Fadden Solicitor said that as the matter had been unanimously referred to a Committee of the Council who had at very considerable inconvenience attended and had gone carefully into the matter, admitted by their unanimous report ~~that~~ that the Clerk should be allowed an increase of salary of £20 a year.
