LEC 26/05 CONSIDERATION OF THE MINUTES OF LETTERKENNY ELECTORAL AREA COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON 21st MARCH 2005.

On the proposal of Cllr. Dessie Larkin and seconded by Cllr. Gerry Crawford the Minutes of Letterkenny Electoral Area Committee Meeting held on 21st March 2005 were agreed.

LEC 27/05 PLANNING & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

27.01 Fairways Estate

Frank Sweeney informed Committee that the Developer had advised him that works would soon to be carried out on the footpath along the R 245 and on the shelterbelt between rear of some of the houses and the Golf Course. Pat Gillespie advised the Committee that drainage works are to be completed to allow the Developer of the Fairways to construct a footpath on the Tara Court side of the road to meet the existing footpath at Kirchoff.

27.02 Ballymacool

Frank Sweeney advised the Committee that as no work had been carried out since the Enforcement Notice had been served that the Council would be referring the matter to the Council Solicitor for follow up.

27.03 Cathedral Hill, Raphoe

Frank Sweeney informed the Committee that the Developer is currently working with the Roads Section and progress is being made. He emphasised that the Developer had been informed that Phase III of the Development could not go ahead until the outstanding issue regarding the levels of the houses in Phase II had been resolved to the Councils satisfaction. Following a query from Cllr Tony McDaid, Frank Sweeney stated that the Developer would have to apply for retention of the houses in Phase II, as the levels weren't in accordance with the approved drawings. It was agreed that Frank Sweeney would advise the Members of any proposals agreed in relation to Cathedral Hill and arrange to meet existing residents.

27.04 Highland Drive, Foxhills

Cllr Dessie Larkin raised the issue of the new development at Highland Drive and asked that Planning Section ensure that Roads and services are completed properly.

Cllr Larkin also requested that the Litter Warden for the area visit the R.O.W. adjoining the site as it was being used for illegal dumping.

27.05 **Hillview**

Cllr Dessie Larkin queried whether the Developer at Hillview had been approached regarding the state of the road at Lismonaghan, as residents were disillusioned as development was continuing.

Pat Gillespie in reply stated that a meeting was being arranged and he would keep the Members updated.

27.06 **Carolina Park**

Cllr Dessie Larkin asked to be advised of the current situation with regard to the sub-division of dwelling at Carolina Park.

27.07 **Pluck, Manorcunningham**

The Members requested that the Council ensure that Planning conditions in respect of Liam Doherty who is currently developing lands at Pluck, are fully complied with.

27.08 **Ard na Mealla, St Johnston**

Following a query from Cllr Gerry Crawford regarding the erection of a boundary fence between the estate at Ard Na Mealla and the private residents alongside it, Frank Sweeney agreed to check the Planning Conditions and revert back to the Committee.

27.09 **St Jude's Court**

Cllr Gerry Crawford raised the issue of the public lights at St Jude's Court as required by the Planning Conditions.

Frank Sweeney agreed to investigate the matter and advise the Committee.

27.10 **Lands at Lifford Common- Expressions of Interest**

The Committee considered the report that was circulated with the Agenda seeking the approval of the Members to proceed to advertise for Expressions of Interest from Developers wishing to develop a site at lands at Lifford Common.

A Preliminary Masterplan was also circulated outlining the various uses that could be accommodated i.e. residential, commercial, enterprise development and social/recreational.

The Members welcomed the proposal and on the proposal of Cllr Gerry Crawford seconded by Cllr Tony Mc Daid the Committee recommended that the Council proceed to request Expressions of Interest from Developers wishing to develop a site on this land, subject to the Masterplan being put out to public consultation for a period first.

Cllr Jimmy Harte requested that the future maintenance of lands designated as football pitches are clarified.

The Committee requested an update regarding the Lifford Local Area Plan.

27.11 **Planning Statistics at 31/03/05**

The Committee considered the contents of the report on Planning Statistics up to 31/03/05, which was circulated with the Agenda.

27.12 **Consideration of Recent Refusals**

The Committee considered the report on applications refused since the last meeting, which was circulated with the Agenda.

Cllr Gerry Crawford sought clarification as to when “Refusal” was issued in respect of 04/6516. Frank Sweeney agreed to check this out and to advise Cllr Crawford.

27.13 **Unauthorised Signage**

Cllr Dessie Larkin commended the Council on the removal of illegal signs but felt that B & B signs should be treated differently and queried whether or not a policy was in place regarding it.

Frank Sweeney in reply stated that he would check on this and revert back to the Committee.

LEC 28/05 **HOUSING & SOCIAL SERVICES**

28.01 **Central Heating Programme 2005**

Patsy Lafferty informed the Committee that tenders have now been sought and received and it is intended to start works as soon as possible after Department approval is received. The Members will be updated at the next Electoral Area Meeting.

28.02 **Remedial Works/Regeneration Programme 2005**

Patsy Lafferty informed the Committee that funding is now available from the Department under the Social and Affordable Action Plan to regenerate older estates. This is in addition to the Central Heating Programme.

The type of works that qualify include:

- Insulation, lagging of hot water tanks
- Rewiring, installation of smoke detectors
- Replacement of single glazed windows, timber fascia and soffit, older kitchen units, bathroom suites and cookers if required
- External painting, assessment of chimneys etc
- Upgrading footpaths, roads, lanes, drainage etc if required

Patsy Lafferty felt that it would be appropriate to carry out the regeneration Programme in conjunction with the Central Heating Programme if possible to reduce inconvenience to tenants and to get best value for money.

The Committee recommended that an application for funding be prepared for the necessary works at the following locations: -

- St Eunan's Tce, Raphoe
- Dr McGinley Rd, Letterkenny
- Old Scheme, Ballindrait
- Fr Arnold Tce, Manorcunningham
- Corkey, Manorcunningham/ Letterkenny Road, Lifford

It was noted that only schemes that still have houses on rent are eligible and in this regard Corkey may not meet the eligibility criteria.

It was also noted that the final works carried out will depend on the actual allocation received and if the money available does not cover all of the dwellings it is proposed to commence at number one above and prioritise accordingly.

Cllr Tony McDaid requested that the tenancy of a particular house on Fr Arnold Terrace be checked as it may be occupied for short periods only, when individual houses are approved under Remedial Works/ Regeneration Programme 2005.

28.03 Voluntary Housing Application

Patsy Lafferty informed the Committee that an application had been received from the Donegal Domestic Violence Service to develop a Women's Refuge at Oldtown, Letterkenny comprising of 4 Crisis/ Homeless Sheltered Units and 2 second stage houses. The proposed location is on Council land where the Department recently approved another Voluntary Scheme by Respond Housing Association.

On the proposal of Cllr Tony Mc Daid seconded by Cllr Gerry Crawford the Committee recommended that the Council make a site available for this project on this land and that a Section 183 Notice be presented at a future meeting when the exact area of land required has been finalised. The Committee also recommended that any proposal should include recreational facilities that will be of the highest standard due to its proximity to the River Swilly.

28.04 Turnkey Development

Cllr Gerry Crawford requested that a meeting be arranged with the objector of the Royal Ford Turnkey at Raphoe and ascertain and cost her requirements.

Cllr Crawford also asked to be advised of the situation with regards to the proposed Turnkey Development at St Johnston due to the critical housing need

In St Johnston.

28.05 **Affordable Housing**

The Members requested that the Council examine ways of advertising Affordable Housing to prospective clients and of keeping all interested applicants on a separate database.

The Members felt that the Council should consider advertising for expressions of interest for Affordable Housing.

28.06 **Non – Resident Fathers**

Cllr Tony McDaid raised the issue of the problems encountered by the non-resident fathers in being allocated housing and felt that a review of the Scheme of Letting Priorities was required to address this issue.

28.06 **S.I. Cottage**

Cllr Dessie Larkin requested an update on S I 40003 for Joseph McGinty, Glenmaquin.

28.07 **Traveller Accommodation Programme 2004-2008**

The Committee considered a report prepared by Fergus McAteer, Traveller Accommodation Officer that was circulated with the Agenda regarding the Halting Site located at the Big Isle, Manorcunningham that was opened in 2001 as part of an Emergency Plan of Action for the Provision of Traveller Accommodation.

This site is now being considered as a potential Permanent Transient Site and he sought approval to advance this proposal to Public Consultation. This is consistent with commitment given that any change in status of sites would only be completed following public consultation.

Some of the members were opposed to this proposal but were in agreement that it should go to public consultation.

On the proposal of Cllr Dessie Larkin seconded by Cllr Tony McDaid the Committee accepted the recommendation as presented, i.e. Members approval to allow progression to the next stage of public consultation and amendment to Development Plans.

LEC 29/05 WATER, ENVIRONMENT & EMERGENCY SERVICES

The Committee considered the Progress Report dated 16th May 2005, which was circulated with the Agenda (Appendix 1)

29.01 **Dangerous Building, Lifford**

The Committee was advised that works on the removal of the roof in question were ongoing.

This was welcomed by the Members who thanked all staff involved in bringing it to this conclusion. Cllr Tony McDaid requested that the cost of the remedial action carried out by the residents in relation to this dangerous building and the cost to the Council of legal proceedings and delays incurred be examined and investigated to determine if the process can be improved in the future.

29.02 **Coolatee Sewerage Scheme**

Cllr Gerry Crawford asked that the odour problems with the Coolatee Sewerage Scheme be investigated and also the issue of raw sewage running onto a field.

Con Mc Laughlin agreed to contact Cllr Crawford on the matter.

29.03 **Glenmaquin G.W.S.S.**

Cllr Dessie Larkin requested an update on the situation regarding Glenmaquin GWSS when a response has been received from the Group. Con Mc Laughlin agreed to advise Cllr Larkin when a reply had been received from the Group.

Cllr Tony McDaid sought clarification on whether or not there were any dwellings between the proposed Glenmaquin GWSS and the proposed Meengorry GWSS that will not be accommodated by either Scheme. Jim Hyland agreed to examine the matter and to contact Cllr Mc Daid.

29.04 **Ballinabreen G.W.S.S.**

The Committee recommended that the Roads and Water, Environment and Emergency Services liase in regards to Road Restoration at Ballinabreen Group Water Supply Scheme which may be included in 2006 Roadworks Programme.

29.05 **Raphoe Water Problem**

Cllr Jimmy Harte raised the issue of the lack of water in Raphoe over the weekend and was informed by Jim Hyland that there is a major leak in the area and Council staff was working on finding the leak at present.

The Members requested that the Council consider tankering water to the area in the event of a long delay in identifying the leak.

29.06 **Letterkenny Water Supply**

29.06.1 **Lough Greenan**

The members requested an update on the situation with regard to the development of Lough Greenan.

29.07 **Kerbside Recycling**

A copy of the Press Release issued by the Waste Awareness Officer on 03/05/05 was circulated with the Agenda which stated that Donegal County Council would be withdrawing from the collection of paper and plastic for recycling in the Letterkenny area on 28/05/05 to coincide with the continued roll out of the Kerbside Collection of dry recyclables from householders in Letterkenny.

The report proceeded to advise that all Waste Collectors in Donegal were now introducing a Kerbside Collection of mixed dry recyclables including paper, cardboard, plastic and cans and that paper and plastic facilities will be withdrawn from other Bring Bank Facilities elsewhere in the County over the coming months.

Cllr Dessie Larkin declared his dissatisfaction with this Report, particularly the fact that the Recycling Facilities at the old Fire Station site in Letterkenny were to be discontinued. Cllr Larkin stated that this could not be allowed to happen, as the cost to the consumer of having the extra bin collected would be at the same rate as the ordinary bin. He was of the opinion that illegal dumping would increase as a result.

These concerns were expressed by the other Members also and even though the whole concept of Kerbside Recycling was welcomed they felt that there was no need to withdraw the existing services. The Recycling facilities should be available to people who do not have a Refuse Collection service and the incentive of cost saving for those who recycle should be retained when Kerbside Collection is introduced.

Con McLaughlin stated, in reply, that the Bring Bank sites were just to increase awareness of the need for Recycling prior to the Kerbside Collection being introduced. He said he would take the concerns of the Members on board and report these to his superiors.

Cllr Larkin requested that a response would issue to the invitation to visit a state of the art Recycling Centre that had been received by the Council.

The Committee recommended that the existing facilities at the Old Fire Station be kept open until alternative facilities are made available and also that a meeting be arranged with the relevant officials in relation to the proposal to close the existing facilities. Con Mc Laughlin pointed out that this site did not have Planning Approval and to keep it open would be in breach of the law.

29.08 **Major Capital Projects**

The Committee considered the Report on Major Capital Projects, which was circulated with the agenda.

29.09 **Small Capital Schemes**

The Committee considered the Report on Small Capital Schemes, which was circulated with the Agenda.

29.10 **Serviced Land Initiative Schemes**

The Committee considered the Report on Serviced Land Initiative Schemes, which was circulated with the Agenda.

29.11 **Group Water Schemes**

The Committee considered the Report on Group Water Schemes, which was circulated with the Agenda

LEC 30/05 **ROADS & TRANSPORTATION**

30.01 **Welcome**

Cllr Jimmy Harte, on behalf of the Committee, welcomed Ronnie Sayers, Executive Engineer to the Meeting and wished him well in his new post.

30.02 **Report on Roads Workshop**

On the proposal of Cllr Dessie Larkin, seconded by Cllr Gerry Crawford the Report on the Roads Workshop held on 31/03/05 was agreed.

30.03 **Maintenance Programme 2005**

Pat Gillespie circulated a handout detailing the maintenance estimate for the Letterkenny area for 2005, which clearly showed that there would be over expenditure on both the Letterkenny and Raphoe Roads Overseers Areas. Mr Gillespie stated that in order to cut back on expenditure over the coming months it would be necessary to cut back on street cleaning or filling potholes. This suggestion was declared unacceptable by the Members who stated that the state of the roads are deteriorating due to lack of maintenance and if this is allowed to continue it will create even greater problems.

The Committee recommended in the interim that Council continue to repair potholes and keep up the existing level of street cleaning during the summer months and defer during the Autumn and re-examine the allocation of the remaining monies in September.

Mr Gillespie agreed to examine that possibility of moving monies from the Autumn period to the Summer months but stressed that he could not work outside the allocated budget.

Mr Gillespie advised that the main problem was in the Letterkenny allocation, as it hadn't been increased for the past number of years. He pointed out that the current system of allocating Road Maintenance monies on a road mileage basis rather than on a road usage basis reduces the amount of money available to the Letterkenny E.A.

Cllr Gerry Crawford suggested that a Meeting be held prior to the next Budget with the Director of Roads and the County Manager to discuss the situation and that additional allocation be requested for Street Sweeping and General Maintenance for the Letterkenny Electoral Area. The Committee supported this suggestion.

30.04 **Ramelton Road, Letterkenny**

The Committee recommended that the section of the road at Tara Court be included for upgrading in 2006 if funding did not allow this work to take place in 2005.

Pat Gillespie stated that Crash Barriers would be erected on the southern side of the R 245 along the boundary of Elmwood Downs and Barnhill Park. The provision of a Crash Barrier along Elmwood Downs will not leave enough width for a footpath along that side of the road. It is now proposed that the footpath will be provided by the Developer of the Fairways on the northern side of the R 245 (Tara Court Side) The Council will carry out some drainage works prior to commencement of construction of the footpath.

The Committee recommend that Road Design prepare designs for the junctions at Carolina House and Magherenan.

30.05 **N56 Mountain Top to Illistrin Project**

Pat Gillespie circulated a Project Update to the effect that the Donegal NRDO had received approval from the NRA to proceed to tender for the Mountain Top to Illistrin Road Realignment Phase 1 Construction Contract.

Adverts inviting Contractors to Tender for the project had been sent to the Newspapers to be published week-ending 20/05/05.

The tenders should be returned on 01/07/05 and a contract start date is anticipated for August/September 2005. It is expected that expenditure on the project this year will be in the region of €3.5m. A report on the completion of the remaining 3.3 km length of this project is being reviewed and it is currently hoped to issue a tender for that work in 2006.

30.06 **Non National Bridges Programme 2005**

The Committee considered and agreed the Countywide Priority Lists for Major Bridge Works and Bridge Strengthening Works that was circulated with the Agenda (Appendix 2 Attached)

Cllr Gerry Crawford asked that Swilly Bridge, Porthall be included under Major Bridge Works.

30.07 **Special Speed Limits**

The Committee considered the Guidelines for the Application of Special Speed Limits that were circulated with the agenda.

The Committee were informed that an application to reduce the speed limit at Lurgyback School had been submitted to Road Design to be analysed and that a report would be brought back to the Committee. The Committee recommended that a similar application be submitted for Magherabeg School.

30.08 **LIS Workshop**

It was agreed that the L.I.S Workshop be held in the County House, Lifford on the 24/05/05 at 10.30am after the Development Charges Meeting.

LEC 31/05 **COMMUNITY CULTURAL AND ENTERPRISE SERVICES**

31.01 **Play Facilities**

Aideen Doherty informed the Committee that of the 70 Expressions of Interest, which had been received from throughout the county with 32 full applications, since received, 3 Groups in the Letterkenny Electoral Area were now capable of providing the requirements.

The Committee recommended the following priority:

1. Letterkenny-Glenwood Park
2. Lifford-Clonleigh
3. Letterkenny-Gartan Field

Following queries from the Committee, Ms Doherty stated that No 1 on the list would be completed this year costing approximately €70,000 which includes providing safety surfacing and play equipment.

The Committee acknowledged the work being done by the Residents Associations and the Tenant Liaison Officers.

31.02 **Donegal Diaspora Initiative**

The Committee considered An Update Report on the Donegal Diaspora Initiative which was circulated with the agenda. The aim of the project is to create a broader Donegal Community at home and abroad and the main aim of which is to create a virtual community of Donegal natives both nationally and internationally by utilising the Information Technology available.

31.03 **North West Film Archive**

The Committee was informed that this is currently at the mid-stage of production and further material is still being sought.

The Committee asked that they be kept informed on progress made.

31.04 **Gender Focus Group**

Cllr Tony McDaid expressed his disappointment that the Gender Focus Group has not received funding for the Officer post and was concerned that the issue of urging women to get involved with such projects would fail if positions weren't being refilled.

Aideen Doherty confirmed that funding was still a major problem and that Claire Mulhall was providing support in the interim.

31.05 **Youth Council**

Cllr Jimmy Harte welcomed Brigid Tunney and Mary Duddy, Members of the Youth Council to the Meeting.

The Youth Councilors circulated a Report to the Committee outlining the:

- Meeting with Lough Swilly Bus to discuss the ongoing deteriorating conditions of the school buses.
- Donegal Youth Audit which was designed to enhance the capabilities of the Youth Councilors through the provision of training on research methodologies and approaches.
- HSE Booklet on alcohol for parents of teenagers.
- Representation by the Youth Council on North West Alcohol Forum, Finn Valley Alliance for positive Mental health and Donegal Local Development Company.

The insurance issue regarding the development of parks was also raised and Cllr Dessie Larkin agreed that a process would need to be initiated to provide parks for our young people.

Cllr Tony McDaid stated how important it is to see the Youth Council involved in Mental Health project and representation on the Donegal Youth Service Board should also be investigated. He also suggested that Lifeskills Training and Self Esteem training should be included on the School Curriculum.

The Members thanked the representatives for their input and wished them well on the projects to hand.

ROLL OUT OF KERBSIDE RECYCLING BINS IN LETTERKENNY.

To coincide with the continued roll out of the Kerbside Collection of Dry Recyclables from householders in Letterkenny, Donegal County Council will be withdrawing from the collection of paper and plastic for recycling in the Letterkenny area on the last weekend of May 2005. The Bring Bank facility at the Old Fire Station site at the High Road, Letterkenny will be closing on Saturday 28th May 2005.

Donegal County Council's Waste Management Plan sets targets for recycling that can only be met by extensive kerbside collection directly from households across the county. The diversion of 50% of all household waste away from landfill is a National target and is a target contained in our Waste Management Plan. The paper and plastic recycling facilities were introduced into Bring Banks as an interim measure to create awareness and develop a practice of recycling in the county. This objective has been achieved. The current level of recycling activities in Letterkenny has outgrown the capacity of the Bring Bank facility. In future paper and plastic for recycling will be collected from your kerbside by your local waste collector, in conjunction with other mixed dry recyclables.

All waste collectors in Donegal are now introducing a kerbside collection of mixed dry recyclables to their customers. This service is a collection of recyclable materials such as paper, cardboard, plastic and cans. Your waste collector will provide you with a list of materials that will be accepted for recycling. It is extremely important that all materials are clean and dry.

Please contact your own waste collector directly for an additional wheeled bin or sack. This bin or sack will be used to store and collect the recyclable materials. Each collector will provide their customers with collection dates and charges.

The successful roll out of kerbside recycling is the most efficient and effective method of capturing good quality materials for recycling and achieving our target of diverting 50% of household waste away from landfill.

Paper and plastic facilities will be withdrawn from other Bring Bank facilities elsewhere the county over the coming months, as kerbside collection is rolled out county-wide. Separate announcements will be made in advance of withdrawal of these facilities.

Donegal County Council will be continuing their waste awareness campaign, with particular emphasis on the roll out of the kerbside collection of recyclables in the coming months.

DEADLINE 28th MAY 2005:

Saturday 28th May will be the final day that the Recycling Site at the High Road, Letterkenny will be operational. Householders are urged to contact their Waste Collector immediately to order the additional bins for recycling. The following Waste Collectors operate in the Letterkenny area:
