We are particularly happy this year to be associated with the inaugural Donegal Connect initiative, ten days of special events for returning members of the Donegal Diaspora. New Theatre

The Festival has excelled in recent years as a platform for showcasing new drama in the county. This year, we have two more new works to engage and entertain our audiences - actor and playwright Maura Logue's new play. The Housekeeper, set in 1960s South West Donegal and the Balor Rep's presentation of Martin Iim McFadden's autobiographical drama, Don't Go There. We are also thrilled to host new shows by two of Ireland's finest comic actors - Ion Kenny in Katie Holly's brilliant Crowman and Kevin McAleer in his own inimitable creation, Guru. Donegal Drama Circle's 19th show for the Festival is a production of David Mamet's China Doll.

Get Involved in Carnival

This year's Carnival Project takes place in association with the Donegal Connect initiative. Under the title Coming Home, it will celebrate Donegal's Diaspora by offering visitors the opportunity to dress up in carnival costume and participate in the Parade on the night. Carnival partners - the ESB and Irish Water - will offer science workshops and tours at Cathaleen's Fall hydro electric power station, Ballyshannon, for primary and second level school students. Music

This year's music programe is one of the Festival's strongest yet. Audiences will thrill to the contemporary sounds of In Their Thousands, The Henry Girls, Slow Place Like Home, Lemoncello, Pine The Pilcrow and Session Americana, while the traditional programme is no less exceptional and features the likes of Patsy Hanly, Roisin McGrory, Tara Connaghan, Steve Cooney, Peter Campbell, Ellie Nic Fhionnghaile, Claire Friel, Shauna Mullin, Brian McNamara, Mick Brown and Stewart Hardy.

Crowman

Crowman is the acclaimed new play by Katie Holly, featuring Jon Kenny of D'Unbelievables fame. Jon is Dan Lonergan, the Crowman of the title. The play is Dan's account of the hilarious characters that inhabit his life on a daily basis and of a true love story



that never was. By turns poignant and comic, Dan transports his audience on a roller-coaster ride from his childhood to middle-age, from the hurling pitch to the pub - with Jon inhabiting one uproariously funny character to the next, as only he can.

Crowman received nightly standing ovations when it premiered at Cork's Misdsummer Festival last year. It comes to Donegal fresh from a triumphant three night run at Dublin's Olympia Theatre.

Jon Kenny is one of Ireland's finest and best loved performers. Actor and comedian in equal measure, he was part of the legendry comedy duo D'Ubelievables with his friend Pat Shortt throughout the 1990s. More recently, he has enjoyed a hugely successful partnership with Mary McEvoy (Glenroe), touring the country with new adaptations of John B. Keane classics such as Letters of A Successful TD and The Matchmaker.

Logue's new play, The Housekeeper. Set in 1960s South West Donegal, the twilight years of a bygone era are observed through the eyes of live-in housekeeper, Áine McBride, long in the service of the fictional Burke family.

Performed by Maura, accompanied by composer and guitarist David Ison, The Housekeeper opens the door to memories of a time in Ireland, when the power of stories, music and family was looked for and loved. Maura's Áine lets us into her life, fills us with her hopes and dreams and thrills us with the pain of lost love.

Maura Logue is an actor, playwright, theatre director and producer from Donegal. She has created many memorable theatre works for the Festival, often on a theme of strong women from times past. Recent highlights have included Sile Molloy (2018), Mother Loss (2016) and Anna Katherine Kelly (2012).

David Ison is an Amerian composer, guitarist and singer, now living in Donegal. He issued his highly successful series of Chakra Sound System compositions in 2012. Earlier this year, he recorded a CD of new compositions, Behind The Mask, a series of works in response to the writings of W. B. Yeats.






China Doll

This will be Donegal Drama Circle's second David Mamet play, having presented American Buffalo for the Festival in 2017. In China Doll, financial shenanigans are the order of the day as the Pulitzer Prize winning playwright tackles the topical issue of international tax avoidance schemes.



The story revolves around a soon-to-

retire New York billionaire, his young fiancée and an aeroplane. Using a complex \$5m tax avoidance scam, the tycoon has just bought a luxury jet as a present for his bride to be. Before leaving his office, he takes one final phone call. The news is not good. The plane has been impounded in Canada for tax violations and his fiancée is being held by Immigration Control. Cue a frantic round of rants and recriminations as the businessman and his assistant try desperately to get the situation under control.

Al Pacino played the role of billonaire businessman, Mickey Ross, during China Doll's 2015 Broadway run. This Donegal production features senior Donegal Drama Circle actors **Conor Friery** and **Christian Carbin** respectively in the roles of Mickey Ross and his assistant, Carson.



Since first coming together in 2012, In Their Thousands have established themselves as one of Donegal's finest ever bands. Four EPs of epic, finely crafted songs such as Carrickatine, Vive La Revolucion, Flicker and The Old Man and the Sea, have recently been joined by their first full length CD – the hotly anticipated and very well received Acrasia - recorded at Attica Studios, Termon. Earlier this summer, they performed at Germany's largest world music event, the Rudolstat Festival and most





recently at Electric Picnic's Body and Soul Stage. In Their Thousands are Downings brothers Aidan and Declan McClafferty, their cousin Ruairí Friel from Fanad and their friend Martin Smyth from Malin.

Lemoncello are much in demand Donegal-Carlow duo Claire Kinsella and Laura Quirke, who make music together using four basic ingredients - guitar, cello and two voices. They met while studying music at Maynooth University, home to fellow Common Grounds Collective artists, Hatchlings and David Keenan. They released their debut EP, Stuck Upon The Staircase, in 2018 and have since performed all over Ireland, including at festivals such as Other Voices, Body and Soul, Belfast's Cathedral Quarter Arts and Clonakilty Guitar Festival. Lemoncello's second EP is due out this autumn.

The late Billy Finn was a native of Kilkenny who spent much of his adult life as a secondary school teacher in Ballyshannon, where he was a founding member of the local Phil Rooney Branch of Comhaltas Ceoltóirí Éireann. An accomplished uilleann piper and flute player, his various sets of pipes and chanters have been generously loaned by his family to the Billy Finn Trust, whereby many young Donegal uilleann pipers are now learning to play the instruments.

The Billy Finn concert will feature Roscommon flute player, Patsy Hanley and Leitrim uilleann piper Brian McNamara. Patsy was a close friend

of the Finn family and was recently recognised by his peers with the prestigious TG4 Gradam award. Brian McNamara comes from a very musical family from Aughavas.





They will be joined by Shauna Mullin of Ballyshannon who grew up in a family steeped in traditional singing. Her repertoire, with elements in both Irish and English, is highly reflective of the North West of Ireland. Other musicians on the night will include the Phil Rooney Branch of Comhaltas Ceoltóirí Éireann, as well as the fiddle duet of Caoimhín Mac Aoidh and Dáire Gallagher.

He has played and worked with acts such as Fujiya & Miyagi, Dan Deacon, Squarepusher and Perfume Genius

Session Americana's name perfectly describes this Boston based ultra-gifted, rotating collective of singers and multi-instrumentalists. Band members have played with a variety of acts



including Patty Griffin, Josh Ritter and the J. Geils Band. They expertly blend vintage American roots music styles from country to jazz to rock, in a rowdy but deft fashion.

Onstage is a collapsable bar table, wired with microphones, around which the musicians of Session Americana sing and play. A vintage suitcase is recast as a kick drum. An assortment of other instruments – guitars, fiddle, banjo, mandolin, harmonicas get passed around in this modern hootenanny where anything can happen.

Session Americana are Ry Cavanaugh, Billy Beard, Jim Fitting, Dinty Child, Jon Bistline and Jefferson Hammer.

Rising piano, cello and violin trio, Pine The Pilcrow, released their debut FP in March 2016 and haven't looked back since. They made many of that year's 'Best Of' lists, including Nialler 9's. The Thin Air and The Last Mixed Tape and were nominated for an IMRO Award for their song. Don't Need Me.



Bairie are led by Derry songstres, Emily McCormick. Their music is best described as 'melancholic folk' with hints of neo-soul, pyschedelic rock and jazz. The release of their debut single, Mr Green, led to a live performance on BBC Radio Ulster's Electric Mainline programme, as well support shows with the likes of Duke Special and Ryan Vail.

Patata (aka Shane Devlin) is an open, honest and diverse songwriter and performer. His songs draw on raw emotion delivered through a prism of folk, rock, pop and jazz influences. His soulful, mellow voice a perfect complement to the innate musicality of his songs.

Singer songwriter Gerry Hodgers hails from Slane Vilage where he's run The Purple Sessions in Boyle's Pub for over a decade. Inspired by Guy Clark, Bob Dylan and Leonard Cohen, his finger style guitar with open tunings and chord voicings perfectly express the evocative emotions of his music.

Joseph Haydn wrote The Nelson
Mass in Austria in 1798. The work's
original title, Missa in Angustiis/
Mass for Troubled Times, reflected
the turmoil in Europe at time, when
Napoleon's armies were threatening
Vienna itself. However, as the



composition was premiered in September of that year, news was filtering through of Napoleon's catastrophic defeat at the hands of Admiral Nelson at the Battle of the Nile. That ensured that the new work became associated with Nelson's victory and was henceforth known as The Nelson Mass.

Donegal Voices was formed in 2015 by Deborah Cunningham, Eileen Carr and Andrew Batchelor, Musical Director. With members drawn from all over Donegal, this exceptional 50 member ensemble has performed works by JS Bach (Magnificat in D), Vivaldi (Gloria), Beethoven (Mass in C) and George Friderik Handel (Coronation Anthems and The Halleluiah Chorus).

Principal soloists, drawn from the Choir, are Deborah Cunningham, Soprano; Fiona Wasson, Mezzo Soprano; Pat Doherty, Tenor and Paul Martin, Baritone.

Andrew Batchelor, Conductor and Musical Director, is principally a singer. He has performed extensively in the UK and Europe and was for many years a member of the world renowned Chorus of the Academy of St. Martin in the Fields. He lives in Mountcharles. CAIRDEAS NA BHEIDII ÉIRÍ
