Donegal County Museum is based in an old stone building, which was once part of the Letterkenny Workhouse, opened in 1845.

Our first floor exhibition tells the story of County Donegal from the Stone Age to the Twentieth century. Throughout

the year we organise a programme of events which includes temporary exhibitions, lectures, seminars and workshops on a wide range of topics.

We also have a range of travelling exhibitions which are available for loan to organisations and community groups. Topics covered include World War I, Donegal and the Easter Rising, the Flight of The Earls and much more.

You can view these digital film archives for free in the County Museum. The North West Film Archive is a unique digital collection of archival material from the counties of Donegal and Derry. It contains over 90 hours of documentaries, newsreel, television news and drama from BBC, UTV, RTE and Channel 4, and short films, animation and home movies.

The Donegal Islands Film and Radio Archive gives an insight into the social history of the offshore islands of County Donegal from the 1950s to the present day.
