## **RECYCLING CHARGES...**

- Cardboard
- Cartons, for example orange juice cartons
- · Household plastic packaging, for example, plastic bottles and containers, tubs and trays.
- Cooking Oil
- Used Engine Oil

€1 for standard black bag of recyclables

- €4 for a standard car full of recyclables
- €8 for a large car full of recyclables
- €8 for a car and trailer (6 X 4)
- €2 per bag of garden waste
- €4 per tyre
- €3 per bag of household waste (not for recycling)

# **2016 NEW YEAR**

The Changes...

**THELESS** YOUR BIN WEIGHS THE LESS YOU WILL PAY!

By July 2016 all householders in Ireland will be charged for their waste collection service on a Pay by weigh each bin every time it is collected and apply a charge based on the weight of the bin. A specific rate per/kg will be applied to each bin, the general waste bin, the recycling bin and the food waste bin (Brown Bin).

- It gives you more control over your waste bills.
- The less your bin weighs, the less you pay!
- There is an incentive for the householder to prevent waste, recycle more and compost.
- Pay by weight leads to better segregation of waste leaving less for disposal.

Householders in the relevant towns must separate all food waste from normal waste Householders in the relevant towns must separate all room waste from normal waste and place it in a brown bin for collection by your waste collector. When collected this **and place it in a drown din for collection by your waste collector.** When collected food waste is sent for special treatment and turned into a high quality compost.

- You can wrap food waste in newspaper to keep your bin clean. Please do not place food waste into plastic bags.
- Your brown bin will be collected once a fortnight at a minimum, your waste collector will provide you with collection dates.
- You can continue to home compost fruit and vegetable peelings etc.
- It is your obligation to ensure that food waste is not placed into the normal waste bin.
