Proposed by Councillor Thomas O'Gorman, seconded by Councillor John Barty and unanimously resolved that we consider the increase of salary which the Minister for Local Government and Public Health, is prepared, according to terms of letter dated 1st August 1925, to sanction to Mr. E. Daly, Clerk of this Council and Town Surveyor, is totally inadequate, having regard to the fact that no bonus has been granted in respect of his offices, and seeing that the maximum salary proposed is far below half the average of the salaries of Clerks and Town Surveyors of Urban District Councils. We further desire to express the opinion that the present salary of fifteen shillings and four pence per week received by the Town Surveyor is not at all commensurate with Mr. Daly's qualifications and the extent of his duties and we therefore request that the increase proposed in the resolution unanimously passed at our Council meeting of 7th April 1924 and at subsequent meetings be sanctioned by the Minister.

Letter from Department of Local Government and Public Health No. 9.36171/25, dated 10/8/25 stating that there is no reason why the Solicitor should await

The Report of Town Surveyor for Half Year ended 30th September, 1925 was read as follows:-

To the Chairman and members of Bundoran Urban District Council.

Dear Sirs,

I have to submit the following report on the Public Works in the Urban District of Bundoran for the Half Year ended 30th September, 1925.

All Road Contracts in the district expire on 31st March, 1926, so that the Council from that date will be in a position to adopt any method of Urban Road maintenance which they may consider most economical.

As before pointed out, all roads in Urban Districts will, under the Local Government Act 1925 be classified as main Roads and Urban Roads.

Main Roads according to this Act are those which the Minister for Local Government and Public Health declares to be main Roads.

Heavy motor traffic, which is increasing daily continues to damage the roads and the cost of upkeep increases in proportion and even with constant attention a satisfactory road surface is not obtained.

It is quite evident that the change in the nature of the traffic will require a change in the methods of construction and repair of roads.

The prolonged drought during the summer months in many places caused the road metal to rise and make the surface uneven

Numerous pot holes formed, and though these were filled with broken rock and gravel the surface could not be made uniform, but on the whole comparatively speaking the roads in the district may be classified as fair.

The quantity of metal now ready for application is 297 tons. This quantity is exclusive of the metal now being prepared for work in connection with the Trunk Road Grant.

The cost of material and work of filling the pot holes on the main Road amounted to £1483. The Urban Roads require to be ledged and side drains scoured.

The retaining wall on the South side of main Road near Bundoran Bridge is cracked and bulged out in two places.

Speed Limit and Road Closing Enquiry

An enquiry relative to motor speed and the proposed closing of Bliff Road to mechanically propelled vehicles was held in August last, but no report has yet been received by Council.

Trunk Road Grant

The allocation of £300 for Trunk Road Improvement in the District was approved of, but no money has been yet received by Council.

Local Government Act 1925.

I have to point out that under the terms of the Local Government Act 1925, the maintenance and construction of all County and main Roads shall be the duty of the Council of such County, and that on the application of the County Council the Minister for Local Government and Public Health may by order direct that the Council of an urban district is to construct or maintain all or any of the main Roads in such urban district.

Water Supply.

The long standing drought coupled with the great quantity of water consumed in the summer months to supply the great number of visitors, caused the

Councillor Dr Flood recommended that the grounds be acquired by agreement if possible. If taken compulsorily a public inquiry may be necessary and both Council and owners must abide by Arbitrator's Award.

Councillor Ryan suggested that an additional field should be acquired.

Councillor Harte informed Council that the fields at present were let on the eleven months system.

After much discussion, on the motion of Councillor Jas O'Gorman Chairman seconded by Councillor Francis Nathan the following resolution was passed:-

"That we hereby direct our Clerk to instruct Mr. P. E. Rogers, Solicitor, Ballyshannon, to take the necessary legal steps to acquire either compulsorily or by agreement, the lands on the Hamilton Estate, Bundoran, known as the Priests Field, the Long Field, the Big meadow, and the site of the disused Right of Way, more particularly delineated on the Ordnance map now before the Council and bordered blue, for purposes of a Public Recreation Ground and Public Health."
