On the proposal of Cllr Jordan, seconded by Cllr Conaghan the Minutes of the Meeting of the Municipal District of Donegal held on the 11<sup>th</sup> April 2023 were confirmed.

# MDD/071/23 CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES OF THE HOUSING & CORPORATE WORKSHOP OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF DONEGAL HELD ON $5^{\rm TH}$ APRIL 2023

On the proposal of Cllr Sweeny, seconded by Cllr Naughton the Minutes of the Housing & Corporate Workshop of the Municipal District of Donegal held on the 5<sup>th</sup> April 2023 were confirmed.

#### MDD/072/23 HOUSING & CORPORATE SERVICES REPORT

#### CORPORATE SERVICES

Prior to commencing the Housing & Corporate Report, Mr Dunnion also extended his good wishes to Mr Sheerin and wished him a speedy recovery.

Mr Dunnion informed the Members that a new staff member, Mr David Charles, will be joining the Housing Office next Monday the 15<sup>th</sup> May 2023. Mr Charles will be responsible for among other things, Housing Repairs. In relation to the second vacant position within the Housing Office, it has been agreed a staff reassignment will take place in due course.

Mr Dunnion advised that the follow ups from the previous meeting were actioned as follows:-

- The comments relating to the Ballyshannon Library were relayed to the Cultural Section.
- Current and former staff were advised of the Member's comments.
- As per the motion, correspondence issued to the Department of Housing, Local Government & Heritage.

#### **Road Safety Authority**

Cllr Naughton noted the importance of ensuring young learner drivers are afforded the opportunity to complete their driving tests prior to the commencement of exams or entering third level education specially to facilitate summer jobs to assist with the costs of going to college. Cllr Naughton expressed his frustration at not being able to make

contact with the local Road Safety Authority office in Donegal Town and asked for a contact number to be provided to the Members rather than having to make contact with the Ballina Office.

Cllr McMahon concurred with Cllr Naughton's comments and referred to a recent case in which a learner driver was unable to take a driving test as the required documentation was not printed in colour.

Mr Dunnion noted that the Test Centre is operating on a 6-day week basis and agreed to follow-up on Cllr Naughton's request for a local telephone contact number.

#### **HOUSING SERVICES**

Progress reports on Casual Vacancies, Grants, Loans, Tenant Purchase Scheme 2016, HAP Tenancies, Housing Need, Housing Capital, Approved Housing Bodies Development, and Lease & Repair Scheme

As Mr Dunnion is new to the role, the Housing Report was taken as read and it was agreed that any questions the Members had, would be responded to following the meeting.

#### **Housing Capital**

Ms Quinn submitted that the construction works are progressing well at Railway Park (Phase 3) and it is expected these units will be complete by June 2023. The contractor is currently carrying out groundworks. In relation to the Drumacrin Project, a letter of intent and unsuccessful letters have issued. The proposed housing scheme at Fintra Road in Killybegs has been prioritised with investigation works continuing.

A number of comments / queries were dealt with as follows:-

#### **Drumacrin, Bundoran (Phase 1)**

Cllr McMahon welcomed the progression of the Drumacrin project and noted the importance of ensuring a local contractor or local subcontractors are appointed to construct this project. Cllr McMahon recommended arranging a meeting with the local residents to discuss the traffic management plan and submitted that as an alternative access road is included in the Local Area Plan, agreement with landowners should be reached as soon as possible in order to alleviate traffic congestion.

Cllr Naughton concurred with Cllr McMahon's comments and agreed that the link road should remain at the top of the agenda.

Ms Quinn agreed to relay the comments raised to the Senior Executive Engineer.

#### **Brookfield (Phase 3)**

Cllr Naughton queried if the allocations have been made for the final phase of the Oak Meadows development at Brookfield. Mr Dunnion agreed to revert with a response.

#### **Laghey Housing Development**

Cllr Naughton sought an update on the Part VIII application for the housing development in Laghey. Ms Quinn submitted that this project is progressing towards a Part VIII application.

#### **Tenant In-Situ Scheme**

Cllr Jordan advised that he has received a high volume of calls in relation to Notices to Quit (NTQ) and the Tenant In-Situ Scheme. Cllr Jordan submitted that the Council should be proactive in terms of the Tenant In-Situ Scheme and noted that Donegal lagged behind in making available information in relation to the application process. Cllr Jordan recommended that Donegal should take a lead in this Scheme and include details of the application process on the Council's website.

Cllr Sweeny suggested for efficiency purposes and knowledge sharing, that the staff appointed to work on the Croí Conaithe Scheme should work in conjunction with those involved in the Tenant In-Situ Scheme. Cllr Sweeny noted that Town Centre Health Checks had been completed on 3 towns within this Municipal District and suggested contacting local Census enumerators to assist in the data gathering of suitable property for housing purposes.

In response, Mr Dunnion informed the Members that a number of expressions of interest in relation to the Tenant In-Situ Scheme have been received and an internal meeting is due to take place later in the week to discuss the implementation of the Scheme. Mr Dunnion submitted that it is expected prioritisation will be given to families who may become homeless as a result of obtaining a NTQ.

#### **Local Economic & Community Plan**

Cllr Kennedy referred to the recent meeting regarding the new Local Economic & Community Plan and noted the wealth of data that has been obtained in relation to the drawing up of the new plan. Cllr Kennedy suggested this data could be utilised for alternative funding schemes.

#### Killybegs

Cllr Kennedy welcomed the prioritisation of the proposed Killybegs Housing Scheme.

Section 183 Request - Disposal of land at East Rock, Ballyshannon

Mr Dunnion sought approval from the Members for the disposal of land at East Rock, Ballyshannon to Liam Coughlan, 1 East Rock Ballyshannon. On the proposal of Cllr McMahon, seconded by Cllr Sweeny, Members confirmed their agreement to the proposed Section 183 and noted the matter would be on the Agenda for the forthcoming Plenary Council meeting.

#### MDD/073/23 ROADS / TRANSPORTATION SERVICES REPORT

#### **2023 Roadworks Programme Status Report**

Members noted the reports on the Road Works programme circulated with the Agenda and Mr Sweeney advised that a number of Roads Improvements Projects have commenced, however, some delays have occurred due to poor weather conditions.

#### Follow up Issues from the previous meeting

Mr Sweeney had provided an update on the follow up issues from the previous meeting, as circulated by email, that dealt with the following matters: -

# Follow up on the public lighting issue at the Kinlough Road Underpass.

These works have been included in the Tll's bridge maintenance contract for this region that is currently out to tender. Works can only commence after the tender has been awarded.

## Ascertain if LED bulbs can be used on the heritage lights at the Abbey Centre car park in Ballyshannon.

LED bulb replacements can be used in the heritage lights at the Abbey Centre car park in Ballyshannon. The lights that are currently not working have been reported on the DeadSure Public Lighting online system.

### Investigate if speed ramps could be laid on the Atlantic Way, Astoria Road in Bundoran.

This request is currently being investigated to see if a suitable location can be found for these ramps. Funding for the provision of same also needs to be considered.

# Investigate if safety railings could be erected along the edge of the footpath adjacent to the Olympic Amusements in Bundoran.

This matter is being considered and costed. Funding for the provision of same also needs to be considered.

Arrange an on-line meeting with members of the Active Travel Team to discuss the one-way system at the West End Rock 2 and Cunningham's Junction in Killybegs.

Members to advise on a suitable date for a workshop. It was agreed to hold the meeting on the 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2023 at 2.00pm in the Council Chamber in the Donegal PSC.

Commence the naming process of the Killybegs Industrial Road. Legal advice is still awaited from our solicitors on the process of naming a road.

# Review the condition of the passing bays along the road to Creevy Pier and discuss same with the Roads Team.

This matter has been referred to the Area Engineer to review.

## Forward a copy of the Specific Improvement Grants to the Members.

A copy of the agreed priority list for specific improvement grant was forwarded to all the Members by email on 21<sup>st</sup> April 2023

#### Identify a suitable waste bin solution for use in coastal towns.

We are currently in discussions with the bin manufacturer to see if they have something in stock that can be retrofitted to the bins to prevent seagulls pulling litter out. If a suitable solution can be identified, we will make arrangements to have it installed on the bins.

Mr Sweeney welcomed the recent announcement by the OPW that the Donegal Town Flood Relief Scheme is now being progressed to the next stage and advised the Members that this stage of the process which involves topographical surveys, environmental surveys, flood modelling, data analysis etc, will take a number of years to complete. This information will then dictate the extent of the works necessary and only then will the Council be in a position to seek planning permission for same.

A number of comments / queries were dealt with as follows:-

#### **Donegal Town Flood Relief Scheme**

Cllr Jordan welcomed the positive response from the OPW in relation to the progression of the Donegal Town Flood Relief Scheme and noted that the application process may take some time to complete. Cllr Jordan highlighted the importance of stakeholder consultation and asked that all parties facilitate the progression of the scheme. Cllr Jordan wished to commend Mr Sweeney on his efforts on bringing this project to this stage.

Cllr Sweeny also welcomed the progression of the project and looked forward to the identification of mitigation measures to alleviate the flooding issue.

Cllr Naughton advised that he had met with the Minister last week and welcomed the progression of the Flood Relief Project.

Mr Martin wished to join in with the positive comments in relation to the progression of this scheme and noted the volume of work already conducted by the Members, the Executive and the Flood Management Team.

#### **High Velocity Sprayer**

Cllr Jordan welcomed the hiring of the Velocity Sprayer to carry out pothole repair and patching works in the Donegal Municipal District. Mr Sweeney advised that the machine will be undertaking works in each of the Municipal Districts.

#### **Footpaths**

Cllr Sweeny noted the comprehensive Roads Work Programme and sought an update on the footpath repair works at the Bank in Ballyshannon and along Market Street and East Rock. Cllr Sweeny noted the difficulty in providing suitable footpaths for wheelchair users in Ballyshannon and advised that the students from Kilbarron National School had completed a Walkability Audit which has highlighted a number of ongoing issues.

In response, Mr Sweeney was aware works were commencing this week on the footpath at the Bank in Ballyshannon and is aware of the works required at Market Street and East Rock. Mr Sweeney confirmed he had also received a copy of Kilbarron's National School's Walkability Audit.

Cllr Naughton sought an update on the footpath in Pettigo located close to the local national school. Mr Sweeney advised that the Area Engineer is to discuss the project requirements with the landowner and subject to NTA funding approval, the project will commence towards the end of the year.

#### **Roads Staffing**

In response to a query from Cllr Sweeny in relation to the recruitment of additional outdoor roads staff and the ETB Training Programme, Mr Sweeney submitted that 6 seasonal workers are due to commence shortly, and 2 staff members have been recruited within this Municipal District under the ETB Training Programme.

#### **Damaged Lighting**

In response to a query from Cllr Sweeny in relation to the damaged lighting at Allingham Road, following a road traffic accident, Mr Sweeney advised that he is aware of the issue and has been speaking to Airtricity regarding the matter.

#### **Active Travel**

Cllr Sweeny noted the number of Active Travel projects and sought an update on the various projects. Mr Sweeney advised these projects will be discussed further at the Active Travel meeting scheduled to take place on the 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2023 at 2.00pm.

In response to a query from Cllr Kennedy in relation to the Active Travel application for Killaghtee National School, Mr Sweeney submitted that he has spoken to the Principal and will be forwarding an email regarding same.

#### **Uisce Éireann / EIR Communications Cabinet**

Cllr McMahon commended the works carried by Uisce Éireann recently in Bundoran, however, noted that the details regarding the works displayed on their website contained inaccurate information. Cllr McMahon noted that the Eir communications cabinet located within close proximity to these works is in poor repair and should be replaced.

As the works were carried out by Uisce Éireann, Mr Sweeney agreed to pass on the comments to the Water Capital Office. Mr Sweeney further agreed to investigate the communications cabinet.

#### **Road Painting**

In response to a query from Cllr McMahon in relation to road painting at the Astoria Car Park and the West End Pool, Mr Sweeney advised that a request has been made to have these works carried out and noted that these works are usually conducted a night-time to prevent traffic management issues.

#### **Donegal Town Traffic Management**

Cllr Naughton sought an update on the Donegal Town One Way System and queried if it was possible to seek funding for the development of a link road at the Abbey Vocational School. It was agreed to discuss the Donegal Town One Way System further at the Active Travel meeting scheduled to take place on the 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2023. Mr Sweeney noted that the only available funding for the development of a link road is Specific Grant Funding, which has already been prioritised within the Municipal District. As the link road has been identified on the Local Area Plan, a developer may be in a position to create same as part of a possible project.

#### Killybegs Walkability Audit

Cllr Kennedy noted the delay in the completion of the Killybegs Walkability Audit and submitted that a St Catherine's Vocational School student who uses a wheelchair is unable to enter / exit school transportation within close proximity of the school as there is no drop kerb.

Mr Sweeney agreed to follow up with Mr Charles Sweeney in relation to the Killybegs Walkability Audit and to investigate the drop kerb requirement near the Vocational School in Killybegs.

#### **Termon River**

Cllr Naughton referred to discussions with Mr Ger McCafferkey from the OPW and the Minister in relation to the flooding issue at the Termon River in Pettigo and asked that Mr Sweeney make contact with the OPW to discuss further. Mr Sweeney agreed to same.

## MDD/074/23 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, INFORMATION SYSTEMS & EMERGENCY SERVICES REPORT

Mr Philip O'Kennedy was in attendance to represent the Economic Development, Information Systems and Emergency Services Directorate. The Members welcomed Mr O'Kennedy to the Donegal Municipal District meetings and noted the update reports circulated with the agenda dealing with the following:-

- 1. Economic Development
  - a. Economic Development Unit
  - b. Tourism Marketing Unit
  - c. Strategic Funding Unit
  - d. Donegal Diaspora Unit
- 2. Local Enterprise Office
- 3. Emergency Services: Fire Service

Mr O'Kennedy advised that an EU50 Event is taking place in the Mount Errigal Hotel to celebrate Europe Day and a recent YOUTHopia Event took place in Oakfield Park to discuss topics such as entrepreneurship and health and well-being. Mr O'Kennedy submitted that the Strategic Funding Unit has attended PEACE Plus workshops in Dungannon and is now working on a project proposal and 13 businesses, who are receiving financial assistance from Donegal Tourism, will be attending the Balmoral Show. The Local Enterprise Office are progressing a number of business support programmes and it was agreed to hold the Minor Tourism Related Works Grant Scheme workshop on the 20th June 2023 at 10.00am.

A number of comments / queries were dealt with as follows:-

#### **Rotten Island Lighthouse**

Cllr Kennedy referred to the motion passed at the previous meeting regarding the Rotten Island Lighthouse and asked that a copy of the letter that issued to the Commissioners of Irish Lights be forwarded as well as a copy of the response if one has been obtained.

#### **Funding Programmes**

Cllr Sweeny queried the projects being developed by the Strategic Funding Unit under the Peace Plus Programme and sought additional information along with information on the progression of the projects under the Shared Island Funding.

In response, Mr Martin advised that no specific projects have been agreed under the Peace Plus Programme and the Council is awaiting further clarification on the broad categories. Once confirmed, it is expected a number of Plenary workshops will take place thereafter to agree priorities. In relation to the Shared Island Fund, Mr Martin agreed to seek an update on the progression of the 5 projects.

#### **Boat Quay in Bundoran**

Cllr McMahon submitted that the boat quay in Bundoran is utilised by a wide variety of stakeholders and noted that the condition of the quay is in poor repair. Cllr McMahon requested an update report be available at the next meeting.

#### **Killybegs Marine Cluster**

Cllr Naughton commended the ongoing work by Ms Anne Marie Conlon with regards to the Killybegs Marine Cluster and noted the importance of the blue economy to this area. Cllr Naughton emphasised the need to continue to strive to further develop the harbour facilities and suggested inviting Minister Ryan to visit the area as well as continuing to work with the Marine Department and Minister Chambers and Minister McConalogue.

In terms of the blue economy and climate adaptation measures, Mr Martin noted Donegal's strategic position with regards to wind energy and submitted that there were huge opportunities over the coming years in these areas. Mr Martin suggested placing this topic on the forthcoming Economic Division's Municipal District Reports.

#### **Tourism**

Cllr Naughton expressed his disappointment at the negative messages in the media in relation to the poor value within the tourism and hospitality sector in Ireland. Cllr Naughton noted the importance of tourism to the counties outside of Dublin and emphasised that value for money can be obtained by visitors to the rural counties such as Donegal. Mr Martin advised that a range of marketing initiatives are ongoing, and the Council and Donegal Tourism will continue to work with this sector considering its economic importance to the county.

#### **Fire Stations**

In response to Cllr Sweeny and Cllr McMahon's query regarding the Plenary motion and the proposed Fire Stations Workshop, Mr Martin advised a detailed motion response had been submitted to the last Plenary Council meeting in chronological order. Cllr Sweeny expressed his disappointment that he has not been furnished with a copy of the existing documentation and reports as requested in relation to the 2 fire stations. Mr Martin also advised that efforts are continuing to source the requested materials that are the subject of Cllr Sweeny's questions but that given that they had been prepared by an external service over 20 years ago, both their existence and location was unclear at this time. A lengthy discussion ensued

whereby it was noted that these documents may not be relevant due to fire regulation changes and the costs to prepare a new business case and cost benefit analysis may be a waste of resources, given that all the feedback from Central Government to date, over a period in excess of 20 years, indicates that only a single location solution will be funded. It was indicated that the existing fire stations are in extremely poor condition with potential health and safety concerns, and it was noted that either station would be closed immediately if there was any staff safety risk. The Members noted that the previous ORH Report was inconclusive with the Chair suggesting holding a Members Workshop to agree a way forward, however a date was not agreed.

#### MDD/075/23 ENVIRONMENT SERVICES REPORT

Mr P Gallagher presented the report for the Environment Section, as circulated with the Agenda highlighting with the following matters:-

- Waste & Litter Management
  - Anti-Dumping Initiative 2023
  - NIECE Sharing Experiences in Waste Enforcement
  - Solid Fuel Enforcement Activities
  - Donegal Recycling Centres

As a follow up to the last meeting, a request was submitted to Uisce Éireann seeking a representative to attend Municipal District meetings. Mr Gallagher advised that Uisce Éireann has made available a Local Representative Support Desk and are also providing a number of clinics during the course of the year.

Mr Gallagher submitted that Community Groups are continuing with various clean-ups throughout the county and a public awareness campaign will take place shortly in relation to bulky goods collections. Mr Gallagher further submitted that additional staff have joined the Environment Section and an extra 5 Beach Lifeguards have been recruited for the 2023 season.

A number of comments / queries were dealt with as follows:-

#### Uisce Éireann

Cllr Jordan expressed his disappointed that Uisce Éireann will not be making available a representative to attend the Municipal District meetings and referred to a recent AIGL meeting whereby is it was agreed that Uisce Éireann would attend Plenary Council meetings. Cllr Jordan also referred to a recent online meeting with Uisce Éireann, at which, confirmation was obtained that the new Mountcharles Treatment Plan is going out to tender shortly and has an expected construction start date towards the end of the year.

Cllr Naughton also expressed his disappointment at the level of engagement with Uisce Éireann and it was agreed a letter would issue to Uisce Éireann seeking a representative to attend Municipal District meetings.

#### **Dog Fouling**

Cllr Jordan referred to the level of dog fouling occurring in scenic areas and noted that the Holmes Beach was unfortunately experiencing a high level of dog waste. Cllr Jordan suggested an awareness campaign take place to highlight the dangers and to encourage dog owners to clean up after their dogs. Cllr Jordan also suggested the placement of specific bins, erecting signage and asking the Litter Warden to carry out random checks of the area.

Mr Gallagher submitted that a video urging dog owners to clean up after their dogs was released recently on social media and agreed to relay the suggestions raised to Ms Bogan.

#### **CCTV** Legislation

In response to Cllr McMahon's query in relation to the CCTV legislation, Mr Gallagher advised the Council are awaiting the Commencement Order.

#### **Community Clean-Ups**

Cllr Sweeny welcomed the recruitment of additional Beach Lifeguards and submitted that there is a significant drop at the end of the Rossnowlagh boardwalk and asked for same to be investigated. Mr Gallagher agreed to relay the comments to the Coastal Officer.

In response to Cllr Naughton's query in relation to the Murvagh Foot Shower, Mr Gallagher submitted that the Coastal Officer has been engaging with the contractor in relation to the work carried out and it has been agreed no payment will be made to the contractor until the works have been completed to a satisfactory standard. #### 2. House Acquisition Programme & Buy & Renew Programme

The Council is currently in the process of acquiring 2 no. units under the Buy & Renew Programme at Donegal Town. This acquisition will see 2 no. long-term vacant properties brought back into productive use for social housing purposes. Significant works will be required to the properties following the completion of the contract stage and in advance of letting.

The Donegal MD is considering expressions of interest for potential house acquisitions throughout the municipal district as well as considering options advertised on the market.

#### 3. Social Housing through Turnkey Acquisition

Donegal County Council's turnkey acquisition process is continuing throughout the county. This competitive dialogue procurement process will result in a major capital investment in social housing and initial projects have now been completed under this process. This is a very effective mechanism enabling the Council to feed into the design of the proposal so as to ensure that the end product is suitable for the needs of social housing tenants. Proposals are subject to meeting the requirements of the procurement process, planning, departmental approval and contract

Construction works to the approved turnkey development at Brookfield, Donegal Town are now complete. The development provides a total of 38 no. high quality and energy efficient social housing units in Donegal Town. Phases 1 & 2 have been tenanted. The contractual matters are now being finalised in advance of the Phase 3 units being let to families and individuals from the social housing list.

A further development of 5 no. 2 bedroom properties at <u>Ballyshannon</u> is complete. Final contractual matters are being concluded with the vendor and the Council's solicitors in advance of the 5 units being handed over to the area team and let to approved applicants.

In addition, Council officials are continuing to dialogue with Developers in relation to an additional valid proposal for Donegal Town for 35 units. This proposal is currently awaiting an Irish Water Letter of Offer. Members will be fully informed of these proposals upon receipt of final departmental approval.

#### 4. Lands / Property for Social Housing Purposes

The Council is planning to develop further projects on existing landbank in various locations throughout the county. Preliminary designs are underway for a number of these sites and are informed by the pertaining approved social housing need at local level. In parallel with the construction and turnkey programmes outlined above, the Council is actively pursuing the acquisition of lands suitable for housing purposes, in towns and villages where there is currently not a social housing solution available / shortfall.

In addition to the current expression of interest advertisement on the Councils' website for parcels of land, derelict sites / buildings with the potential to deliver social housing, the Council is also separately identifying parcels of land with social housing potential in areas of need.

A number of suitable parcels of land have been identified across the Donegal MD and engagement / negotiations are ongoing directly with landowners / agents to acquire these lands. In this regard the Council has currently 1 offer accepted, subject to contract, in Ballyshannon.

Title Countywide	Property Solutions: The team is progressing 13 property solution opportunities across the county. These are queries relating to the purchase of council owned lands for Economic Development purposes.  Killybegs Marine Cluster Steering Group – The Economic Development Unit continues to support the development of the Marine Cluster with a view to enhancing business development opportunities for businesses in the sector not just in Killybegs but across the county. Recent activity includes the Innovation Cadet programmes hosted by the Alpha Innovation Team, St Catherines Vocational School and the Cluster to introduce young people to innovation and opportunities in the Marine Sector.  Caravan, Camping and Campervan Study: DCC are continuing to implement
	the recommendations of the KPMG study and work with the Internal and External Steering groups on renewed actions in 2023. Renewed promotion of the Campers Code and a targeted marketing campaign for the sector are planned for Summer 2023. New signage is in development. Of the grant scheme, 9 letters of offer have been issued, which will create an additional 140 spaces once projects are delivered. A review of the existing camping service points is in progress.

**Shared Island:** Work continuing on Shared Island funded projects as follows:

**North West RegTech Initiative** is a proposal to develop an all-island national institute in Regulatory Technology in the North West with partners DCSDC, Catalyst and ATU. The appointed consultants for the Scoping/Feasibility Study and Business Case/Economic Appraisal (Stratagem Partners) held an inception workshop with project partners on 19<sup>th</sup> May 2023 with stakeholder engagement planned for June 2023.

Innovation Plaza to develop cross-border food innovation campuses in Ballyshannon and Irvinestown in partnership with Fermanagh and Omagh District Council (FODC). Tender evaluation to undertake the scoping/feasibility study, options appraisal and business case has taken place. The most economically advantageous tender is being appointed with work expected to commence in June.

Regenerative Tourism Project is a proposal to develop a cross border slow tourism destination which preserves and showcases the regions rich, social, cultural and natural heritage while enabling tourism enterprise clusters to grow and prosper. Toposophy have been appointed as lead consultants to undertake the Scoping/Feasibility Study and Business Case/Economic

Appraisal. A project inception meeting was held with project partners on 17th May 2023. Stakeholder engagement is planned for June 2023.

**Slí Cholmcille Project** is a proposed 250 km pilgrimage route linking key Colmcille related sites across Donegal and Derry, with the ambition to link across NI to Scotland. DCC is leading feasibility assessment with partners DCSDC and Slí Cholmcille CLG. Outdoor Recreation NI have been appointed as the lead consultants for the Scoping Study, Business Case/Economic Appraisal and Design Toolkit.

Ambassador Visit: On 22 May 2023 the Deputy British Ambassador Ellen Burns visited Donegal and met with representatives from the Councils Economic Development team, IDA, Enterprise Ireland, Udaras na nGaeltachta and the ATU. She also met with businesses in the Colab in Letterkenny and expressed a desire to support businesses looking to access the UK market.

**Irish Times Feature:** Donegal featured in the **Irish Times Special Report** "Living and Working in" published on 25<sup>th</sup> May 2023 both in paper print and online.

In Business Magazine: Donegal will also be featured in the upcoming "In Business" magazine focusing on highlighting key industry, entrepreneurship and innovation in Donegal and the North West City Region.

#### **Upcoming Programmes:**

#### **Ambition**

Ambition is an exciting pre-accelerator programme which focuses on female entrepreneurs and promotes the skills and resilience needed to develop globally scalable ventures, attract investment and create jobs.

We are looking for innovative new business ideas amongst Donegal's early-stage female entrepreneurs. Up to twelve businesses will be selected to participate in twelve half-day workshops. These will be chosen based on criteria including: the scale of ambition, the size of the problem to be solved, early market understanding, a clear competitive

advantage, feasible business model and strength and diversity of the team.

Teams must be available to participate on all programme days. At the end of the programme showcase, a Judging Panel comprising leading entrepreneurs, executives and investors, will evaluate progress.

The programme will run from September 2023 to December 2023. An information session on the programme is taking place on 15<sup>th</sup> June, 2023.

#### **Al For Donegal Businesses**

With the growing focus on AI, an introductory session will be held remotely on Tuesday June 27<sup>th</sup> @ 10am to provide insight to the opportunities presented by Artificial Intelligence for Donegal businesses.

Pre-event registration is required, and Elected Members are asked to advise micro-businesses in your MD of this event.

#### **Procurement Training for eTenders**

Training on the new eTenders platform for Donegal businesses is currently in planning with two webinars due to take place in June, to provide practical tips to Donegal businesses on how to successfully operate the new system.

#### **Ongoing Programmes:**

#### **Scale-X Accelerator**

Scale-X is an 11-week Accelerator Programme which is currently underway and is aimed at start-up entrepreneurs with the potential for fast growth. There are a total of 14 participants in the programme from a diverse range of businesses and sectors. The programme focuses on giving a deep understanding of the metrics that can drive success, the skills to build financial models that stand up to investor scrutiny, and industry engagement and mentorship that give valuable insights to adapt a company's business model to create the perfect fit.

The Programme runs weekly until Wednesday June 28<sup>th</sup>, when each business will present their final business pitch.

Planning is underway for a new Scale-X programme to run in September.

#### **Business Information Session**

An in-person Business Information Session took place in the PSC Donegal Town on Friday May 26<sup>th</sup> involving 9 participants who were interested in starting and/or growing their business from Donegal. Each business, spanning a range of sectors, was advised on the training, consultancy and grant aid supports available.

Three sessions are planned for June, two virtual and one in person taking place on Friday June 30<sup>th</sup> in the Inishowen Innovation Centre in Buncrana.

#### **Digital Start**

The objective of Digital Start is to help businesses prepare and implement a plan for the adoption of digital tools and techniques across the business.

Digital Start provides strategic intervention for businesses to work for FREE with third party consultants worth up to €4,500 to:

#### **Green for Micro**

#### **Current activities:**

- The Food Coast Strategy Review has been completed and the new strategy was launched at Castle Grove Country House Hotel, on the 30<sup>th</sup> of May. As national journalists were in attendance, we also used this as an opportunity to showcase excellent Donegal food and drinks produce.
- Donegal lamb promotion was successfully launched over Easter and will continue over the coming months.

- ATU Higher Diploma in Food Business & Product Innovation Level 8 programme - LEO Donegal and Food Coast Donegal has sponsored three food businesses from the county to participate and feedback is very positive.
- National Food Academy Steering Committee this year is the 10th anniversary of the programme so please keep an eye out for Donegal producers on your local Super Valu shelves.

#### **Creative Coast Donegal**

Creative Coast Donegal's aim is to support the building of a strong creative and digital economy in Donegal with businesses that are robust, confident, financially viable, and collaboration-friendly, all impacting positively on the local economy in terms of job creation, as well as being pro-active and competitive on an international stage.

There are currently 204 members of the Creative Coast Donegal network. These members are creative business owners throughout Donegal from various sectors within the Creative industry.

LEO Donegal submitted an application to Creative Ireland for funding to deliver the IMMERSE project, a collaboration between Donegal County Council, Eirmersive, Connected Hubs, Regional Enterprise Offices (MidWest/NorthWest/West), CREW, Údarás na Gaeltachta and the Western Development Commission. The project, a multi-agency, panregional proposition across the Atlantic Innovation region, will focus on the Content Creation Sector.

Funding of €68,000 was awarded from the Creative Communities

Action Fund, and responsibility has been assigned to the Western

Development Commission to handle project operations. The Western

Development Commission will submit a draft report to LEO Donegal in late November 2023, prior to final submission to Creative Ireland.

The LEO Donegal and external consultants are developing a 3-year action plan for the creative industry in Donegal and expect to have it finalised the coming weeks.

#### **Donegal Engineering Network**

The ambition of the **Donegal Engineering Network** is to expand, strengthen and enhance the existing engineering group in Donegal.

A range of Good Practice visits, Exhibition Visits and collaborations with other cluster/network facilitators on reciprocal events are being scheduled.

Donegal Engineering Network hosted a stand at the Manufacturing & Supply Chain Expo, RDS Dublin on the 23<sup>rd</sup> & 24<sup>th</sup> May. This was a fantastic opportunity to showcase our excellent Donegal Engineering sector.

Monthly workshops are facilitated with the topics selected by the Engineers. Recent topics covered included HR and ISO certification. Earlier this month, we lead a delegation of Engineers on a LEAN good practice visit to Kirchhoff-Automotive in Letterkenny. Next month, we will visit Inishowen Engineering to view their extended facilities.

#### **Start You Own Business Programme**

So far this year there have been 4 Start Your Own Business (SYOB) Programmes held on-line. A total of 69 have participated in the 4 programmes, with 15 applicants scheduled to commence the June programme, commencing on 6th June, 2023. A further 2 on-line programmes are taking place this year, in September & October, with potential for a third in November (subject to demand).

A one day SYOB Bootcamp was held in the Silver Tassie Hotel, Letterkenny, on Saturday 27th May, 2023 and was attended by 13 participants. This was the first in-person SYOB event this year and the attendees received a short intensive course covering the main essentials of the on-line programme. A second Bootcamp is scheduled (subject to numbers) to take place later this year.

#### **Enterprise Europe Network**

The Enterprise Europe Network Ireland helps Irish businesses to innovate and grow internationally and is delivered by a partnership between Enterprise Ireland, Cork Chamber of Commerce, Dublin

Chamber of Commerce with Donegal County Council leading out on behalf of the Local Enterprise Office.

Services offered through the EEN help businesses to grow through tailored support, new business and technology partnerships, commercial opportunities, licensing deals, and partners searches for EU funded R&D. The services are tailored to SMEs but are also available to all other businesses, universities and research centres.

Internationally, the Network is active in more than 60 countries worldwide bringing together 3,000 experts from more than 600 member organisations. EEN is the largest support network for SMEs and combine international business expertise with local knowledge to help you take your innovation into new markets.

Two meet the buyer events will take place later in 2023 with EENginex catering for the engineering sector and Food eirEEN for the food sector.

6 Donegal companies are engaged in EEN services to support them in both sourcing and selling internationally.

#### **WATER SERVICES**

### Signing of Master Cooperation Agreement (MCA) between Donegal County Council and Activity / **Project Title** Uisce Éireann **Project** Donegal County Council entered into a Service Level Agreement (SLA) dated the 1st January Description/ 2014 with Irish Water under the provisions of Section 31 of the Water Services (No. 2) Act, Activity 2013. The SLA: (i) detailed the services that Donegal County Council would provide to Irish Water (Uisce Éireann since 1st January 2023) in support of the Water Services Functions; detailed the relationship between Irish Water and Donegal County Council with (ii) respect to such services; and (iii) is due to expire on 1st January 2026. The Government Policy Paper – "Uisce Éireann – Towards a National, Publicly-owned, Regulated, Water Services Utility" dated 23 February 2021 and the Workplace Relations Commission document "Framework For the Future Delivery of Water Services" dated June 2022 provide for a new agreement to replace the existing SLA. It has been agreed between the Local Authority Sector and Uisce Éireann that the SLA is to be terminated and replaced by this MCA. The purpose of the MCA is to provide for Uisce Eireann to have full accountability for Water Services Functions and for Uisce Éireann to have the necessary Management and Direction of Local Authority Water Services Staff. The MCA is based on the final draft agreed at National level through the Water Services Transition Office on behalf of the Local Authority Sector and Uisce Éireann. All thirty-one local authorities signed the respective MCAs on the 5th May 2023. The Chief Executive, the Director of Water and Environment and the Water Services management team met with Water Services staff on the 3rd May 2023. The options open to staff wishing to remain with Donegal County Council were discussed. We have engaged with Unions and with staff locally over the past few years about these emerging changes and will continue to do so over the coming weeks and months ahead. Further updates will be provided to Elected Members at future MD Meetings.



**Update:** Acquisition of the key regeneration site in Market Yard was completed by year end 2022. The Team now continues to work towards the publication of a planning scheme, so as to develop this project as a shovel ready capital project targeted for future Category 1 RRDF funding.

Further to the public consultation period on the draft plans held in October-November 2022, the Team is continuing to engage with key stakeholders in relation to the feedback received. This includes the local Business Chamber, ESB and Bus Eireann. Good progress is being made in this regard and further arrangements will also be made for a further workshop with Members in early July to update on this evolving consultation and design process.

**1.1.2** Ramelton Historic Town Centre – A Restorative & Transformational Public Realm Scheme.

Value: €249,159 (RRDF funding approved €186,869)

**Update:** A Part 8 planning scheme for this project was published on Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> February 2022 and a Chief Executives Report on the proposed development was brought before the Elected Members at a Plenary Meeting of the Council on Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> April, 2022 and it was decided to proceed with the development as proposed.

The Detailed Design phase is now completing and it is intended to open a construction tender in June 2023 ahead of a projected commencement on site in early Q4 of 2023. The Team will continue to update and advise Members on

progress and key milestones as this project moves towards commencement on site. The process of project handover to the Council's Capital Project Delivery Unit (CPDU) has also commenced in anticipation of imminent progression to site. CPDU will manage the construction and handover stage of the project.

The Regeneration and Development Team completed the submission of a Category 1 capital funding application to the Rural Regeneration and Development Fund for the capital delivery of this project by the 12noon deadline on Friday 29<sup>th</sup> April 2022. The submitted project had a total project value of €7,949,868.

On 10<sup>th</sup> November 2022 the Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys announced that €6.3m had been awarded under the Fourth Call for Category 1 Projects of the RRDF for the "Ramelton Re-Imagined" regeneration Project. This represents a full award of the RRDF funding sought. Work is now nearing completion on the Detailed Design and preparation of a Tender Package for this project, together with arrangements for handover to the Capital Project Delivery Unit for onward delivery.

# 1.2.2 THIRD CALL FOR CATEGORY 2 PROJECTS UNDER THE RURAL REGENERATION & DEVELOPMENT FUND (RRDF)

On 6<sup>th</sup> January 2022 the Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys announced that €1.17m had been awarded under the Third Call for Category 2 Projects of the RRDF for the "Repowering Buncrana" regeneration Project.

Due diligence has been completed on this project and a formal letter of Offer together with an associated Funding Agreement was received on 10<sup>th</sup> May 2022. The Funding Agreement was subsequently accepted and formally returned to the Department on 18<sup>th</sup> May 2022. The project will now progress to procurement of the required consultancy services before commencement of the planning and statutory consents stages of this project enabled by the funding award.

The Elected Members of the Inishowen Municipal District were updated on the status of this

project at workshop on Friday 27<sup>th</sup> January 2023. It is now intended to progress this project to

tender in Q2 of 2023 and in this regard the project was submitted to the DRCD for Decision Gate 2 Pre-Tender Approval on Monday 20<sup>th</sup> March, 2023. Decision Gate 2 approval was subsequently received on 3<sup>rd</sup> April, 2023 and this project is therefore now approved to proceed to tender. Preparations are continuing in this regard.

A sale agreed position has also now been reached in respect of the town centre acquisition interest enabled by this project. The property concerned is the former Garda Barracks at St. Orans Rd, Buncrana. The Councils legal services have now been instructed to close out and complete this acquisition. The property will be

redeveloped as an economic development proposition as a part of this project with a forward view towards job creation and inward investment.

# 1.3 FOURTH CALL FOR CATEGORY 1 PROJECTS (SHOVEL READY) UNDER THE RURAL

### REGENERATION & DEVELOPMENT FUND (RRDF)

On 17<sup>th</sup> December 2021 the Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys TD announced the fourth call for Category 1 applications to the €1 Billion Rural Regeneration and Development Fund (RRDF).

# The closing date for the receipt of proposals was 12 noon on Friday 29th April 2022.

As described at Point 1.2.2. above the Ramelton Re-Imagined regeneration project, with a value of €7,949,868 was submitted under this call.

On 10<sup>th</sup> November 2022 the Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys announced that €6.3m had been awarded under the Fourth Call for Category 1 Projects of the RRDF for the "Ramelton Re-Imagined" regeneration Project. Work will now continue to complete the Detailed Design and preparation of a Tender Package for this project, together with arrangements for handover to the Capital Project Delivery Unit for implementation on site.

### 1.4 Rathmullan RRDF Project Development work

A formal Part 8 planning scheme for this project was published on Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> November 2022. Submissions or observations were required to be made in writing on or before 4:30pm on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> January 2023. A Chief Executives Report on the proposed development was brought before the Elected Members for consideration at a Special Meeting of the Council on 13<sup>th</sup> February 2023 when Members decided to proceed with the development as proposed.

Work will now continue to position the project for application to future calls of the Rural Regeneration & Development Fund (RRDF) for category 1 (capital) projects. The next stage in project development work concerns the preparation of a Business Case.

The project is a partnership with Rathmullan The Way Forward CLG.

#### 1.5 Milford Town Centre First Plan

In late 2021 the Department of Rural and Community Development sought nominations for towns to be considered as part of the 1st Phase of the Town Centre Masterplan Initiative. Minister Heather Humphries TD subsequently announced that Milford was successful in securing €100,000 under the call. The Regeneration & Development Team is now leading on the delivery of a Town Centre First Masterplan for the Town.

GM Design Associates Ltd were appointed as the successful consultancy service to deliver the Town Centre First Plan for Milford on Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> February 2023 and the project commenced with the first stage of Public Consultation which took place over a period of 3 weeks beginning on Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> February and concluding on Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> March 2023. The first stage consultation process involved a number of targeted workshops, including a project workshop with Elected Members which took place on Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> February 2023, as well as a cross-directorate workshop, a community stakeholder group workshop and workshops with students attending the two local secondary schools. A very successful Public Consultation Event was also held on Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> February which was attended by c.120 no. participants.

The public engagement also centered on the launch of a dedicated project website, facebook page and twitter page, and provided for responses via an online resident's survey, a business survey, a feedback form for individual submissions as well as a kids' page. On the whole there has been a hugely positive response to the public engagement with 227 no. online surveys completed with a further 128 no. survey responses from the secondary school pupils, 355 no. in total. There were also 16 no. comment sheets submitted, 3 no. written submissions and 2 no. email submissions as well as 86 no. kids' responses.

The consultants, GM Design Associates Limited, have now completed the process of collating, recording and interpreting the findings and results of the public and stakeholder engagement together with the conclusions of the baseline analysis of the town centre including the SCOT analysis, and have finalised the Stage 1 Report entitled 'Milford TCF Plan Baseline Profile', which was presented to the Elected Members at a Workshop on the 5<sup>th</sup> of May 2023. This Report has directly informed the Draft Milford Town Centre First Plan, the preparation of which is now well advanced and is targeted for completion by the end of June 2023, with Public Consultation on the Draft TCF Plan programmed to take place during the month of July 2023. The Draft TCF Plan will be presented to the Elected Members of the Letterkenny-Milford MD at a Workshop in late June to secure endorsement to consult on the Draft Plan.

### 1.6 Creeslough Village Plan and Community Regeneration Project

Donegal County Council, the Creeslough Working Group and the Creeslough Community Association supported by Arup launched a public consultation process to prepare a Village Plan and community regeneration project for the Creeslough Community. The first stage of public consultation ran between Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> May, 2023 and Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> May, 2023 and included the following events:

- A Senior Citizens Workshop in Creeslough Day Centre from 12noon to 1pm on Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> May, 2023;
- A public information event from 2pm to 8pm on Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> May 2023 in Massinass Hall, Creeslough, and,
- Workshops with National, Gaelscoil and Secondary schools across Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> May to Friday 12<sup>th</sup> May 2023.

These events were extremely well attended, with over 180 persons attending the drop in event in Massinass Hall. Work is continuing to examine the feedback being received and to prepare a Draft Village Plan and community regeneration project for further consultation in towards the end of June 2023.

# 2.0 URBAN REGENERATION AND DEVELOPMENT FUND (URDF)

# 2.1 Existing approved URDF project in Letterkenny (application submitted 2018; final approval to proceed received September 2019)

This first application secured €1.9m in URDF monies, match funded by €600,000 for three sub-projects. Sub-project A, preparation of Letterkenny 2040 Regeneration Strategy is now complete and available at <a href="https://www.letterkenny2040.ie">www.letterkenny2040.ie</a>.

Sub-project B, CPO in respect of the Letterkenny 2040 Strategic Urban Regeneration Site, significantly progressed having served Notices to Treat and Enter in March and April 2023. On 8<sup>th</sup> May 2023, Donegal County Council took possession of the CPO lands required to enable the delivery of Phase 1 development of the site as regards Alpha/Beta office accommodation and public realm infrastructure. Acquisition by agreement of remaining property on Port Road to enable Phase 2 is on target to be closed out by 1<sup>st</sup> July 2023.

In addition, a Recommendation has been prepared to progress the business case for an Affordable Housing Scheme in respect of the residential component of the Concept Masterplan relating to the remainder of the strategic site (Phase 2). As a result, this part of the site will transfer to Housing colleagues with alignment and input from both the Regeneration and Development Team and the Capital Projects Delivery Unit. Further updates will be brought to the Letterkenny-Milford MD in this regard as this work develops.

Please refer to Capital Project Delivery Unit MD reporting for update as regards the public realm sub-project.

# 2.2 Successful application to the Urban Regeneration & Development Fund (May 2020)

The Councils successful application to URDF Call 2, entitled 'Letterkenny 2040 (Phase 1): To Re-energize and Connect the Historic Town Centre' secured a provisional allocation for total project cost of €18.1m (comprising €13.6m URDF support together with match funding committed by the Council in the sum of €4.5m). Total project uplift was secured at Decision Gate 1 in relation to Preliminary Business Case to take account of inflation resulting in total project cost of €19.3m (comprising €14.5m URDF support and €4.8m match funding by Donegal County Council). Project costs will remain under review at each stage of project development and as the approval gateways under the Public Spending Code are navigated.

The project will advance five sub-projects to varying stages as follows:

- The further enhancement of the Cathedral Quarter
- The re-purposing of the Courthouse
- Strategic land assembly towards:
  - o Renewal of Lower Main Street
  - o Advancement of a Regional Transport Hub
  - o Enhancement of 'LK Green Connect,' walking, cycling and parkland infrastructure.

In line with the Public Spending Code, a Detailed Project Brief and Procurement Strategy was submitted to DHLGH on 29<sup>th</sup> July 2022 for review and consideration. DHLGH approval to proceed was secured by letter dated 7<sup>th</sup> February 2023. A number of clarifications were sought on Monday 13<sup>th</sup> February 2023 and as a result, amended correspondence was received on 7<sup>th</sup> March 2023. DHLGH advise that each sub- project will now progress on its own timeline including the preparation of individual Final Business Cases prior to appointment of construction contractor.

Accordingly, steps are being taken to proceed with each sub-project as set out in the following table.

### 2.3 'The Eat Out' Outdoor Dining Infrastructure Project, Letterkenny

'The Eat Out' Outdoor Dining Infrastructure Project at the public space to the front of An Grianan Theatre secured Part 8 planning consent at the plenary Council meeting in November 2022. Detailed design of this project has now been enabled in the context of the further development of the concept contained in the Letterkenny 2040 Regeneration Strategy via the appointment

of The Paul Hogarth Company and O'Connor Cronin Sutton Engineers. The Regeneration Team now provide support and input into the detailed design process which is led by Community Development with a target for opening of tender for construction contractor imminently.

### 2.4 Letterkenny Cultural Corridor

Design development in respect of a future Part 8 proposed development for the 'Cultural Corridor' section of LK Green Connect is progressing and is at an advanced state of readiness. A presentation in this regard was made to Letterkenny MD workshop on 17<sup>th</sup> April 2023. Part 8 is being prepared with the support of Pasparakis Friel Architects appointed to provide Part 8 drawings while the Regeneration and Development Team manage and lead all other elements of the Part 8 process including review of design, specific development of High Road design elements, AA and EIA screening. This project will also provide for a long-term public realm scheme at the front of An Grianan Theatre taking account of 'The Eat Out' and for enhancements to the existing pathway and environment adjacent to the Boxing Club. The project also includes consultation with the Cultural Partners (An Grianan Theatre, the Regional Cultural Centre and Donegal County Museum) and other stakeholders including Letterkenny Tennis Club, the Boxing Club and a number of landowners. Specifically, design work is currently underway to explore improved access arrangements to the Tennis Club with a further meeting with the Tennis Club scheduled for 27th June 2023. Target for publication of Part 8 is end of Q2 2023 however this is noted as dependant on ongoing stakeholder engagement.

#### 2.5 2<sup>nd</sup> Phase of LK Green Connect

Early design work using in-house resources commenced initially in January 2023 on Part 8 proposed development for Phase 2 of LK Green Connect to link walking and cycling infrastructure at Phase 1 (currently under construction) to Pearse Road. This would, in due course secure Phase 2 to shovel ready status. Given the early stage in the design process, the timeline for publication of the Part 8 is yet to be confirmed and is subject to capacity of staff resources across both URDF and RRDF programmes. The preferred scenario is to publish a part 8 by Q3 2023. Workshops at MD level will be arranged as this project develops.

#### 2.6 Youth/Community focused project at Lower Main Street

Early engagements with Letterkenny Youth Club and Donegal Youth Service have commenced to further explore the potential for a youth/community focused project at Lower Main Street as envisaged within the Design Concepts contained in the Letterkenny 2040 Regeneration Strategy and relating to a number of Councils acquisition interests under URDF Call 2 successful application. In this regard, a partnership in principle has been agreed. Following progress on relevant land acquisition under the Councils URDF Call 2 project, it is targeted to commence design processes as regards a future capital scheme at this location. Timeline for commencement of design work is

likely to be Q3/4 of 2023 and is highly dependent on capacity of in-house resources. Updates will be provided to Members on ongoing basis.

### 2.7 Collaboration with Housing Section of Donegal County Council

Collaborative working arrangements have been established with the Housing Section of Donegal County Council to explore and develop social/affordable housing schemes on key regeneration sites within the town centre generally and, more specifically at Lower Main Street and at Phase 2 of the Strategic Urban Regeneration Site located between Pearse Road and Ramelton Road. Members will be updated as this work progresses.

#### 2.8 URDF Call 3

Minister O'Brien launched URDF Call 3 on 30th January 2023 alongside the launch of the Governments Vacant Homes Action Plan. URDF Call 3 focusses on enabling Local Authorities to tackle long-term vacancy and dereliction in Letterkenny town centre and on the acceleration of residential development. The programme will provide a rolling fund to Local Authorities to enable acquisition and design and civil works that may be required to de-risk property to make it more attractive for onward sale. A workshop with Letterkenny-Milford MD took place on 27<sup>th</sup> February 2023 to explore the Councils submission which was thereafter submitted to DHLGH on 10<sup>th</sup> March 2023. Members of the team attended a workshop for Local Authorities organized by DHLGH on 31st March 2023 following which all Local Authorities submitted a simple review of the submission made. A summary of the submission and update was provided at the workshop of Letterkenny-Milford MD held on 17<sup>th</sup> April 2023 and sought in the order of at least €5m to tackle the vacancy/dereliction challenges in Letterkenny. Announcement on allocations now awaited.

#### 2.9 Other

The Regeneration and Development Team continue to engage in other regeneration related work areas in Letterkenny and support other sections of Donegal County Council as required and across several other activities.
