Mr W. Breslin said it was a hardship on the tenants of the Cottages to have to come or send their Rents to the office of the R.D. Council.

The Clerk stated that this matter had been raised in Parliament, and after very fully investigating the matter, the Association was informed by the M.P. for the District that the arrangements seemed satisfactory as a very large percentage of the tenants preferred the liberty of sending their rent at any time during the month that they could spare it - in preference to having

It called for weekly, as they might not always have it to spare - besides a number of the tenants have always paid their rent in advance - some quarterly others half yearly when their children get their wages or when they get their payments for Road Contract -

 Mr Breslin stated the Labourers would pay 1/- a week Rent -

The Clerk stated that 44 Notices to Quit have now been served in accordance with directions given at last meeting. a few of those on whom Notices were served had paid up their Rents. about one half of said number would be in readiness for Summoning to first Court and these could not now be postponed unless the Justice would stay the proceedings.

The Council directed that no further Summonses be issued until the Clerk has a reply from the Inspector on the matter - and that this first lot only be proceeded with at this time.
