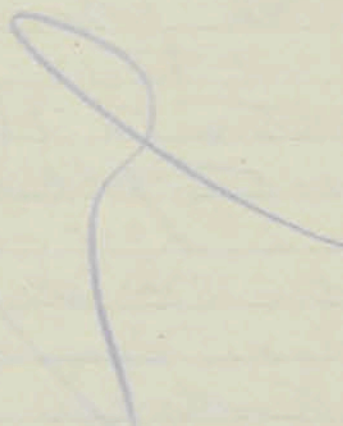

The following Letters from the Local Government Board for Ireland, or others, were read, and directions given thereon as follows :-

From Mr. Browne dated 4 March 09. that 4 children of Patrick Connors of Carrowthanna are suffering from Typhoid fever of an intermitting type. That he tried to persuade the Parents to send them to the Fever Hospital, but they would not do so. That the house is small and no room for isolation - The house is in a deep valley and the only reason he can give for the outbreak is bad drainage, unsanitary surroundings and overcrowding.

The father of the children informed Mr. J. McDonoghue a member of the Board that the children are getting along very well and will soon be all right and that he is fixing another house about 50 yards distant and intends changing into it as soon as he can.

Regulations as to Food Act 1907, were submitted.

Mr. J. J. Leakey proposed that the Sanitary Sub officers in the several Dispensary Districts be appointed Inspectors under the Dairies Cows and Milkshops order. and that the fee for inspections be 1/6^d per holding - seconded by Mr. Denis McDonoghue.

Mr. R. J. Blackwood proposed as an amendment that the fee be 6^d. per holding. seconded by Mr. Neal Jones.

On a vote being taken the amendment was carried by 10 votes to 7 for motion. The amendment was declared carried that the fee be 6^d per holding.
