No L 1386. dated 16 February 1909 expressing sanction to a further payment of £30 to the Clerk in respect of services in connection with carrying out of the Letterkenny R.D. Labourers (unopposed) order 1907.

Mr W. Platt Raymochy, appeared before the Council and explained that there were labourers cottages being placed on one of his fields and that as there would be a small strip of land left along a fence that would be practically lost to him he suggested that the plots should be made a little shorter and broader.
