This resolution was seconded by Councillor John Doherty and passed.

The Chairman pointed out that it appeared to be the unanimous wish of the Council not to have stalls erected in public places but that no expressed decision as to the matter had yet been given.

The Council directed the Clerk, if and when the stalls are removed, to have public seats erected on space between Cliff Road and Road to Sea near Septic Tank.

Councillor P. Connolly moved, Councillor P. Clancy seconded, and it was resolved "That a sum of Five pounds Sterling be charged Minstrel Troupes, Pierrottes, or Follies, for permission to carry on open air entertainments in the Urban District of Bundoran during the season 1920, and that the said sum of Five Pounds be paid to the Clerk of the Council on or before the 31st day of July 1920."

- ④ 6. Payment of balance of arrears to be made on or before 1st November, 1920.
- ⑤ 7. Tenants to bear expense of agreements.
- ⑥ 8. Tenants to keep houses in reasonable repair and condition after property is handed over to them.
- ⑦ 9. Tenants to have option of clearing off instalments on paying a lump sum equal to redemption value.

Paragraph no. 9 not to be inserted in agreement except with advice of Solicitor.

Gentlemen,

I beg to submit the following Report
for the Half Year ended the 30th September, 1920.

Roads.

Owing to the heavy traffic of military
and other lorries, and the discontinuance of the
Railway services, the roads in the District, especially
the main Roads have been seriously affected for
the worse and in consequence a greater quantity
of metal than has hitherto been applied will
be required for next Halfyear's upkeep.

About 330 tons of stone are ready for
application but they cannot be laid on until
the Road Roller is supplied ^{which} I am informed
by the Deputy County Surveyor is idle owing to
the Coal Shortage. I think if a small supply
of coal, sufficient to take the Roller from
Donegal to Bundoran were provided, the coal
necessary for the working of the Roller in this

District could be obtained.

Water Supply. The main Pipe which was leaking near the Intake has been repaired and the pressure kept up fairly well during the Summer months. Gravel washed down from the mountain is still accumulating and at the first opportunity ought to be removed.

Sewers:— The Sewerage System worked well except at one point near Marathon Lodge where it got blocked. The obstruction was removed and all the public sewers are now in a satisfactory state.

Scavenging:— The main Roads have been very well attended to, and as far as Chaulinies is concerned give satisfaction.

It would be desirable that the dumping of unsightly refuse were prevented from taking place in prominent parts in the District.

Main Road. The quantity of metal supplied for Contract no. 20 main Road no. 20— from Protestant Church to Danville Gate— is short by Seventy seven tons. The Contractor has promised to make up the deficiency in a month.

Contract no. 22. Seven tons of metal are deficient on Contract no. 22. Road from Bundoran to Kinlough but these will be ready before Roller arrives.

I regret that in consequence of some metal not having been up to the required standard of specification, I was compelled to reject it.

The good price given by the Council for the metal should be an encouragement to providers to supply the best quality.

① I recommend that payments be made to Contractor

My other recommendations are as follows:—

- ② To keep in repair all district roads by direct labour till year ending 31st March 1922, except those in Contract.
- ③ To keep in repair the main Road between Bundoran Bridge and Urban Boundary in Fenner by direct labour from 1st day of April 1921 to 31st day of March 1922.

My Estimate for maintaining the Public Works in the District for the ensuing Financial Year ending 31st March, 1922 is set forth hereunder:—

My estimate is based on the assumption that the work of maintenance in most cases

will be done by direct labour.

The provision of a quarry from which to obtain a supply of suitable road stone is a matter requiring urgent consideration as also the rate of wages to be paid to employees.
