In the chair; Councillor J. M. Judge  
 other Councillors present were: - Messrs John Carty, Vice  
 Chairman; Patrick Connolly; John J. Harte; Jas Murphy  
 and Thomas O'Gorman.

Unemployment

Chairman explained that the meeting was summoned  
 to consider the question of unemployment so rife in the  
 district and the prevailing distress in consequence.

He adverted to the lack of fuel and advocated applying  
 for coal and timber as has been done by several other councils,  
 in case a considerable number of the public thought it advis-  
 able. The grants administered are subscribed by the people  
 and he thought that each district in need should get its  
 due proportion.

Councillor Carty said that the people wanted work and  
 not doles of coal and railroad sleepers.

Councillor O'Gorman said that the money paid out in  
 doles should be applied to productive work. The towns



of Ballyshannon and Bundoran pay annually over £1200 in Road Tax and he believed they were not getting their due proportion for upkeep of roads.

Proposed by Councillor J. Barty, Vice Chairman, seconded by Councillor P. Connolly, and resolved:-

"That we hereby desire to impress upon the Government the urgent necessity that exists for the relief of unemployment in this District, which is now industrial and depends solely on the profits made from Tourist Traffic.

Grant of £2000

We further wish to point out that during the past five years, Tourist Traffic has been negligible and the Fishing Industry has become practically extinct. We therefore ask that a Grant of £2000 be made available for the relief of unemployment to be expended on works of public utility in the District."

The Chairman, Councillor O'Gorman, and the Clerk were appointed to interview Major Smyth, T.D with the object of having the matter brought before the proper Government Department.

Clerk was directed not to proceed in connection with the matter till after interview with Major Smyth, after which application be made for the grant.

It was suggested that the grant be expended on the making of a road round the cliffs from Finner to connect with the Strand Road near Public Shelter.

Councillor O'Gorman proposed, Councillor Harte seconded the following proposition which was passed:-

Lough Melvin Road

That this Council request the Revenue Commissioners to declare the Road round Lough Melvin running through Belleek Co. Fermanagh to be open to Tourist Traffic.

The Chairman said that he had received a communication on the subject of offering evidence at the Boundary Commission.

Boundary Commission

Proposed by Councillor John Barty seconded by Councillor J. O'Gorman and passed:-

"That our Chairman represent this Council on the Boundary Commission."

Local Elections

From Department of Local Government & Public Health dated 11th Feb, 1925 enclosing copy of Circular No. F.4229/25 of same date addressed to each County Secretary on the subject of the postponement of Local Government Elections.

Local Taxation

From same Department No. S. 6410/1925 dated 16/2/25 approving of Council's proposal to appoint the same person to the office of Poor rate and Town Rate Collector.

From same Department, dated 13/2/25 relative to grants payable to Urban Councils in aid of local Taxation.

In reply to Councillor O'Gorman, Clerk stated that no Agricultural Grant had been received from the County Council since 31st March 1920, and that there was now due £225 to the Urban Council, but owing to non payment of land purchase annuities this sum will be materially reduced.

Apply for Agricultural Grant

Council agreed that the Local Taxation Account was liable for the full amount due the Urban Council and directed Clerk to apply to the County Council for £225 the full amount.

From same Department G. 8222/25 dated 24/2/25 returning draft advertisement in connection with appointment of Rate Collector.

Water Pipe Compensation

Clerk stated he had advertisement published as amended.

From Mr. P. E. Rogers, Solicitor, dated 7/3/25 stating that compensation for damage to water pipe had been paid and enclosing Paying Order for £63.4.9. for



same of which sum £6.6.3 is for costs and expenses  
 From Tircovall County Council requesting payment  
 of a sum of £720-5-5 in respect of three instalments of  
 Annual Estimate + Demand for year ending March 1925  
 Ordered that two instalments amounting to £480-3-8  
 be paid, as owing to non payment of the Agricultural Grant  
 for the last five years the Council is unable to pay the  
 full amount demanded.

From Ballyshannon Rural District Council dated 19<sup>th</sup>  
 February 1925 requesting payment of a sum of £73.19.10  
 amount due in respect of transferred rateable cottages  
 to ~~the~~ Council made no order.

Appointment of Collector of Rates.

Application from Peter Daly, Ross Bundoran for position  
 of Rate Collector was read. Application dated 28/2/25  
 Application dated 23-2-25 from James Nicholson  
 Bundoran, W. E. was read.

Both applicants stated that in case the Council  
 decided to re-appoint the former Rate Collector, Mr.  
 Michael Mulhern, they would withdraw their applications  
 Clerk read copy of advertisement for Rate Collector  
 as published in the "Donegal Democrat" newspaper.

Mr M. Mulhern who was present stated that he had  
 paid a large amount of rates for defaulters in order  
 to qualify for his poundage fees, that he found it im-  
 possible to collect either Rent or Rates during the  
 trouble and having disposed of his property, had now no  
 means of living. He had 22 years service as Collector

Council decided to postpone the appointment of  
 a collector of Rates till the 20<sup>th</sup> March, 1925 and  
 directed Clerk in the meantime to ask the Local  
 Government Ministry to sanction Mr. Mulhern's re-  
 appointment and in case the Ministry does not give  
 its sanction to ask whether this Council will be  
 allowed to give him a pension or gratuity.

Proposed by councillor Pat. Connolly seconded  
 by councillor Hart, and passed:-

That this Council will support any application

#### Roads.

At last Half yearly meeting it was arranged  
that contracts be let only for one year, so that all road  
contracts will expire on 31st March, 1926.

Under the Local Government Act, 1925, roads in an Urban District  
are classified as Main Roads and Urban Roads. The maintenance  
and construction of all Main Roads in a County shall be the duty of  
the County Council, except the Minister by Order directs otherwise.

The constantly increasing heavy motor traffic continues to  
further damage the roads, and it is evident that the present methods  
of construction and maintenance are not sufficient to meet the  
heavy strain imposed. All the Main Roads were steam rolled  
at end of last year, and in many places potholes have begun to appear.  
These have been filled with gravel from the sea shore with only  
partial success.

It is probable that when these roads are taken over by the  
County Council, new methods of upkeep will be adopted.

The Urban Roads are in good order and at present require  
very little attention.

The amount of metal rolled in since last Half Yearly meeting  
is as follows:— Main Road 653 tons Urban Roads 167 tons.

To this must be added 640 tons provided by means of the Trunk  
Road Grant which was totally expended.

Water Supply

A good pressure was maintained throughout the past half year. As the ~~number~~ number of service pipes from the Main Supply Pipe increases, there will be more necessity for supervision, in order to prevent waste, and it is highly probable that as in the near future steps must be taken to by some means supplement the supply.

The Intake requires attention and the "Horse Shoe" requires to be emptied of gravel. It would be well if the Filter Bed was cleansed before the Summer drought. I would recommend that at least Fifteen pounds be expended on the necessary works.

Sewers.

There was very little trouble with the Main Sewers, All the Sludge from Septic Tank was removed and it is now working well.

Some drainage ordered to be done by private persons is now in operation. I recommend the following payments to be made To William Doherty, Contractor the sum of Seven pounds sixteen shillings and nine pence (£7-19-9) in respect of supply of 27 tons Road metal under Contract No. 33 main Road.

To John J. Doherty, Contractor, the sum of Seventeen pounds seven shillings and three pence (£17-7-3) for supply of 56 tons road metal under Contract No. 36 District Roads.

It will be necessary to apply for use of the Inconail County Council Road Roller so that arrangements may be made to have it in operation towards the end of the year.

I would consider it desirable that a suitable quarry for Road stone be acquired or rented by the Council.
