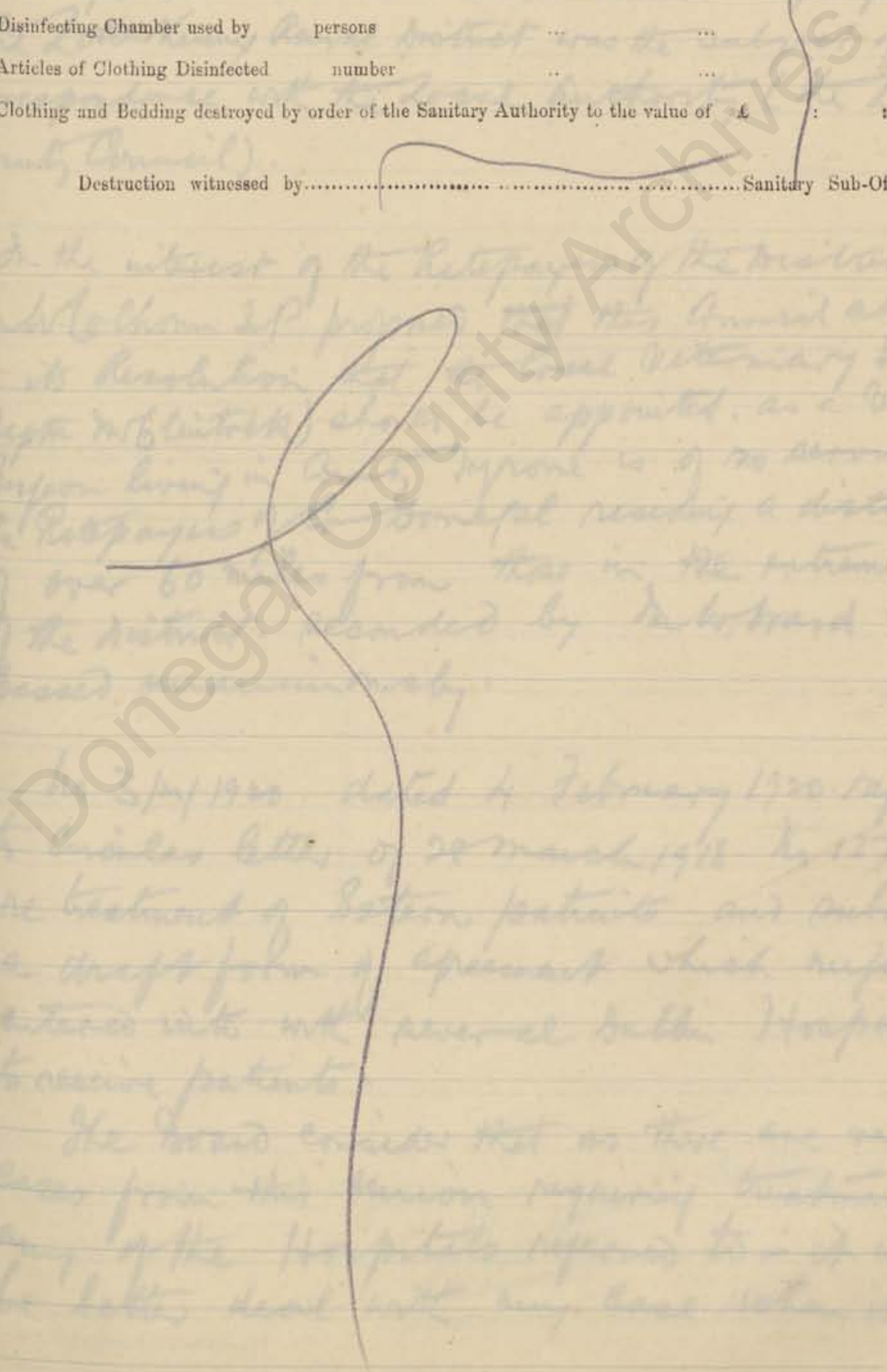

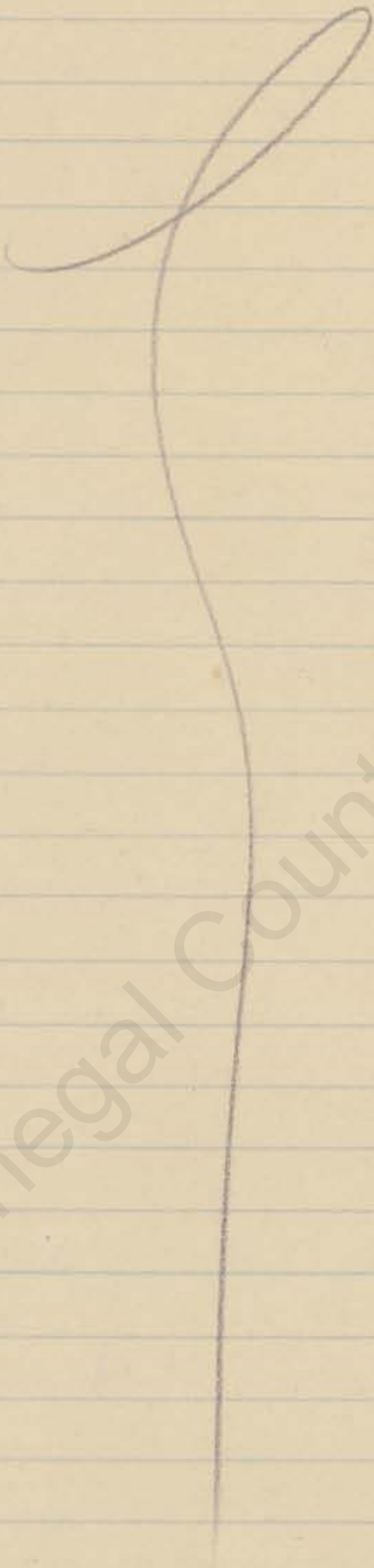

The Deputation from Farmers & Labourers Union appeared before the Council and the Inspector, advocating that the Labourers were unable to pay the rents of their Cottages owing to unemployment. Messrs Robt Wylie, Robt Scott & J. White and W. J. Boyle were the members of the deputation.

The Clerk was asked to read a statement showing how the payment of Rents had been made &c.

The Clerk stated that there are 109 tenants in good standing on the Rental. — and of the remaining 44 — 13 owed between £3 and £4 24 — owed between £4 + £5 — 5 owed between £5 + £6. and 2 owed between £6 and £8 —

Patt. Harkin tenant of Cottage 115 Oldtown stated that owing to unemployment the tenants are unable to pay more than 1/- a week and get all arrears struck off and asked that the Cottage and Plot become the property of the tenant when the grant is paid off.

The Inspector asked did he think tenants of Cottages who owned Cattle were unable to pay?

P. Harkin did not think many of the tenants had Cattle.

Mr. Boyle said the Farmers want the Labourers at certain seasons of the year but are not able to keep them employed all the year round and favoured the Labourers having Contracts on Roads to keep them employed when Farmers did not require them.

The Chairman stated that the Loans were borrowed for building Cottages for the Labourers and the Loans must be repaid otherwise the deficit will fall on the rates.

The Cost of repairs during the past year - done and to be completed amounts to close on £500 and as there are no Cottages in the Divisions in his neighbourhood he will ask these Divisions to be exempt from any Charge made for such deficit and let the Ratepayers of the Divisions where the Cottages are built become liable.

Mr. J. White stated that he was of opinion the Cottages should have been

more scattered, and not built so closely in certain townlands, and that now if the cottages become vacant other tenants will not take them and may be destroyed and the Ratepayers will have to meet the loss.

Jas Sample Senr Labourer. stated that the cause of non payment of rent was purely inability owing to unemployment.

Mr W Breslin R.D.C stated the tenants would pay 1/- a week if they got all arrears wiped off.

Mr. Neal Kelly Chairman stated that the Council was elected 3 years ago, and had to contend with a state of affairs never met with by former Councils, that the Loans must be met and he would object to let his area pay for any deficit caused by Labourers rents or reduction of rents.

Mr Wyke suggested that some Government grant should be earmarked to meet any deficit caused by any reduction granted to the Labourers in their Rents - and Mr J Boyce suggested a reduction of 3d a week -

The Inspector stated that from what he had heard and knows, the agitation is not an honest one and unless the Union could submit facts and figures he could not recommend any reduction as the Cottages could not become Minor County Homes.

The Clerk was directed to await the Inspector's report before taking further action - 13 day of July 1923
