The Clerk also read copy of letter sent to the Urban Council Clerk. as follows:— I have been directed by the Letterkenny Rural Sanitary Council, being the Rural Sanitary Authority, to write and ask whether in the event of that body giving its consent to the execution of the proposed works for Water Supply Scheme, through their Sanitary District the Urban Sanitary Authority will give its consent to a free transfer of water being allowed to the Urban Council, seeing that supply power is separate, seeing that the said Sanitary Authority is for the reasons of the poor of a portion of the area to be taken for said supply.

has been read from Urban Sanitary Council dated 12 March 1908 as follows:— I have a reply to you of the 11th inst. I have been instructed by the Letterkenny Rural Sanitary Council to inform you that they are prepared to give a supply of water free of charge to the Urban Council in case of any outbreak of fire or other emergency, and also to let the Urban Council have the services of their fire extinguishers and appliances gratis on occasion of fire for the use of same. The Clerk pointed out that he did not consider the reply from the Urban Sanitary Council satisfactory, as it only offered a supply for a case of fire which was not what was required, but that a supply might be required if the Sanitary Authority was to improve the water supply.

Messrs. Lugg & Madden Solicitors appeared in support of the scheme and asked the sanction of the Rural District Council to the execution of the works through the Rural Sanitary District.

Mr. Mallin's Solicitor stated that he appeared for Lord Leitrim & some Ratepayers to oppose the scheme.

After considerable discussion it was proposed by Mr. John McBanley seconded by Mr. J. Bellows J.P. that the consent asked for be given.

Mr. J. Reid proposed as an amendment that the consent of the Rural District Council be refused, and that the local Government Board be requested to hold a further inquiry to see whether a supply for the Asylum can be had nearer than Lough Salt, seconded by Mr. R. McFarley J.P.

On a vote being taken there appeared for the Motion 12, and for the Amendment 8.

The Motion was declared carried by 4 of a majority that the consent asked for be given, as follows:— The Letterkenny Rural District Council, being the Sanitary Authority for the Rural District of Letterkenny in which the Letterkenny District Lunatic Asylum is situated, hereby consent to the Letterkenny Urban District Council executing and doing all such works and things within the Letterkenny Rural District as may be necessary for the carrying out of the proposed supply of water from Lough Salt to the Town of Letterkenny, and the Letterkenny Rural District Council hereby further consent that the said Urban District Council may supply and sell water to the Board of County Council for the purposes of the said Donagh District Lunatic Asylum.
