Proposed by Mr W. Johnson JP. That having had before us the letter of the Local Government Board of the 21 September last in reference to fees to be paid our Solicitor under the Labourers Acts 1906 we affirm our resolutions of the 2nd August and 6th September last on the subject.

We decline to require our Clerk to discharge legal work in connection with our Schemes which is distinctly work for a Solicitor to carry out, and of which work our Clerk has no experience nor has he the training necessary to discharge it - Inasmuch as the discharge of legal work by our Clerk renders him liable to prosecution and fine for performing the work of a Solicitor and receiving remuneration for same on the scale set out in Rule 46 of the Labourers (Ireland) Order 1906, and as he will require to be indemnified by us in respect of the action to which he so renders himself liable, we are strongly of opinion that our action in agreeing with our Solicitor for the performance of all the legal work in connection with our Schemes at the fee set out in our resolution of the 2nd August last is the wisest and will prove the most economical in the long run.

We therefore request the L. Govt Board to sanction this this recommendation and reconsider their decision. Seconded by Mr J. A. Armore, and unanimously resolved.
