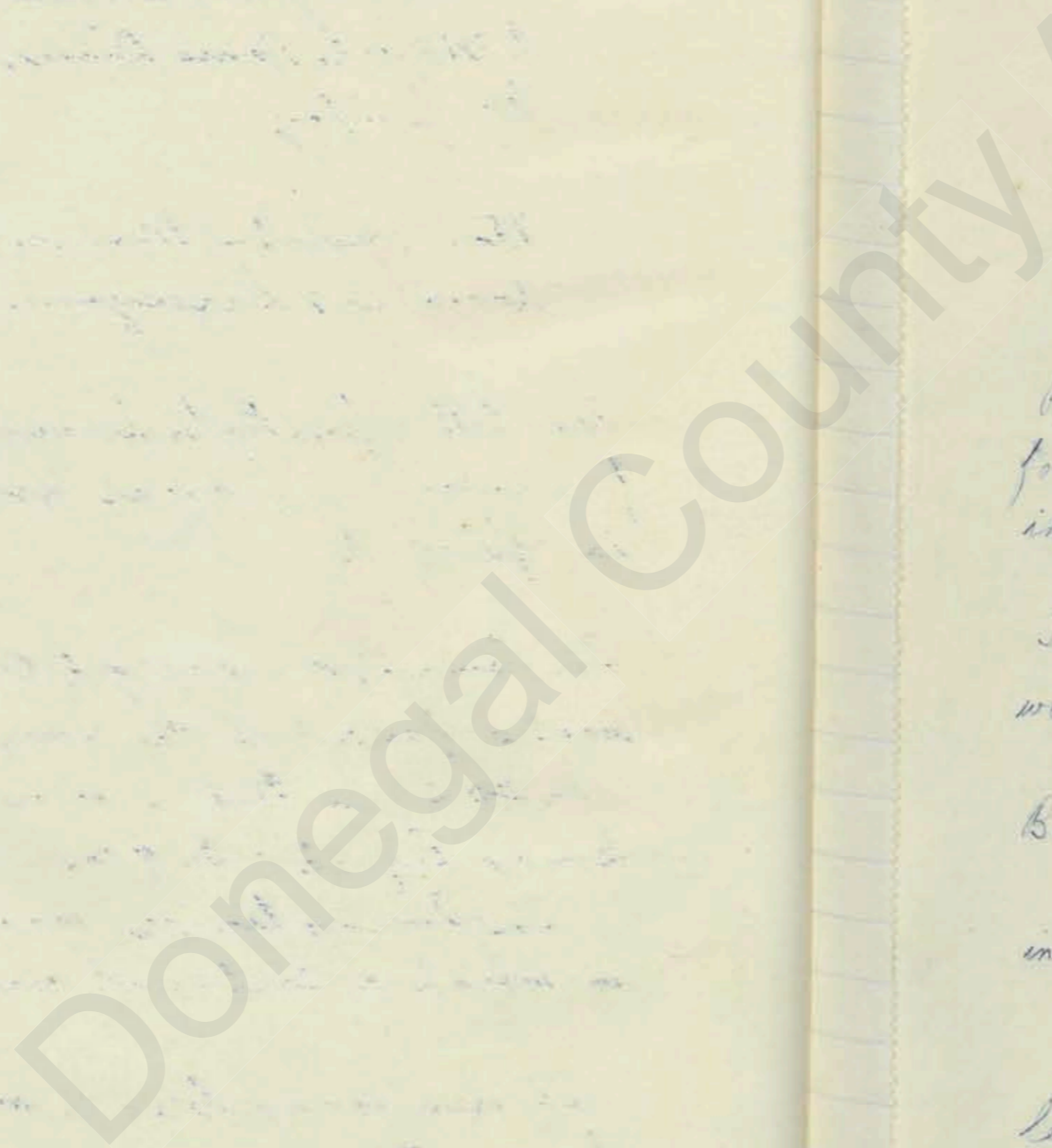

Board dated 31st July 1911, No. 39173/1911, forwarding extracts from the report of their Inspector Dr. Macfarthy relating to the sanitary condition of Enishowen Rural District, suggesting that the Board of Guardians might be communicated with regarding the provision of a disinfecting apparatus.

and urging the Council to adopt the Infectious Disease (Notification) Act, 1889, and the Infectious Disease (Prevention) Act, 1890, as these acts have been of great service to Sanitary Authorities in dealing with infectious disease outbreaks; also stating that the provisions of the Public Health Act are mandatory as regards the registration of Common Lodging Houses.

Resolved that the L.C. Board be informed that the Council do not consider the adoption of the Infectious Disease Acts or the provision of a disinfecting apparatus necessary in this district; that the question of the Dairies Order and of the Greenacres water supply have been already dealt with as set out on the foregoing minutes, that the ^{condition of the} wells at Bluebeacon & Disterman ~~is~~ is a matter for the persons using them & they have been asked to keep them in good order. That Larnadonagh Sewerage System is sufficient and that the Council will take steps to provide a water supply for Larnadonagh, when the people of the town wish them to do so.

Read reports of Month's Public Health Committee of meetings held on 28th July and 9th August 1911, from which it appeared that they have appointed Mr. Hugh Berlin as Chairman and Col. Montgomery as Hon. Sec. have arranged to meet on the first Monday of each month. Also sending resolutions:- (1) Agreeing to pay the lamp lighters 2/6 per week during the Summer months for cleaning the public water closets at the pier, (2) That the lamp stands be painted, (3) That Col. Montgomery & Mr. Gibson were appointed a sub Committee to look after the water supply, due notice to be published in the town when it is proposed to shut off the water; (4) That they had considered tenders for repair of public water closets; (5) That they had Mr. Nolan's specification for fire hydrants

unusual drought was so low that it would only last a day or two, in fact that there was no water & they had to take immediate steps ^(Signal) to provide a temporary supply. This was done by pumping from a spring at Gransha situate at a level of 80 feet below the town reservoir & some 400 yards distant.

This spring on measurement was found to yield 1250 gallons per hour and same was connected into the mains and to the Reservoir by means of a two-inch iron pipe, and pumped thereinto by means of a two-throw single-acting ram pump and a six horse power Belfast Barker Petrol engine connected by 3 inch 3-ply Balata belt. The Committee were advised that this was the only course which would give a supply of pure water immediately & they therefore asked the District Council to confirm this action which was absolutely unavoidable. The clerk reported that the Committee had inspected a specimen barrel on 20th Nov. 1911, and agreed that if it were supplied at 7/6, the tender might be accepted.

Read Letter from Mr. Michael Farren of Rostown dated 9th Dec. 1911, stating that he could not accept the offer of 7/6 for the barrels, but now submitted a better sample @ 10/-

Ordered that paying Order N. 25 be cancelled.

Read Letters from the Estates Commissioners dated 29th Nov. and 8th Dec. 1911, inquiring whether Ptk. Doherty of Portalean, has agreed to pay half the cost of changing the fence in consideration of the Council altering the site of the plot required on his holding.

Read Letter from Mr. Patrick Doherty, Portalean, dated 9th Dec. 1911, recounting the treatment he had received in connection with the acquisition of a plot for a Labourers cottage on his holding in Carthage, & asking is it fair or just after such treatment to be asked to bear the whole or part of the expense of altering the fence.

Councillor Scott moved that the Council bear all the expense of altering the fences.

This was ruled out of order, but appeared to be the wish of the members present, and

Councillor McCallion handed in a Notice of Motion for next meeting that the resolution passed on 13th Nov. 1911, agreeing to pay half of the expense in connection with the changing of the shape of the cottage plot on Ptk. Doherty's property be rescinded and that they pay whole of the expenses.

Read Letter from Messrs. Brookbank, Leach, & Davies, Solrs, Coleraine, dated 23rd Nov. 1911, enclosing draft declaration of Mrs. Harveys Agent relative to Mrs. Harveys title to Plot 11, Lisfin (Scheme 3), and inquiring whether the Council will be satisfied with the Declaration or will require an Abstract of Title.

The Clerk said he referred the matter to Mr. O'Hagan. Read Letter from Mr. O'Hagan, the Council's Solicitor, dated 28th Nov. 1911, stating that the draft declaration meets the requirements of the Statute, but that if the Agent can declare there are no incumbrances, the compensation might be paid at once.

Read further letter from Mr. O'Hagan, dated 28th Nov. 1911, relative to the Costs of Mr. B.S. 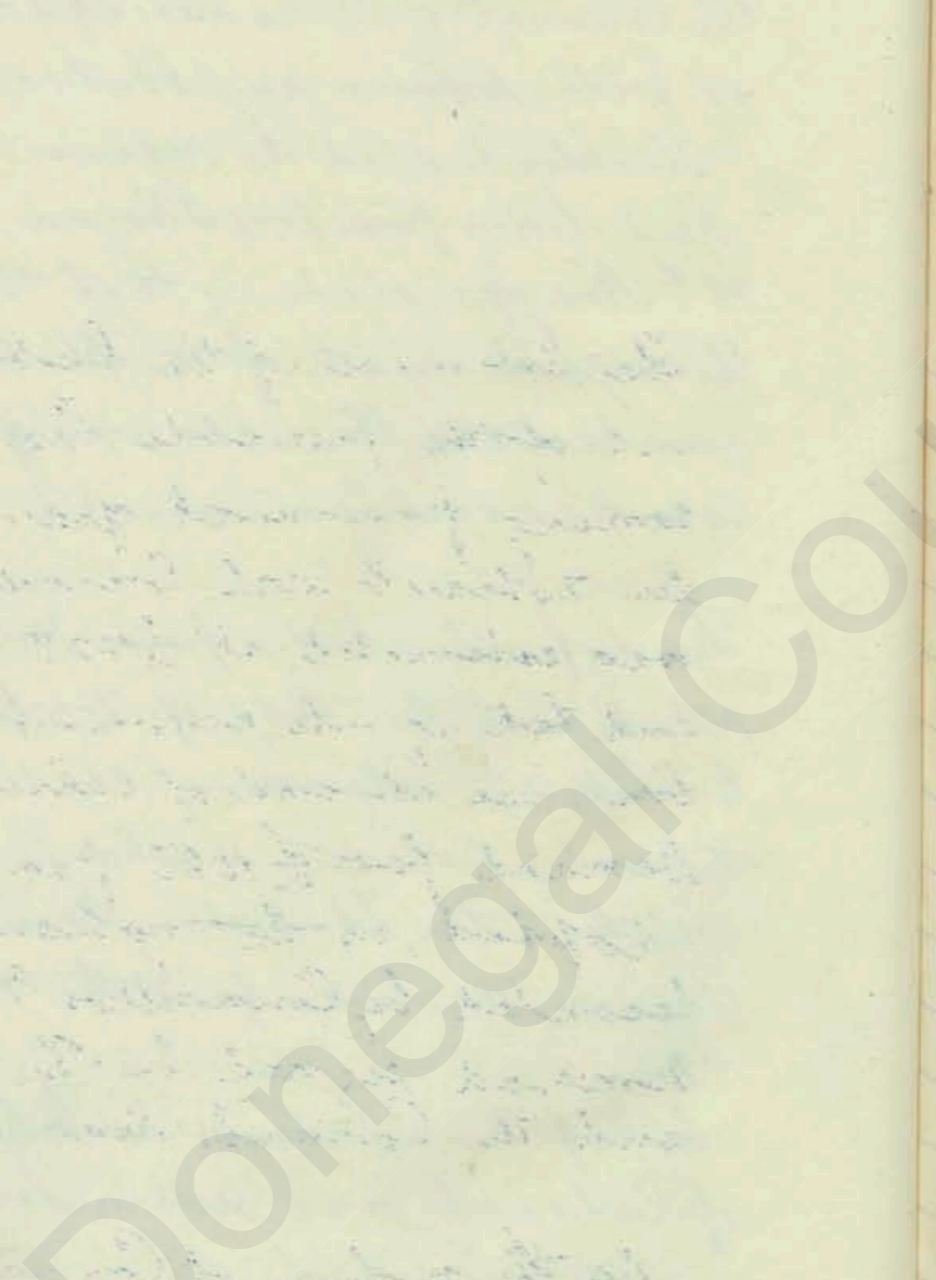

Read report from Mr. Nolan B.E. dated 10th Feb. 1912, stating that James Deary had undone what had formerly been done to remedy the smoke, viz. had removed the ~~Backs~~ Backs Flue & taken off the Chimney pot. Since then the pot was replaced & he did not find any smoke. That a small open drain along the fence would remedy the complaint as to overflow water from adjoining field. That the sewerage pipes have got choked & both them & the Cess pool require to be cleared out. The sashes require new cords & the woodwork inside & outside needs to be painted, in Deary's & the adjoining Cottage.

Ordered that Mr. Nolan prepare a specification.

Mr. Nolan also reported concerning the nuisance at the Ballylooney Cottages, stating that as the ground is flat it is difficult to get an outlet for drainage & water sometimes lodges on the street. As the subsoil is of a porous nature the water soon disappears. The application of a liberal supply of road metal & keeping the drains open along the boundary fence would considerably relieve the inconvenience. 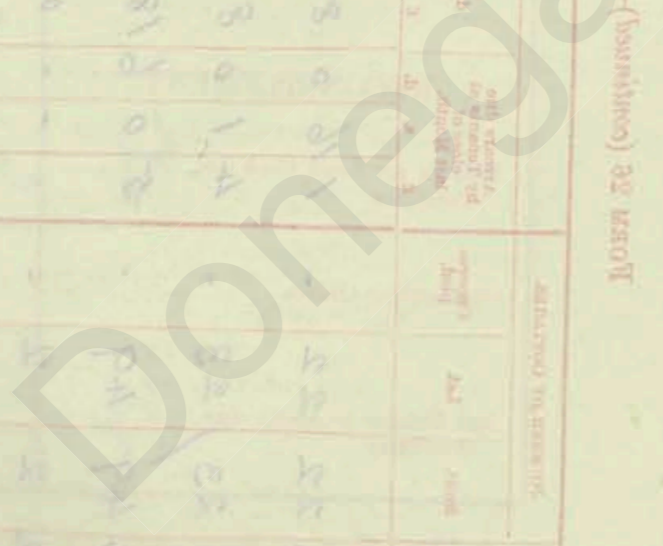

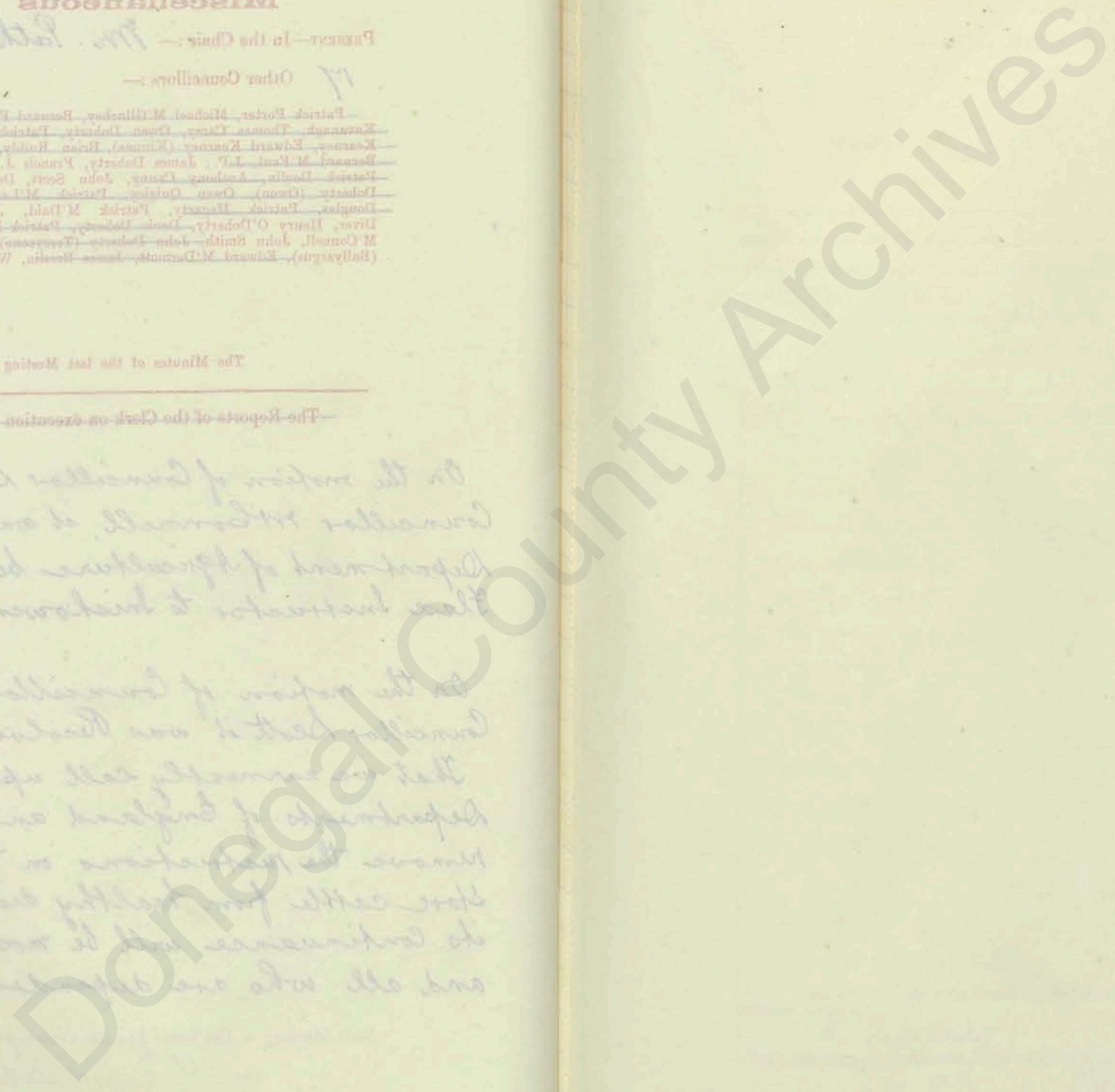

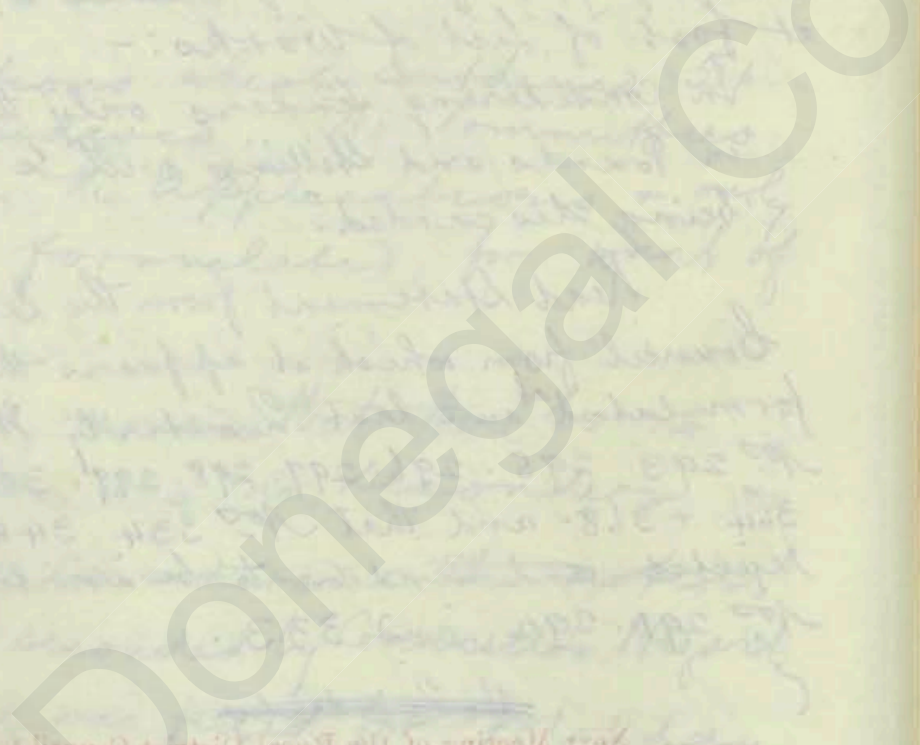

When there is no water flowing in the mill race the sewage collects and the result is most insanitary, Not long ago a flood carried away the head of the channel & no water enters it at present, the result being deplorable. Steps should be taken at once to repair the head and flush the channel. Mr. Kelly will restore the head works if the committee pay half of the cost, which will probably not exceed £2, & we recommend this. We recommend that expert advice be taken regarding the best way to establish a proper system of drainage for all the houses on the west side of the Malin Road.
