On the proposal of Cllr Jordan seconded by Cllr Naughton the Minutes of the Housing & Corporate Workshop of the Municipal District of Donegal held on the 12th December 2023 were confirmed.

MDD/008/24 HOUSING & CORPORATE SERVICES REPORT

CORPORATE SERVICES

Cllr McMahon submitted that he had been contacted by a constituent who had to attend the A&E Department in Sligo recently and unfortunately had to wait 19 hours before receiving attention. Cllr McMahon noted the excessive hours existing medical staff are working and asked that a letter issue to the Department of Health to request additional supports be provided to hospital departments. Cllr Jordan seconded this proposal.

HOUSING SERVICES

Progress reports on Casual Vacancies, Grants, Loans, Tenant Purchase Scheme 2016, HAP Tenancies, Housing Need, Housing Capital, Approved Housing Bodies Development, and Lease & Repair Scheme

Ms McCann noted the reports circulated with the agenda and advised that the Housing Office will continue to deliver an extensive work programme during 2024.

A number of comments / queries were dealt with as follows:-

Housing

Cllr Sweeny thanked the Housing Team and welcomed the allocations made in advance of Christmas. Cllr Sweeny noted the upturn in the number of housing grants and loans during 2023 and commended the Croí Cónaithe Scheme that is administering a high volume of applications.

Cllr McMahon welcomed the commencement of construction of the 42 housing units in Bundoran and noted the importance of delivering additional social housing stock within communities. Cllr McMahon advised that he has been made aware of 3 Notices to Quit since the beginning of the New Year and suggested measures should be considered to reduce the number of Notices to Quit.

Cllr Jordan also welcomed the recent allocations and suggested the process of identifying land banks within the smaller towns and villages should be expediated as these areas would benefit from an increase in population whilst simultaneously reducing the housing waiting lists in the larger towns. Cllr Jordan submitted that the Tenant In-Situ Scheme and the Repair & Leasing Scheme should be abolished as they currently were not working in their existing format.

Cllr Kennedy also agreed with the progression of identifying suitable lands within the smaller towns and villages and noted that there was a need for additional sheltered housing facilities in the Donegal MD.

Cllr Naughton submitted that the Donegal MD delivered a high volume social housing units in 2023 and welcomed the proposals to deliver further houses in Donegal Town and Bundoran as well as the proposal to deliver 4 units in Laghey.

L McCann thanked the Members for their comments and submitted that the delivery of additional housing units is an ongoing priority for the Donegal MD.

MDD/009/24 ROADS / TRANSPORTATION SERVICES REPORT

2024 Roadworks Programme Status Report

M Sweeney advised the Roads Report excluded the Roads Maintenance and Improvement Works Programme as the budget for 2024 has not been announced yet. It is anticipated a workshop will be arranged in due course, when the overall budget amount has been allocated.

Follow up Issues from the previous meeting

Mr. Sweeney provided an update on the follow up issues from the previous meeting, as circulated by email, that dealt with the following matters: -

- Seek an update on the works at Donaldsons Corner. This work was completed before Christmas.
- Arrange a meeting with the Marine Engineer to the discuss the possible erection of bollards and a height restriction barrier at the Pier in Bundoran.

This meeting took place on 5th January 2024.

- Review the junction at Saimer Drive, Ballyshannon.
 The area roads office will arrange to trim back the branches on the Portnason side of the junction in the coming days.
- Dunkineely National School Prepare a letter of support, -Consider the traffic report and feedback the Members' concerns to the National Roads Office.

A letter of support was sent to the school principal and to the Parents Association on 2nd January 2024.

• Follow up with the Roads Central Office in relation to the naming of the Killybegs Industrial Road.

An email was sent to Roads Central on 2nd January 2024 asking for the process of renaming this road to be progressed as soon as possible.

 Refer the request for a one-way system at the Sheil Avenue in Bundoran to the Road Design Office.

This request was referred to Road Design on 2nd January 2024.

 Review the Community & Climate Plan to ascertain if funding is available to construct footpath extensions to link to local schools.

This fund is being administered through the Environment Section. See link below which details the information available on the Council's website in relation to the Community Climate Action Fund. You will note from same that Theme 2 – Sustainable Travel relates to cycle parking / racks, improving cycle way access, safe and active routes to schools, eCargo bikes, bike repair hubs.

Donegal County Council (donegalcoco.ie)

The Environment Section of the Council are holding a series of public information sessions throughout the County in January with the Donegal MD session being held on 30th January 2024 from 7pm to 8pm at the Donegal Town Public Services Centre.

A number of comments / queries were dealt with as follows:-

Pedestrian Crossing - Ballyshannon

Cllr Sweeny welcomed the commencement of the access road for the Sheil Hospital via the Market Yard in Ballyshannon and queried if it was possible to introduce a left hand turn only at the exit junction and construct an adjacent pedestrian crossing. Cllr Sweeny noted that the surrounding businesses have provided positive feedback in relation to the possibility of a pedestrian crossing at this location. M Sweeney welcomed the positive feedback in relation to the pedestrian crossing and agreed to consider suitable funding streams. He also submitted that the Market Yard exit junction will remain as a two way exit junction, however, it will be monitored for a time period and if required, a left hand only turn will be introduced.

Uisce Éireann

In response to Cllr Sweeny's query in relation to the laying of a water main under the Ballyshannon/Bundoran cycle path, Mr Sweeney advised that he is awaiting a reply from Uisce Éireann and agreed to follow up on same.

Ramps - Bundoran

Cllr McMahon submitted that he was aware that further car meets are being organized for Bundoran and sought an update on the previously requested ramps. Mr Sweeney advised that subject to funding, Bundoran would be facilitated with 4 ramps; 2 on the Main Street and 2 on the Atlantic Way and noted that the TII have revised their guidelines and are introducing ramps in areas to ensure cars continue to drive at the slower speed through urban areas. Cllr N Kennedy welcomed the reintroduction of ramps in town centres.

Footpaths

In response to Cllr Naughton's query in relation to the footpath works at Pettigo and the Old Golf Course Road, Mr Sweeney advised that these projects have not yet been advanced due to staffing issues but hoped that a new Executive Engineer will be in place in the near future which will facilitate these projects progressing in due course.

One-Way System, Donegal Town

Although Cllr Naughton welcomed the introduction of the one-way system in Donegal Town, a number of issues have arisen, particularly a traffic congestion point at the Blueberry Restaurant. In order to reduce traffic congestion at this area, Cllr Naughton suggested removing the uncontrolled pedestrian crossing point at the Triona shop and encouraging pedestrians to use the crossing adjacent the Four Masters Bookshop. In response, M Sweeney submitted that the crossing points are placed at the areas where most usage takes place and noted that pedestrians wishing to cross from the Triona Shop side to the Abbey Hotel would not walk to the Four Masters Bookshop to

cross the road at this point. If the crossing was removed at this location, pedestrians would still be crossing at this point. M Sweeney advised that it is important in a town centre that both vehicular and pedestrian movements are catered for and during peak times when the town gets busy, it is important that pedestrians are facilitated.

M Sweeney submitted that the key to resolving much of the traffic congestion being experienced around the Diamond, Bridge Street, Main Street and Quay Street is removing the majority of busses using the existing bus stop on the Diamond, which currently facilitates up to 97 buses on a daily basis. The existing bus stop facility does not have the capacity to deal with this volume of busses and associated traffic that comes with the bus stop being at this location and alternatives are being considered and being discussed with the relevant authorities and service providers.

Cllr Conaghan expressed his dismay at the negative comments in relation to the one-way system and suggested these comments do not benefit the businesses who are currently operating within the town centre. Cllr Conaghan noted that when complete, the one-way system will ease traffic congestion within the town centre.

Winter Maintenance

Cllr Naughton advised that a supply of salt is required at the Dummies Bridge, Letterbarra. M Sweeney agreed to relay the request to the Outdoor Maintenance Staff.

Cllr Sweeny queried if additional equipment such as a tractor could be purchased to facilitate the spreading of salt in areas that are not currently serviced by the winter maintenance programme. In response, M Sweeney advised that the Area Roads Office, does facilitate the ad hoc distribution of salt/grit in areas of special need such as wake houses or patients who are receiving palliative care and noted that additional funding sources would be required for the acquisition of equipment and the appointment of extra staff.

Kildoney Bridge

In response to Cllr McMahon's query in relation to Kildoney Bridge, M Sweeney advised staff are investigating the issue and will upsize the pipework if required.

LIS Workshop

The Members agreed to hold an LIS Workshop on Monday the 15th January 2024 at 10am.

MDD/010/24 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, INFORMATION SYSTEMS & EMERGENCY SERVICES REPORT

Ms Joy Browne presented the report for the Economic Development, Information Systems & Emergency Services, as circulated with the Agenda with topic headings noted below:-

In relation to Tourism, J Browne submitted that the Tourism Unit will have a presence at the Dublin Holiday World scheduled to take place from the 26th to 28th January 2024 and 16 businesses have agreed to share the stand. The new tourism brochure will be available for distribution at the show. In addition, a new tourism campaign will be delivered in February with the aim to drive incremental visitors to our county in the non-peak period.

J Browne further submitted that the Strategic Funding Unit has been successful in securing Interreg funding for 2 applications, namely the *Green Hydra Project* and the *EDIN Project* and the Local Enterprise Office will be delivering 6 Brokerage Events in 2024 / 2025 aimed at connecting SMEs with international buyers.

A number of comments / queries were dealt with as follows:-

Donegal Town - Outdoor Space

In response to Cllr Jordan's query in relation to the commencement date for the works to the Diamond in Donegal Town, J Browne advised that a contractor has been appointed and the works are due to commence on the 22nd January 2024. J Browne advised correspondence has issued to the Members in this regard, and it is expected the works will be completed by June, in advance of the summer season.

In response to Cllr Naughton's query in relation to the works at the Donegal Town Pier, J Browne advised that suitable funding sources are currently being investigated.

Bundoran Outdoor Dining Project

Cllr McMahon sought an update on the Bundoran Outdoor Dining Project and J Browne advised a meeting is scheduled to take place this week and it is expected the tender process will be finalised by the end of the month.

Supports for SMEs

In response to Cllr McMahon's query in relation to supports for SMEs, J Browne advised the Local Enterprise Office is a good starting point

for potential businesses as well as the Concierge Service offered by the Economic Development Unit.

Tourism Sectoral Forum

Cllr Sweeny welcomed the participation at the Dublin Holiday World and also welcomed the funding announcement for the 2 Interreg projects. Cllr Sweeny called for the reestablishment of the Tourism Sectoral Forum and noted that there is a currently a disconnect between tourism operators on the ground. Cllr Kennedy concurred with Cllr Sweeny and noted that the existing structure of the Donegal Tourism Board and the Associate Members Committee is positioned at a higher level with a greater focus on the hotel sector. J Browne noted that this issue is currently being discussed by the Tourism Team and agreed to relay the comments raised.

MDD/011/24 ENVIRONMENT SERVICES REPORT

Ms S Bogan presented the report for the Environment Section, as circulated with the Agenda highlighting with the following matters:-

Ms S Bogan informed Members that a pack would issue to Members in mid-January regarding the Climate Action Plan. She also informed Members that the Community Climate Action Fund is accepting applications up until the 22nd March 2024.

S Bogan submitted that the recycling of natural Christmas trees is encouraged and a number of recycling centres throughout the county are accepting trees up until the 27th January 2024.

A number of comments / queries were dealt with as follows:-

Donegal Town Bottle Bank Site

Cllr Conaghan welcomed the upgrade works to the Donegal Town Bottle Bank site and wished to convey his thanks to the Environment Team and the contractor who completed the works. Cllr McMahon concurred with Cllr Conaghan's comments. S Bogan agreed to relay the comments to the Senior Management Team.

Deposit Return Scheme

Cllr McMahon referred to the introduction of the Deposit Return Scheme, which facilitates the return of empty undamaged drinks containers featuring the Re-turn logo to any retailers that sells drinks in plastic and steel/aluminium cans and queried if the Environment Section will have a presence at the launch of the Re-turn Station in Bundoran. S Bogan advised that this scheme is ran by Re-turn and will commence in February 2024. S Bogan agreed to relay the suggestion to the Senior Management Team.

CCTV Legislation

Cllr McMahon expressed his dismay at the level of rubbish left at the Bundoran Bottle Banks during the Christmas period and suggested a letter issue to the Department seeking an update on the CCTV legislation.

Community Climate Action Fund

In response to Cllr Jordan's query in relation to the Community Climate Action Fund, S Bogan advised that a meeting is being arranged with colleagues in Northern Ireland to consider possible community proposals under the Strand 1(a) Shared Island Community Climate Action.

1. Welcome

Cllr T Conaghan opened the workshop by welcoming all attendees and a round of introductions took place.

2. Presentation by SSEE Airtricity

Mr S Herron, Public Liaison Officer with SEE Airtricity advised the company had 3 operational windfarms in Donegal with plans in place to construct a fourth windfarm at Drumnahough. Mr Herron noted that the consultation period for the draft County Development Plan had expired, however, in advance of the Plenary meeting to approve the County Development Plan for 2024 to 2030, SEE Airtricity wished to highlight that lands where approximately 33 of their existing wind turbines are located, has been shaded pink on the map and designated as an area of scenic amenity. Both Mr Herron and Ms M Donnelly, Project Manager with SSE Airtricity emphasised that the lifespan of wind turbines is approximately 25 to 30 years and the existing wind turbines are coming near their end of life. It was noted that with new technological advances and innovation, less wind turbines would be required to generate power, however, they are bigger in scale. It was further noted that the draft plan did not consider the repowering of existing turbines in great detail and there was concern expressed that should this proposal be adopted, repowering opportunities may be limited for the company.

In this regard, a discussion ensued, and a number of comments were made, and queries answered.

The Members were presented with the current list of Local Improvement Schemes in each RSS area and agreed the schemes where the applicants are to be contacted and asked to submit further information to ascertain if their scheme meets the qualifying criteria. This list will be sent to Roads Central who will arrange to write to these applicants seeking the necessary information.

2. Donegal Town One Way system enabling works.

The Members were briefed on the extent of the enabling works that had to be carried out at the Donegal Town Livestock Mart to facilitate the one-way system and agreed that funding for these works can be sourced form the Pay & Display funding.

3. Donegal Town One Way system matching funding for surfacing works.

The Members were reminded that back on 8th September 2020 they agreed at a Municipal District meeting to contribute €50,000 from the Pay & Display fund as matching funding for the Donegal Town One Way System. This funding will be used for surfacing works which will be undertaken in the coming months.

4. Donegal Town - St Patricks Day parade.

Works on the Diamond in Donegal Town are scheduled to commence on 22nd January 2024 and are expected to be completed in June 2024. As a result, the space on the Diamond will not be available for the crowds expected on St

Patrick's day so this will result in more people gathering on the other streets along the route of the parade. To assist the parade organising committee with managing this the Members have, as a once off, agreed to cover the cost of additional barriers needed to manage the crowds expected.



2. House Acquisition Programme & Buy & Renew Programme

The completion of the sale of 2 properties in Donegal Town is expected in the coming days. Significant improvement works to bring these properties back into use can then be procured and undertaken.

A number of further acquisitions are being considered by Donegal MD.

3. Social Housing through Turnkey Acquisition

Donegal County Council has opened a new turnkey acquisition process seeking proposals from Developers to deliver turnkey social housing units to help meet the Council's social housing need. This is a county-wide process and proposals can be made for any town or village throughout the county, on lands suitable for housing purposes.

The Council is seeking developers to make submissions for 1, 2, 3 & 4 bedroom housing units. Proposals must contain a minimum of 5 units and can include:

- Completed units, including potential regeneration projects.
- Units under construction.
- Units to be constructed on suitable sites.

This process has been advertised on <u>STENDERS</u> (reference RFT 2461070), where all documentation and information can be obtained. Submissions must be made in strict accordance with the requirements of the procurement documentation and the deadline for submission is 16.30 on Wednesday, 30th of September 2026.

In order to provide advice and guidance to potential applicants, the Council is holding dropin information events throughout the county during the month of February. Members will be fully informed of these proposals upon receipt of final departmental approval.

4. Lands / Property for Social Housing Purposes

The Council is actively pursuing the acquisition of lands suitable for housing purposes, in towns and villages where there is currently not a social housing solution available. In the Donegal MD, the following provides an update:

- 1. An offer to acquire lands in Bundoran has been made. Decision awaited from vendor.
- 2. An offer to acquire <u>Ballyshannon</u> has been agreed, subject to contract and availability of utility connections.
- Additional lands are being considered across Donegal MD and Members will be informed of same upon the Council progressing to make offers to acquire.



As part of the MEM structure, Civil Defence continues to support the Principal Response Agencies (PRAs) when the need arises. Already in January of this year, Civil Defence AFS units has been placed on standby to assist with Storm Isha and Strom Joclyn.

Health Service Executive: Severe Weather Events:

During severe weather events, such as snow, frost and icy conditions, Civil Defence provides transport support to the HSE and National Ambulance Service with their 4x4 vehicles. In January of this year, Civil Defence provided transport services to the HSE Home Care Support Teams from 17th January – 20th January inclusive. This service allows the Home Care Support workers to continue their twice daily care of the vulnerable in the community, during the severe weather.

Civil Defence Officers Association Conference:

The 3-day National Civil Defence Officers Association Conference was held in Farnham Estate, Cavan on 7th, 8th and 9th November. In attendance was, 234 delegates, over the course of the event, 33 traders exhibited their latest equipment for potential future Civil Defence use.

	Main Provisions
	 It is estimated that about 1.9 billion drinks bottles and cans are consumed each year in Ireland, in-house and 'on the go'.
	 The Deposit Return Scheme aims to boost the recycling rate for these drinks containers by charging a small, refundable deposit for each plastic bottle or cans.
	 The Scheme will be operated by Deposit Return Scheme Ireland CLG, trading as Return, who Minister Smyth appointed in July 2022.
	 The Scheme will include PET plastic bottles and aluminium and steel cans between 150ml and 3 litres.
	 A deposit of 15c will apply to containers 500mls or less and a deposit of 25c for each container above 500ml.
	 All producers and retailers are legally obliged to register with Re-turn. Registration is open at <u>www.re-turn.ie.</u>
	 Customers get this money back when they return the container to a retailer or other collection point to be recycled.
	 Places supplying beverage bottles and cans will be obliged to take back the containers and reimburse the deposit.

NOTE – Not every place supplying drinks has to take back containers (e.g. chip vans, small shops) but they have to apply for an exemption and if granted have to display their exemption


The scheme will be up and running from 1st February 2024.

Notes

This is a deposit return scheme commencing on the 1st February 2024 geared towards promoting recycling and addressing littering concerns by assigning a monetary value to beverage containers. If you purchase a drink in a plastic bottle, aluminium, or steel can bearing the Re-turn logo, a small deposit is added to the drink's price. Upon returning the empty, undamaged container to any retail outlet, the full deposit is refunded. Container size determines the deposit amount, with 15c for 500ml or less and 25c for containers exceeding 500ml. The scheme covers PET plastic bottles and aluminium/steel cans ranging from 150ml to 3 litres.

Designed for convenience, Re-Turn offers return points throughout Ireland. Any establishment selling drinks with the Re-turn logo is obligated to accept and refund deposits for empty, undamaged containers, except those with a Take Back Exemption. This exemption is applicable to on-site drink-serving businesses (hotels, restaurants, bars, cafes), off-site sellers with small store sizes (250 sq. meters or less), and online drink retailers. These exempted businesses must display a QR code and website link indicating the nearest return points.

Beyond convenience, the scheme is expected to benefit communities by promoting recycling as a potent tool for addressing climate change. Re-Turn seeks to transition away from the 'take-make-dispose' mindset, encouraging the return of valuable materials to the economy for prolonged use.





Final Checklist for Retailers

Re-turn is encouraging all Retailers to do a final checklist in preparation for go live of the Deposit Return Scheme on 1 February. This applies to all Retailers regardless of whether they have been granted a Take Back Exemption.

Activity / Donegal household waste collectors will be taking part in the National Food Waste Recycling **Project Title** Project in 2024 **Project** Description/ Activity The EPA estimates that Ireland generated 753,000 tonnes (t) of food waste in 2021. Growing, processing and transporting food uses a huge amount of resources, such as land, water, energy and fertiliser. If food is wasted, these resources are wasted too. The EPA estimates that food waste costs the average Irish household about €60 per month or €700 per year. That's an annual national cost of €1.29 billion. In order to help households to separate their waste and to reduce contamination in the food waste stream Donegal household waste collectors will be taking part in the National Food Waste Recycling Project this year. This project is funded by the Department of Environment, Climate and Communications (DECC) and is being led by the Regional Waste Management Planning Authorities under the guise of mywaste.ie. Through the project Donegal collectors will be provided with thousands of kitchen caddy packs to distribute to their customers. Each pack consists of a 7 litre kitchen caddy, a starter pack of compostable liners and an information leaflet. Householders can use the caddy and liners to separate their food waste in the kitchen and when the liner is full, place it in their kerbside food waste bin. The **Community Climate Action Fund - Public Information Sessions** are ongoing and are being well attended by community groups across the county.





no upper limit but projects seeking over €10m would be considered exceptional in nature.

In recognition of the classification by the EU Commission of the North West Region as a Transition Region, grant aid of 90% will apply with 10% to be provided in matching contributions by the Council – this 10% matching contribution can be in the form of Local Authority investment, community investment or philanthropic contributions.

The deadline for submission of applications is **12 pm on Tuesday 8th February 2024**. As confirmed to Elected Members at the November 2023 Plenary meeting of the Council, work is underway to bring forward applications for Regeneration Projects in Rathmullan and Creeslough under this Call.

The Council have undertaken Step 1 to identify vacant and derelict properties

through the GEO Directory. This survey has been undertaken in the towns listed in

Table 4 below and will be carried out in further towns over the coming months:
