

Second Special Meeting

Two tenders were submitted for the opening and cleaning out of the sewer in Manorcummingham Village.

The Clerk stated that from information received, the carrying out of work, as specified in the poster, would not remove the obstruction; inasmuch as the yard where stagnant water is lodging, is a little lower than the bottom of sewer, and he was of opinion it would only be a waste of money to let it on the conditions specified; but that sewer should be deepened so as to allow a fall for sewerage from yard and other private drains.

This was agreed to, and he was directed to communicate with the Assistant County Surveyor Mr. W. Laughlin, requesting him to prepare a specification for sinking and laying with 6" crockery pipes so as to effectually carry away all sewerage from yards, and fixing a fee of 10/- for said work, and sending in a report when completed. And that when specification is prepared, Clerk to invite fresh tenders, to be considered on 6th April next.

Mr. A. Failey proposed that expenses in connection with this sewerage of Manorcummingham be a charge on the Town of Manorcummingham, seconded by Mr. W. Colhoun.

The Clerk stated that the expenses would be charged on the Rural District of Letterkenny; as per sealed order of L. G. B. fixing area of charge for sanitary expenses.

Mr. Failey stated that as this Board had passed a Resolution some time ago, protesting against District charges for sanitary expenditure, said Resolution would require to be rescinded before it could be made a District Charge, and that said expenses should be payable by the inhabitants of village who derive the benefit of said expenditure, and therefore request the sanction of the L. G. B. to said expenses being charged to the Ratepayers of village of Manorcummingham.

The Council next took into their consideration the salary of their Clerk, which had been before them some months ago. And after fully discussing the matter, it was proposed by Mr. W. G. McKinney, seconded by Mr. Mick McHenry that the salary be fixed at £50 per annum to date from 1st April 1899, passed unanimously.

The Clerk stated that he would be satisfied with this sum as fixed, for the combined offices of Clerk to Council, and Clerk to Barial Board. The Council expressed their satisfaction with Clerk's offer, and request the sanction of L. G. B.

The Council considered it a little premature to fix any salary under the Labourers Act, seeing that the scheme is not yet formulated, and they do not yet know the amount of work to be performed in connection with Scheme; they will be prepared to determine this salary at a future date.

Read notice of Auditor's appointment, from Major Eccles stating that he will audit the accounts to September last on Thursday 22nd instant.

Letter from the L. G. Board No 32682. dated 7th June. re the plans for Labourers Cottages was submitted and a request that they may be amended in certain particulars.

From Mr. O'Sullivan Architect dated 14th June stating that he has carefully considered the suggestions of the L. G. Board with regard to the Labourers Cottages, and I have amended the Specification to meet their wishes. I have struck out all reference to the L. G. B., their Inspectors, and Board of Works.

The L. G. B. suggest that you should place the doors on double cottages in the ends of the block instead of front as at present planned. and that both Kitchens should be in rears. There is something no doubt in the suggestion to put the door in the ends as it would give greater space in front rooms, but in the Plans as approved by you; the entrance to front room in one of the double cottages is from the hall, and this makes the room private, which even in a Labourers Cottage is a consideration of some merit.

I do not like to put both Kitchens in rears, as this would necessitate carrying up both flues together; and as the Council are only proposing to build one double Cottage in the present scheme I think the L. G. Board are likely to approve of the present plan, and if the Council in the future decide to build double Cottages, the suggestions of the L. G. B. could be carefully considered.

In the plan of the single Cottage the L. G. B. are of opinion that the smallest room should be at least 6 1/2 feet wide you can easily do this, by taking

taking 1 foot 2 inches off the Bed rooms, and if the Council adopt this I can mark the dimensions on the plan.

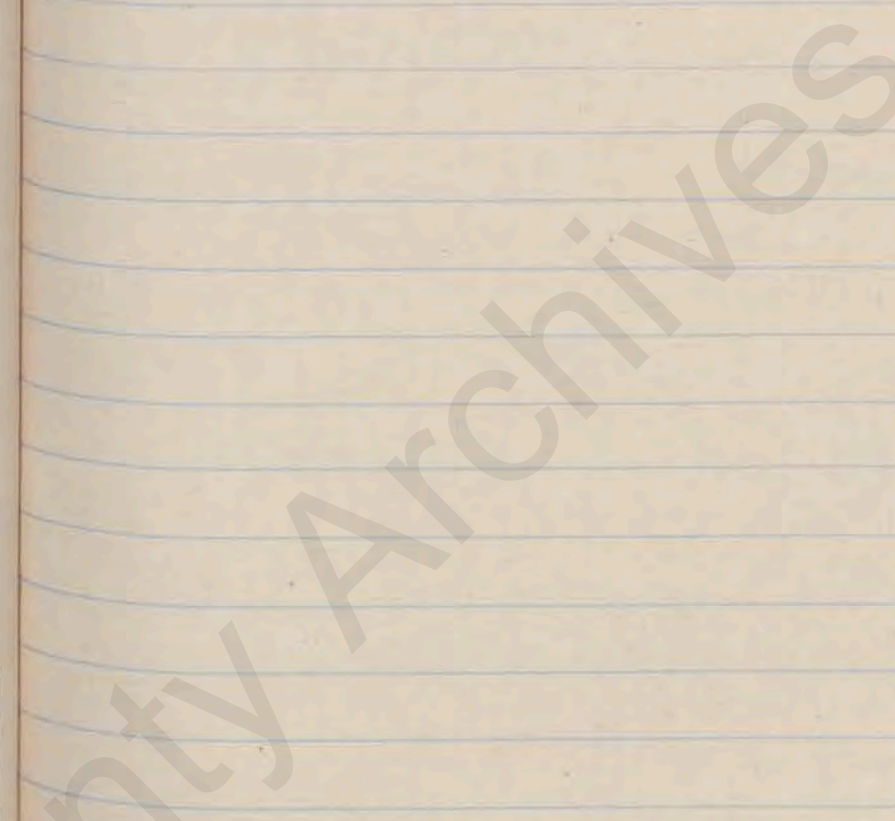
