

new agreements are entered into, also referring Council to section 64 of the Housing of the Working Classes Act 1890 governing sale of houses to the tenants.

Asked by Chairman, whether he had any remarks to make, Mr. McGovern said that taking into account the bad condition of the cottages no rent would be paid till the defects in the houses are remedied. He enumerated the defects as follows. Water under floors - sidewalks badly constructed, chiming walls never finished leaky roofs - slates blown out as well as blown in.

Asked to state precisely why the tenants refuse to pay rent, Mr. McGovern replied "on account of the houses not being rentable"

Councillor Kelly pointed out that the defects mentioned were original defects and that the Bundoran Council was not responsible for these which existed before houses were taken over.

Town Surveyor was directed to inspect the houses and report on each.

Chief was directed to apply to Local Govt. Board for a suitable form of rent receipt, also to again point out to L.G. Board the high cost of repairing houses and again asking them to sanction sale.

Chief referred Council to reply of L.G. Board on the question of sale, which reply appeared definite. It was ordered that legal proceedings be taken if tenants refuse to pay rent, and that the Rent collector demand rent from each tenant immediately. Proceedings were adjourned to next monthly meeting.

The signatories to the documents requested that the phrase Cottages transferred from Ballyshannon Rural District Council should be substituted in stead of the phrase "lodging houses for the working classes"; and they were read as changed.

There was a protracted discussion relative to arrears due by tenants, and the Rent Collector's Account Book was tabled and examined.

Councillor Pete Clancy proposed, Councillor J. Hart, seconded and it was unanimously resolved "That legal action be not taken, on condition that all tenants of cottages, who owe more than three months' rent, pay immediately all arrears due to 1<sup>st</sup> January 1919, and that the remaining tenants pay immediately all arrears due to 1<sup>st</sup> February 1919."

The deputation agreed to the terms of the resolution.

Mr. McGovern referred to the unsuitability of the form of the receipt issued for the payment of rent

Clerk stated that he had requested the Local Government Board to supply a suitable form. The deputation then withdrew.

Councillor Judge in succinct statement drew

attention to the heavy burden to the rates consequent on the large instalment payable in respect of transferred cottages and the increasing cost of repair.

Proposed by Councillor J. M. Judge

seconded by Councillor H. J. Kelly and resolved:

That owing to the altered conditions since the outbreak of the war, and also to the fact that the houses, transferred under terms of the Adjusting Officer's Award, dated 20<sup>th</sup> October 1915, from Ballyshannon Rural District Council to Bundoran Urban District Council, are presently a very heavy charge on the rates of Bundoran Urban District, and will become an increased charge owing to the expense for necessary repairs, weast the Local Government Board to re-adjust the Award so as to effect a substantial reduction in the instalments payable to Ballyshannon Rural District Council.

The major portion of quarried stone has been delivered by the contractor and will be broken as soon as the steam breaker is available.

**Footpaths and Crossings** The crossings to gateways are still in need of repair and numerous flags are broken in the footpaths.

The work of replacing broken flags is delayed owing to the difficulty of procuring replacements and the heavy expense that would be entailed

Part of the coping of the Protection wall at the Cliff, Shene Avenue, has been displaced and thrown on to the rocks below

**Water Supply.** The Intake has been cleared of gravel and earthy deposit, but a large quantity of both has accumulated recently as a result of heavy floods

It will be necessary to remove this as soon as weather conditions allow. The main Supply Pipe has been washed out periodically.

I would suggest that the storage reservoir be cleared as there is evidence that this is necessary

**Sewers:** Generally the main Sewer and Septic Tank have worked satisfactorily - only one man-hole in the East End giving any trouble.

A line of sewer pipe 67 yards long has been laid in continuation of the public drain at Miss Beacon's, to connect with the main Sewer

The overflow from storage reservoir is now intercepted at the "main" and its flow through the principal sewer will tend to diminish the foul smell often felt from the manholes at the sea front, as well as completely stop the flow of water which was so offensive on the beach.

The need for Public Conveniences is still very urgent and it would be well in the interests of the Town that steps be taken to provide this want.

**Cleaning:-** The streets have been attended to carefully and cleaned regularly so that their general state as regards cleanliness is satisfactory.

Dumping of refuse on the beach still continues and I would recommend strong measures to be taken to prevent this objectionable practice.

Clerk informed Council that no replies had been received to letters asking those tenants of working Class Houses to provide new sureties in stead of those dead. He pointed out each tenant was notified three times, and notices in every case were ignored.
