# 1. INTRODUCTION

## 1.1 Context

There are 50 historic graveyards in the care of Donegal County Council (see Appendix 1) and most of them are included in the Record of Monuments and Places and protected under the National Monuments Acts (1930-2004). As well as containing significant archaeological and built heritage, these historic graveyards provide important habitats for our wildlife. The proposed habitat assessments and mapping will inform the on-going management of these heritage sites and will highlight opportunities for the implementation of best conservation practice measures that will benefit the natural heritage at these sites. The example set by Donegal County Council will also provide direction to, and opportunities for engagement of, local community groups in the management, conservation and promotion of the natural heritage in historic graveyards in the county.

The Roads & Transportation Directorate of Donegal County Council maintains the historic graveyards in the guardianship of Donegal County Council. The County Donegal Heritage Office hosts 'Care & Conservation of Historic Graveyards' seminars in the county to raise awareness and encourage the conservation of the natural, built and cultural heritage in historic graveyards. There is considerable interest by local community groups in the conservation, management and promotion of the heritage in historic graveyards in County Donegal. This is reflected in the number of attendees at past 'Care & Conservation of Historic Graveyards' seminars and by the number of community groups already undertaking works in historic graveyards in the county. As guardians of 50 historic graveyards, Donegal County Council hopes to encourage best practice in the management of these heritage sites to encourage, advise and inspire community efforts.

An ecologist will be appointed to undertake site visits, conduct habitat assessment/mapping and suggest conservation recommendations for 15 historic graveyards<sup>1</sup> (and their immediate environs) in the guardianship of Donegal County Council that are included on the Record of Monuments & Places. Habitat assessment/mapping of 12 historic graveyards in the guardianship of Donegal County Council was undertaken in 2018. The classification of habitats will be based on 'A Guide to Habitats in Ireland'<sup>2</sup> and will adhere to 'Best Practice Guidance for Habitat Survey & Mapping'<sup>3</sup>. Baseline information on the natural heritage in these historic graveyards will be gathered and linked with existing information and present-day management practices to highlight opportunities for the implementation of a best practice conservation management scheme in the future. The assessments will provide an evidence base for improved decision-making in the local authority and will generate discussion on, and help formulate, a best practice conservation management scheme.

## **1.2 Objective**

The proposed project addresses several actions in the National Biodiversity Action Plan (2017-2021):

- It will provide important information and mapping on terrestrial habitat, land cover and ecosystem services in historic graveyards in the guardianship of Donegal County Council (Action 2.1.3).
- It will contribute to the production of guidance as regards the protection of biodiversity and the management of natural heritage in historic graveyards for local authority staff and community groups undertaking projects in historic graveyards in the care of Donegal County Council (Action 1.1.8).
- This project will provide opportunities to engage with local communities and stakeholders to establish and implement natural heritage management practices in historic graveyards in County Donegal (Action 3.1.1).
- In the absence of a staff ecologist and/or Biodiversity Officer, it will help to strengthen ecological knowledge within the local authority as regards natural heritage management providing direction as regards natural heritage management to other local authority staff (Action 1.1.4) and may identify opportunities for the containment, control and/or eradication of invasive species at these heritage sites (Action 4.4.3).

The project will provide baseline information to Donegal County Council in order for it to better manage the natural heritage in its guardianship. It will contribute to the achievement of Action 2.11 in the County Donegal Heritage Plan which is to "Initiate a best practice conservation and recording scheme for historic graveyards in County Donegal". This project also supports Strategy 3 (Promote use of heritage data in decision-making) and Strategy 8 (Promote best practice in the conservation and management of our heritage) in the Heritage Council Strategic Plan.

## **1.3 Aims & Outputs**

The aims of this project are to:

- (i) record, map and assess the habitats and natural heritage in 15 historic graveyards in the guardianship of Donegal County Council (see Appendix 1);
- (ii) produce a base map, datasheet and photographic record of the natural heritage of each graveyard highlighting possible maintenance and conservation issues;
- (iii) liaise with Donegal County Council staff, local community groups and individuals involved in the recording, maintenance and conservation of the heritage in these historic graveyards;
- (iv) compile a report that summarises the natural heritage and conservation issues in these historic graveyards and suggest conservation priorities; and
- (v) deliver a report, mapping, database and presentation on the study's findings.

## **2. RESPONSE TO TERMS OF REFERENCE**

Proposals in response to these terms of reference should set out how the survey will be approached, methodology, and any other relevant matters. The proposal should include:

### **2.1 Required Skills and Experience**

Proposals should contain clear details of the skills and experience of the researcher(s), and the CV(s) of the researcher(s). Details should also be given of the relevant experience including examples of previous relevant work.

### **2.2 Methodology**

The proposal should contain a clear methodology to achieve the aims and outputs of this project. This should include:

**2.2.1 Method statement:** including key reference material to be used, methodology, fieldwork, consultation planned, data analysis, outline of proposed assessment / mapping and a detailed timetable.

**2.2.2 A Resource Plan:** showing the breakdown of person hours and costs.

## **3. GENERAL ISSUES**

### **3.1 Timescale**

The project will commence at the beginning of September 2019 and a final report will be due for submission by Friday, November 22, 2019. The researcher(s) appointed must be in a position to begin immediately once appointed.

### **3.2 Project Management**

A steering committee comprising representatives of the County Donegal Heritage Forum of Donegal County Council & The Heritage Council will guide the development of this project. Day-to-day contact will be with the Heritage Officer. The steering committee will meet regularly to review progress.

### **3.3 Budget**

The maximum budget for this Heritage Plan action is €9,200 excluding VAT. Please quote proposed costs excluding and including VAT.

**3.4** The researcher(s) shall effect and maintain insurance necessary to cover their liabilities under this Heritage Plan action.

### **3.5 Copyright and Confidentiality**

The researcher(s) will be required to assign copyright of the text, illustrations, maps and/or photographs to Donegal County Council. Copyright for any illustrations or other material used should be cleared by the researcher(s). The survey results will be made available for public use by Donegal County Council.

### **3.6 Freedom of Information**

Donegal County Council operates under the Freedom of Information Act 1997 and all information held by the Council (including proposals submitted in response to this brief) may be subject to requests under the Act.

### **3.7 Evaluation of Proposals & Selection of Researchers**

Evaluation of proposals will be based on the ability of the researcher(s) to deliver the skills and outputs detailed above within the specified timeframe. Interviews may be held with selected candidates prior to the final evaluation. Donegal County Council is not obliged to accept any proposal or the proposal with the lowest bid, and no person making a submission will be remunerated for any expense incurred in preparing a submission. It is envisaged that the successful researcher(s) will demonstrate:

- (i) a good knowledge of biodiversity and natural heritage (20%);
- (ii) proven experience of undertaking relevant research, field survey and report writing (30%);
- (iii) an ability to liaise with key stakeholders and engage with the public (10%);
- (iv) a clear methodology to achieve the aims and outputs of this project (30%);
- (v) competitive price (10%).

The decision of the evaluation panel will be final.
