ELECTION OF CHAIRPERSON

Cllr Denis Mc Gonagle thanked all the Members and Officials for their cooperation during his time as Chairman.

Each Councillor thanked and paid tribute to Cllr. Mc Gonagle for the manner and fairness in which he conducted meetings during his term of office.

On the proposal of Cllr. Francis Conaghan and seconded by Cllr. Bernard McGuinness, Cllr. Pdraig MacLochlainn was unanimously elected as Chairperson of the IEAC for the year 2005/2006. There were no other nominations for the position.

Cllr MacLochlainn thanked fellow Councillors for his election and paid tribute to the outgoing Chairperson. The issue regarding representation of Buncrana Town Council at the Electoral Area Meeting was raised, in that Cllr MacLochlainn as Mayor of the Town Council and Chairperson sought agreement on a representative from the Town Council deputising in place of the Mayor.

Cllr McGuinness stated that it was a statutory regulation that only the elected Mayor of a Town Council attends the meetings and he was also opposed to the minutes of E.A. meetings being forwarded.

Cllr. Conaghan outlined the position that occurred at previous electoral area meetings where a similar situation arose he asked that the regulation in relation to same be checked.

Eunan Kelly confirmed that the Regulation's allow a Chairperson /Mayor to attend and that there is no provision for a deputy to attend when the Mayor is already a member of an Electoral Area Committee.

It was agreed on a proposal by Cllr McGuinness and seconded by Cllr. Donaghy that a meeting takes place twice a year between the members of the Town Council and the Inishowen Electoral Area Committee.

€10,000 be used for White Strand, which would leave €40,000 for the Erosion Study and monitoring. The balance could be funded from maintenance funding.

Cllr. McGuinness stated that he was 100% behind the idea of a bursary and cited that Culdaff beach whilst not presently under threat; the time to take action was now. It was noted that beach parties were being advertised which endangered the Blue Flag status. Cllr. Donaghy agreed with Cllr McGuinness and highlighted Lisfannon Beach.

Garry Martin advised that the entire bursary funding for the County was €16,000 and suggested that maybe IRDL could co-fund the project.

A long discussion took place regarding the recommendation and the funding the 3 year bursary. The Committee agreed to the recommendation proposed by Vincent Lynn subject to the balance of the funding being identified.

32.2 Portmore Pier

Vincent Lynn informed the meeting that work on Portmore Pier would begin in one week's time.

INISHOWEN E.A. YOUTH COUNCIL:

The Chairman welcomed Mr. Andrew McNulty, Project Officer and Lisa Burns, Youth Councillor for Inishowen EA Youth Council, to the meeting.

Lisa talked about anti-social behaviour amongst the youth of today and outlined several projects, which the Youth Council have and will be involved with in the future.

The Committee thanked Lisa for her presentation and acknowledged that Anti-Social Behaviour was a major problem and a source of concern for everyone. The Committee asked that the Youth Council consider changing the name of the forthcoming conference in September to "Youth Rights & Responsibilities Conference", and also consider meeting parents to discuss their responsibilities as the Committee felt that some young people were in need of parental guidance.

Cllr. Mc Donald stated that the youth were not the only cause of anti-social behaviour, better communications was needed and there was also a major parenting problem, youths needed parental guidance.

Cllr Conaghan stated that he would welcome the Youth Council's views on anti-social behaviour on housing estates, loitering, drinking on greens, noise etc., also what relationship exists between Gardai & Youth and requested that the Youth Council consider making a submission on these issues to the Housing S.P.C.

Cllr MacLochlainn enquired as to the outcome of the meeting between the Gardai and the Youth Council. Andrew McNulty advised that the meeting did not take place as yet.

34.1 Role of Donegal County Council in Directly Supporting the Tourism Sector in County

Garry Martin made a Power point presentation on the Role of Donegal County Council in Directly Supporting Tourism Sector in County (Appendix 2 attached) He explained that the Purpose of the Presentation was to: -

1. Summarise Council's Role in Supporting Tourism in the County
2. Review Investment in 2005 by Council
3. Consider Recent Reviews and Studies (ITIC and DCC)
4. To note the Ongoing Role of North West Tourism and Donegal Tourism Ltd.
5. To consider Key Issues going forward
6. To obtain Initial Feedback for Tourism Workshop September 2005

He also identified a number of Key Issues for consideration: -

- Product
- Flagship(s) required but can Influence/Action Micro-Product (dual purpose local amenity use at sub-county level)
- Funding Possibly Available for Prioritised Actions via
-Council TDF (2005 & Subsequent Years)
- Interreg IIIA (ICBAN Interest)
- Peace II Task Force
- Relevant Leader + Co's (Possibly 2006 Onwards)
- Development Contribution Scheme

He also identified the following Next Steps: -

1. Consideration of Current Policy by Members
2. Preparation for September 2005 Members Workshop
3. Identification/Prioritisation of Potential Actions at Local Electoral Area Level

The Chairman on behalf of the Committee thanked Garry Martin for his detailed presentation.

Cllr. McGuinness outlined the four different groups associated with Tourism in the County and felt there was duplication and that two of the groups could be amalgamated. He also requested a breakdown of the figure of €388,000 allocated to Tourism on a Countywide basis.

He stated that he was embarrassed in regard to the state of the Inishowen 100 roadside grass verge needed cutting and the monies that are being spend on Marinas, Cruise Liners etc. Small festivals were being neglected and needed help regarding insurance costs. The Inishowen 100 was being neglected and not given proper attention in that it brought tourists to the area.

Cllr.McDonald stated that there were no lay-bys or proper signage on the Inishowen 100.

Cllr. Conaghan asked that a meeting be arranged between Mr. Joe Getins National Parks & Wildlife Services and Road personnel to agree funding for car parking at Grianan of Aileach. The road has been closed and a gate put on. The Council needs to promote and encourage development of an Grianan of Aileach and the Interpretive Centre.

The Committee recommended that the following be taken into consideration: -
Status of Proposed Coastal Zone Management Centre for Bunrana

Local market to be catered for as well as tourists including indoor and all-weather activities.

Facilities for young families within a budget and more family friendly activities.

Tourism Accommodation providers to be encouraged to look at their prices.

Angling to be encouraged.

Funding to be provided for access to facilities, e.g. Ballyliffin Golf Club access road.

Disabled Access must be addressed

Finance to be provided for litter control, grass cutting, lay byes, anchorage for yachts

Pat Gillespie agreed to discuss proposals with Councillors regarding the Ballyliffin Golf Club Road.

It was agreed that Garry Martin organise a workshop on in early September.

WATER ENVIRONMENT & EMERGENCY SERVICES

Cllr Conaghan requested that Minute No. 28.2 of the 09th May 2005 be amended to read that he requested the possibility of replacing the watermain between Burnfoot and Bridgend as part of the Lagan Water Supply Scheme, Phase 3 be examined. This was noted and agreed by the Committee.

The Committee considered Progress Report dated 11th July 2005 (Appendix 1), which was circulated with the Agenda.

35.1 Major Capital Projects

Con Mc Laughlin updated the Committee on the Major Capital Programme by means of a Progress Report.

35.1.1 Stoneybridge

Cllr MacLochlainn stated that the Stoneybridge residents now had to take over a Sewerage Treatment Plant, which had not been completed properly by the developer. It was agreed that the planning conditions for the development at Stoneybridge be examined in relation to future maintenance of the Package S.T.W. Plant

Cllr. Conaghan enquired if the County Council had a policy in place that a sewerage plant can connect into the mains when the developer leaves the site and the Council has to take over. He also requested that Vincent Lynn and his staff bring a report to the next Electoral Area meeting giving details as to the estates that have been taken over with Electrical and Mechanical Plants.

35.1.2 Carndonagh W.S.

Cllr. McGonagle stated that he had been informed there was a problem with a wayleave in the Carndonagh Water Supply Scheme and the contractor had stopped work. Con Mc Laughlin agreed to investigate and report back to the members.

35.1.3 West Inishowen W.S.

Cllr. Donaghey stated that the lime in the water was having an adverse effect on household plumbing, and may be causing corrosion in the copper piping in the Buncrana Area. Con Mc Laughlin stated the Water Service had also been made aware of such complaints and these were being examined at present. He indicated that one suggestion from previous similar occurrences was that this may be due to the quality of the copper being used but agreed to investigate and to report to the next meeting.

35.1.4 Lagan Water Supply Scheme

The Committee requested that details of the Water Audit be presented at the next IEAC Meeting and recommended that the replacement of the watermain between Burnfoot and Bridgend be included as part of Phase 111.

35.2 Small Capital & Group Water Schemes

Progress report noted.

35.2 Serviced Land Initiative

Con McLaughlin in his report advised that in regard to the SLI Programme at Bridgend 60% of the costs was required from development. A levy of €3,000 per unit was proposed and agreed to allow a fund to develop towards progressing the SLI.

35.4 WEES Workshop held on 9th May 2005

The Report on the WEES Workshop held on 9th May 2005 was agreed subject to an amendment.

35.5 Malin Town Sewerage Scheme

Cllr McGuinness stated he was unhappy that a report was sent to the D.O.E.H.L.G. that did not include the School and the new Social Housing Scheme as was agreed at the previous meeting.

John McElwaine stated that this was an oversight and could be included when approval for the scheme was received. He also pointed out that if this was submitted now that it could delay approval for the scheme.

The Committee recommended that the School and the proposed Social Housing Scheme be included with the submitted scheme.

John McElwaine to contact the Department to ascertain at what stage the original proposal is at and informally discuss how best to proceed with including the school and the proposed housing estate in the Contract Documents.

35.6 Illegal Dumping

Cllr McDonald informed the meeting that she and local people collected 80 bags of rubbish that was discarded at various locations in Moville over a weekend. People were dumping their rubbish at the Bring Banks etc; she stated that the local community were advocating bringing the discarded rubbish back to the people who dumped it if they could be identified.

Cllr. MacLochlainn stated that the Litter Warden was the person to pursue the polluters by means of fines and court prosecutions if necessary.

Con McLaughlin informed the meeting that as part of the Waste Management Plan, Kerbside collections, along with Civic Amenity Sites was being proposed.

Cllr Donaghy stated that a Civic Amenity Site should be considered for Buncrana due to its population in conjunction with the Town Council. Con Mc Laughlin advised that the C.A.S. in Carndonagh catered for Buncrana.

The Committee recommended that the abandoned car at Newtowncunningham be removed.

35.6.1 Proposed Level 3 Clean Up

Con Mc Laughlin advised that that part of the budget of €22,000 available for a Community led Summer Clean ups, was to be used as in previous years for a 'Level 3' Clean Up of known illegal dump sites. Mr. McLaughlin presented options in this regard drawn up in conjunction with the Litter Warden.

The Committee recommended that the Carrowblagh Site, and the site at Malin Head on the Inishowen 100 be included for a Level 3 Clean Up this year.

Cllr Conaghan proposed that a clear strategy is outlined in relation to the clean up. On a proposal from Cllr. Donaghy and seconded by Cllr, McGuinness it was agreed that the Council should use such clean ups to highlight the problem of illegal dumping and alternative options available to the public for proper disposal of various wastes. Con McLaughlin agreed to organise such a campaign with a Press

Conference held showing before and after photos of the event with the Elected Members in attendance.

35.7 Moville/Greencastle Sewerage Scheme Consultation Forum

John McElwaine distributed draft proposals for the composition of the Consultation Forum with an independent chairperson to be nominated from a list of three people proposed by the Clean Estuary Environmental Group. The residents expressed a wish that the chairperson would be independent from the Council and have a technical knowledge.

The Committee agreed with the proposal subject to the inclusion of the full Inishowen Electoral Area Committee on the Forum. Con McLaughlin Area Manager was also invited to join the Forum but declined indicating that the Capital Design Office staff are running that project which should suffice for DCC's interests. The Committee requested details and the background to the three people proposed to chair the Forum.

35.8 Deputation from Community for a Clean Estuary

Cllr Mac Lochlainn on behalf of the Committee welcomed the Deputation from Community for a Clean Estuary to the meeting. The deputation consisted of
Ms. Rose Kelly (Secretary)
Mr. Enda Craig (Committee Member)
Ms. Sandra McConnell (Resident Carnagrave)

The Deputation made a presentation and circulated a document on their concerns/opposition to the proposed location of the Sewerage Treatment Plant. The Deputation raised a number of issues including the following: -

- Lough Foyle and its environs provide sanctuary and breeding grounds to a myriad of bird species.
- It also provides work in the Fishing Industry.
- It is an area, which is a place of recreation and attracts tourists and holidaymakers, which boosts the local economy.
- Effluent should not be discharged into tidal part of Lough
- The Proposed Site was not included in Public Consultation in 2002
- Properties in vicinity of Proposed S.T.W. will be devalued.

The Deputation also stated that they were in favour of an Independent Chairperson with Technical expertise to chair the meetings of the Consultative Sub Group.

This was followed by a series of questions from each of the Elected Members, which the Deputation responded to.

The Chairman thanked the Deputation for attending the meeting and making their presentation and advised them that replies would issue to them in relation to all the issues raised. The Deputation then left the meeting.

Cllr McGuinness asked why this site was chosen and why the members had not been informed of this decision. He further stated that he was not happy with the Consultants appointed as the same Consultants were involved in the process 15years earlier and it was found that the information they supplied was incorrect and had been discredited.

35.9 Capital Replacement (Restoration) Programme 2005 - Inishowen E.A.

Con Mc Laughlin circulated a Report on the Capital Replacement (Restoration) Programme 2005. On the proposal of Cllr Francis Conaghan seconded by Cllr Denis mc Gonagle the Committee recommended that the following proposed works be carried out:

Burnfoot WS - Upgrade Inch Pumphouse	€14,200
Buncrana SS - Refurbishment of Odour Control Equipment	€14,200
Meendoran - Upgrade Works	€15,300
East Inishowen - Upgrade Works	€6,000
Gleneely - Upgrade Electrical & Civil Works	€24,950
Buncrana WS - 2 Pumps and Telemetry at Hilltown GWSS	€8,000
Culdaff WS - 75 KVA Generator	€18,000

Total €100,650

35.10 Culdaff Beach & Shroove Beach

Cllr Mc Guinness raised the issue of camping in vicinity of Culdaff and Shroove Blue Flag Beaches and the fact that the Blue Flags could be lost next year unless this is prevented.

The Committee recommended that the Council attempt to prevent camping in the vicinity of Culdaff Beach and Shroove Beach as a matter of urgency.

35.11 Fluoridation of Carndonagh Water Supply

The Committee noted the contents of the letter dated 29th June 2005 from the Principal Dental Surgeon, HSE. This letter pointed out that children in the

Inishowen area in particular Carndonagh have higher levels of dental decay than those in most parts of the county and country. The Council were directed in this letter by the Fluoridation Committee to proceed with the utilisation of water fluoridation facilities in existence in Carndonagh.

PLANNING & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

36.1 Barrack Hill

Frank Sweeney gave an update on Barrack Hill and has requested that Patricia McIntyre, Special Projects Officer, attend the next Electoral Area meeting to brief members. He also advised that an Engineer for the Project has not been appointed as yet.

Members were of the opinion that it would be an advantage that a person with local knowledge be appointed as Project Engineer.

On a proposal from Cllr McGuinness and seconded by Cllr McGonigle, the Committee recommended that Council agree to proposal to allow Ms Marner to apply for planning permission on site to be exchanged at Barrack Hill for land for a car park.

36.2 Section 154 Licences

Frank Sweeney informed the Committee that the fees in regard to Licences under Section 154 of the Planning & Development Act 2000 are receipted to Planning.

36.3 Local Area Planning Programme

The Committee considered the report from Gerry Richards, Central Planning Unit requesting that the Committee to prioritise the villages/settlements in the Electoral Area that they wish to be the subject of Local Area Plans. Each Electoral Area has been requested to do this and a programme for county will be agreed.

Members were concerned that housing quotas were being filled very quickly and Cllr McGonagle requested that he be informed regarding the development quota for Clonmany.

On the proposal of Cllr Conaghan and seconded by Cllr. MacLochlainn the Committee recommended the following Priority List for Local Area Plans in Inishowen:

1. Newtowncunningham
2. Carrigans
3. Quigley's Point
4. Culdaff

36.4 Planning Statistics

The members noted Planning Statistics and Recent Refusals.

36.5 Unauthorised Development/ Compliance with Planning Conditions

Frank Sweeney stated that a Dedicated Planning Enforcement Officer would be appointed from existing staff in the Planning Office by the end of the month.

36.6 Glen Residents Association Development Plan 2005-2010

On the proposal of Cllr. McGuinness and seconded by Cllr MacLochlainn, it was agreed that the Planning & Roads Services take the Glen Residents Plan into consideration in regard to the Review of the County Development Plan and that copies be forwarded to the Central Planning Unit in Lifford.

ROADS AND TRANSPORTATION

37.1 Consideration of Minutes of Roads Meeting held on 23/05/2005

On the proposal of Cllr. McDonald, seconded by Cllr. McGonagle, the minutes of the meeting held on 23rd May 2005 were agreed.

37.2 Draft Car Parking By-Laws for Buncrana & Carndonagh

The Committee considered the report circulated with the Agenda regarding the intention to address the issue of car parking control through the use of Bye Laws and car-parking charges in Buncrana and Carndonagh.

On a proposal by Cllr. McGonigle and seconded by Cllr. McDonald the Committee recommended that Draft By-Laws be prepared for Buncrana and Carndonagh and presented to the members for their consideration.

37.3 NRA N13 Moness to Bohillion Pavement Strengthening Contract 2005

Pat Gillespie informed the Committee that the tenders were being advertised at present with an expected start date in September 2005.

Cllr Conaghan stated that he was unhappy with the delay in appointing a contractor for this project.

37.4 Speed Limits

Cllr. McGonigle requested that small repeater Speed Limit Signs be provided in Ballyliffin.

Cllr. Conaghan requested that the Nurses Lane, Tooban and Knowhead Road, Muff be included in application for speed reduction.

On the proposal of Cllr. MacLochlainn, seconded by Cllr. McGonigle, the Committee recommended that all requests for speed reductions be examined by the Road Engineers and that a report be presented to the next IEAC Meeting.

37.5 EU Co-Financed Schemes 2006

The Committee considered the report circulated at the meeting by Pat Gillespie on the EU Co-Financed Schemes for 2006.

On the proposal of Cllr. McGonagle, seconded by Cllr. MacLochlainn the Committee recommended that the following schemes be approved for 2006 subject to alternative funding for Movice Road widening and footpath being investigated and if sourced that this funding be used complete the works at Redcastle: -

37.6 Mill Bridge

Pat Gillespie informed Cllr Donaghy that the original proposed design for the Mill Bridge has gone through the Part 8 Planning process.

37.7 LIS Scheme

The Committee considered and agreed the LIS Allocation List for 2005, which was circulated at the Meeting.

37.8 Roadworks Programme 2006

It was agreed that the Roadworks Programme for 2006 be circulated to the Committee.

37.9 Traffic Lights/Pedestrian Crossing at Moville

The Committee recommended that funding be examined for the provision of Traffic Lights and Pedestrian Crossing at Moville.

37.10 2006-2008 Multi-Annual Road Works Restoration Programme

The Committee noted the contents of Circular RLS 22/2005 advising that new lists of priority restoration projects will be required in advance of the 2006 grant allocation process and that Councils are requested to prepare prioritised list of restoration works to be carried out over the period 2006-2008. These lists must be submitted to the D.O.E.H.L.G. by 16th September 2005.

38.1 Update on Housing Issues

Patsy Lafferty informed the Committee that:

- Letters of offer have been issued to the successful applicants for the 30 houses at Pairc na hAlúine at Magherinture, Buncrana. It is envisaged that the keys will be issued within the next few weeks.
- The 4 units in Greencastle will be allocated within the next week.
- It is envisaged that the houses in Carndonagh will be allocated during the month of September 2005.
- Work commenced on 4th July 2005 under the Central Heating Programme at Seaview Terrace, Glengad and that the other estates selected will follow on completion of this scheme.
- The Submission has been forwarded to the DOHELG on Remedial Works/Regeneration Programme for 2005 agreed at last meeting.
- That work had started on the 56 units in Carndonagh for North West Housing Association.
- Eamon Canney, Divisional Manager is meeting with groups who have submitted requests for sites from land bank at Buncrana.

38.2 Housing Progress Reports

The Committee noted the contents of the Housing Progress Report.

38.3 SI Cottages

Cllr. Conaghan and Cllr McGuinness asked that they be updated on the position with regard to a number of S.I.'s. Patsy Lafferty agreed to follow up on same.

Cllr. McGuinness expressed disappointment that the Turnkey for Glengad did not go ahead in the last Programme.

AGENDA Items no. 8 - Fluoridation programme:

See attached correspondence from Health Service Executive to the Donegal County Council, seeking immediate progress required on fluoridation programme in Inishowen area / Carndonagh Water Supply. The preparation works required for fluoridation of the Carn supply have previously been constructed which will allow this programme to progress with immediate effect.

AGENDA Items no. 8 - illegal dumping:

Consider proposals for level 3 clean up of illegal dumping in Inishowen, options to be discussed at meeting following investigations by local Litter Warden. Such clean-ups are most effective where the capacity of the local communities to monitor the areas in question following clean ups is evident.
