Members complimented the Youth Councillors on their work. In particular, in relation to events that they had ran or participated in, including, Road Safety, use of Social Media Platforms and awareness / education regarding toxic sites and influences of social media, Democracy/Politics and importance of same, wellbeing, alcohol/drugs, vaping, wellbeing, opportunities / education / Youthopia, Youth Conference etc., Equality etc.

A number of other comments/queries were dealt with at the meeting.

Members thanked and complimented the Youth Councillors on their presentation and activities and encouraged them to keep in contact so that the Members could assist / support the Youth Council where possible in their endeavours.

At this point the Youth Councillors thanked Members for their support and taking the time to receive their deputation and departed the meeting.

Ms. McCann informed Members that the follow ups from the' previous meeting had been dealt with and that the responses to the various requested correspondence had been forwarded to Members.

## **Christmas Holiday Opening Days**

Ms. McCann informed Members that that Council Offices would close for Christmas at 12.30pm on Friday the 22<sup>nd</sup> December 2023 and would re-open on Wednesday the 27<sup>th</sup> December 2023 at 9.00am. She confirmed that emergency numbers would be published on the Councils website as normal to deal with emergencies only, same as in previous years.

# Proposed Section 183 disposal by means of a short term lease of the former Bundoran Town Council offices to Bundoran Community Group.

Ms. L McCann referred to the discussion at the earlier workshop on the proposed Section 183 disposal of the former Bundoran Town Council offices via a short-term lease to the Bundoran Community Group. Ms. McCann noted that the terms of the lease had been accepted by the Bundoran Community Group which includes monthly rent of €500.00 plus utilities to be paid separately when costs are known. On the proposal of Cllr McMahon, seconded by Cllr Sweeny, Members agreed that the proposed Section 183 proceed to the next meeting of the Plenary Council. Members also thanked Ms. McCann and Mr. Martin for progressing the Section 183 on behalf of the community group. Ms. McCann informed Members that the matter would now proceed formally to the Plenary Council with the expectation that matters could be finalised for the group in January 2024.

#### **HOUSING SERVICES**

Progress reports on Casual Vacancies, Grants, Loans, Tenant Purchase Scheme 2016, HAP Tenancies, Housing Need, Housing Capital, Approved Housing Bodies Development, and Lease & Repair Scheme

Ms McCann noted the reports circulated with the agenda. In particular, she highlighted the large number of housing allocations during 2023 including 52 houses allocated since September with the completion of new houses in Donegal Town and Ballyshannon. She also confirmed that the Budget Programmes for 2023 have been completed e.g., Deep Retrofit and that preparations are underway for 2024 in anticipation of further allocations for the schemes.

### **Housing Capital Report**

Ms. T Quinn updated Members on the Housing Capital report. Members noted works on the new housing scheme in Bundoran have commenced and theSI at Kilcar is due to go to tender in January 2024, The proposed development at Fintra Road Killybegs is due to go to Part VIII in May 2024 noting ongoing negotiations with Uisce Eireann to be concluded. Members also noted ongoing considerations regarding surface water disposal at the Laghey site which must be resolved and that final construction drawings are awaited from the contractor for the proposed 35 turnkey houses in Donegal Town.

A number of comments / queries were dealt with as follows:-

#### Phase 1 Drumacrin, Bundoran

Cllr McMahon welcomed the commencement of construction of the 42 housing units in Bundoran and thanked Members and Officials for bringing the project to this stage. He also welcomed that Glebe Builders had won the contract submitting that this will bring much work and economic benefits to the area during construction. He also advised that a meeting had been held with residents and that there will be co-operation for the project. Cllr McMahon requested that a meeting be arranged to include Road Design, Roads, Planning, Housing and Uisce Eireann, to ensure that the access road to the new development can be planned and progressed noting that it is important that this matter is addressed satisfactorily.

Cllr Naughton seconded the request for the meeting, who also referred to a potential zoning issue regarding the land on which the proposed access road may be constructed, which will need to be addressed by the Council. In response to the request for the meeting, Ms. L McCann confirmed she would follow up on same in the New Year.

Members welcomed the commencement of the works on the scheme in Bundoran and commended the progress in general in the Housing Programme.

#### Housing

Cllr Sweeny welcomed the progress on the Casual Vacancies and the coming on stream of the five new houses in Ballyshannon.

#### **Housing Acquisitions**

In response to a query from Cllr Sweeny regarding progress on Housing Acquisitions, with the numbers on the housing waiting list, and in particular e.g. the purchase of existing buildings, Ms. McCann informed Members that there are currently four acquisitions being pursued in this District and that the housing section will continue to to source additional acquisitions.

## Site Acquisition in Ballyshannon

In response to a query from Cllr Sweeny regarding an update on a site acquisition in Ballyshannon for social housing, Ms. McCann advised she would seek an update and revert to Members.

#### Planning approval for houses at Portnason, Ballyshannon

Cllr Sweeny welcomed the grant of planning permission for a private housing development at Portnason in Ballyshannon.

#### Pending discussion in Dáil Eireann on proposed Eviction Ban

Cllr Jordan referred to a proposed discussion due in Dáil Eireann on an eviction ban and sought information on numbers in this district in emergency accommodation and details of what emergency accommodation is available in this District for persons who find themselves homeless. He submitted that the Repair and Lease Scheme is not working and should be discontinued or amended. He referred to the Tenant in Situ scheme and submitted that the cost limits on purchases is too low advising that it is a sellers' market at present. He stated that he wanted an eviction ban and that some of the schemes that are in place to assist persons are not working. He welcomed the new houses that have been completed noting that it means a lot to people to be allocated a house.

In response to the matters raised by Cllr Jordan, Ms L McCann informed Members that there are currently two single persons and a family in emergency accommodation in this District, by means of supported Bed & Breakfast/Hostel type accommodation. She submitted that the housing section liaises with the St. Colmcille Hostel in Letterkenny which provides emergency accommodation. She also referred to the Council actively seeking transition houses that will assist persons to avail of private rented if appropriate e.g if they don't have Landlord references. However emergency accommodation is largely dependent on supported Bed and Breakfast/Hostel Accommodation. Other measures she referred to are the HAP Placefinder and allocations from the Council's own housing stock to assist homeless persons. In relation to the schemes that are currently in place, she informed Members that the housing section through

Headquarters in Lifford provides feedback to the Department of Housing on Schemes. In relation to the Repair and Lease Scheme, she noted that this scheme is a loan, rather than a grant, and is led by the owners if they wish to progress, similar to the Tenant in Situ Scheme. She noted that some schemes are working well and referred to the Croí Conaithe Scheme which is of huge assistance to dereliction.

#### **Casual Vacancies**

Cllr Kennedy referred to one of the properties on the Casual Vacancy list which has been vacant since May 2023 and submitted that this was a long time for a vacancy not to be re-allocated.

## **Housing in Donegal Town**

Cllr Naughton welcomed the progress provision of housing in Donegal noting that there will have been around seventy houses allocated in the Donegal area in 2023 which is good news and further welcomed the progress on the Casual Vacancies which has just two houses on same at present. He also noted that other schemes are progressing and that any new houses allocated may help to free up private rented accommodation.

Cllr Conaghan welcomed the progress in the housing provision and thanked officials for all the progress during the years noting that he hoped great progress could also be made in 2024.

## Fintra Road, Killybegs

Cllr Kennedy referred to the update on Fintra Road, Killybegs (17 Units) noting the update that part VIII planning would be in May 2024 and submitted that it takes a long time for Capital Projects to be delivered. She referred to the lack of social housing in South Donegal which is a difficulty for the area.

#### Request for a meeting with Uisce Eireann

Cllr Naughton requested that an 'in person' special meeting be arranged with Donegal County Council and Uisce Eireann as it appears that Uisce Eireann decides if schemes can progress with connection fees etc. that they apply and submitted that it is important that this meeting would take place shortly to discuss these issues.

### Refusals of offers for housing

Cllr Naughton referred to great standards of new houses and to the number of refusals of offers and submitted that consideration should be given to stopping Housing Assistance Payments to applicants in the event of refusals of reasonable accommodation. He submitted that he was shocked at the number of refusals.

#### Croí Conaithe

Cllr Naughton welcomed the progress of the Croí Conaithe Scheme noting 462 active applications, 206 approved applications with 8

houses completed. He submitted that this is a great scheme which will help rejuvenate our towns and villages.

Ms McCann welcomed the positive feedback and noted the progression of various social housing options is a priority for the Housing Section of the Council.

#### MDD/157/23 ROADS / TRANSPORTATION SERVICES REPORT

#### 2023 Roadworks Programme Status Report

Members noted the reports on the Road Works Programme displayed on the screen at the meeting. Due to an oversight the roads report was not loaded onto the Members sharepoint system and Mr. E Monaghan confirmed to Members that he would forward the report to Members immediately after the meeting.

## Follow up Issues from the previous meeting

Mr. Sweeney provided an update on the follow up issues from the previous meeting, as circulated by email, that dealt with the following matters: -

- Circulate a copy of the Dunkineely Scoping Study Report
- Discuss Bundoran Quay car parking issue and road lining with the Marine Section
- Consider the creation of addition passing bays on the Creevy Pier Road
- Install a road counter adjacent to Rossnowlagh Friary
- Carry out works to the damaged railing in Pettigo
- Investigate the overhanging tree at Donaldson's Corner outside Belleek and discuss the review of the Hedge Cutting Policy with Senior Management

# Part VIII Ballyshannon Bundoran and Donegal Town Active Travel

Mr. M Sweeney thanked Members for approving the Part VIII Planning Approval for the Active ravel Projects. This was also welcomed by Cllr Sweeny.

A number of comments / queries were dealt with as follows:-

#### **Donaldsons Corner**

In response to a query from Cllr McMahon if the works at Donaldsons Corner would be completed before Christmas, Mr. M Sweeney informed Members he would check same and revert to Cllr McMahon.

#### Pier Bundoran – parking issue

Cllr McMahon submitted he would like something done at the Pier in Bundoran e.g., erection of Bollards and height barrier. In response to

same Mr. M Sweeney informed Members, he would arrange to meet with the Marine Engineer to discuss same.

#### Potholes in Bundoran Area

Cllr McMahon welcomed the works done on potholes with the Patcher and queried if one could be purchased for this Municipal District. In response to same, Mr. M Sweeney informed Members that the Patcher would be back in the area next week and that a programme of pothole repairs would be in place during 2024. He also informed Members that consideration is being given to either renting or purchasing a Patcher.

# Works to be completed at Bosco Moohans Corner on the Drumacrin Road.

In response to a request for some repair works to be completed at Bosco Moohan's corner, Mr. M Sweeney informed Members that the patcher is in the area and these works would be done shortly.

#### **Junction at Saimer Drive, Ballyshannon**

Cllr Sweeny referred to issues with trees at the junction at Saimer Drive, Ballyshannon and also issues with parking on the Right-Hand Side of the Junction. In response to same, Mr. M Sweeney advised he would review this junction noting that the cycleway may have an impact on same.

# Potholes at Kildoney, Ballyshannon

Cllr Sweeny queried if the potholes at Kildoney, Ballyshannon had been repaired by the Patcher. In response to same, Mr. M Sweeney advised this would be sorted when the Patcher is next in Ballyshannon.

#### **Dunkineely Scoping Report**

Cllr Kennedy raised a number of queries in relation to the scoping report undertaken on Dunkineely, submitting that the time of year and the location of the count may not be truly reflective of the traffic in the area. She submitted that the other side of the town may have produced different results had the survey been undertaken there.

Cllr Jordan submitted that the speeds recorded at Dunkineely have decreased due to the signage erected by parents of the National School children. He submitted that he only long-term solution is for the off road set down area at the school to proceed but that the school is not yet obtaining approval for emergency funding to carry out these works from the Department of Education and asked that a letter of support issue on behalf of the Municipal District, to the Minister for Education supporting the School Principal's application for emergency funding.

In response to the same, Mr. M Sweeney informed Members he would be happy to write a letter of support for the School in their application for funding to the Department of Education, to construct the set down off road parking area at Dunkineely National School, which in any case was a planning condition on their planning permission for the construction of the extension to the school.

Mr. Sweeney also advised Members he would go through the details of the traffic report on Dunkineely and would feedback any concerns or proposals from Members to the National Roads Office

#### **Emergency Funding to Repair Private Roads**

Cllr Kennedy queried if there is any emergency funding to assist persons on private roads that have been damaged by flooding submitting that this is an issue for people to be able to afford to carry out necessary repairs. In response to same, Mr. M Sweeney informed Members that some assistance may be available through the Department of Social Protection, but that Roads would continue to explore if any opportunities to apply for any such emergency funding should the opportunity arise.

#### **Industrial Road Killybegs**

Cllr Kennedy referred to her previous request to name the Industrial Road, Killybegs as "The Glenlee Pass" which was agreed by Members. She noted that she had submitted a question on same and noted the response. She proposed that the naming of the road be progressed as a matter of urgency. The proposal was seconded by Cllr Jordan and agreed. In response to same, Mr. M Sweeney advised he would refer the matter to Roads Central for follow up, noting that legal advice is being sought.

# Active Travel – request for a footpath out to Abbotts, outside Donegal Town

Cllr Naughton asked if a footpath could be extended out to Abbotts outside Donegal Town. In response to same Mr. M Sweeney informed Members that funding has been secured through a specific development charge for an extension to the footpath at this location. Cllr Jordan also asked if the trees could be cut on the narrow footpath close to this area. In response to same Cllr Conaghan advised that the trees at this location had already been cut.

Mr. M Sweeney also informed Members that the NTA are focusing the funding of Active Travel Scheme on the larger population bases in the first instance and that he is hoping to get projects through the Part VIII Planning process and shovel ready so that if funding becomes available for reallocation, the DMD Roads Office would be ready to progress such projects.

#### Request for a one-way system at Shiel Avenue, Bundoran

Cllr Naughton requested a one-way system at the Shiel Avenue, Bundoran near St. McCartan's National School. In response to the request Mr. M Sweeney advised Members he would refer same to Road Design as this would require Part VIII Planning approval noting that he understands that additional staff are being assigned to the Road Design Section next year to assist with such projects.

#### Meeting with TII in Dublin (Delegation)

Cllr Naughton referred to the recent meeting he attended with TII in Dublin and noted that the continuation of the improvement of the road from Inver to Killybegs is not in the National Planning Framework. He submitted that this needs to be addressed.

Mr. M Sweeney noted the importance of getting this road onto the National Planning Framework so that it major improvements can be funded in the future on this road.

Cllr Naughton noted that a lot of safety works have been carried out on County Donegal roads which is to be welcomed as referred to at the TII meeting.

Cllr Naughton also advised that the TII is introducing a new scheme for safety measures on National Roads.

#### Safety Measures at Laghey

Cllr Naughton welcomed the positive news on the proposed safety measures at Laghey Junction, noting that the funding has been approved and that the Part VIII will be completed in 2024.

This was also welcomed by Mr. M Sweeney.

#### **Greenways/Footpaths**

Cllr Naughton noted that the TII is dealing with Greenways and that this scheme is to get more people walking. He submitted that there needs to be a scheme in each county to provide paths to enable walking to schools, as a lot of schools are outside of the speed limits in towns and villages. He referred to the proposed footpath coming into Laghey and queried of there might be some climate action or other source of funding for same as these type of works would suit a lot of schools.

In response to same Mr. M Sweeney advised Roads would look at the Community and Climate Plan to see if there is a funding source in same that can be used to construct footpaths. He also noted that the Permeability Link Funding for footpaths is to be prioritized and a workshop will be arranged at a later date for same.

Cllr Jordan submitted that the Department of Transport had been asked to review the policy on funding footpath extensions to schools where they are outside to the town/village speed limits.

#### Water running onto Roads

Cllr Naughton requested that efforts to address water running onto roads and causing damage. In response to same Mr. M Sweeney informed that there is an ongoing programme to deal with this matter which in some instances also involves discussion with Landowners to solve issues.

#### **Donegal Tourism**

Cllr Kennedy referred to a Donegal Tourism Sectoral Forum, which was previously chaired by Mr. Barney McLaughlin which brought all of the Tourism Sector together and was a great source of information sharing and communication for the sector and asked if this could be re-introduced. Cllr Sweeny agreed with same. In response to same Mr. G Martin informed Members that there is an associate grouping in place which is a smaller group than the sectoral forum and that her proposal could be brought to Donegal Tourism for consideration. Cllr Kennedy also asked if the contact details of the Membership of the Donegal Tourism Board could be communicated to Members and Mr. G Martin advised that same would be circulated.

#### **Bundoran Water World**

Cllr McMahon congratulated Ms. Aine Temple and Water World on their recent award noting that it had been a very successful year for the centre.

#### Irish Rail

Cllr McMahon expressed his disappointment at the level of service on the trains running into Sligo submitting that TII and Irish Rail Service was not satisfactory and damaging to attracting visitors to the area. Cllr Sweeny submitted that he recently travelled on the train to Dublin from Sligo and found the service good. Ms. J Harron informed Members that issues with the Irish Rail service were raised before and that she would review same again.

#### **Tourism Operator Concierge Service**

Cllr Sweeny queried if this service guided tour operators to certain events / areas and if so, how is it fed in to promote festivals etc. In response to same, Ms. J Harron informed Members that the details of same are on the website but that she would look at same in more detail and revert to Members via the tourism team. Mr. G Martin also informed Members that Donegal Tourism is the vehicle for marketing tourism and recommended contacting Sarah Nolan in this regard, noting that additional resources are being added to the tourism team in 2024.

#### **Sustainable Arctic and Peripheral Biking Tourism Project**

Cllr Sweeny queried if there are any opportunities with the Sustainable Arctic and Peripheral Biking Tourism Project.

#### Minor Tourism Related Work Scheme

Cllr Sweeny queried if there is a deadline for applications and funding for the Minor Tourism Related Work Scheme. In response to same, Ms. Joy Harron advised she would seek additional information and revert to Members.

### Campervan facilities funding

Cllr Naughton queried if all the allocated funding for the Campervan Facilities provision had been paid out noting that there are development charges with such developments which disincentivise such developments which are important to the County. He queried why such a level of development charges would apply for such developments. In response to same, Mr. G Martin advised that the council needed to be mindful that these facilities are provided by the private sector and that it needs to be viable. He advised that the Council does not have sufficient funding to increase the grants but that the costs need to be as such so as not to be unattractive for service providers. He advised that the matter could be reviewed internally.

#### **ATU Apprenticeships**

Cllr Naughton welcomed the €4.7m funding for the ATU Killybegs for apprenticeships which is a good investment for Killybegs and good news for young people.

#### **Broadband Rollout**

Cllr Jordan referred to the National Broadband rollout and asked if there would be a Municipal District Workshop to update Members on same. He noted that some areas of the county still have poor broadband service and the fibre service is necessary in these areas to enable people to work from home. In response to same Mr. G Martin informed Members a briefing had been held with Members in September 2022 and that the issue for the rollout, is resources. He advised there is a broad outline on the website. He submitted that he could ask for a Municipal District presentation, but it was unlikely that it would be granted. He also advised that Northern Ireland is largely complete at this stage and that this will likely free up resources to work on the National Broadband Rollout.

In the interim he submitted that Starlight is a reliable wireless service provider.

#### MDD/159/23 ENVIRONMENT SERVICES REPORT

Ms S Bogan presented the report for the Environment Section, as circulated with the Agenda highlighting with the following matters:-

- Climate Action
  - Notice of the Preparation of the Donegal County Council Draft Climate Action Plan 2024 – 2029
  - Community Climate Action Fund
  - Sustainable Energy Communities Programme Financing for Energy Master Plans
- Waste & Litter Management
  - School Bikes for Africa Campaign
  - Waste Management End of Year Update
  - Waste Enforcement Priority: Household & Commercial Waste
  - National Food Waste Recycling Week
  - National Waste Enforcement Priority: Producer responsibility initiatives and additional local priorities
- Central Laboratory
  - Public Service Announcements Water Quality
  - Farm Inspections
  - Amendment of Septic Tank Grant Scheme

Ms. Bogan informed Members that a pack would issue to Members in early January 2024 with a view to seeking the adoption of the Climate Action Plan in February 2024. She also advised that a Community Climate Action Plan Officer is to be in place in January 2024 and that there would be information sessions on the Community Climate Action Fund on the 11<sup>th</sup> January 2024 from 7.00pm to 8.00pm. She also noted the amendments to the Septic Tank Grant Scheme.

A number of comments / queries were dealt with as follows:-

#### **Community Climate Fund**

In response to a query from Cllr Naughton if the Council can apply to the Community Climate Fund, Ms. S Bogan advised Members that the Council could not as applications have to be community led with the community group taking on a project and obtaining planning permission if required and then delivering the project. In respect of some issues the Council could consider the active travel avenue in respect of new footpaths. She also confirmed that the Environment Section would assist groups with applications groups for funding to the Community Climate Fund.

In response to a further query from Cllr Naughton, Ms. S Bogan informed Members that the Officer dealing with the Community

Climate fund would be in situ, in the second week of January 2024. She also asked that groups are be encouraged to avail of funding through the Community Climate Fund and through the Shared Island funding.

#### **Amendments to the Septic Tank Grant Scheme**

Cllr Naughton welcomed the amendments to the Septic Tank grant scheme with increased grants and the removal of the requirement to have a tank registered with Protect Our Water on or before the 1<sup>st</sup> February 2013, with the changes coming into effect on the 1<sup>st</sup> January 2024.

In response to a request for an update on requested change to the well grant scheme, which Cllr Naughton would work well in conjunction with the Croí Scheme as a lot of applications are in rural areas, Ms. S Bogan advised she would bring the query back to Headquarters for follow up.

#### **Bottle Banks Donegal Town**

Cllr Naughton expressed his dissatisfaction that Members were not informed directly regarding the works at the Bottle Banks, Donegal Town which have been temporarily removed to facilitate works on the area. Cllr Kennedy also expressed her dissatisfaction in the manner in which this was dealt with as Members had received a lot of complaints from the public with no prior notice of what was taking place.

Cllr Conaghan noted that he had been working on this issue for some years and was pleased that a resolution was now being implemented. He expressed his thanks to Mr. John McCarron for his efforts to come up with a solution for the bottle banks which are to return to their current location after modifications to the site have been completed.

#### Water Supply in Bundoran and Parkhill

Cllr McMahon referred to two recent disruptions to the water supply in Bundoran submitting that the water main is in need of replacement and also referred the water quality at Parkhill and Portnason, Ballyshannon and requested an update on same. In response to the request, Ms. S Bogan noted that she did not represent Uisce Eireann but she would bring the request back to Headquarters for follow up.

Cllr Sweeny submitted that it would be timely for Uisce Eireann to plan to replace the water main from Ballyshannon to Bundoran given the proposed cycleway that is due to be constructed which might avoid unnecessary works being carried out after the cycleway has been constructed. He asked that this be communicated to Uisce Eireann. In response to same. Mr. M Sweeney informed Members that this matter has already been brought to the attention of Uisce Eireann.

#### **Shed at Water World Bundoran**

In response to a query from Cllr McMahon as to who would be responsible to repair the roof on a shed at Water World Bundoran

which houses the ESB sub-station for Water World, it was clarified that this is a matter for Water World to deal with in liaison with the ESB.

#### **Special Areas of Conservation (SECs)**

In response to a request for a Map of the 32 SECs to be made available, Ms. S Bogan informed Members that same is available on the SEAI website.

### **Use of Drones for Illegal Dumping**

Cllr Jordan welcomed that training of staff in the use of drones to assist with the detection of illegal dumping. He also welcomed the approval from the Data Commissioner for the use of CCTV in detecting littering/illegal dumping, which he hoped would allow for more prosecutions of these offenses.

In response to a request for an update on progress on 'Back to Ballyshannon', given that the process is three years into being and if the potential for housing could be brought into the RRDF either in one element or progressed separately, Ms. A Quinn informed Members that she would ask Mr. Paul Kelly to revert to Members with an update.

## **Building Control**

### **Doonan Court, Donegal Town**

On the proposal of Councillor Naughton seconded by Councillor Jordan it is resolved that the Council make an order in accordance with Section 207 of the Planning & Development Act 2000 (as amended) for the creation of a public right of way over the estate roads within the housing estate **Doonan Court, Donegal Town** as set out in the attached maps, to enable it to proceed with the taking in charge of the estates.

On the proposal of Councillor Jordan seconded by Councillor Naughton it is resolved that the Council make an order in accordance with Section 11 (1) of the Roads Act, 1993 to declare the estate roads within the housing estate **Doonan Court, Donegal Town** to be a public road and note the consequential provisions contained in Section 180(4) of the Planning and Development Act, 2000 (as amended) whereby this Council will also take in charge the water services infrastructure and the public open spaces or car park within the attendant grounds of the development and will subsequently transfer the water services within the estate to Irish Water.

# MDD/161/23 DISCUSSION ON THE FURTHER DEVELOPMENT AT MALIN BEAG TO MALIN MÓR AND THE SILVER STRAND BEACH

On the proposal of Cllr Kennedy, seconded by Cllr Jordan the following motion was adopted: -

"That this MD calls for financial help and planning, from Failte Ireland, Udaras and Donegal County Council /Donegal Tourism for the Area from Malin Beag to Malin Mor and the Silver Strand Beach as it is the biggest tourist attraction after the Glencolmcille Folk Village and the Sliabh Liag Cliffs in this area. The improvement works on the carpark at the Silver Strand beach which needs attention, lining and barrier etc to be included in the financial help and planning. The huge influx of campervans in the region along with the cruise ship coaches are welcome but planning and investment in the area is required".

Members were given a response to the motion by the Director of Economic Development, Information Systems & Emergency Services.

In speaking to this motion, Cllr Kennedy referred to the area submitting that the area has a lot to offer but needs assistance. She referred to Bed & Breakfasts, Hostels, Coffee Stands, the Silver Strand Beach, Slí Colmcille and the Appalachian trail to name but a few attractions in the area. She referred to the portaloos at Silver Strand Beach that had blown over, the wall that has been promised for the car park at the same location and the need to look after the Malinbeg side of the area. She submitted that of the 30 cruise ships that came this year, all had tourists who went to the area. She submitted that the area requires assistance from Community and Economic Development, Failte Ireland and Udaras and asked that the agencies put a plan in place to improve the area to make it more attractive and for the benefit of locals and visitors. She submitted that the area has a lot of potential and also that land is available for Campervan Facilities to be provided.

In seconding the motion, Cllr Jordan submitted that he was glad to second the motion noting that the area needs investment including passing bays on the road and road widening and work on the Silver Strand Car Park. He also noted that the area is on the Wild Atlantic Way.

## MDD/162/23 DISCUSSION ON THE CONSIDERATION TO TAKE IN CHARGE THE ACCESS PATH BETWEEN COLÁISTE CHOLMCILLE AND ERNE DALE IN BALLYSHANNON

On the proposal of Cllr Sweeny seconded by Cllr McMahon the following motion was adopted: -

"That this MD considers the taking in charge the access path between Colaiste Colmcille and Erne Dale in Ballyshannon".

Members were given a response to the motion by the Area Manager, Roads & Transportation

In speaking to his motion, Cllr Sweeny welcomed the response to his motion and submitted that the path has a few issues that could be dealt with. He noted that the path runs into school property and that it is a safe route to get around.

Cllr McMahon in seconding the motion submitted it would be a nice project to bring forward.

# MDD/163/23 REQUEST FOR AN UPDATE ON THE STATUS OF NAMING THE KILLYBEGS INDUSTRIAL ROAD

#### 2. House Acquisition Programme & Buy & Renew Programme

The completion of the sale of 2 properties in Donegal Town is expected in the coming days. This acquisition will see 2 no. long-term vacant properties brought back into productive use for social housing purposes. A programme of works will be tendered in order that the properties can be brought up to the required standards for letting. Further acquisitions are being considered by Donegal MD.

#### 3. Social Housing through Turnkey Acquisition

Donegal County Council has opened a new turnkey acquisition process seeking proposals from Developers to deliver turnkey social housing units to help meet the Council's social housing need. This is a county-wide process and proposals can be made for any town or village throughout the county, on lands suitable for housing purposes.

The Council is seeking developers to make submissions for 1, 2, 3 & 4 bedroom housing units. Proposals must contain a minimum of 5 units and can include:

- Completed units, including potential regeneration projects.
- Units under construction.
- Units to be constructed on suitable sites.

This process has been advertised on eTenders (reference RFT 2461070), where all documentation and information can be obtained. Submissions must be made in strict accordance with the requirements of the procurement documentation and the deadline for submission is 16.30 on Wednesday, 30<sup>th</sup> of September 2026. Any enquiries from interested parties should be sent via eTenders.

Separately, turnkey acquisitions at Brookfield, Donegal Town and <u>Rockview</u>, <u>Ballyshannon</u> are complete providing a total of 43 no. high quality and energy efficient social housing units in Donegal Municipal District.

Members are aware that an additional turnkey proposal for Donegal Town for 35 units is being progressed. This proposal has received its connection offer from <u>Uisce</u> Eireann. Stage 3 approval has been received. Finalised drawings are awaited from the Developer in order that we can progress the proposal to Final Tender and contract stage. Members will be fully informed of these proposals upon receipt of final departmental approval.

#### 4. Lands / Property for Social Housing Purposes

The Council is actively pursuing the acquisition of lands suitable for housing purposes, in towns and villages where there is currently not a social housing solution available. In the Donegal MD, the following provides an update:

- 1. An offer to acquire lands in Bundoran has been made. Decision awaited from vendor.
- An offer to acquire <u>Ballyshannon</u> has been agreed, subject to contract and availability of utility connections.
- Additional lands are being considered across Donegal MD and Members will be informed of same upon the Council progressing to make offers to acquire.

Hosted in the Inishowen Innovation hub in Buncrana, the 3-hour session was delivered by Grace Shields of Social Scene PR and went through:

- Explored how to maximize sales during #BuyDonegal and Black Friday.
- Developing a strategy to increase revenues in 2024.
- Gained an understanding of applying for support such as Local Enterprise Office Donegal's Trading Online Voucher.

Participants left with a prioritized Action Plan to drive sales in their business over the festive period.

### **Shared Island Funded Projects Update**

Scoping and Feasibility Studies along with Business Cases have been completed for four projects namely NW RegTech Initiative, Slí Colmcille, Crossborder Innovation Plazas and Regenerative Tourism Initiative. This work was funded under the Shared Island Local Authority Grant Scheme. Project documentation has been submitted to both the Shared Island Unit and the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage in accordance with the grant scheme. #### **Investment in the North West City Region:**

#### **Golden Bridges and the US Trade Mission 2023**

This took place from 14<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> November 2023 and was a very successful trade mission that incorporated both meetings and events showcasing the North West City Region.

- The annual Golden Bridges Conference took place on 17<sup>th</sup> November 2023 attended by the NWCR delegation. Joe Kennedy III, US economic envoy to Northern Ireland also attended.
- As part of the US trade mission the 'Pathfinder Go To Market' programme was very successful in partnership with the LEO and Alpha Innovation and facilitated by Catalyst. 10 businesses from the North West City Region travelled to the US to take part, 4 were from the Life Sciences sector and 6 were from the Tech, Saas, Al sector.
- The 'Ireland's North West City Region' brand was promoted throughout the US Trade Mission and at Golden Bridges 2023 through using new branded marketing collateral.
- The NWCR delegation met with contacts in Philadelphia to discuss tourism collaboration opportunities with agreement to explore the potential of a golf tourism focused initiative between the US and the North West City Region.
- The NWCR delegation met representatives of CSC Station, Wilmington, Delaware in relation to their Innovation Hub and potential collaborations with the North West City Region.
- The Donegal Association Philadelphia hosted an evening reception for NWCR delegates. This event provided an opportunity to build relationships and nurture connections with the Diaspora in Philadelphia and to showcase the latest developments and inward investment initiatives in the North West City Region.
- The NWCR delegation met with management of 'Pennovation Works' an Innovation Centre in Philadelphia. This meeting provided an opportunity to discuss Innovation Centre business models and approaches.

- The NWCR delegation attended the IABCN Life Sciences Summit 2023, which provided an
  opportunity to network and discuss potential collaboration opportunities.
- The Boston State House representatives hosted a reception with NWCR delegates to further strengthen civic links with Boston MA and update on the opportunities and challenges facing the NWCR
- A meeting between IDA & INI US East Coast with North West City Region representatives took
  place to agree pathways on collective branding and marketing to accelerate inward investment
  location determination for the NWCR.
- Other meetings were held with key US coast contacts including Harvard University and the World Trade Centre in Boston.

#### North West City Region - Irish Embassy Event in London

This North West City Region event was hosted by Ambassador Martin Frazer on 4th December 2023 at the Embassy of Ireland in London. The objective of this event was to promote Ireland's North West City Region in relation to trade and investment and to demonstrate the competitive advantages of doing business in the North West City Region. The event is also marked the 25-year anniversary of the Good Friday agreement and to share success stories of how the region has evolved since from an economic development perspective and highlighted the benefit to businesses of locating in this region which can provide seamless market access to both the EU and UK. The Cathaoirleach of Donegal County Council Cllr. Martin Harley and Mayor of Derry City and Strabane District Council, Patricia Logue along with Council Executive representatives were in attendance.

Approximately 60 guests attended the event including key business and community representatives, partner organisations, key influencers and Diaspora representatives. The event provided an opportunity to strengthen relationships with the Diaspora and other key contacts in the UK.

#### **CPMR General Assembly**

Donegal County Council will continue its membership of the CPMR in 2024. Atlantic Arc Commission Hub meetings will be held on 31 January & 1st February 2024 incorporating meetings of the Fisheries & Aquaculture Working Group and the Atlantic Tourism & Culture Working Group.

#### **Project Partnership & Development**

The SFU is exploring several project opportunities under the Atlantic Area Programme and is liaising with Council staff and other potential partners on project concepts related to air quality, green infrastructure, fishing sector ecosystem innovation and tourism.

#### Two new EU projects successfully funded.

The SFU applied for two projects under the Interreg Europe funding call and both have been successfully funded, the Green Hydra and EDIN project. They will launch in late January/early February 2024.

The *Green Hydra* project's main scope is to improve national, regional, or local policies for involving SMEs across the whole hydrogen value chain by ensuring better conditions for the following:

- greening existing value chains and creation of new ones.
- financing for testing equipment.
- upscaling innovations related to green hydrogen products and services.
- supporting identifying needs for skills, knowledge development, education and communication and measures for their upscaling.
- identifying new social and economic measures of energy transition project

The *EDIN project* is focused on Digital Nomads (DN) in European regions. Promoting regions as viable locations for digital nomads to work represents an opportunity for the sustainable development of partner regions. The EDIN project intends to engage in knowledge exchange learning on how to adapt or change policy instruments in order to attract digital nomads to the variety of member states involved in the project in order to fully exploit the benefits they can bring to the regions in the form of talent, tech and tourism.

## **AER Summer Academy 2024**

DCC hosted the Summer Academy in Donegal in 2022 in partnership with Udarás na Gaeltachta. The next Summer Academy youth focused event will take place in Norway in August 2024. # Wakeaton:

Donegal Youth Council members joined Foroige in a wakeaton for Homelessness. This was held on the 13<sup>th</sup> of October as part of Focus Ireland's "Shine a light" campaign for the homeless. Young people raised €830 for Focus Ireland while also staying awake all night to create awareness and discuss the issue of homelessness in Ireland.



# Youth Conference:



## 1.2 Fifth Call for Category 1 Projects (shovel ready) under the Rural Regeneration and Development Fund (RRDF).

In November 2023 a fifth call for Category 1 projects was announced. This is a competitive application process and Local Authorities can



submit a maximum of 3 applications for large scale and ambitious in nature projects. The minimum request per project is €500,000 with no upper limit but projects seeking over €10m would be considered exceptional in nature.

In recognition of the classification by the EU Commission of the North West Region as a Transition Region, grant aid of 90% will apply with 10% to be provided in matching contributions by the Council – this 10% matching contribution can be in the form of Local Authority investment, community investment or philanthropic contributions.

The deadline for submission of applications is **12 pm on Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> February 2024**. As confirmed to Elected Members at the November 2023 Plenary meeting of the Council, work is underway to bring forward applications for Regeneration Projects in Rathmullan and Creeslough under this Call.

### 2.0 Urban Regeneration and Development Fund (URDF).

Funding is provided from the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage for towns with a population in excess of 10,000 which includes Letterkenny in this County, with calls for application to the Fund sought under two categories. **Category 1** relates to projects with all necessary planning and other consents in place and which are ready to proceed, i.e shovel ready. **Category 2** projects are those which require further development to become ready for Category 1 status.
